## THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

### Regulations under the Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930.

I, WILLIAM MORRIS HUGHES, Minister of State for Health, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930* and the *Public Health Ordinance 1928-1930*, hereby make the following Regulations.

Regulation thirty-three of the Public Health (Dairy) Regulations is repealed and the following regulation inserted in its stead:—

“33. Where any sample of milk or cream has been taken by an Authorized Officer in accordance with the last preceding regulation, he shall—

- (a) divide each sample into two portions.
- (b) place each portion in a separate bottle seal each bottle with an official seal and affix to each bottle a label bearing the distinguishing number of the sample the date upon which the sample is taken the name and address of the owner of the milk or cream and the name of the person from whom the sample is obtained.
- (c) return one portion to the person in charge of the vehicle can or container or premises from which the sample has been taken.

IN PURSUANCE of section seventeen of the *Industrial Board Ordinance* 1936-1937, Determination No. 8 of 1937, dated 24th November, 1937, is notified hereunder.

### (Determination No. 8 of 1937.)

#### PRIVATE EMPLOYEES.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred upon it by the *Industrial Board Ordinance* 1936-1937, the Industrial Board hereby makes the following Determination (by consent with the exception of Part 11 thereof):—

The salaries, wages, rates of pay and terms and conditions of employment of Breadcarters in the Territory for the Seat of Government, shall, on and from the second day of December, 1937, be as follows:—

#### BREADCARTERS.

##### PART 1.—TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT.

###### 1. Definitions.

In this Determination, unless the contrary intention appears, "Premises" means the premises attached to a bakery, and includes the place where the employer or his representative keeps his vehicles or stables his horses.

"Breadcarter" means an employee who delivers bread or bread rolls from any bread cart or any other description of vehicle or conveyance, and who is in charge of such cart, vehicle or conveyance and/or the delivery therefrom; but—

- (a) where a breadcarter receives bread or bread rolls on his run from his employer, the person transferring such bread or bread rolls from one vehicle to another vehicle shall not be classed as a breadcarter;
- (b) where any person employed by an employer who regularly employs five or more breadcarters is required, for not more than eighteen hours in any one week and for not more than three hours in any one day, to deliver bread and bread rolls other than to private dwellings, or to supplement the delivery of a breadcarter to the customers regularly served by such breadcarter, such person shall not be a breadcarter for the purpose of this Determination; provided he does not start work before the starting time fixed by this Determination; and
- (c) an emergency man delivering bread shall not be classed as a breadcarter so long as he is paid more than a breadcarter's wage, and does not deliver bread before the hours prescribed herein for the delivery of bread.

###### 2. Hours.

- (i) *Weekly Hours*—Except as hereinafter provided, the ordinary hours of labour per week shall be as follows:—
  - (a) Ordinary week, 44 hours;
  - (b) Where a statutory or a holiday specified in this Determination occurs, 38 hours; and
  - (c) Where two such holidays occur, 32 hours.
- (ii) *Daily Hours*—Notwithstanding anything in this Determination contained, the hours of labour shall be worked between the starting hours set out in sub-clause (iii) hereof, and the finishing hours set out in sub-clause (iv) hereof.

- (iii) *Starting Times*—No work shall be done before 7 a.m. on single days and 5 a.m. on double days provided that one loader may be employed loading one hour earlier.
- (iv) *Finishing Time*—The finishing time shall be 6 p.m. and all labour shall cease at 6 p.m.
- (v) *Week's Work*—The week's work shall commence on Monday and finish on Saturday night.
- (vi) *Day's Work*—The day's work shall commence at the time the breadcarter arrives at the employer's premises and terminate when he finally leaves them.
- (vii) *Consecutive Hours*—All working hours in the day shall be consecutive, except for meal times.
- (viii) *Meals*—Every breadcarter shall be allowed one hour per day for meals.

### 3. Overtime.

- (i) Overtime at the rate of time and a half shall be paid for all work done in excess of the hours specified in Clause 2 hereof. No work of any kind shall, except as provided for in sub-clause (iii) of Clause 2.—*Hours*, be allowed before 7 a.m. on single days or 5 a.m. on double days or after 6 p.m. on any day.
- (ii) *Limitations*—Overtime shall be limited to six hours per week.

### 4. Sunday Work.

No work shall be done on Sundays.

### 5. Sick Leave.

A breadcarter absent from duty on account of personal accident, arising out of and in the course of his employment, or to personal ill-health necessitating his absence from duty, shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal accident or personal ill-health or both, for more than six days or one week in each year.

### 6. Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Eight Hour Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day and, in addition to all such holidays, any day observed in the Territory for the Seat of Government as a statutory or proclaimed holiday.

### 7. Annual Leave.

- (i) Annual Leave for an unbroken period of three working weeks shall be granted on full pay to each breadcarter under this Determination after not less than twelve months' continuous service, less annual leave. When any Holiday specified in Clause 6 occurs during a period of Annual Leave, one day for each such holiday shall be added to the period of annual leave.
- (ii) Annual Leave shall be granted by the employer and shall be taken by the breadcarter within six months after the date on which the leave became due.
- (iii) An employer shall give each breadcarter seven days' notice of the date from which his annual leave shall commence and shall pay to such breadcarter three weeks' wages in advance before the commencement of his annual leave.
- (iv) Where a breadcarter has worked less than twelve months or less than twelve months since his last annual leave was due and his services are terminated, he shall be allowed one and a half days' leave for each month worked or *pro rata* payment for leave due in respect of each such month.
- (v) A breadcarter shall not be compelled to take Annual Leave on days during the period in which notice of termination of employment in pursuance of sub-clause (iii) of clause 9 hereof is current (whether such notice be by the employer or the breadcarter).
- (vi) Where a breadcarter's employment is terminated before twelve months' service has been completed, he shall forfeit payment of wages equivalent to the number of days' leave he has been granted in excess of the leave to which he is entitled.

8. *Shortage of Money or Bread.*

A breadcarter shall not, except in the case of dishonesty, be held responsible to make good any shortage of money or bread appearing on the face of his book unless he is notified of such shortage within twenty-four hours after the day upon which the entry in such book has been made. Sundays and holidays shall not be included in such period of twenty-four hours.

9. *Terms of Employment.*

- (i) *Weekly Employment*—Wages in all cases shall be weekly wages, and shall be paid weekly.
- (ii) *Payment of Wages*—Wages shall be paid not later than the termination of work on Friday in each week in which it is earned, except where a breadcarter is terminating his employment, in which case he shall be paid on Saturday. Overtime and extra payment shall be payable not later than the following Friday.
- (iii) *Week's Notice*—A week's notice of termination of employment shall be given by either the employer or the breadcarter. Failing such notice the employer shall pay or the breadcarter shall forfeit a week's wages in lieu thereof.

10. *Preference.*

Preference shall be given, other things being equal—firstly, to returned soldiers and sailors with satisfactory records of service; and secondly, to members of the Amalgamated Road Transport Workers' Union of Australia, Canberra Branch.

## PART 2.—RATES OF PAY.

*Division 1.—Basic Wage.*

The basic wage and the total base rate payable to adult breadcarters under this Determination shall, subject to cost of living adjustments as provided hereafter, be as prescribed in Table "A" hereunder:—

The index number in column 2 of Table "A" is the purchasing power of money index number published by the Commonwealth Statistician (All Houses Table) for Canberra for the quarter ended 30th September, 1937.

The basic wage prescribed in column 3 of Table "A" and consequently the total base rate prescribed in column 5 of Table "A" are the basic wage and the total base rate respectively payable under this Determination from the commencing date of operation of this Determination.

On and from 1st February, 1938, the basic wage prescribed in column 3 of Table "A" and consequently the total base rate prescribed in column 5 of Table "A", shall be increased or decreased in accordance with the monetary figure assigned in Table "B" hereunder, or in any similarly constituted extension thereof, to the index number for the quarter ended 31st December, 1937, for Canberra, and such altered basic wage and the total base rate shall be the basic wage and total base rate payable under this Determination until and including 30th April, 1938.

Thereafter, on and from 1st May, 1st August, 1st November and 1st February, in each year during the continuance of this Determination, the basic wage prescribed in column 3 of Table "A", and consequently the total base rate prescribed in column 5 of Table "A", shall be increased or decreased in accordance with the monetary figure assigned in Table "B" hereunder to the index number for Canberra mentioned in column 2 of Table "A", for the then preceding quarter ending 31st March, 30th June, 30th September and 31st December, respectively.

## BY-LAW No. 697.

*Customs Tariff* 1933-1936, Item 174(r).

The machines, machine tools, and appliances for use in connexion therewith, enumerated hereunder, may be admitted under Tariff Item 174(r), viz.:—

## (a) Miscellaneous machines and appliances, viz.:—

Pumps, fuel injection, for incorporating in Australian-made compression ignition engines having an engine speed not less than 450 revolutions per minute, under security. By-law No. 499, published in *Gazette*, No. 29, dated 10th June, 1937, is hereby cancelled.—(Operating on and from 19th October, 1937.) (T.D. 37/612.)

## (b) Miscellaneous machines and appliances, viz.:—

Pumps, fuel injection—Parts of, for use as replacement parts only, for fuel injection pumps in use on compression ignition engines having an engine speed not less than 450 revolutions per minute. By-law No. 33, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the following, viz.:—“Pumps, fuel injection—Parts of, for use as replacement parts only, for fuel injection pumps in use on compression ignition engines over 600 (engine) revolutions per minute”. (Operating on and from 19th October, 1937.) (T.D. 37/613.)

## (c) Miscellaneous machines and appliances, viz.:—

## BY-LAW No. 699.

*Customs Tariff* 1933-1936, Item 174 (r).

By-law No. 33, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting from the reference to Equipment, fuel injection, viz.:—appearing under the heading “Miscellaneous machines and appliances, viz.:—” the following:—

“(a) for use as replacement parts for fuel injection equipment in use on compression ignition engines exceeding 600 (engine) revolutions per minute.

“(b) for incorporating in Australian-made compression ignition engines exceeding 600 (engine) revolutions per minute”

and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

Engine, compression ignition oil, 68 horse-power, 1,700 revolutions per minute, including spare parts and tool kit. (Operating on 17th May, 1937, only.)

Filling machine, cushion, complete with foot treadle, scale attachment, Y attachment and rubber hose. (Operating on 16th July, 1937, only.)

Folding machine, paper, for folding sheets of from 6 inches by 9 inches to 30 inches by 48 inches both sizes inclusive, output 3,000 sheets per hour, fitted with self regulating feed. (Operating on 27th July, 1937, only.)

Fondant making plant, automatic, continuous, for use in connexion with the production of confectionery. (Operating on 22nd January, 1937, only.)

Grinding machine, tool and cutter, universal, and associated equipment excluding motor. (Operating on 4th December, 1936, only.)

Grinding machine, tool, two wheel, for use in connexion with the production of agricultural machines. (Operating on 27th November, 1936, only.)

Hydro-extractor having a vulcanized cage, for use in the carbonizing of wool. (Operating on 25th August, 1937, only.)

Plant for use in connexion with the manufacture of sulphuric acid by the contact process. (Operating on 17th, 18th, 20th and 24th August, 1936, and 27th May, 1937, only.)

Press and die therefor, for use in connexion with the production of animal foods in the form of pellets and cubes. (Operating on 22nd June, 1937, and 2nd August, 1937, only.)

Record-making and reproducing machine, gramophone, 16 inches, and extra feed screw therefor. (Operating on 2nd March, 1937, only.)

Re-knitting machine for repairing knitted goods and “ladders” in stockings. (Operating on 2nd July, 1937, only.)

Waste making machine, for making wiping and engine cleaning waste. (Operating on 8th April, 1937, only.)

Welding machine, electric, for use in connexion with the production of spot-welded steel reinforcing fabric and fabricated fencing. (Operating on 21st May, 1937, only.)

The machines, machine tools, and appliances for use in connexion therewith, enumerated hereunder, may be admitted under Tariff Item 174(r), viz.:—

Exhausters, gas, 14 inches by 36 inches, designed to handle 160,000 cubic feet of gas per hour, including vertical steam engines and hydraulic regulators for use therewith, together with spare parts and bearings for such exhausters and engines. (Operating on 27th September, 1937, only.)

Lathe, sliding surfacing and screw-cutting, 20 inches swing, 15 feet bed, complete with fittings other than electrical. (Operating on 5th October, 1937, only.)

Motor, electric, slipring induction, enclosed, 90 horse-power, 2,200 volt, 50 cycle, 3 phase, 480 revolutions per minute. (Operating on 23rd September, 1937, only.)

Motors, electric, direct current, flame proof and explosion proof, 2½ horse-power. (Operating on 27th September, 1937, only.)

Nail-making machine for the production of wire nails. (Operating on 4th October, 1937, only.)



Reeds, 40½ inches wide, for use on a wire weaving loom. (Operating on 11th September, 1937, only.)  
Shaft complete with impellers guide vanes half coupling and parts, for a water feed pump. (Operating on 8th October, 1937, only.)

Scythe, motor, self propelled, to cut 3 feet swathes, including mechanical driving unit. (Operating on 6th October, 1937, only.)

Twisting machine, quad, for use in connexion with the manufacture of trunk telephone cables. (Operating on 27th September, 1937, only.)

(T.D. 37/608.)

#### BY-LAW No. 692.

##### *Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 285(B).*

By-law No. 100, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the following:—“(but not including, in the case of machines and machine tools, the motive power, engine combinations, or power connexions, if any, when not integral parts of such machines or machine tools, unless otherwise specified)”. (Operating on and from 8th September, 1937.) (T.D. 37/594.)

#### BY-LAW No. 702.

##### *Customs Tariff 1933-1936, Item 415A(1).*

- (b) Glass, welding, electric arc, complying with the optometrical specification of the British Engineering Standards Association—Welding Glass Specification. Clause (c) of By-law No. 351, published in *Gazette*, No. 97, dated 10th December, 1936, is hereby cancelled. (Operating on and from 7th September, 1937.) (T.D. 37/610.)
- (c) Packings in sheet form, being paper or paperboard treated to resist gases oils and other liquids. (Operating on and from 3rd February, 1937.) (T.D. 37/616.)

- (f) the *Australian Industries Preservation Act 1906-1930*.

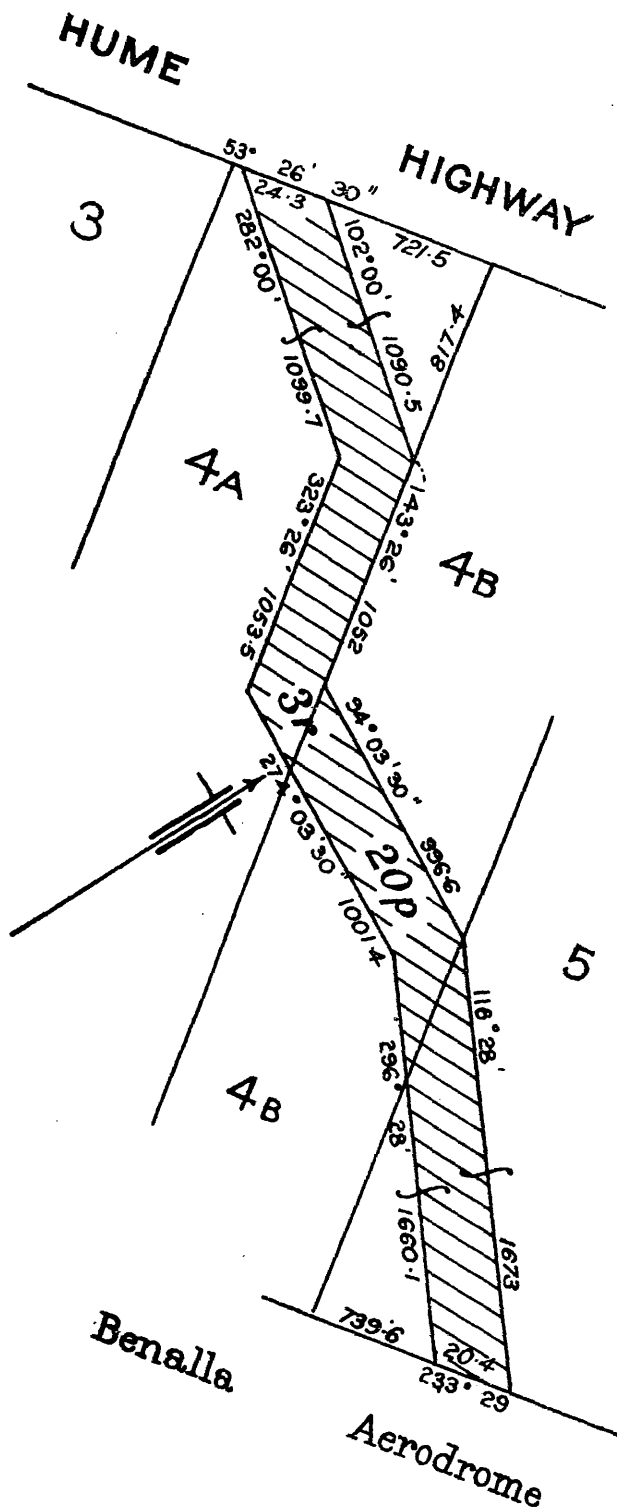

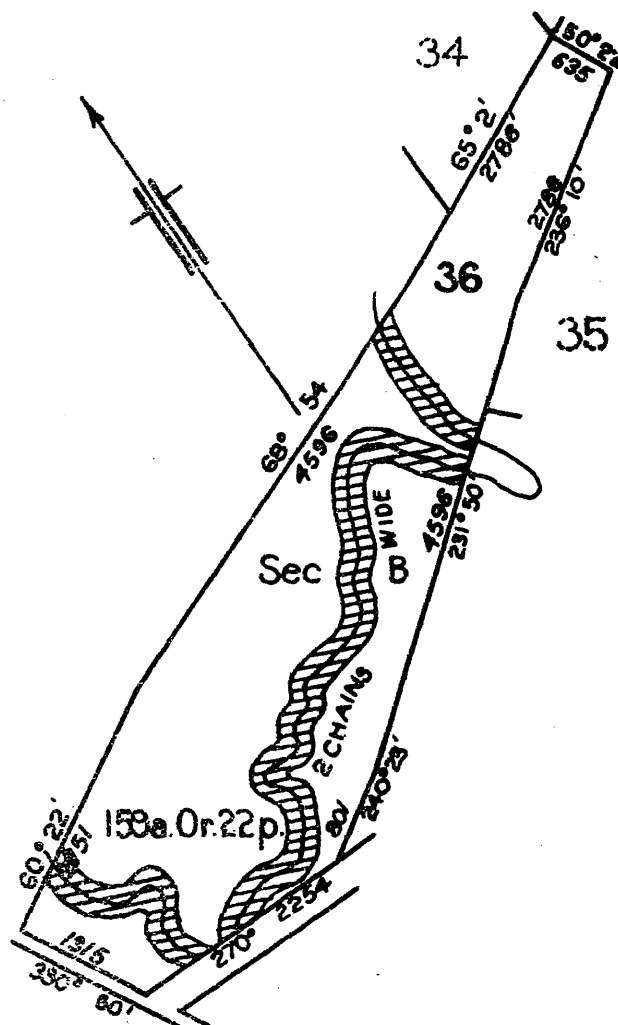
