PROCLAMATION.

Commonwealth of
Australia to wit.
HUNTINGFIELD
Deputy of the
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Deputy of
the Governor-General in and over
the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by sub-section (3) of section sixteen of the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910-1933* it is provided *inter alia* that where any law which is continued in force in the Northern Territory of Australia by virtue of that section is a law of the State of South Australia, any power or function which by that law is vested in the Governor of that State, shall be vested in and exercised or performed by the Governor-General or as the Governor-General directs:

And whereas the *Prisons Act 1869* and the *Prisons Act 1905* of the State of South Australia are continued in force in the Northern Territory of Australia:

And whereas by virtue of the *Prisons Act 1869* and the *Prisons Act 1905*, the Governor-General was, by Proclamation dated the tenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, pleased—

- (a) to revoke the Proclamation dated the fifth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine proclaiming and directing that the buildings and premises known as the Police Stations at Anthony Lagoon and Katherine in North Australia shall be public gaols, prisons and houses of correction;
- (b) to proclaim and direct the buildings and premises known as the Police Station situate at Borroloola in North Australia to be a public gaol, prison and house of correction; and

- (c) to appoint the police station situate at Katherine in North Australia, and any premises thereunto appertaining, to be a police prison:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said Proclamation dated the tenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty:

Now therefore I, William Charles Arcedeckne, Baron Huntingfield, the Deputy of the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—

- (a) revoke the said Proclamation dated the tenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty;
- (b) proclaim and direct that the buildings and premises known as the Police Station situate at Anthony Lagoon in the Northern Territory of Australia shall be a public gaol, prison and house of correction; and
- (c) appoint the police station at Katherine in the Northern Territory of Australia, and any premises thereunto appertaining, to be a police prison.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth, this third day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.

CUSTOMS BY-LAWS Nos. 422-434.

I THOMAS WALTER WHITE, Minister of State for the Commonwealth of Australia administering the Department of Trade and Customs, do hereby, in pursuance of the *Customs Tariff 1933-1936*, and of all other enabling powers, make the following Departmental By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 424.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 174(Y).

The machines, machine tools, and appliances for use in connexion therewith, enumerated hereunder (but not the motive power, engine combinations, or power connexions, if any, when not integral parts of the machine or machine tools, unless otherwise specified), may be admitted under Tariff Item 174(Y), viz.:—

(a) Electrical machines and appliances, viz.:—

Armatures for electric measuring and recording instruments for measuring insulation resistance. (Operating on and from 28th January, 1937.) (T.D. 37/48.)

(b) Miscellaneous machines and appliances, viz.:—

Elements, steel, corrugated, for air preheaters. (Operating on and from 17th August, 1936.) (T.D. 37/49.)

(c) Miscellaneous machines and appliances, viz.:—

Hoists, air or pneumatic, for use underground in mines, under security.

By-law No. 33, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words "Hoists, air or pneumatic, for use underground in mines" appearing under the heading "Miscellaneous machines and appliances, viz.:—"

(Operating on and from 2nd February, 1937.) (T.D. 37/38.)

BY-LAW No. 427.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 174(Y).

The machines, machine tools, and appliances for use in connexion therewith, enumerated hereunder (but not the motive power, engine combinations, or power connexions, if any, when not integral parts of the machines or machine tools, unless otherwise specified), may be admitted under Tariff Item 174(Y), viz.:—

Alternator, turbo, 1,870 k.v.a., and exciter—Spare parts for. (Operating on 4th January, 1937, only.)

Armature, exciter, 115 volt, 3,000 revolutions per minute, 8½ k.w., 74 amp., for a turbo generator. (Operating on 14th July, 1936, only.)

Beating machine, cream, for use in connexion with the production of confectionery. (Operating on 14th January, 1937, only.)

Brushes to replace faulty brushes in plansifters. (Operating on 30th October, 1935, only.)

Cleaning unit, clothes, dry, of the rotary type—Spare parts for, viz.:—

Centre unit

Pump, electrically driven.

(Operating on 17th September, 1936, only.)

Conche for use in connexion with the manufacture of chocolate. (Operating on 30th December, 1936, only.)

Crushing machine, coal, automatic, arranged with pulleys for flat belt drive. (Operating on 14th January, 1937, only.)

Cutterhead for a gramophone record making machine. (Operating on 12th June, 1936, only.)

Cutting and creasing machines, 23 inches by 35 inches, fitted with chases, for use in connexion with the production of paper boxes. (Operating on 11th December, 1935, and 18th December, 1936, only.)

De-aerating and carbonating machines, automatic, for use in the production of aerated waters, capacities 1,000 dozen, 600 dozen and 250 dozen bottles per hour respectively. (Operating on 8th January, 1937, only.)

Dividing and moulding machine, combined, for use in connexion with the production of cakes and pastry. (Operating on 4th January, 1937, only.)

Drills, coal, hand, electrically driven—Spart parts for. (Operating on 10th February, 1936, only.)

Engine, marine diesel, 37 horse power, with direct reverse gear. (Operating on 11th March, 1936, only.)

Engine, marine diesel, light weight, high speed, 66 horse power, complete with clutch, reverse and reduction gears, propeller and shaft, compressed air starting, circulating and bilge pumps, 12 volt generator for electric lighting, and first set of spare parts. (Operating on 10th December, 1936, only.)

Glove belt machine for use in the dry cleaning of gloves. (Operating on 27th March, 1936, only.)

Grinder, tool and cutter, universal, for use in connexion with the production of tools and gauges. (Operating on 16th November, 1936, only.)

Grinding machine for grinding cambered milling cutters, including grinding wheels and pilot wheel. (Operating on 29th December, 1936, only.)

Grinding machine, universal, 16 inches by 36 inches—Electrical equipment imported with and for use with, comprising—

Motor, direct current, 1 horse power, 300 revolutions per minute, 200 volt.

Generator, direct current, and exciter.

Switchgear.

Controlling apparatus.

(Operating on 18th March, 1935, only.)

Grinding machine, wheel, double face, automatic, for use in connexion with the production of springs. (Operating on 20th November, 1936, only.)

Hydraulic apparatus for straightening, bending, spring spreading, &c., for use in the automobile industry—Parts of. (Operating on 10th November, 1936, only.)

Motor, 22/380 volt, specially wound for use with a flange-making machine used in connexion with the manufacture of electric incandescent lamps. (Operating on 16th July, 1936, only.)

Motor, electric, direct current, with two shaft ends, 5 horse-power, 460 volt, 1,360 revolutions per minute. (Operating on 4th September, 1936, only.)

Paper-making machine, auxiliary equipment and spare parts therefor including the following motors and starter, viz.:—

60 horse-power forced ventilated direct current compound wound inter-polar type motors.

35 horse-power forced ventilated direct current compound wound inter-polar type motors.

Self-starting, open type, self-synchronizing, 415-volt, 3-phase, 50-cycle motor, with exciter.

75 horse-power, 360 revolutions per minute squirrel cage drip proof motor.

1½/4½ horse-power, 350/1150 revolutions per minute, V.S. commutator drip proof motor.

125 horse-power, 231 revolutions per minute, A.S. protected motors.

150 horse-power, 375 revolutions per minute, A.S. protected motor.

½ horse-power, 960 revolutions per minute, S.C. drip proof motor.

1 horse-power, 26 revolutions per minute, S.C. drip proof motor.

7½ horse-power, 1,450 revolutions per minute, S.C. drip proof motor.

Starter for 20/4.8 horse-power, 1,450/350 revolutions per minute, motor.

(Operating on 7th November, 1935; 14th and 19th December, 1935; 15th January, 1936; 18th, 19th and 28th February, 1936; 2nd, 11th, 17th and 26th March, 1936; 3rd and 8th April, 1936; 1st and 18th May, 1936; 1st, 2nd and 12th June, 1936; 9th July, 1936; and 6th, 18th and 21st August, 1936, only.)

Perforating machine, rotary, for use in the printing and book-binding industry. (Operating on 29th December, 1936, only.)

Plant for measuring, weighing and mixing raw materials for use in the manufacture of superphosphates. (Operating on 8th January, 1937, only.)

Plant for use in connexion with the production of tanning extracts, viz.:—

Finisher capable of producing low moisture extract.

Grinding mill.

Double drum dryer with spare scraper knives.

Guillotine knife sharpening machines.

(Operating on 29th July, 1936; 7th September, 1936; 1st and 14th October, 1936; and 19th December, 1936, only.)

Polishing machine, diamond and synthetic die, single head, for use in connection with the production of fine steel wire. (Operating on 25th November, 1936, only.)

Punching machine, for power drive with central adjustment of top platen by means of bevel cog-wheels, with single gearing, friction clutch, automatic stop after each cut, arrangement for continuous running and instantaneous stop in any position, for use in connexion with the manufacture of stationery. (Operating on 4th January, 1937, only.)

Shaping machine for use in connection with the manufacture of wooden pencils. (Operating on 11th January, 1937, only.)

Starter, liquid, with auxiliary switch and trifurcating box, imported with and for use with a 150 horse-power synchronous motor. (Operating on 11th November, 1936, only.)

Stocks, steel roller, rubber covered, for a printing press. (Operating on 22nd May, 1936, 2nd June, 1936, and 17th November, 1936, only.)

Tearing machine, rag, having a welded wrought iron cylinder mounted with hardwood lags fitted with flat steel teeth, and accessories therefor. (Operating on 17th July, 1936, only.)

Turbine, steam, 1,500 k.w., and spare parts therefor. (Operating on 4th January, 1937, only.)

Valve and valve seat for a homogeniser, imported for use as a model in the manufacture of similar appliances in Australia. (Operating on 22nd September, 1936, only.) (T.D. 37/44.)

BY-LAW No. 423.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 285(B).

The following medicines and medicinal preparations in any form (unless otherwise specifically qualified) may be admitted under Tariff Item 285(B), viz.:—

- (a) Butyn. (Operating on and from 28th January, 1937.) (T.D. 37/46.)
- (b) Prostigmin. (Operating on and from 3rd September, 1936.) (T.D. 37/47.)
- (c) Salvacid. (Operating on and from 15th October, 1936.) (T.D. 37/35.)

BY-LAW No. 422.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 285(B).

By-law No. 64, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words "Anabolin hepatic extract in solution form" appearing under the heading "Extracts, medicinal, of all kinds, excepting—" and the word "Anabolin", but any goods which were in direct transit to Australia on 2nd February, 1937, or were in bond in Australia on that date, and which, but for this by-law would be admissible under Tariff Item 285(B) may be admitted under that Tariff Item if entered for home consumption—

- (a) as regards goods in direct transit—On arrival.
- (b) as regards goods in bond—On or before 2nd March, 1937.

(Operating on and from 2nd February, 1937.) (T.D. 37/34.)

BY-LAW No. 425.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 404.

The materials and minor articles shown in the second column of the table hereunder may be admitted under Tariff Item 404 for use in the manufacture within the Commonwealth of the articles shown respectively opposite such materials or minor articles in the first column of the table.

As to all the goods shown in the second column, the qualification, unless otherwise expressly stated, applies that they must not be partly or wholly of gold or silver, but, unless the contrary is specially stated, goods merely gold-plated or silver-plated are not excluded.

This by-law shall not apply to any goods which otherwise are goods not included in the Customs Tariff.

Plates or sheets, steel, rolled or hammered to the desired thickness, under security. (Operating on and from 10th September, 1935.) (T.D.'s. 37/50, 37/51 and 37/54.)

By-law No. 97, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the reference to plates, steel, circular, rolled or hammered to the desired thickness, under security, for use in the manufacture of dies for extrusion presses and wire drawing machines. (Operating on and from 10th September, 1936.) (T.D. 37/54.)

BY-LAW No. 429.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936.

By-law No. 97, published in *Gazette*, No. 29, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the reference to films, coated, dental, not exceeding approximately 2½ inches by 3 inches, for use in the manufacture of X-ray photographs. (Operating on and from 1st January, 1937.) (T.D. 37/55.)

BY-LAW No. 430.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 404.

The materials and minor articles shown in the second column of the table hereunder may be admitted under Tariff Item 404 for use in the manufacture within the Commonwealth of the articles shown respectively opposite such materials or minor articles in the first column of the table.

BY-LAW No. 431.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 404A.

The materials or minor articles prescribed hereunder, being of a class or kind not commercially produced or manufactured in Australia or the United Kingdom, for use in the manufacture of goods within the Commonwealth, may be admitted under Tariff Item 404A, viz.:—

Calcium citrate, synthetic, for use in the manufacture of citric acid. (Operating on 14th and 26th June, 1936; 28th August, 1936; 29th December, 1936; and 4th January, 1937, only.) (T.D. 37/58.)

BY-LAW No. 432.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 415A(1).

The following manufactures (but not including, in the case of machines and machine tools, the motive power, engine combinations, or power connexions, if any, when not integral parts of such machines or machine tools, unless otherwise specified), being of a class or kind not commercially manufactured in Australia or the United Kingdom, may be admitted under Tariff Item 415A(1), viz.:—

Film, strip, for strip film cameras used in connexion with photo engraving. (Operating on 6th November, 1936; 23rd December, 1936; and 5th and 18th January, 1937, only.)

Machines for use in connexion with the production of electric incandescent lamps, viz.:—

Flange-making machine.

Frosting installation for the inside frosting of bulbs.

Inserting mill for automatically feeding parts into a sealing-in machine.

(Operating on 16th July, 1936, only.)

(T.D. 37/58.)

BY-LAW No. 426.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 415A(2).

The following manufactures imported for use in the development of an Australian industry or of the natural resources of Australia, or for use in Public Hospitals or Public Educational Institutions, or for use by public utilities established under

Commonwealth or State law and not conducted for private gain, being of a class or kind not commercially manufactured in Australia and not being admissible under Tariff Item 174, 219(c), 404 or 415A(1), may be admitted under Tariff Item 415A(2), viz.:—

Piece goods, impregnated with an insulating substance, including empire tape but not including other water-proofed tape or textile strip prepared with rubber, oil, celluloid, nitro-cellulose, pitch or bitumen, provided that the importer declare on the face of the entry that such piece goods will be used in electrical apparatus and appliances only.

By-law No. 101, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words "Piece goods impregnated with an insulating substance for use in electrical apparatus and appliances, provided that the importer declare on the face of the entry that such piece goods will be used in electrical apparatus and appliances only."

Clause (a) of By-law No. 174, published in *Gazette*, No. 51, dated 2nd July, 1936, is hereby cancelled.

(Operating on and from 15th June, 1936.) (T.D. 37/40.)

BY-LAW No. 428.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 415A(2).

The following manufactures imported for use in the development of an Australian industry or of the natural resources of Australia, or for use in Public Hospitals or Public Educational Institutions, or for use by public utilities established under Commonwealth or State law and not conducted for private gain, being of a class or kind not commercially manufactured in Australia and not being admissible under Tariff Item 174, 219(c), 404 or 415A(1), may be admitted under Tariff Item 415A(2), viz.:—

(a) Films, sensitized, viz.:—

Dental X-ray, not exceeding the approximate size of 2½ inches by 3 inches.

Photographic, of the type used in the production of film in natural colours.

Stripping, for offset printing.

(Operating on and from 1st January, 1937.) (T.D. 37/55.)

(b) Plates and sheets, iron or steel, galvanized, bearing such proportionment to the importer's normal requirements as determined by the Minister, and entered for home consumption during the period 15th July, 1936, to 7th December, 1936, both dates inclusive. (T.D. 37/63.)

(c) Sheets, steel, silicon, provided that the importer declares on the face of the entry that such silicon sheets will be used in magnetic circuits only.

By-law No. 101, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words "Sheets, steel, containing silicon, for use in magnetic circuits, under security".

(Operating on and from 28th January, 1937.) (T.D. 37/53.)

BY-LAW No. 433.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 415A(2).

The following manufactures being of a class or kind not commercially manufactured in Australia and not being admissible under Tariff Item 174, 219(c), 404 or 415A(1), may be admitted under Tariff Item 415A(2), viz.:—

Automobile service equipment, viz.:—

Automatic flush type wheel alignment indicator;

Axle straightening attachments for knee action cars;

Camber correction tools with jack;

Caster correction tools with or without jack;

Ignition point dressers;

Universal surface type wheel alignment indicator.

(Operating on 2nd and 3rd March, 1936, only.)

Bricks, fire, having a magnesite content of approximately 89 per cent., for lining the furnace bed of an open hearth steel furnace. (Operating on 8th July, 1936; 11th August, 1936; 21st December, 1936; and 4th January, 1937, only.)

Lenses, semaphore, clear optical, for use in tail lights on railway rolling-stock. (Operating on 19th November, 1936, only.)

Packings, metallic, for use with condenser tubes on a steamship. (Operating on 26th November, 1936, only.)

Pads, dye, for use in connexion with the dry cleaning of gloves. (Operating on 27th March, 1936, only.)

Protector equipment, network, including spare fuses and spare parts for testing relays, for the control of alternating current in an electricity supply system. (Operating on 23rd and 24th June, 1936; 18th August, 1936; 29th September, 1936; and 26th November, 1936, only.)

Sheets, steel, corrugated, 3 ft. 8½ in. overall width, 10 ft. 7 in. long, 5.7-in. corrugations, for use as moulds for the production of asbestos cement sheets. (Operating on 29th December, 1936, and 15th January, 1937, only.)

Transformers, current, rated 50-25/5, imported by a State government department to replace similar transformers in 22,000 volt outdoor type metering equipments. (Operating on 19th May, 1936, only.)

Valves, air or gas, and seats therefor, for use with furnaces of the open hearth type. (Operating on 24th December, 1936, only.)

T.D. 37/58.)

By-LAW No. 434.

Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 432(c).

Cotton, raw, American, good middling, 1-in. staple, for spinning purposes, may be admitted under Tariff Item 432(c), under security, provided such cotton be used not later than 31st March, 1937. (Operating on 28th August, 1936; 19th October, 1936; 11th and 21st November, 1936; and 4th January, 1937, only.)

- (a) By omitting from Class C of the Award setting out the classification of Surface Labourers the words "Labourer, loading and unloading coal, coke, bone-dust and fertilizer in bags, stone, &c." and inserting in their stead the words "Labourer, loading and unloading stone, &c.";
- (b) By inserting at the end of that classification the words "Employee engaged in maintenance of flower gardens and lawns at Government House.";
- (c) By adding at the end of the classification set out in Class D of the Award for Surface Labourers the following words:—

"Labourer, loading and unloading coal, coke, bone-dust and fertilizer in bags."

"Vegetable gardener at Government House.";

By adding at the end of the classification set out in Class E of the Award for Surface Labourers the following words:—
"Labourers working rotary hoe."; and

- (e) By omitting from the provisions of the Award headed "RANGERS" and relating to "Horse Rations", the words "six working days leave with full pay" and inserting in their stead the words "twelve working days leave with full pay. Where such an employee has not completed twelve months' service, he shall, on the termination of his employment, provided he has been employed for at least six months, be entitled to one day's pay for each complete month of service."

PRIVATE EMPLOYEES.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred upon it by the *Industrial Board Ordinances* 1936, the Industrial Board hereby makes the following Determination:—

The salaries, wages, rates of pay and terms and conditions of employment of employees at catering establishments, restaurants, tea shops, cafes and fish and oyster shops conducted by private employers in the Territory for the Seat of Government, excluding the Territory accepted by the Commonwealth in pursuance of the *Jervis Bay Territory Acceptance Act* 1915, shall, on and from the fourth day of March, 1937, be as follows:—

EMPLOYEES AT CATERING ESTABLISHMENTS, RESTAURANTS, TEA SHOPS, CAFES AND FISH AND OYSTER SHOPS.

PART 1.—TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT.

(1) HOURS.

The week's working hours shall not exceed forty-four to be worked in six days and within a spread of thirteen hours per day.

The "spread" of hours herein referred to shall be reckoned from the time an employee goes on duty to the time the employee goes off duty.

The time allowed for each meal shall be not less than half an hour and shall be included in the spread.

(2) OVERTIME.

All time worked in excess of forty-four hours per week, or time worked in excess of the prescribed spread of hours each day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(3) ROSTER.

A roster for all employees showing time to be worked shall be kept and, where possible, exhibited in a conspicuous place.

(4) TIME OFF.

Employees shall be allowed one full day off in each week.

Where an employee is required to work during the period that he or she was rostered for "time off" in accordance with the foregoing the employee shall be paid at overtime rates for such work whether or not the weekly hours exceed forty-four.

(5) RECREATION LEAVE.

An employee on completion of twelve months' employment shall be entitled to twelve working days' leave with full pay.

If employment is terminated before the completion of twelve months' service, the employee shall, in lieu of leave, be allowed one day's pay for each completed month of service.

(6) UNIFORMS.

Where an employee is required by an employer to wear a uniform while on duty he shall be so notified at time of engagement.

The employer shall provide the uniform. "Uniform" shall mean any coat, dress, cap, apron, cuffs, or other special article of clothing the employer requires an employee to wear.

(7) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

Other than in the case of dismissal for misconduct, two working days' notice shall be given by an employer, or by an employee, of intention to terminate employment. In lieu of such notice two day's wages shall be paid by the employer, or be forfeited by the employee, as the case may be:

Provided, however, that an employee may be dismissed without notice because of absence due to sickness, accident, or other unavoidable cause, if the employee has failed before noon on any day to—

- (a) inform the employer of his inability to take up duty on that day;
- (b) furnish particulars as to his whereabouts; and
- (c) furnish a reasonable explanation for his absence from duty.

(8) FARES.

In cases where fares are advanced on engagement, the amount of such fare may be recovered from the first or subsequent pay due to the employee; provided, however, that should the employee complete six months' service the amount of fare, if recovered as provided herein, shall be refunded to the employee.

(9) HIGHER GRADE WORK.

An employee who is required on any day to perform work for which a rate of pay higher than the rate of pay fixed for the work usually performed by him is fixed, shall not be paid at the higher rate unless he is employed on that work for more than two hours and a half on that day and in that event he shall be paid at the higher rate for the whole of the day.

(10) BOARD AND RESIDENCE.

(a) Where twenty-one meals are available weekly to employees residing on the employer's premises, the sum of fifteen shillings and ninepence shall be deducted from the weekly wages herein prescribed:

Provided that, if an employee notifies the employer that a meal or meals will not be required on the employee's "day off", the employee shall be allowed ninepence for each meal not received on such day.

(b) In the case of employees who do not reside on the employer's premises deduction shall be at the rate of ninepence for each meal supplied during the employee's spread of working hours.

(c) Where sleeping accommodation is provided for an employee the sum of five shillings and sixpence shall be deducted from the weekly wages herein prescribed.

(11) PREFERENCE TO UNIONISTS.

Preference of employment shall be given—other things being equal—

Firstly, to Returned Soldiers and Sailors with satisfactory records of service; and

Secondly to members of the Federated Liquor and Allied Trades Employees' Union of Australasia, a registered organization under the provisions of the *Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1930*.

(12) POSTING OF AWARDS AND NOTICES.

No employer shall prevent an official of the organization hereinbefore referred to from posting a copy of this award or any official notice of the organization in any suitable place on an employer's premises, such notice not to exceed a size of 14" x 9".

(13) WAGES AND TIME SHEETS.

An employer shall keep a time sheet showing the number of hours worked per day by each employee, and the payment made to each employee. Such sheets shall be accessible to the Officials of the Union at reasonable times.

The basic wage and the total base rate payable to adult employees under this award shall, subject to cost of living adjustments as provided hereafter, be as prescribed in Table A hereunder:—
