No. 25 of 1933.

## AN ORDINANCE

### Relating to Instruments and Securities.

B E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

#### PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Instruments Ordinance Short title. 1933.
- 2. This Ordinance shall commence on a date to be fixed by commencement. the Attorney-General by notice in the Gazette.
- 3.—(1.) The Bills of Sale Ordinance 1930 and the Bills of Repeal. Sale Ordinance 1931 are repealed.
- (2.) The Acts of the State of New South Wales specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance shall cease to apply to the Territory.

(3.) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section, any bill of sale, agreement or mortgage which at the commencement of this Ordinance is registered under any law referred to in this section, shall continue to be as valid and effectual, and the law under which it was registered shall continue to apply thereto, as if this Ordinance were not in force.

Parts.

- 4. This Ordinance is divided into Parts, as follows:

  - Part I.—Preliminary.
    Part II.—Administration.
    Part III.—Hills of Sale.

  - Part IV.—Liens on Crops.
  - Part V.-Liens on Wool and Stock Mortgages.
  - Part VI.—Miscellaneous.

Definitions

5. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears-"Registrar" means the Registrar of Securities and includes any Deputy Registrar of Securities appointed under this Ordinance.

#### PART II.—ADMINISTRATION.

Administration.

6. The Attorney-General shall be charged with the administration of this Ordinance.

Registrar and Deputy Registrars.

- 7.—(1.) For the purposes of this Ordinance, there shall be-
  - (a) a Registrar of Securities; and
  - (b) such Deputy Registrars of Securities and other officers as are necessary for carrying out this Ordinance.
- (2.) The Attorney-General may appoint any person to be a Registrar of Securities or a Deputy Registrar of Securities and, during any temporary vacancy in the office of Registrar, the Attorney-General may appoint any person to be an Acting Registrar of Securities.
- (3.) Any Acting Registrar so appointed shall have all the powers and perform all the duties of the Registrar.

#### PART 111.—BILLS OF SALE.

Definitions. N.S.W. No. 10, 1898, s. 3.

- 8.—(1.) In this Part, unless the contrary intention appears-
  - "Bill of sale" includes bills of sale, assignments, transfers, declarations of trusts without transfer, and other assurances of personal chattels, and also powers of attorney, authorities, and licences to take possession of personal chattels as security for any debt, but does not include the following documents, that is to say: -- Assignments for the benefit of the creditors of the person making or giving the assignments; marriage settlements; transfers or assignments of any ship or vessel, or any share thereof; transfers of goods in the ordinary course of business of any trade or calling; bills of sale of goods in foreign parts or at sea; bills of lading; India warrants; warehouse-keeper's certificates, warrants, or orders for the delivery of goods; or any other documents used in the ordinary course of business as proof of the possession or control of goods, or authorizing, or purporting to authorize, either by indorsement or by delivery, the possessor of the document to transfer or receive goods thereby represented;
  - Personal chattels" means goods, furniture, fixtures and other articles capable of complete transfer by delivery; but does not include chattel interests in real estate, or shares or interests in the stock, funds or securities of any Government, or in the capital or property of any incorporated or joint stock company, or choses in action, or any stock or produce upon any farm or lands which by virtue of any covenant or agreement, or of the custom of the country, ought not to be removed from any farm or lands where the stock or produce are at the time of making or giving of the bill of sale.

- (2.) For the purposes of this Part, unless the contrary intention appears, personal chattels shall be deemed to be in the "apparent possession" of the person making or giving a bill of sale, so long as they remain or are in or upon any house, mill, warehouse, building, works, yard, land or other premises occupied by him, or as they are used and enjoyed by him in any place whatsoever, notwithstanding that formal possession thereof has been taken by or given to any other person.
- 9.—(1.) Within thirty days after the making or giving of Bills of sale every bill of sale of personal chattels made after the commence unless for the commence whether with ment of this Ordinance, either absolutely or conditionally, whether subject or not to any trusts, and whereby the grantee or holder 16.5.4. has power either with or without notice, and either immediately or at any future time, to seize and take possession of any property and effects comprised in or made subject to the bill of sale, the bill of sale shall be registered by leaving in the office of the

(a) the bill of sale and every schedule or inventory which is thereto annexed or therein referred to, or a true copy thereof, and of every attestation of the execution thereof;

(b) a statutory declaration of the time of the bill of sale being made or given;

(c) a description of the residence and occupation of the person making or giving the bill of sale, or a description of the residence and occupation of the person against whom the process has issued in case the bill of sale is made or given by any person under or in the execution of any process; and

(d) a description of the residence and occupation of every attesting witness to the bill of sale.

- (2.) In default of registration in accordance with the provisions of this section, the bill of sale shall, as against-
  - (a) the official receiver or trustee in bankruptcy, where a sequestration order is made against the grantor in pursuance of the Bankruptcy Act 1924-1932, and all assignees or trustees of the estate and effects of the person whose goods or any of them are comprised in the bill of sale, under any assignment for the benefit of the oreditors of that person; and

(b) all sheriff's officers and other persons seizing any property or effects comprised in the bill of sale, in the execution of the process of any court authorizing the seizure of the goods of the person by whom or of whose goods the bill of sale has been made; and

- (c) every person on whose behalf the process has been issued, be null and void, to all intents and purposes whatsoever, so far as regards the property in, or right to the possession of, any personal chattels comprised in the bill of sale, which at or after the date of the sequestration order, or the time of the execution by the debtor of the assignment for the benefit of his creditors, or of executing the process (as the case may be), and after the expiration of the period of thirty days referred to in the last preceding sub-section are in the possession or apparent possession of the person making the bill of sale, or of any person against whom the process has issued under or in the execution of which the bill of sale has been made or given, as the case may be.
- 10. If the bill of sale is made or given, subject to any defeasance of condition of condition of condition of trust not contained in the body condition of thereof, the defeasance or condition or declaration of trust shall, written on for the purposes of this Ordinance, be taken as part of the bill the same part of sala and shall be with the same part of the bill the b of sale, and shall be written on the same paper on which 1898, s. 0. the bill of sale is written before the time when the bill of sale is registered, otherwise the bill of sale shall be null and void to all intents and purposes as against the same persons, and as regards the same property and effects, as if the bill of sale had not been registered according to the provisions of this Ordinance.

Registrar to keep a book containing particulars of each bill of sale. Ib. s. 10.

- 11.—(1.) The Registrar shall cause every bill of sale, and every schedule and inventory and every copy of a bill of sale, schedule or inventory left in his office under the provisions of this Ordinance to be numbered.
- (2.) The Registrar shall keep a book or index, in which he shall cause to be inserted as and when any bill of sale or copy thereof is left for registration, the name, addition, and description of the person making or giving the bill of sale, or, in case the bill of sale is made or given by any person under or in the execution of any process, the name, addition and description of the person against whom the process has issued, as the case may be, and also of the persons to whom or in whose favour the bill of sale has been given or transferred, but containing no further particulars thereof.

A bill of sale to have no effect as to certain household furniture unless consent of wife or husband of maker or giver endorsed thereon. N.S.W. No. 12, 1903, s. 2. 12. Where, at the time any person makes or gives a bill of sale, that person is married and living with his or her wife or husband, and the bill of sale comprises any household furniture, the bill of sale shall not be enforced by seizure or sale of any such furniture as then is actually in use by the person making or giving the bill of sale or his or her wife or husband, as the case may be, unless at the time of execution it is endorsed in the manner and according to the form contained in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance by the wife or husband of the maker or giver of the bill of sale, and the endorsement is attested by the Registrar, a solicitor of the High Court, a Justice of the Peace or a Commissioner for Declarations appointed under the Statutory Declarations Act 1911-1922.

Provided that this section shall have no effect after the death of the wife or husband, or if, after the making or giving of the bill, the husband and wife live apart pursuant to a decree, order, or deed of separation, or if a decree for the dissolution or nullity of their marriage has been made.

Bill of sale transferable by writing. Vic. No. 3706., ss. 62, 74.

- 13.—(1.) A bill of sale shall be transferable by writing, and every transferee thereof may bring every such action thereupon or in respect thereof in his own name, and shall have and may exercise the same right, title and interest, powers and authorities as the original grantee could have brought, would have had or might have exercised if no transfer had been made by him.
- (2.) The Registrar, if required so to do, shall register any such transfer by noting in the book or index kept in pursuance of section eleven of this Ordinance the name, addition and description of the transferee, and the date of the execution of the transfer.

Discharge of bill of sale. N.S.W. No. 17, 1919, s. 2.

- 14.—(1.) A bill of sale may be discharged, or partly discharged, by a receipt indorsed on the bill of sale, or copy thereof, held by the grantee or person claiming through him, in accordance with the form set out in Part I. of the Third Schedule to this Ordinance, or to the like effect.
- (2.) If the Registrar is satisfied that a bill of sale, or copy, held by the grantee or person claiming through him, for some good reason cannot be produced, the bill of sale may be discharged or partly discharged by a receipt in accordance with the form in Part II. of the Fourth Schedule to this Ordinance.
- (3.) The signature to any such receipt shall be witnessed by a solicitor of the High Court or by a Justice of the Peace, or by a Commissioner for Declarations appointed under the Statutory Declarations Act 1911-1922.
- (4.) The Registrar, if required so to do, and if satisfied that the receipt for the money is duly acknowledged, shall register any such discharge or part discharge by noting the receipt upon the bill of sale or copy registered.

Not to affect liens on crops, wool, &c. N.S.W. No. 10, 15. Nothing in this Part shall affect or apply to any liens on crops, liens on wool or mortgages on sheep, cattle, and horses registered in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

#### PART IV.-LIENS ON CROPS.

16. In this Part, unless the contrary intention appears

"agricultural produce" includes wheat, maize, sorghum, Definitions. barley, oats, lucerne, and grass, whether for hay or 1898, s. 3. grain, and other agricultural produce;

"horticultural produce" means fruit of any kind.

17. In all cases where any person makes any bona fide advance Lien on yearly crops of money or goods to any holder of land on condition of receiving bearing to see the second s as security for the advance the growing crop or crops of agricultural or horticultural produce on any such land, and where the agreement relating to the security is made in accordance with or to the effect of the form in the Fourth Schedule to this Ordinance, and purports on the face of it to have been made as security for the advance, and is duly registered within thirty days after the date of the agreement, by leaving in the office of the Registrar a true copy thereof duly verified by statutory declaration, the person making the advance, whether before, at, or after the date of the agreement, shall have a preferable lien upon, and be entitled to the whole of the crop and the whole produce thereof, and the possession thereof by the lienor shall be to all intents and purposes in the law the possession of the lience, and when the advance is repaid with interest specified in the agreement the possession and property of the crop shall revert to and vest in the lienor.

18. No such lien duly made and registered shall be extinguished Lien no affected or otherwise prejudicially affected by the death of the lienor, or sa by any sale or mortgage of, or other incumbrance upon the land 10.8.5. on which any such crop is growing; and if the lienor, his executors, administrators, or assigns, neglects or refuses either to pay off the whole of the advance with interest as agreed upon, or to give up the crop to the lience thereof in pursuance of the agreement, the lience, his executors, administrators, or assigns, may enter into possession of the crop, and may gather, and carry away and sell the crop, and may apply the proceeds in paying himself the advance, with interest as agreed upon, and all expenses of gathering, carrying away, making marketable, and selling any such crop, and shall pay the balance to the lienor, his executors, administrators, or assigns.

19.—(1.) If the lienor be a leascholder then the lienee shall, Lienee to pa before selling any such crop, pay to the landlord of the land land before whereon the crop is growing such sum of money not exceeding one selling crop. N.S.W. No. 7. year's rent as is due to him for rent at the time of carrying away 1898, s. 6. the crop, and the lience may repay himself the sum so paid out of the proceeds of the sale of the crop before paying over the balance to the lienor.

- (2.) For the purposes of this section-
  - "leaseholder" includes a person holding land under a lease from the Commonwealth, and a person to whom land is sub-let:
  - "landlord of the land", where the leaseholder holds the land under a lease from the Commonwealth, means the Commonwealth, and, where he is a sub-lessee, means the person by whom the land is sub-let.
- 20. - 21.—(1.) A lien under this Part shall be transferable by writing, and every transferee thereof may bring every such action thereupon or in respect thereof in his own name, and shall have and may exercise the same right, title and interest, powers and authorities as the original lience could have brought, would have had or might have exercised if no transfer had been made by him.
- (2.) The Registrar, if required so to do, shall register any such transfer by noting in the register kept in pursuance of the next succeeding section the name, addition and description of the transferee, and the date of the execution of the transfer.

List in registry open to inspection. N.S.W. No. 7, 1898, s. 8. 22. The Registrar shall keep a separate alphabetical register of all agreements referred to in section seventeen of this Ordinance.

Duration of lien.
Ib. s. 9.

23. A lien under this Part shall not continue in force for more than one year from the date thereof, and the Registrar, at the request of both parties, shall at any time enter satisfaction thereon.

Penalties for frauds on lienee.

Ib. s. 10.

24. Any lienor, whether principal or agent, who, by sale or delivery of any crop affected by the lien, or of any part thereof, without the written consent of the lienee, or by any other means defrauds the lienee of the crop or the value thereof, or any part thereof, and thus or by any means directly or indirectly defeats, invalidates, or impairs his right of property in the crop, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding three times the amount of the loss thereby sustained, or to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three years.

#### PART V.—LIENS ON WOOL AND STOCK MORTGAGES.

Right of lience to wool as security or in payment. Ib. s. 11.

25. In all cases where any person makes any bona fide advance of money or goods, or gives any valid promissory note or bill to any proprietor of sheep on condition of receiving in payment or as security only for the money, goods, promissory note, or bill, as the case may be, the wool of the then next ensuing clip of the proprietor, and where the agreement relating to the purchase or security is made in accordance with or to the effect of the form in the Fifth Schedule to this Ordinance, and purports on the face of it to have been made in payment or as security for the advance, and is duly registered within thirty days after the date of the agreement by leaving in the office of the Registrar a true copy thereof, duly verified by statutory declaration, the person making the purchase or advance shall be entitled to the whole of the wool mentioned in the agreement, whether the advance of money or goods, or of the note or bill is made before, at, or after the granting of any such preferable lien; and the possession of the wool by the proprietor shall be, to all intents and purposes in the law, the possession of the person making the purchase or advance; and when the advance is repaid, with such interest and commission as is specified in any such agreement, the possession and property of the wool shall revest in the proprietor.

Right of lience to ensuing clip of wool. N.S.W. No 7, 1898, s. 12.

- 26.—(1.) Where any person makes any bona fide purchase or advance, as mentioned in the last preceding section, the preferable lien of the lience making the purchase or advance on the wool of the next ensuing clip of the proprietor shall not be in any way extinguished, suspended, impaired, or otherwise prejudicially affected by any subsequent sale, mortgage, or other incumbrance whatsoever of the sheep mentioned and described in the registered agreement relating to any such preferable lien, but shall be as valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsover against any such subsequent purchaser, mortgagee, incumbrancer, or other claimant or possessor of the sheep, as against the original proprietor thereof who granted the preferable lien.
- (2.) If any such lienor, subsequent mortgagee, or incumbrancer, or other claimant or possessor of the sheep neglects or refuses to shear and deliver the wool of any sheep for which any such preferable lien has been granted in pursuance of the provisions in that behalf contained in the registered agreement, the

lience, his executors, administrators, or assigns may take possession of the sheep bearing the wool, for the purpose of washing and shearing the sheep; and all expenses attending the washing and shearing and conveyance of the wool to the place of abode of the lience shall be incorporated with and be deemed in law part of the amount secured by the lien.

27. Any mortgage of sheep, cattle, and horses, which, after the Right of commencement of this Ordinance, is made bona fide and for although valuable consideration, and the names of the parties to which and mortgag the particulars of which are duly registered within thirty days 16. s. 18. after the date thereof in the office of the Registrar in accordance with the form in the Sixth Schedule to this Ordinance shall be valid in the law to all intents and purposes whether the money secured by the mortgage is payable presently or not, and notwithstanding that the mortgaged live-stock are not delivered over to the mortgagee but remain and continue in every respect, as theretofore, in the possession, order, and disposition of the mortgagor.

28. Any mortgagor of sheep may, with the consent in writing Mortgagor of of the mortgagee thereof, but not without that consent, make and sheep may consent of give a valid lien on the next ensuing clip of the wool of those mortgagee give

29.—(1.) A lien on wool or a mortgage of sheep, cattle, or liens on wool horses shall be transferable by writing, and every transfered transferable thereof may bring every such action thereupon or in respect thereof by write in his own name, and shall have and may exercise the same right, Vic. No. 3706, title and interest, powers and authorities as the original lience or mortgagee could have brought, would have had or might have exercised if no transfer had been made by him.

(2.) The Registrar, if required so to do, shall register any such transfer by noting in the appropriate registry kept in pursuance of the next succeeeding section the name, addition and description of the transferee, and the date of the execution of the transfer.

30. The Registrar shall keep a separate and distinct registry Particulars of from year to year of all agreements for purchases of wool or by Registrar. advances thereon as mentioned in section twenty-five of this 1898, s. 16. Ordinance, and shall also keep a separate and distinct registry of the particulars of all mortgages of sheep, cattle, and horses, as mentioned in section twenty-seven of this Ordinance.

31. At the end of twelve months next after the expiration of Cancelling of liens. the year for which any preferable lien on wool has been given N.S.W. No. 7, in pursuance of this Ordinance, the Registrar may remove from 1898, s. 17. the records of his office that preferable lien, and may destroy or cancel the lien, or at any time, at the request of both parties to any such preferable lien, may enter satisfaction on the lien.

32. In every case where the amount of principal and interest, Registration or of the balance of principal and interest due upon any mortgage of satisfacti of sheep, cattle, or horses is paid to the person entitled to receive 16. s. 18. it, or his agent in that behalf, and a receipt in writing for the amount so paid is given, signed by the person so entitled, or by his agent acknowledging the payment to be in satisfaction of the mortgage, the mortgagor, his executors, administrators, or assigns may cause a copy of the receipt, duly verified by affidavit, to be registered in the office of the Registrar, on production to him of the original receipt and of the mortgage deed to which the receipt relates; and from and after the time of the registration of the verified receipt the payment shall operate as an extinction of the mortgage, and of the right and interest thereby created, to all intents and purposes whatsoever, but without prejudice to any previous sale, or any conveyance in pursuance thereof, under the mortgage deed, and without prejudice to any second or subsequent mortgage affecting the same stock or any part thereof then duly registered, unless every party thereto, by writing under his hand at the foot of the receipt, has signified his assent to the registration of the receipt.

33. Nothing in this Part shall be construed to affect in any Saving of 33. Nothing in this Part shall be construed to affect in any rights of the Commonwealth as to any of the lands of the Commonwealth described in any such lien or mortgage to which this Part relates as the lands or stations where any sheep, horses, or cattle, the subject of the lien or mortgage, are depasturing.

Frauds by lienor, mortgagor or other person. Th. s. 20.

- 34,—(1.) Any grantor of any preferable lien on wool under this Part, whether the grantor is principal or agent, who afterwards sells or delivers to any purchaser, pawnee, or other person, the wool under any such lien without the written consent of the lienee, or sells, steams, or boils down, or causes to be sold, steamed, or boiled down, without that written consent, the sheep whereon the wool is growing, with a view to defraud the lienee of the wool or the value thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 2.) Any mortgagor of sheep, cattle, or horses, and their increase and progeny under this Part, whether the mortgagor is principal or agent, who, after the due execution and registry of any such mortgage, without the written consent of the mortgagee, sells and disposes of, or steams or boils down, or causes to be sold and disposed of, or to be steamed or boiled down, any sheep, cattle, or horses, or their increase or progeny, mentioned or described in any such mortgage, shall be guilty of an offence.
- (3.) Any grantor of any preferable lien under this Part, or any mortgagor of sheep, cattle, or horses, and their increase and progeny under this Part, whether principal or agent, who in any way, or by any means whatever or howsoever, directly or indirectly, destroys, defeats, invalidates, or impairs, or any other person who wilfully and knowingly incites, aids, or abets any such grantor or mortgagor, directly or indirectly, to defeat, destroy, invalidate or impair the right of property of any lienee in the wool of any sheep mentioned and described in any agreement registered under this Part, or the right of property of any such mortgagee in any sheep, cattle, or horses, or their increase and progeny, mentioned in any mortgage duly executed and registered under this Part, shall be gailty of an offence.
- (4.) The penalty for any offence under this section shall be a fine not exceeding three times the amount of the loss thereby sustained, or imprisonment for any period not exceeding five years, or both such fine and imprisonment.

#### PART VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

Index of bills of sale, &c., registered under cause to be inserted such particulars as are prescribed of all bills state Acts. of sale, agreements and mortgages referred to in sub-section (3.) of section three of this Ordinance.

Search of registers. &c.

- 36.—(1.) Any person shall have access to any book, index or register kept in pursuance of this Ordinance, and may search any such book, index or register during the usual hours of business upon paying the prescribed fee for each search.
- 2.) Any person shall, upon paying the prescribed fee for each office copy or extract, be entitled to have an office copy or extract of any instrument or document lodged or left in the office of the Registrar in pursuance of this Ordinance.

Fees.

- 37.—(1.) There shall be paid to the Registrar in respect of the several matters specified in the Seventh Schedule to this Ordinance the fees in that Schedule mentioned or such other fees in substitution therefor as are prescribed.
- (2.) The registration of any bill of sale, lien or mortgage, or of any transfer, discharge, or satisfaction thereof shall not be completed or effectual unless and until the prescribed fees respectively payable in respect of the registration have been paid.

Regulations

38. The Attorney-General may make regulations, not inconsistent with this Ordinance, prescribing all matters which by this Ordinance are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which

are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for giving effect to this Ordinance, and in particular for prescribing matters providing for and in relation to-

(a) the fees payable for the registration under this Ordinance of any instrument, or document or of any particulars;

(b) the fees payable for any search made in any book, index or register kept in pursuance of this Ordinance;

(c) the fees payable for any office copy or extract of any instrument or document lodged or left in the office of the Registrar in pursuance of this Ordinance.

## AN ORDINANCE

## To amend the Real Property Ordinance 1925-1930.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Real Property Ordinance 1933.
- (2.) The Real Property Ordinance 1925-1930 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Real Property Ordinance* 1925-1933.

2.—(1.) Section three of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting, after the word "Act," (last occurring), the words "or which is deemed to be under the provisions of that Act,".

(2.) This section shall be deemed to have commenced on the date of the commencement of the Real Property Ordinance 1925.

3. Section thirty-eight of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting, after the word "is" the words "or is deemed to be".

4. Section one hundred and twenty-eight of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the word "Act" and inserting in its stead the word "law".

Repeal.

Land registered under Real Property Act 1900 of New South Wales brought under Ordinance. Registrar to carry out order of Court vesting trust

5. After section one hundred and thirty-eight of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted in Part XIV.

"138A.—(1.) Where any land, estate or interest under the pro- Appointment of new orl visions of this Ordinance is held by a trustee, either solely or jointly additional trustees. with other trustees, and-

(a) the trustee vacates his office and a new trustee is appointed in his place or the vacancy is not filled; or

(b) an additional trustee is appointed to hold the land, estate or interest jointly with the existing trustees, the Registrar, upon receipt of the instrument effecting the vacancy or appointing the new or additional trustee, or of an office copy

thereof, or of a copy thereof verified by affidavit, or upon production of such other evidence as the Registrar thinks sufficient, and upon being satisfied that the vacation of office or the new or additional appointment, as the case may be, is in accordance with law, shall, subject to this Ordinance, enter in the Register Book upon the folium constituted by the grant or certificate of title of the land effected and on such instruments as he thinks fit, a memorandum setting forth the fact of the vacation of the office or of the new or additional appointment, as the case may require.

(2.) Upon the entry being made the continuing trustees, or the continuing trustees and the new or additional frustee, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be the registered proprietors of the land, estate or interest, and as such to be subject to the provisions of this Ordinance as if they were the trustees originally registered

as proprietors of the land, estate or interest.

"(3.) For the purposes of this section 'trustee' includes an assignee or trustee of a bankrupt or insolvent registered proprietor, and an executor or administrator of the estate of a deceased proprietor.".

6. Section one hundred and forty-one of the Principal Percentage to be levied ordinance is amended by adding at the end of sub-section (1.) the registration of a transfer. following proviso:-

" Provided that in the case of-

(a) a transfer not made for valuable consideration and made to a beneficiary by a trustee in conformity with the trusts contained in a memorandum of transfer, or a declaration of trust executed in conjunction with a memorandum of transfer, in respect of which such fees have been paid as would have been payable if the transfer had been made direct to the beneficiary;

(b) a transfer made or executed bona fide by way of completion or confirmation of title whereby no greater benefit, legal or equitable, accrues to the person in whose favour the transfer is made or executed than he originally had or was entitled to have by virtue of some other instrument in respect to which the fees payable under this Ordinance have been paid;

(c) an instrument of appointment made in favour of persons specially named or described as the objects of a power of appointment contained in a memorandum of transfer in respect of which the fees payable under

this Ordinance have been paid; or (d) a transfer whereby the apparent purchaser of property that is vested in him upon trust for the person who was the real purchaser, and who has actually paid the purchase money therefor, transfers the same to the real purchaser,

the fee payable for the registration of the memorandum of transfer or instrument of appointment shall be One pound".

7. The Eighteenth Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is Eighteenth Schedule. amended by adding at the end thereof the words-

"For entering memorandum of fact of vacation of office of trustee or appointment of new or additional

To amend the Leases Ordinance 1918-1927, as amended by the Leases Ordinance 1933, and to amend the Leases Ordinance 1933.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Leases Ordinance* (No. 2) 1933.
- (2.) The Leases Ordinance 1918-1927, as amended by the Leases Ordinance 1933, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) Sub-section (3.) of section one of the Leases Ordinance 1933 is repealed.
- (4.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Leases Ordinance* 1918-1933.

Determination of rent.

- 2. Section three AA of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
  - (a) by omitting sub-section (4.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-sections:—
    - "(4.) Where an objection is so forwarded, the Commissioner shall review the determination which, for the purposes of the review, shall be deemed to be a decision of the Minister within the meaning of section six of the Land Commissioner Ordinance 1933.
    - "(4A.) The Commissioner, on review, shall make a recommendation to the Minister, and shall forward the recommendation, together with the evidence tendered at the hearing, to the Minister; and
  - (b) by omitting from sub-section (5.) the words ", in pursuance of sub-section (4.) of section six of the Land Commissioner Ordinance 1933,".

Reduction of rent and relief from conditions.

- 3. After section three AA of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—
- "3AB.—(1.) The Minister may, in respect of any period, whether commencing before, at or after the commencement of this section, or whether commencing before, at or after the giving of the approval, approve of—
  - (a) the reduction of the rent payable under a lease or a tenancy, or of the amount payable in respect of any occupation of land; or
  - (b) the grant of relief, to a lessee, tenant or occupier of land, from compliance, wholly or in part, with any covenant or condition to which his lease, tenancy or occupation is subject,

and thereupon the liability and obligation of the lessee, tenant or occupier under the lease or tenancy or in respect of his occupation shall, in respect of that period, be discharged to the extent of the reduction or grant of relief approved.

"(2.) Any grant of relief approved in pursuance of the last preceding sub-section may be absolute or subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit.

"(3.) Except in cases to which the next succeeding section applies, the Minister shall send by post or deliver or cause to be sent by post or delivered to the lessee, tenant or occupier, a memorandum specifying the reduction or the grant of relief approved by the Minister, and any such memorandum which purports to be signed by the Minister or by the Secretary to the Department of the Interior or by the Assistant Secretary, Property and Survey Branch, Department of the Interior, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts stated therein.

"3AC.—(1.) Where the Minister grants a lease he may, by the Discharge from liabilities grant, and either absolutely or subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, fully discharge the lessee, from all liabilities and obligations which the lessee may have incurred in respect of any prior occupation of the leased land or portion of the leased land.

- "(2.) For the purposes of this section, the lessee shall be deemed to have been so discharged if the grant contains an acknowledgment by the lessee of his indebtedness in a specified sum in respect of the prior occupation, and an agreement or covenant by the lessee to pay the sum so specified, notwithstanding that that sum be less than the amount of his total liability, obligation or indebtedness in respect of the prior occupation.
  - 4. Section four of the Leases Ordinance 1933 is amended-

Validation of prior leases.

(a) by omitting from sub-section (1.) all words after the words "that lease" and inserting in their stead the words "shall be deemed to be, and shall at all times be deemed to have been, as valid and effectual for all purposes as if this Ordinance had been in force at the time the Minister or the Federal Capital Commission, as the case may be, granted or purported to grant the lease, and the provisions of section three AA of the Leases Ordinance 1918-1933 shall, subject to this section, apply in relation to that lease and to any determination made or purporting to have been made under or by virtue of any such condition or agreement:

Provided that with respect to any such determination made or purporting to have been made before the commencement of this section the proviso to subsection (1.) and sub-sections (2.) and (3.) of section three AA of the Leases Ordinance 1918-1933 shall not apply, but the lessee may, within one month after the commencement of this Ordinance, or, with the approval of the Minister, at any time lodge with the Minister an objection in writing against any such

determination."; and

(b) by omitting sub-section (2.) and inserting in its stead

the following sub-sections:-

"(2.) The Minister shall forward the objection to the Commissioner appointed under the Land Commissioner Ordinance 1933 and the Commissioner shall review the determination which, for the purposes of the review, shall be deemed to be a decision of the Minister within the meaning of section six of the LandCommissioner Ordinance 1933.

"(2A.) The Commissioner, on review, shall make a recommendation to the Minister, and shall forward the recommendation, together with the evidence tendered at the hearing, to the Minister."; and

(c) by omitting from sub-section (3.) the words ", in pursuance of sub-section (4.) of section six of the Land Commissioner Ordinance 1933.".

Appeals by lessees.

- 2. Section six of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
  - (a) by omitting sub-section (2.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:—

"(2.) The lessee may within one month after the notice of the Minister's decision is delivered to, or served on, him—

(a) if the original offer is not varied by the decision, accept that offer;

(b) if the original offer is varied by the decision, accept that offer as so varied; or

(c) request the Minister to refer the decision to the Commissioner for review.";

(b) by inserting in sub-section (3.) after the word "lessee" the words "in person or by his counsel, solicitor or agent,";

(c) by adding at the end of sub-section (3.) the words "and may examine or cross-examine any witness on any matter which the Commissioner deems relevant to the inquiry, and any witness so examined or cross-examined shall have the same protection and be subject to the same liabilities as if examined by the Commissioner";

(d) by omitting sub-section (5.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:—

"(5,) The Minister shall within one month after the receipt of the recommendation of the Commissioner notify the lessee by notice in writing delivered to, or served by post on the lessee, either—

(a) that the decision has not been varied; or

(b) that the decision has been varied to the extent specified in the notice,

as the case may be.

"(6.) The lessee may within one month after the notice referred to in the last preceding sub-section is delivered to, or served on, him accept the original offer, or that offer as varied by the decision or by the decision as varied, as the case may be."

#### No. 6 of 1933.

## AN ORDINANCE

### Relating to the Exportation of Fruit.

E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Norfolk Island Act 1913, as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Exportation of Fruit short stde. Ordinance 1933.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears - Definitions.

"appointed place" means a place appointed by the Administrator in pursuance of section six of this Ordinance to be a place where fruit intended for export may be inspected and examined by an inspector or brought for shipment;

"approved stamp" means the stamp approved by the Minister in pursuance of section eight of this

"Collector" means the Collector of Customs, Norfolk

Island;

- "disease" means any disease affecting plants or fruits which the Administrator by notice posted at or near to the Court House, Norfolk Island, declares to be a disease within the meaning of the Plant and Fruit Diseases Ordinance 1928;
- "fruit" means any edible product of a plant which the Administrator declares, pursuant to section four of this Ordinance, to be fruit for the purposes of this Ordinance, and includes the peel, skin, pulp, juice or shell of any such fruit whether fresh or canned;

"inspector" means an Inspector of Fruit appointed under this Ordinance;

"ship" includes any description of vessel, launch, boat, lighter or other craft used in navigation by sea.

3.—(1.) For the purposes of this Ordinance the Administrator Appointment of may appoint any person to be an inspector.

- (2.) Every appointment made under this section shall be notified in the Gazette.
- 4.—(1.) The Administrator may, by notice posted at or near Administrator may prohibit to the Court House, Norfolk Island-

(a) declare the edible product of any plant to be fruit for

the purposes of this Ordinance; and

- (b) prohibit the export from Norfolk Island of any fruit unless it has been first passed for export by an inspector and marked by him with the approved stamp.
- (2.) All notices made by the Administrator under this section shall be notified in the Gazette.
- 5.—(1.) Any fruit or case, package, container or covering Forfeiture of fruit not pas containing fruit not passed for export by an inspector and not for export. marked by him with the approved stamp, which is exported or placed on board any ship for export, may be detained and seized by the Collector.
- (2.) Any fruit, case, package, container or covering containing fruit detained and seized under this section shall be forfeited to the King and may be sold or otherwise disposed of as directed by the Administrator.

Appointed places.

6. The Administrator may, by notice posted at or near to the Court House, Norfolk Island, appoint any place to be a place where fruit intended for export may be inspected and examined by an inspector or brought for shipment.

Inspection of fruit.

7. All fruit intended for export shall be submitted to an inspector for inspection and examination at an appointed place within such time before shipment as is prescribed.

Approved stamp.

8. There shall be a stamp of such design as is approved by the Minister.

Marking of packages for export. 9. Any person who exports any fruit or case, package, container or covering containing fruit from Norfolk Island which fruit has not been passed for export by an inspector and marked by him with the approved stamp shall be guilty of an offence.

Prohibition of export of unfit or improperly packed fruit.

10. Subject to the regulations, the approved stamp shall not be applied to any fruit or case, package, container or covering containing fruit where, in the opinion of an inspector, the fruit is infected with disease or is not in a condition suitable for export by reason of size, faulty grading, bad or improper packing, or other causes.

Applying unauthorized impression of approved stamp to fruit or cases, &c. 11. Any person who applies to any fruit or case, package, container or covering containing fruit intended for export, or brought to any appointed place for the purpose of export, an unauthorized impression of the approved stamp, or any impression of a stamp so nearly resembling the approved stamp as to be likely to deceive, shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

Marking of fruit for export. 12. Any fruit which has been passed for export by an inspector in pursuance of this Ordinance or any case, package, container or covering containing any such fruit may be marked by the inspector with the approved stamp.

Issue of export permit.

13. An export permit in accordance with the Form in the Schedule shall be issued by the inspector in all cases in which the provisions of this Ordinance have been complied with.

Export permit to be delivered.

14. The export permit shall be delivered by the exporter to the person authorized by the Administrator to receive export permits at an appointed place.

Powers of inspector.

15. An inspector may—

(a) board any ship,

(b) enter any wharf, landing place or establishment,

(c) open any package, and

(d) do all things necessary to enable him to carry out his powers and duties under this Ordinance.

Inspection fees,

16. There shall be paid to the Collector in respect of the inspection of fruit intended for export such fees as are prescribed.

Penalty.

17. Any person who commits an offence against this Ordinance shall, where no other penalty is provided, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Regulations.

- 18. The Minister may make regulations, not inconsistent with this Ordinance, prescribing all matters which by this Ordinance are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to this Ordinance, and in particular providing for and in relation to—
  - (a) the packing, conditions of preparation and grade standards of fruit intended for export;

(b) the inspection of fruit;

(c) the grading certification and marking of fruit;

- (d) the taking of samples of fruit inspected by an inspector and the analysis thereof;
- (e) the application of the approved stamp to fruit, cases, packages, containers and coverings; and

(f) the fixing of penalties not exceeding Twenty pounds for breaches of the Regulations.
