# AN ORDINANCE

### To amend the Administration and Probate Ordinance 1929-1932.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act, 1910-1931, as follows:-

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Administration and Probate Ordinance 1933.
- (2.) The Administration and Probate Ordinance 1929-1932 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Administration and Probate Ordinance 1929-1933.

Passing and allowance of accounts of executors, &c.

- 2. Section fifty-eight A of the Principal Ordinance is amended-
  - (a) by omitting from paragraph (a) the word "and" (last occurring); and
  - by adding at the end thereof the following paragraph:-
    - "and (c) in and about the investment of moneys by the Curator under section one hundred and four of this Ordinance.".

Curator to invest moneys after expiration of six months.

3. Section one hundred and lour of the limitage is amended by inserting, after the word "Court" (first occurring), the words "or a Justice". 3. Section one hundred and four of the Principal Ordinance

- (a) drawback shall be allowed only in respect of steel plates in regard to which evidence is produced to the satisfaction of the Collector that supplies of similar or suitable steel plates of Australian manufacture are not procurable in the Commonwealth;
- hen required by the Collector the manufacture shall take place under the supervision of an officer; (b) when
- (c) in each case before drawback is allowed the Collector shall be satisfied that the drawback claimed is properly due.

The conditions upon which vessels shall be permitted to use any wharf of the Commissioner shall be as follows:—

(i) The owner, master or agent of any vessel using a wharf of the Commissioner shall be liable for injury caused to the wharf by the vessel or by any boatman or other persons belonging to or employed in or about the vessel.

(ii) The Commissioner may recover in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the owner, master or agent of any vessel damages for any injury caused by the vessel to a wharf of the Commissioner.

(iii) The owner, master or agent of any vessel which causes injury to a wharf of the Commissioner shall not be relieved of any liability to the Commissioner by reason of the fact that the vessel was under compulsory pilotage at the time at which the injury was caused.

(iv) Nothing in this By-law shall prejudice any other rights which the Commissioner may have or limit any liabilities to which any vessel or the master, owner or agent thereof may be subject in respect of any injury caused by the vessel.

### DIRECTIONS TO DRUGGISTS.

Drugs, dressings and appliances are to conform to the standards of the current issue of the British Pharmacopoeia or British Pharmaceutical Codex, where those standards are applicable. Drugs are to be plainly labelled and the official dose, for an adult, of the contents of the bottle is to be stated clearly on the label.

Sand-blasted labels are recommended where possible; alternatively, gold and black or some other form of durable label.

Bottles are to be glass stoppered. All medicines indicated thus (\*) are to be marked with a red poison label and kept in a separate locker under lock and key.

Articles marked thus † are to be carried in green fluted bottles and labelled "For external use only."

This Scale is identical, excepting in regard to the classes of ships to which it applies, with Scale I. of the Scales issued by the Board of Trade of the United Kingdom.

QUANTITIES.—(a) All drugs, dressings and sundries of this scale, except where indicated by an (\*) shall be increased by 50 per cent, for voyages of from thirty-one to sixty days' duration; by 75 per cent, for voyages of from sixty-one to one hundred days' duration; and by 100 per cent, for voyages of more than one hundred days' duration.

(b) For every additional 500 passengers and crew over and above 1,000, or portion thereof, an increase of 10 per cent, to the quantities of drugs, dressings and appliances shall be added to the column for 1,000 passengers and crew, except where indicated by an (\*).

§ "Factory eye drops." The bottle must have a label attached containing the following instructions for the use of eye drops:—

(1) With the aid of the dropper put two drops into the eye.
(2) Wait five minutes.
(3) Put two more drops into the eye.
(4) Wait five minutes.
(5) Put in two more drops.

## APPENDIX B.

SPECIFICATION FOR CHLORIDE OF LIME FOR TREATMENT OF DRINKING WATER IN SHIPS.

- 1. The Chloride of Lime must be of approved quality.
- 2. It must contain not less than 24 per cent. and not more than 26 per cent. available chlorine.
  - 3. It must contain not less than 14 per cent. of free quick lime (CaO).
- 4. The total water existing in all forms, consisting largely, if not entirely, of the water in combination in the form of calcium hydroxide, must not exceed 7.5 per cent.
- 5. It shall be of such stability that after passing four weeks in an oven kept at 140° F.  $(\pm 2^{\circ})$  the percentage of available chlorine shall not decrease more than 2.
- 6. The powder to be put up in 1 lb. tins, the date of issue by the manufacturer to be stamped on the base of each tin.
- 7. Each tin and contents (except the measure, which may be used again) whether partially used or not, to be renewed within one year following the date stamped on
- 8. Each tin to contain a measure, made of a material resistant to chlorine, to contain 60 grains of the powder, when full, i.e., sufficient to chlorinate approximately 200 gallons

## APPENDIX C.

## CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL OF DISINFECTANTS FOR SHIPS.

#### I. PHENOL OR CARBOLIC ACID.

A liquid containing not less than 90 per cent. of free carbolic and/or cresylic acid, and approved by a Medical Inspector of Shipping. The approved disinfectant must have a germicidal value not less than that of pure phenol when tested against B. typhosus in the presence of excess of organic matter, and must be miscible with sea water in the manner described on the containers so as to produce a 5 per cent. emulsion which shall show no appreciable separation of the disinfectant after standing for six hours at the normal temperature of about 60° F.

## II. CHLORINE MAY BE CARRIED EITHER IN THE FORM OF

#### (a) Stabilized Chloride of Lime.

(a) Stabilized Unloride of Lime.

If stabilized chloride of lime is carried the quantity of phenol or cresylic acid may be reduced by not more than 50 per cent., and the amount so reduced must be replaced by an equal weight of stabilized chloride of lime.

Chloride of lime must be dry and suitably stabilized yielding not less than 30 per cent. by weight of available chlorine and must be put up in tins of not more than 10 lb. per tin, the date of issue by the manufacturer being stamped on each tin. Each tin and contents, whether partly used or not, must be renewed within one year of the date stamped on the tin. Full instructions for the use of the powder for cleansing decks, bulkheads, urinals, lavatory basins, &c., must be given on a label attached to each tin. Samples for test will be taken from time to time. This material is not to be used for the sterilization of drinking water, nor for the sterilization of dejecta, soiled utensils or apparel of persons suffering from a contagious or infectious disease:

## or (b) Stabilized Hypochlorite Solution.

If a stabilized solution of hypochlorite of soda is preferred to chloride of lime, this preparation may be carried in place of the chloride of lime, provided the total quantity of available chlorine is the same. The amount of phenol or the total quantity of available chlorine is the same. The amount of phenol or cresylic acid carried may then be reduced by 50 per cent. The conditions and restrictions as to its purpose and use are the same as for chloride of lime. The hypochlorite solution must yield at least 10 per cent. of available chlorine. If the solution should at any time decrease in strength so that the available chlorine falls to less than 8 per cent. it must be replaced as soon as possible. The liquid is to be stored in stoneware jars or other containers, of not less than two gallons nor more than ten gallons capacity, not liable to cause a diminution of the strength of the solution. The jars must be sealed either with stoneware stoppers or with stoppers which have no appreciable action in diminishing the strength of the solution. Unless it can be shown that the strength of the solution is unaltered, the disinfectant must be renewed at least once a year. The date of sealing the containers and directions for use must be stated on a label adhering firmly to the jar;

## or (c) In Ships in which a Sea-water Electrolizer is Installed,

capable of giving an unlimited quantity of sodium hypochlorite solution concapable of giving an unlimited quantity of sodium hypochlorite solution containing not less than 0.1 per cent. of available chlorine, the quantity of phenol or cresylic acid disinfectant carried may be reduced by not more than 50 per cent. The type of electrolizer must be approved by a Medical Inspector of Shipping and subject to inspection from time to time. A sample of electrolite will occasionally be taken for testing the chlorine content. The conditions and restrictions as to its purpose and use are the same as those for chloride of lime or hypochlorite solution in tins.

### III. THE STABILIZED CHLORIDE OF LIME PUT UP IN 1 LB. TINS

is intended to be used for sterilizing drinking water. Instructions for use will be found on pages 11-13 of the 1929 edition of the Ship Captain's Medical Guide. For conditions of approval see Appendix B.

PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

LENGTH OF VOYAGES—DIETARY SCALES—MEDICAL STORES.

WHEREAS by section 366 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894 of the United Kingdom it is provided that the Governor of a British Possession may by proclamation—

(a) determine what shall be deemed, for the purposes of Part III. of the said Merchant Shipping Act 1894, to be the Length of the Voyage of any ship carrying steerage passengers from any port in that British Possession to any other port;

(b) fix Dietary Scales for steerage passengers during the voyage; and

(c) declare what Medical Stores shall be deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the steerage passengers during the voyage;

And whereas by section 18 of the Interpretation Act 1889 of the United Kingdom the expression "British Possession" is defined as meaning any part of His Majesty's Dominions exclusive of the United Kingdom, and when parts of such Dominions are under both a central and a local legislature, all parts under the central legislature shall for the purposes of this definition, be deemed to be one British Possession:

And whereas the Commonwealth of Australia consists of parts of the British Dominions under both a central and a local legislature, and the said Commonwealth is accordingly a British Possession within the meaning of section 366 of the said Merchant Shipping Act 1894:

Now therefore I, John Lawrence, Baron Stonehaven, the Governor-General aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the said Merchant Shipping Act 1894 and all other powers me thereunto enabling—

(a) do hereby determine that for the purposes of Part III. of the said Merchant Shipping Act 1894, the length of the voyage of any ship carrying steerage passengers from any port in the said Commonwealth to any other port shall be as prescribed hereunder:—

And I declare that this Proclamation shall have effect as on and from the First day of July, 1926, and shall supersede any Proclamation heretofore issued under section 366 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1894 by the Governor of any State of the said Commonwealth.








