Commonwealth of Australia to wit. ISAAC A. ISAACS Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

HEREAS by section 103 of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1933, it is, amongst other things, provided that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, reserve for certain public purposes specified therein or for any other public purpose which he thinks fit, any unalienated Crown lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the purposes of a Slaughtering Reserve the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto being lands which are unalienated and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Schedule hereto being lands which are intariented and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:
Now therefore I, Sir Isaac Alfred Isaacs, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of a Slaughtering Reserve.

SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land in the Northern Territory near the Town of Stuart, containing an area of 50 acres or thereabouts; commencing at a point on the East bank of the Todd River and situate about 120 chains South South-easterly from Heavitree Gap; thence East about 35 chains; thence South about 20 chains; thence West about 15 chains to the East bank of the Todd River; thence North-westerly along the East bank of the Todd River to the point of commencement. ment.

Stuart be attached to the said Command from the thirty-first day of August, 1933, until further order, or until attached by order of the British Admiralty or of the Senior Officer of the said Command to any other Command of the King's Navy, and that during the time she is so attached to the said Command or to any other Command of the King's Navy, or is within the limits of any other Command, the Captain Officers and Men borne on the books of H.M.A.S. Stuart shall be subject to the orders of the British Admiralty and of the Senior Officer of the Command to which H.M.A.S. Stuart is for the time being attached or of the Command within the limits of which the ship is at the time, and other their superior Officers for His Majesty's Service, and to the laws and regulations of the King's Naval Forces so far as they are applicable. they are applicable.

AMENDMENT OF THE CROWN LANDS REGULATIONS.

1. Regulation 109 of the Crown Lands Regulations is repealed and the following regulation inserted in its stead:-

Form of grant.

"109.—(1.) A grant in fee-simple may "be in accordance with Form 22 or 23, as the case requires, or in such other form as the Governor-General thinks fit.

"(2.) A grant in fee-simple shall be prepared in duplicate and certified as correct by the Surveyor-General.".

Amendment of Schedule.

2. The Schedule to the Crown Lands Regulations is amended by omitting from Forms 7, 8, 9, 10, 14 and 15 the words "six per cent." and inserting in their stead the words "five per cent.".






