THE TERRITORY OF NORFOLK ISLAND.

No. 4 of 1937.

AN ORDINANCE

Relating to Surveys.

BE it ordained by the Deputy of the Governor-General in and
over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of
the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the *Norfolk Island
Act 1913-1935*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Surveys Ordinance 1937*. Short title.
2. The *Surveys Ordinance 1913-1936* is repealed. Repeal.
3. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.
“authorized survey” means a survey of land authorized or
required—

(a) under, or in connexion with, the administration
of any law for the time being in force in
Norfolk Island dealing with the alienation,
leasing or occupation of Crown lands; or

(b) by any proprietor, lessee or mortgagee of any land under any law for the time being in force in Norfolk Island affecting the title to that land.

“authorized surveyor” means a person authorized by the Administrator to make authorized surveys.

Persons entitled to be authorized.

4.—(1.) Any person who, in the opinion of the Administrator, is competent to make surveys may be authorized by the Administrator to make authorized surveys.

(2.) The Administrator may at any time revoke any authority given under this section.

Power of authorized surveyor to enter land, &c.

5.—(1.) An authorized surveyor may, for the purpose of making an authorized survey, with any assistant—

(a) enter any land, building or premises and bring on any such land any horse or vehicle;

(b) cut and remove any soil;

(c) place any mark whether of stone, brick, wood or other material on the land, building or premises; and

(d) do any other act incidental to or consequent on or necessary for making an authorized survey.

(2.) An authorized surveyor shall give to the proprietor, lessee or occupier of any land forty-eight hours' notice of his intention to enter upon the land for the purpose of making an authorized survey.

(3.) An authorized surveyor shall not be liable for any damage if the act occasioning the damage was necessary for the due making of an authorized survey.

(4.) Any person obstructing an authorized surveyor in the exercise of the powers conferred by this section shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Offences.

6. Any person who wilfully obliterates, removes or defaces any boundary or survey mark or any land-mark or beacon made or erected, before or after the commencement of this Ordinance, by an authorized surveyor or by any person authorized to make surveys under the law for the time being in force in Norfolk Island relating to surveys shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Twenty pounds or imprisonment for six months, or both.

- (2) That the following material which was, by determination No. 1, dated the second day of August, 1934, and notified in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette*, No. 55, of the ninth day of August, 1934, deemed to be a manufactured raw material for the purposes of sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of the said section, shall, from and after the date of this determination, not be deemed to be a manufactured raw material for such purposes, viz.:—
Aluminium oxide, crude, in rough crushed lump form.

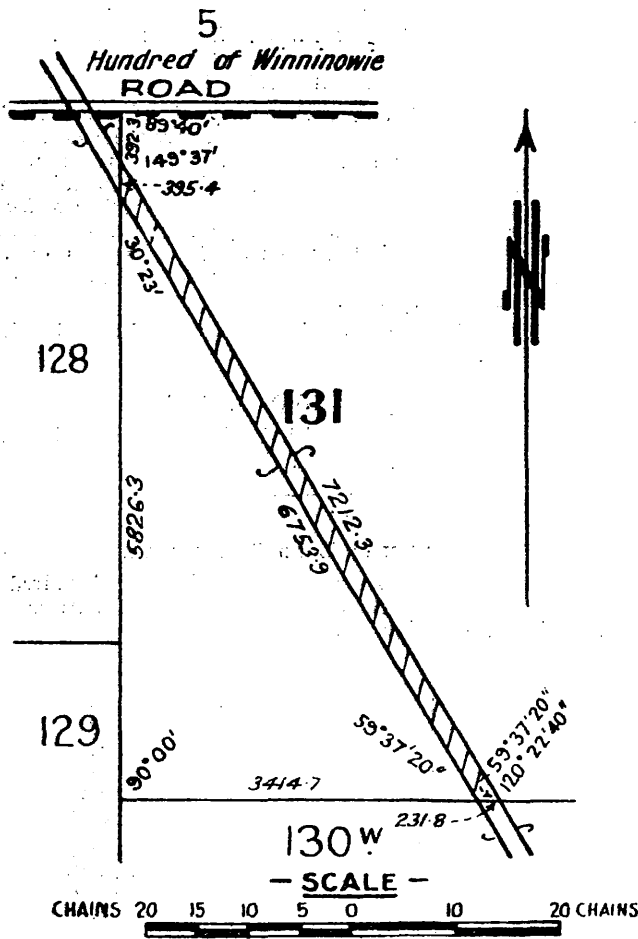

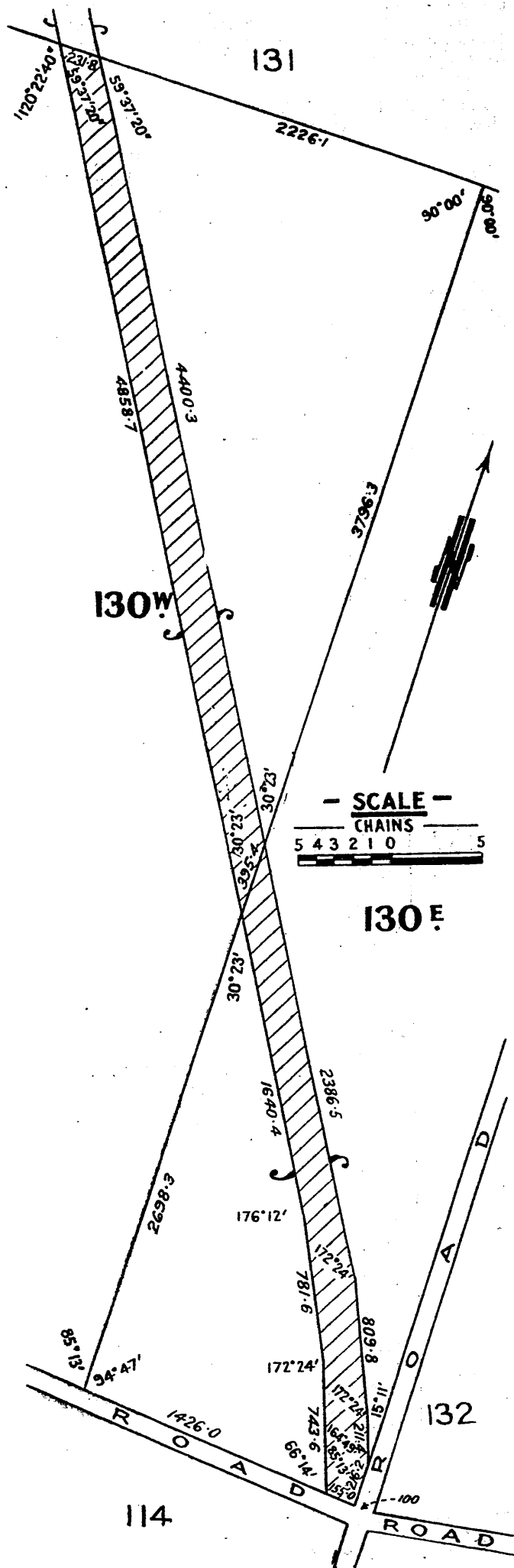

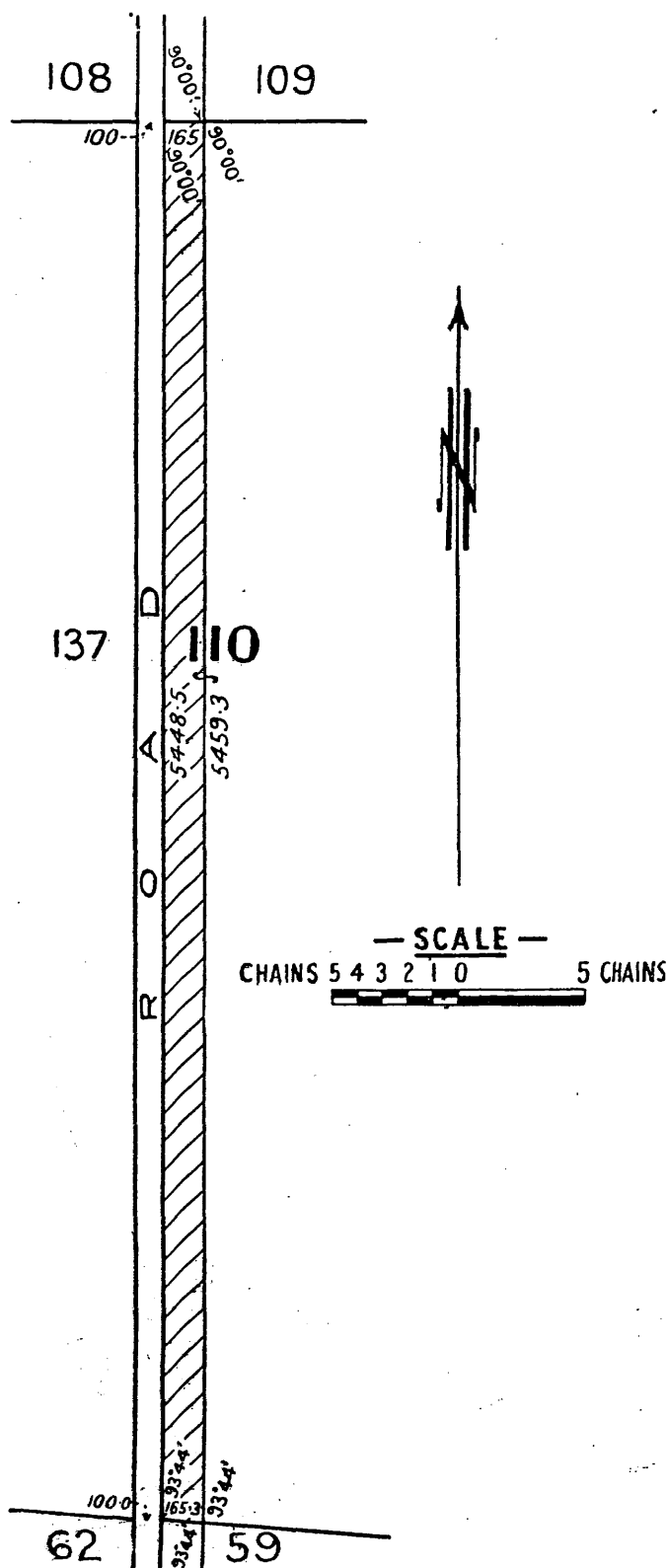

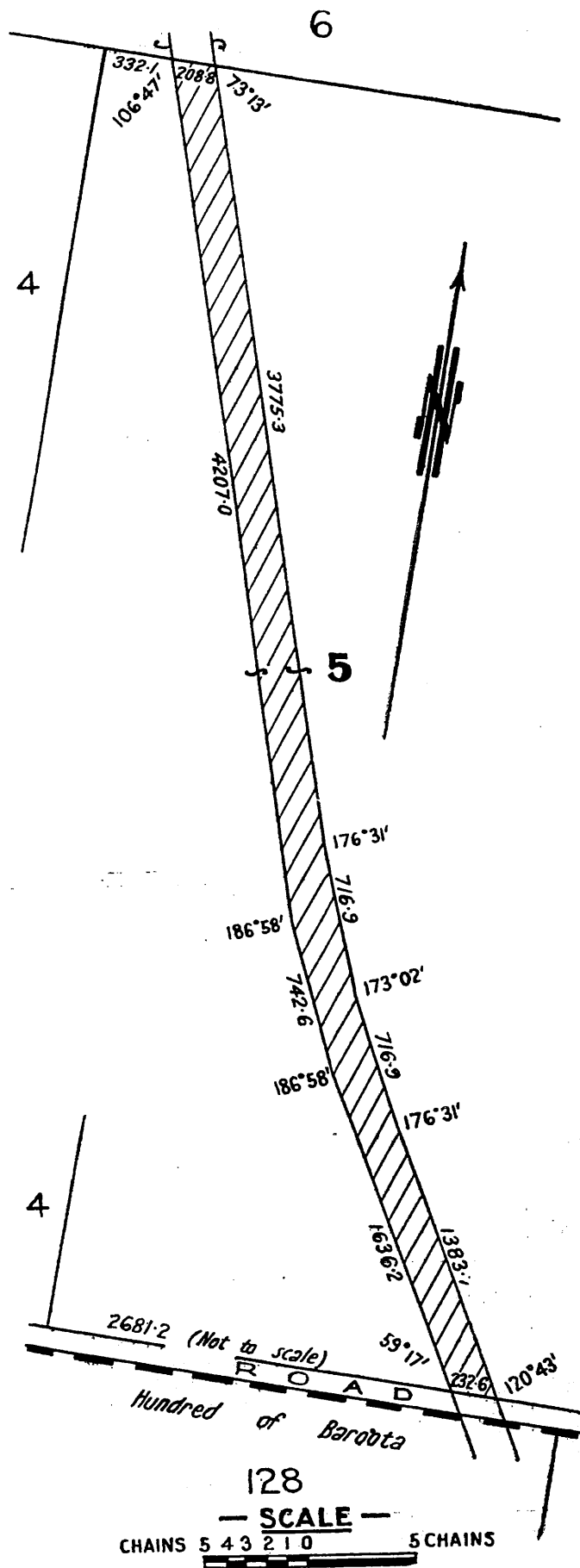

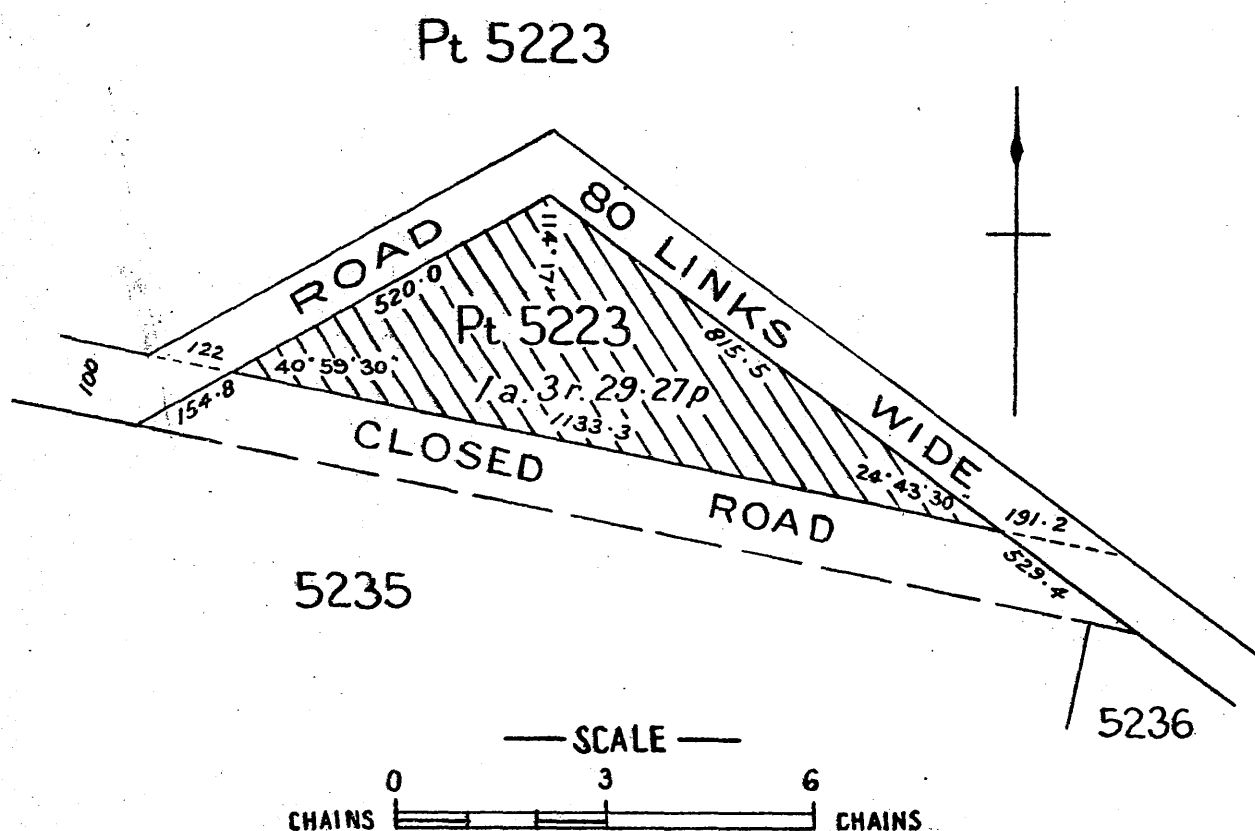
