Customs Tariff 1933-1936.**DUTY ON PARTS.****PARTS ORDER No. 14.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Customs Tariff 1933-1936* and all other enabling powers, I, Thomas Walter White, Minister of State for the Commonwealth of Australia, administering the Department of Trade and Customs, hereby direct that hat brims of grass or straw or imitations thereof shall, when imported separately, be chargeable with duty under the tariff item applicable to hats n.e.i., at two-fifths of the specific rate or the ad valorem rate, whichever rate returns the higher duty.

This order operates on and from 24th May, 1937.

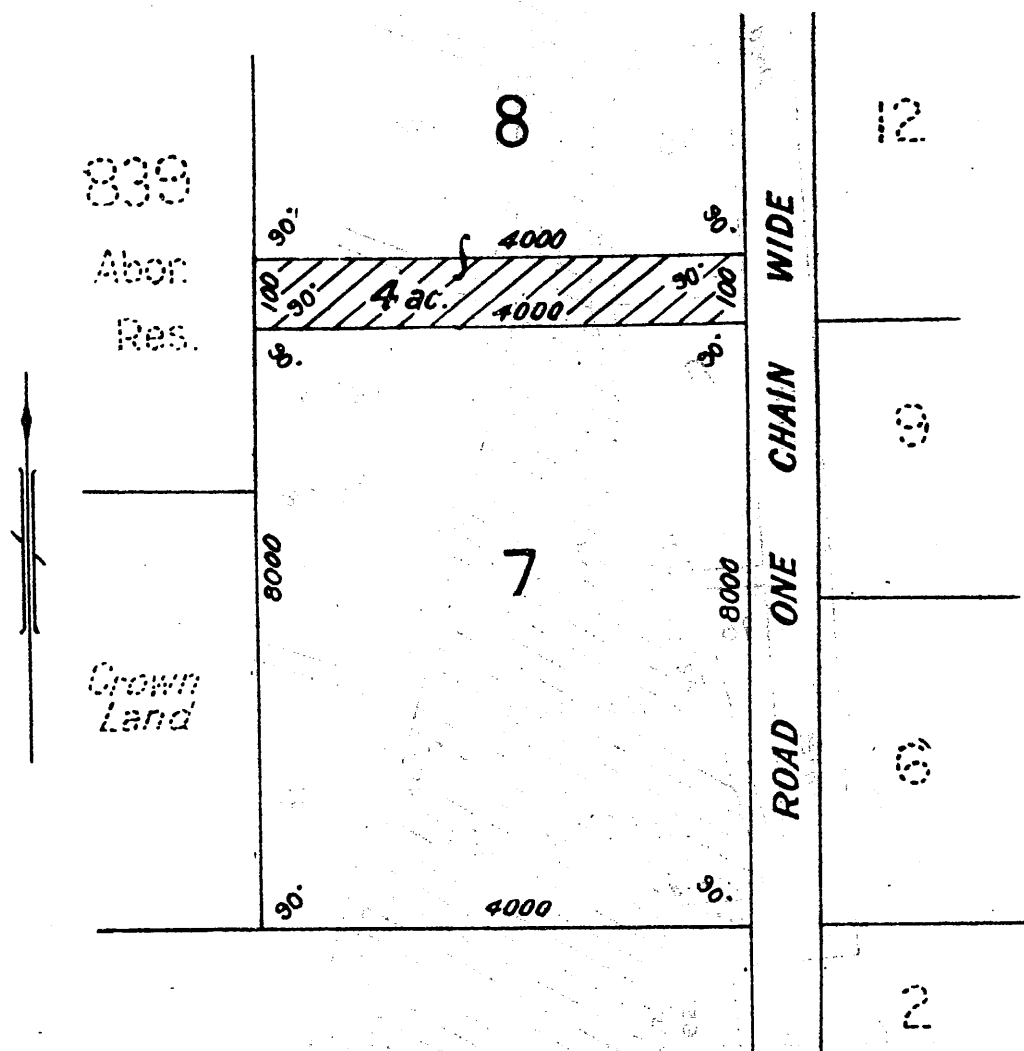

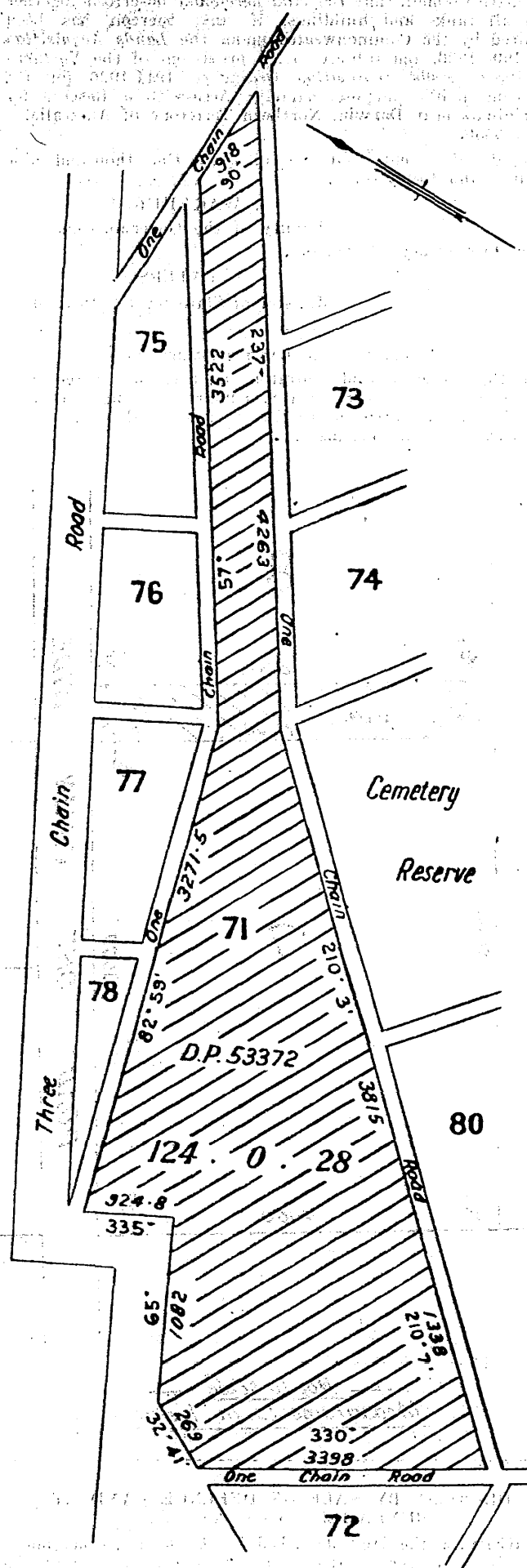

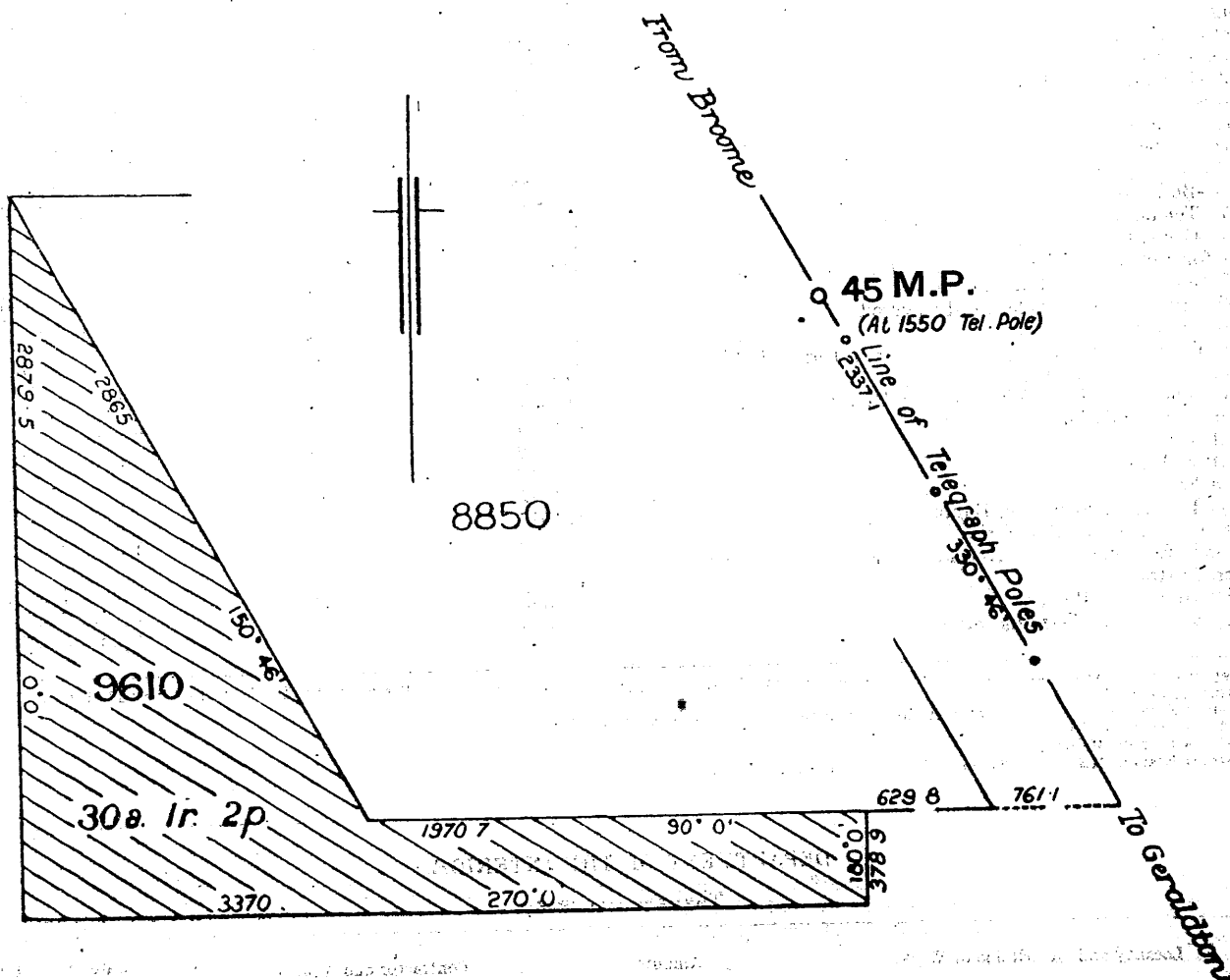
