into operation upon the date of the commencement of the *Weights and  
Measures Ordinance 1932*.

### WEIGHTS AND MEASURES REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Weights and Measures Short title.  
Regulations*.

2. The application of the Regulations under the *Weights and  
Measures Act, 1915* of the State of New South Wales, as applied by the  
*Weights and Measures Ordinance 1932*, shall be subject to the following  
modifications, adaptations and exceptions:—

Modification,

(a) The regulations shall be read—

(i) as if the words "the date of the Regulations" were  
substituted for the words "6th July, 1917"  
(wherever occurring); and

(ii) as if the words "in pursuance of section 27 of the  
Ordinance during a period of five" were sub-  
stituted for the words "by section 31 of the Act  
during a period of twenty" (wherever  
occurring);

- (b) Regulation 2 of Part I. shall be read as if the following words were omitted:—  
“Part VIII.—Sale of Coal and Firewood.  
“Part IX.—Registration of Public Weighbridges and Licensing of Weighmen.”;
- (c) Regulation 3 of Part I. shall be read—  
(i) as if the words “First day of August, 1933,” were substituted for the words “first day of August, 1917”; and  
(ii) as if, at the end thereof, the following definition were inserted:—  
“the Ordinance” means the *Weights and Measures Ordinance* 1929-1933;
- (d) Regulation 1 of Part II. shall be read as if, after the words “Colonial Treasurer”, the words “of that State” were inserted:
- (e) Regulation 2 of Part III. shall be read as if, in sub-paragraph (4) of paragraph (e), the word “Ordinance” were substituted for the word “Act”;
- (f) Regulation 49 of Part IV. shall be read—  
(i) as if the following proviso were substituted for the proviso to sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph (e):—  
“Provided that, in the case of instruments stamped, in pursuance of the *Weights and Measures Act* 1898 of the State of New South Wales, prior to the first day of January, 1926, the instruments may be restamped if the knife edge shanks are firmly and securely fitted.”;  
(ii) as if the following proviso were substituted for the proviso to paragraph (g):—  
“Provided that instruments stamped in pursuance of the *Weights and Measures Act* 1898 of the State of New South Wales prior to the first day of January, 1926, may be restamped.”; and  
(iii) as if the following proviso were substituted for the words “and shall not take effect until the first day of January, 1926, or preclude the restamping thereafter of instruments stamped prior to such date if the indications of the instruments are clearly readable” in the proviso to sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph (j):—  
“: Provided further that instruments stamped in pursuance of the *Weights and Measures Act* 1898 of the State of New South Wales prior to the first day of January, 1926, may be restamped if the indications of the instruments are clearly readable.”;
- (g) Regulation 53 of Part IV. shall be read as if the following proviso were substituted for the proviso to paragraph (c):—  
“Provided that instruments stamped in pursuance of the *Weights and Measures Act* 1898 of the State of New South Wales prior to the first day of January, 1926, may be restamped.”;
- (h) Regulation 69 of Part IV. shall be read as if the following proviso were substituted for the proviso to paragraph (d):—  
“Provided that instruments stamped in pursuance of the *Weights and Measures Act* 1898 of the State of New South Wales prior to the first day of January, 1926, may be restamped.”;
- (i) Regulation 75 of Part IV. shall be read as if the following proviso were substituted for the proviso to paragraph (c):—  
“Provided that instruments stamped in pursuance of the *Weights and Measures Act* 1898 of the State of New South Wales prior to the first day of January, 1926 may be restamped.”;
- (j) Regulation 76A of Part IV. shall be read as if the following proviso were substituted for the proviso thereto:—  
“Provided that instruments stamped in pursuance of the *Weights and Measures Act* 1898 of the State of New South Wales prior to the first day of January, 1926 may be restamped.”;

- (k) The heading to regulation 89 of Part IV. shall be read as if the words "and Weighbridges" were omitted;
- (l) Regulations 91, 92 and 93 of Part IV. shall be read as if the words "or weighbridge" were omitted;
- (m) Regulations 94 to 97 (inclusive) of Part IV. are excepted;
- (n) Regulation 112 of Part IV. shall be read as if, after the word "Office," the word "Sydney" were inserted;
- (o) Regulation 115 of Part IV. shall be read as if the word "Superintendent's" were substituted for the word "metropolitan";
- (p) Regulation 117 of Part IV. shall be read as if the words "In the Metropolitan Weights and Measures District" and the proviso thereto were omitted;
- (q) Regulation 118 of Part IV. is excepted;
- (r) Regulation 121 of Part IV. shall be read—
  - (i) as if the words "Commonwealth or the Commonwealth Railways Commissioner" were substituted for the words "Railways Commissioners or other Government Department"; and
  - (ii) as if the words "Commonwealth or the Commissioner" were substituted for the words "Commissioners of such Department";
- (s) Regulation 122 of Part IV. shall be read as if the words "Act, Sections 30 (1) and 57 (p)" were omitted from the heading thereto;
- (t) Regulations 123 to 129 (inclusive) of Part IV. and the headings thereto are excepted;
- (u) Regulation 2 of Part V. shall be read as if the word "Ordinance" were substituted for the word "Act";
- (v) Part VI. shall be read as if the words "Act, section 57, sub-section (1)" in the heading thereto were omitted;
- (w) Regulation 1 of Part VI. shall be read as if the words "same meaning as in the *Public Health Ordinance* 1928-1930" were substituted for the words "meaning assigned thereto by the *Pure Foods Act*, No. 31, 1908, section 4";
- (x) Regulation 3 of Part VI. shall be read as if paragraph (a) were omitted;
- (y) Part VIA. shall be read as if the words "Act, section 25 sub-sections 1 and 4 (a)" in the heading thereto were omitted;
- (z) Regulation 1 of Part VIA. shall be read as if the words "sub-sections (1.) and (2.) of section 21 of the Ordinance" were substituted for the words "section 25, sub-sections (1) and (2) of the Act";
- (aa) Part VII. shall be read as if the words "Act, section 25 (3) and 57 (q)" in the heading thereto were omitted;
- (bb) Regulation 1 of Part VII. shall be read—
  - (i) as if the words "sub-section (3.) of section 21 of the Ordinance" were substituted for the words "The Act, section 25 (3)"; and
  - (ii) as if, in paragraph (d), the words "sub-section (1.) of section 19 of the Ordinance" were substituted for the words "section 23. (1) of the Act";
- (cc) Regulation 5 of Part VII. shall be read—
  - (i) as if the words "sub-section (3.) of section 21 of the Ordinance" were substituted for the words "section 25 (3) of the Act"; and
  - (ii) as if, after the words "*Fruit Cases Act*, No. 72, 1912", were inserted the words "of the State of New South Wales";
- (dd) Part VIII. and Part IX. of the Regulations are excepted;
- (ee) Regulation 1 of Part X. shall be read as if the words "twenty-one of the Ordinance" were substituted for the words "twenty-five of the Act";
- (ff) Regulations 3 and 4 of Part X. are excepted; and
- (gg) Table XII. of Part X. shall be read as if the words "Second Schedule to the Ordinance" were substituted for the words "Act, Schedule B".

### WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION REGULATIONS.

- Short title.** 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation Regulations.
- Interpretation.** 2.—(1.) In these Regulations "the Ordinance" means the *Workmen's Compensation Ordinance 1931-1933*.
- (2.) Any reference in these Regulations to a form shall be read as a reference to a form in the Schedule to these Regulations.
- Claim by employee.** 3. A claim by a workman for compensation under the Ordinance shall be made in accordance with Form A and shall be delivered or sent by post to the person against whom the claim is made.
- Claim by dependant.** 4. A claim by a dependant for compensation under the Ordinance shall be made in accordance with Form B and shall be delivered or sent by post to the person against whom the claim is made.
- Fees of medical referees.** 5. The fees payable to a medical practitioner or a medical referee shall be as follows:—

- Form of medical certificate.** 6. The medical practitioner or medical referee to whom any matter is referred shall give a certificate in accordance with Form C.
- Frequency of medical examinations.** 7. A workman shall not, after the expiration of one month from the date on which the first payment of compensation was made, be required to submit himself for medical examination pursuant to clause 9 of the First Schedule to the Ordinance except as follows:—
- At reasonable hours, once a week during the second month, and once a month during the third, fourth, fifth and sixth months after that first payment, and thereafter, once every two months.
- Employer not to give false particulars.** 8. Any employer who for the purpose of procuring the issue or renewal of a policy of insurance or indemnity supplies to an insurer any information which is false in a particular, or who wilfully fails to observe any of the terms of the policy or indemnity shall be guilty of an offence.
- Penalty: Fifty pounds.
- Provisions of insurance policy.** 9. Any insurer who issues a policy of insurance or indemnity to any employer in respect of that employer's liability under the Ordinance shall include in that policy all provisions determined by the Minister under sub-section (3.) of section seventeen of the Ordinance.
- Penalty: Fifty pounds.
- Compliance with forms.** 10. Strict compliance with the forms in the Schedule shall not be required and substantial compliance shall suffice for the purposes of these Regulations.

11. Declarations under these Regulations may be made before any Declarations.  
of the following persons:—

A postmaster or person in charge of a post office, a police or special magistrate, a justice of the peace, a barrister or solicitor, a school head teacher, a member of the police force, a legally qualified medical practitioner, a notary public, a commissioner for declarations, a minister of religion, or a member of Parliament.

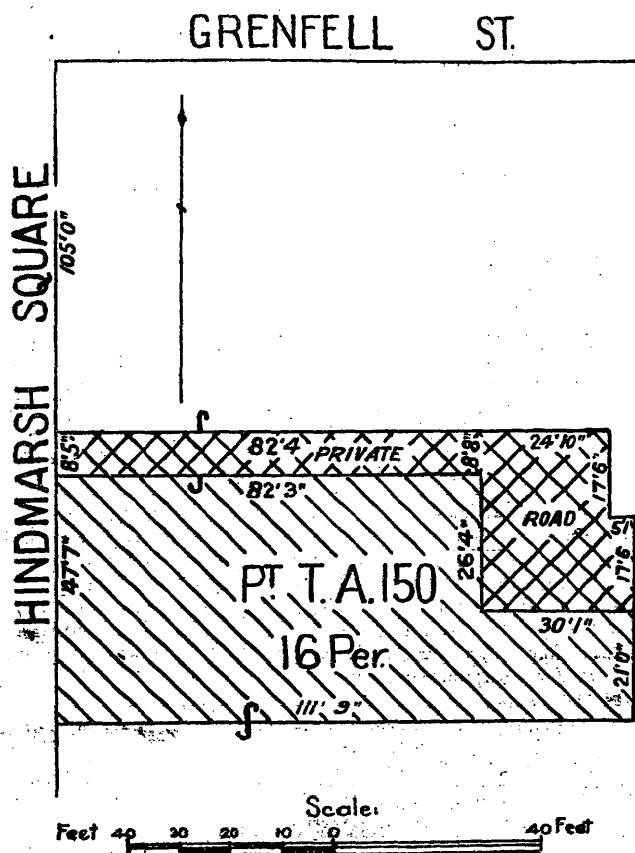
