THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

${\bf PROCLAMATION}.$

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. ISAAC A. ISAACS Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 103 of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931, it is, amongst other things, provided that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, reserve for the use and benefit of the aboriginal native inhabitants of the Northern Territory any unalienated Crown lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the use and benefit of the aboriginal native inhabitants of the Northern Territory the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto being lands which are unalienated and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Now therefore I, Sir Isaac Alfred Isaacs, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto for the use and benefit of the aboriginal native inhabitants of the Northern Territory.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at the north-western corner of the Aboriginal Reserve situated in the south-western corner of the Northern Territory, thence true north along the 129th meridian of east longitude for 40 miles, thence true east for 150 miles, thence true south for 40 miles to the north-eastern corner of the said Aboriginal Reserve, thence true west along the northern boundary of the said Aboriginal Reserve to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and Seal of the Commonwealth, this twenty-ninth day of March, in the year of Our (L.S.) Lord. One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and in the twenty-third year of His Majesty's reign.

DELEGATION OF POWERS IN RELATION TO COURTS-MARTIAL.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. ISAAC A. ISAACS Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

I SIR ISAAC ALFRED ISAACS, the Governor-General afore-said, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred on me by the Defence Act 1903-1932 and the Air Force Act 1923, do hereby delegate to every officer who shall at any time during the continuance of this delegation be holding the office or being a member of the Air Board shall be performing the duties of the Air Member for Personnel at the Head-quarters of the Royal Australian Air Force, power from time to time to convene a general Court-Martial or a District Court-Martial and to appoint officers to constitute any such Court-Martial and in respect of any General Court-Martial or District Court-Martial convened under any delegation under the Defence Act 1903-1932 or that Act amended or the Air Force Act 1923 to confirm the finding or findings or any of them and the sentence or to send back the finding or findings or any of them or the sentence or both for revision to mitigate or remit the punishment or any part of the punishment awarded by any sentence or to commute any such punishment for any less punishment to which the offender might have been sentenced by the Court-Martial and to suspend the execution or currency of any sentence on such terms if any as such officer shall think fit and I declare that this delegation shall communece on the twenty-ninth day of March, 1933 and shall continue until revoked.

The delegation of the eleventh day of December, 1923, is hereby revoked.—(Ex. Min. No. 70.)

To amend the Extradition Ordinance 1927.

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Extradition Ordinance 1933.

(2.) The Extradition Ordinance 1927 is in this Ordinance

referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Extradition Ordinance 1927-1933.

Definition.

2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from the definition of "the Act" in sub-section (1.) the figures "1895" and inserting in their stead the figures "1932".

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Birds and Animals Protection Ordinance 1922-1924.

Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the New Guinea Act 1920-1926, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Birds and Animals Protection Ordinance 1933.

(2.) The Birds and Animals Protection Ordinance 1922-1924 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Birds and Animals Protection Ordinance* 1922-1933.

Special permits may be issued. 2. Section six of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end of sub-section (5.) the following proviso:—

"Provided that the Administrator may, if he thinks fit, in special cases waive the whole or any portion of that fee.".

To amend the Motor Traffic Ordinance 1928.

E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the New Guinea Act 1920-1926, as follows:-

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Motor Traffic Short title and Ordinance 1933.
- (2.) The Motor Traffic Ordinance 1928 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Motor Traffic Ordinance 1928-1933.
- 2. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced on the Commencement. date of the commencement of the Principal Ordinance.
- 3. Section twenty-nine of the Principal Ordinance is amended Power to make by inserting in paragraph (u) of sub-section (1.), after the word "Territory", the words "and commissioned officers of the New Guinea Police Force".

To amend the Immigration Ordinance 1932.

E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the New Guinea Act 1920-1926, as follows:-

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Immigration short title and citation. Ordinance 1933.
- (2.) The Immigration Ordinance 1932 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Immigration Ordinance 1932-1933.
 - (a) by inserting in sub-section (1.), after the word dictation test.

 "Administrator", the words "or an officer authorized by him in that babale" 2. Section nine of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
 - (b) by inserting in sub-section (1.), after the words "paragraph (a) of", the words "sub-section (1.) of".

Duty of master, &c., of vessel bringing prohibited immigrant to provide return passage. 3. Section twenty-seven of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-section (3.) the words "passage money as is prescribed", and inserting in their stead the words "sum of money as the Administrator thinks reasonable".

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Post and Telegraph Ordinance 1923.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the New Guinea Act 1920-1926, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Ordinance 1933.
- (2.) The Post and Telegraph Ordinance 1923 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance* 1923-1933.

Incorporation.

- 2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the word "Principal" and inserting in its stead the word "Papuan".
- 3. Section three of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following sections inserted in its stead:—

General amendments. "3. The Papuan Ordinance is amended by omitting the words 'Lieutenant-Governor' and 'Lieutenant-Governor in Council' (wherever occurring) and inserting in their stead the word 'Administrator'.

Newspaper and letter rates. Regulations.

- "4. Section seventeen of the Papuan Ordinance is repealed.
- "5. Section ninety-five of the Papuan Ordinance is amended-
 - (a) by inserting after paragraph (1.) the following paragraph:—
 - '(1a) prescribing the rates to be charged for the conveyance of postal articles posted within the Territory for delivery therein or for transmission abroad;'; and
 - (b) by inserting after paragraph (n) the following paragraph:—
 - '(na) regulating the use of code and other telegraphic addresses;'".

Repeal of

"6. The Third Schedule to the Papuan Ordinance is repealed.".

4. Where the Administrator purporting to act under the Validation of Principal Ordinance or under the Principal Ordinance and the regulations. Post and Telegraph Ordinance 1912-1916 of the Territory of Papua in its application to the Territory has made any regulations, such regulations shall be deemed to be and to have been of the same force and effect as if the Post and Telegraph Ordinance 1923-1933 had been in force on the date on which they were made, and as if they had been made by the Administrator under the Papuan Ordinance, as amended by that Ordinance.

ACCESSION TO INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS.

T is notified, for general information, that an Order has been made by His Excellency the Governor-General in Council that His Majesty the King be moved to accede, in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia, including the Territories of Papua and Norfolk Island and the Mandated

Territories of New Guinea and Nauru, to the International Convention for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, and to the Protocol of Signature, adopted at Geneva on 13th July, 1931, subject to the following reservations:—

- (1) The accession to the said Convention of the Commonwealth of Australia extends only so far as the subject matter of the Convention is within the legislative competence of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia.
- (2) In so far as the provisions of the Convention relate to matters necessary for carrying out or giving effect to the said Convention which are within the legislative competence of the States of the Commonwealth the obligations of the Commonwealth of Australia will be limited to co-operation with the Governments of the several States in regard to such matters
- to such matters.

 (3) The Government of the Commonwealth of Australia does not undertake to create a special administration as required under Article 15 of the said Convention in view of the fact that all the necessary functions can be exercised by the Department of Trade and Customs.
