THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

No. 9 of 1933.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Interpretation Ordinance 1931-1932.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Northern Territory Acceptance Act* 1910-1919, and the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act* 1910-1931, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Interpretation Ordinance* 1933.

(2.) The *Interpretation Ordinance* 1931-1932 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Interpretation Ordinance* 1931-1933.

Application of Acts Interpretation Acts to Ordinances.

2. Section four of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the figures and words "1901-1930 and sections one to eight and section eleven of the *Acts Interpretation Act* 1904-1930" and inserting in their stead the figures and words "1901-1932 (except section fifteen A) and sections one to eight inclusive, nine A and eleven of the *Acts Interpretation Act* 1904-1932".

3. After section sixteen of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

Disallowed regulation not to be re-made unless motion rescinded.

"16A.—(1.) Where in pursuance of section fifteen or section sixteen of this Ordinance, either House of the Parliament disallows any regulation, no regulation, being the same in substance as the regulation so disallowed, shall be made within six months after the date of the disallowance, unless the resolution disallowing the regulation has been rescinded by the House of the Parliament by which it was passed.

(2.) Any regulation made in contravention of this section shall be void and of no effect."

Where the employee is stationed in the locality mentioned in the first column of Table No. 6 hereunder, the employee shall be paid the rate mentioned in the sixth column of the said Table No. 6, and where the employee is performing any of the classes of work mentioned in the first column of Table No. 7, the employee shall also be paid the marginal difference prescribed in the third column of the said Table No. 7.”

By-law No. 61 is amended by omitting therefrom Clause 59 and inserting in its stead the following:—

“(1.) In this clause ‘quarter’ means a period of three calendar months ending the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, in each year.

“(2.) The rates prescribed in Table No. 6 of this By-law are the rates payable under this By-law until the fifth Saturday after the last day of the quarter ending on the 30th day of June, 1933. Thereafter there shall be substituted for the amounts specified in columns 3, 4 and 6 of Table No. 6 of this By-law amounts ascertained in the following manner.

“(3.) Ascertain the Retail Price Index Number under the “All Houses” Table for the last quarter of the year 1929 for Kalgoorlie and Port Augusta respectively (Namely 1579 and 1752) then ascertain the Index Number upon the “All Items” table for the whole year 1929 for the corresponding places (Namely 1032 and 1062 respectively) and equate these “All Items” Index Numbers to the aforesaid “All Houses” Index Numbers respectively. Then ascertain the corresponding “All Items” Index Number for the first quarter of the year 1933 for Kalgoorlie and Port Augusta (as to Port Augusta the Index Numbers inclusive of railway stores prices for bread, groceries and dairy produce) and adjust the aforesaid “All Houses” Index Numbers (Namely 1579 and 1752) according to the difference between the relevant “All Items” Index Numbers for the year 1929 (Namely 1032 and 1062) and the above-mentioned Index Numbers for the first quarter of the year 1933. The wage value of the Index Numbers arrived at by means of this adjustment of the aforesaid “All Houses” Index Numbers shall be as shown in the Table of Daily and Weekly Wages based on the Commonwealth Statistician’s Index Numbers containing divisions of 1d. per day and 6d. per week, as contained in sub-clause (5) of this clause. The “Powers 3s.” shall be adjusted in a similar way according to the difference between the above-mentioned “All Items” Index Numbers for the year 1929 (Namely 1032 and 1062) and those for the first quarter of the year 1933. In making these calculations if the first decimal reaches .5 or more the next higher unit figure shall be taken for the Index Number.

“(4.) Adjustments made in accordance with the last preceding sub-clause as from the fifth Sunday after the last day of the quarter ending on the 30th June, 1933, shall continue in force until the fifth Saturday after the end of September, 1933. Thereafter the amounts prescribed

in columns 3, 4 and 6 of Table No. 6 of this By-law shall be further adjusted quarterly as from the pay period next commencing after the fifth Saturday after the end of the months of September, December, March and June in the manner aforesaid according to the difference between the relevant "All Items" Index Numbers for the year 1929 (Namely 1032 and 1062) and the quarterly "All Items" Index Numbers for Kalgoorlie and Port Augusta (as to Port Augusta inclusive of Railway Stores prices for bread, groceries and dairy produce) last issued by the Commonwealth Statistician before the time hereby prescribed for any such adjustment.

"(5.) The following is the table of daily and weekly wages based on the Commonwealth Statistician's Index Numbers, referred to in sub-clause (3.) of this clause:—

Then ascertain the corresponding "All Items" Index Number for the first quarter of the year 1933 for Kalgoorlie and Port Augusta (as to Port Augusta the Index Numbers inclusive of railway stores prices for bread, groceries and dairy produce) and adjust the aforesaid "All Houses" Index Numbers (Namely 1579 and 1752) according to the difference between the relevant "All Items" Index Numbers for the year 1929 (Namely 1032 and 1062) and the abovementioned Index Numbers for the first quarter of the year 1933. The wage value of the Index Numbers arrived at by means of this adjustment of the aforesaid "All Houses" Index Numbers shall be as shown in the Table of Daily and Weekly Wages based on the Commonwealth Statistician's Index Numbers containing divisions of 1d. per day and 6d. per week, as contained in sub-clause (5.) of this clause. The "Powers 8s." shall be adjusted in a similar manner according to the difference between the abovementioned "All Items" Index Numbers for the year 1929 (Namely 1032 and 1062) and those for the first quarter of the year 1933. In making these calculations if the first decimal reaches .5 or more the next higher unit figure shall be taken for the Index Number.

"(4.) Adjustments made in accordance with the last preceding sub-clause as from the fifth Sunday after the last day of the quarter ending on the 30th June, 1933, shall continue in force until the fifth Saturday after the end of September, 1933. Thereafter the amounts prescribed in columns 3, 4 and 6 of Table "A" of this By-law shall be further adjusted quarterly as from the pay period next commencing after the fifth Saturday after the end of the months of September, December, March and June in the manner aforesaid according to the difference between the relevant "All Items" Index Numbers for the year 1929 (Namely 1032 and 1062) and the quarterly "All Items" Index Numbers for Kalgoorlie and Port Augusta (as to Port Augusta inclusive of railway stores prices for bread, groceries and dairy produce) last issued by the Commonwealth Statistician before the time hereby prescribed for any such adjustment."
