#### PROCLAMATION.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. GOWRIE GOVERNOT-GENERAL. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of the Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910-1933 it is provided interalia that where any law which is continued in force in the Northern Territory of Australia by virtue of that section is a law of the State of South Australia, any power or function, which by that law is vested in the Governor of the said State shall, in relation to the Northern Territory of Australia, be vested in and exercised and performed by the Governor-General or as the Governor-General directs:

And whereas by virtue of section two of *The Police Prisons*Act, 1905, an Act of the State of South Australia continued in force in the Northern Territory of Australia, it is provided inter alia that the Governor may, by Proclamation, appoint any Police Station, and any premises thereunto appertaining, to be a Police Prison:

And whereas it is desirable to proclaim the Police Station at Tennant Creek in the Northern Territory of Australia to be a Police Prison:

Now therefore I, Alexander Gore Arkwright, Baron Gowrie, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the

Federal Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Police Station situate at Tennant Creek in the Northern Territory of Australia, and any premises thereunto appertaining to be a Police Prison.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth (L.S.) this nineteenth day of May One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.






