ORDER UNDER SECTION 422A OF NAVIGATION ACT. EXPLANATION FOR EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

THIS Order is for the purpose of permitting oversea ships, not licensed to engage in the coasting trade of the Commonwealth, to carry passengers and goods on the coast in the special circumstances set out in the Order.

A person exclusively employed by a Shipowner or Agent is already permitted to make a coastal voyage on one of that Shipowner's or Agent's ships. Para. (a) of the Second Schedule to the Order permits the family or effects of such an employee to be likewise carried when he is travelling on the business of the owner or agent, or when he has been transferred to another place.

The Order also permits a wife or a husband, as the case may be, of a person travelling on an oversea ship to accompany that person along the coast.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 422A.

EXEMPTION FROM COASTING TRADE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT OF SHIPS CARRYING PASSENGERS OR CARGO UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. Gowrie Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Navigation Act 1912-1935 it is provided that ships not licensed under the said Act to engage in the coasting trade shall, if engaging or proposing to engage

in that trade, comply with the following requirements (hereinafter referred to as the "aforesaid requirements") namely:—

- (a) the requirements to become licensed under the said Act to engage in that trade; and
- (b) the requirements specified in the sections and schedules set out in the First Schedule to this Order:

And whereas by section 422A of the said Act it is among other things enacted that where the Governor-General is satisfied, as regards any ship or class of ships, that such circumstances exist as render compliance with any specified requirement of that Act impracticable, or make insistence upon compliance with that requirement undesirable in the public interest, he may, by order, direct that that ship or class of ships shall not be required to comply with that requirement:

And whereas it is by the said section further enacted that any directions under that section may be unconditional or subject to such conditions, limitations and restrictions as are expressed in the order:

And whereas 1 am satisfied that as regards ships not licensed under the said Act to engage in the coasting trade, such circumstances exist as make is undesirable in the public interest to insist upon compliance by those ships with the aforesaid requirements in respect of the carriage by them of the passengers or cargo specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order, where the carriage is subject to the conditions, limitations and restrictions respectively set out in the second column of that Schedule:

AN ORDINANCE

For the Interpretation of Ordinances and for the Shortening of their Language.

it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:-

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Interpretation Ordinance 1937.

Repeal.

2. The Ordinances mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance are repealed.

Definition

3. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears— "the State" means the State of New South Wales.

Application of Ordinance.

- 4.—(1.) This Ordinance, and this Ordinance as amended from time to time, shall, unless the contrary intention appears, apply to every Ordinance, including this Ordinance, whether made before or after the commencement of this Ordinance.
 - (2.) This Ordinance shall bind the Crown.

Application of Ordinance to instruments under Ordinances.

5. Where an Ordinance confers power to make, grant or issue any instrument (including rules, regulations or by-laws), then, unless the contrary intention appears, this Ordinance shall, so far as it is applicable, apply to the interpretation of expressions used in the instrument as if the instrument were an Ordinance.

Application of Interpretation Ordinances.

6. Subject to this Ordinance, the provisions of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1937 (except sections five, fifteen A, forty-eight and forty-nine), as amended from time to time, shall, so far as they are applicable, apply to all Ordinances, including this Ordinance, as if an Ordinance were an Act.

- 7.—(1.) The provisions of sections five, seven, seven A, thirteen, Application of certain section fourteen, fifteen, seventeen, nineteen to twenty-one, twenty-one B of Crimes Act and twenty-one c of the Crimes Act 1914-1932, as amended from to Ordinances. time to time, shall, so far as they are applicable, apply in relation to all Ordinances as if an Ordinance were a law of the Commonwealth.
- (2.) For the purposes of this section, "Ordinance" includes rules, regulations and by-laws under an Ordinance and every law of the State in force in the Territory as a law thereof.
 - 8. In any Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears— Definition of "Justice of the Peace" means a Justice of the Peace of the expressions. Territory and includes a Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction as such in the Territory;
 - "the Supreme Court" means the Supreme Court of the Australian Capital Territory;
 - "the Territory" means the Territory accepted by the Commonwealth in pursuance of the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909, and described in the Second Schedule to that Act.
- 9. All proceedings for offences (other than indictable offences) Proceedings for offences. against the provisions of any Ordinance or regulations thereunder may, unless the contrary intention appears in any Ordinance, be heard and determined by a court of summary jurisdiction.
- 10. Where any moneys have become due, in pursuance of the civil provisions of, or under, any Ordinance or any regulation thereunder, then, unless the contrary intention appears, the person, firm or company, or the body or authority, to whom or which the moneys are due, may sue for and recover those moneys, together with any costs and expenses, in any court having civil jurisdiction in the Territory to the extent of the amount due.
- 11. Where an Ordinance repeals in whole or in part any law Effect of State of the State in its application to the Territory, or provides that laws re any such law shall cease to apply to the Territory, then, unless the contrary intention appears, the repeal or the ceasing of the application shall not-

- (a) affect the previous operation of any law so repealed or ceasing to apply, or anything duly done or suffered under any law so repealed or ceasing to apply; or
- (b) affect any right, privilege, obligation or liability, acquired, accrued or incurred under any law so repealed or ceasing to apply; or
- (c) affect any penalty, forfeiture or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against any law so repealed or ceasing to apply; or
- (d) affect any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, penalty, forfeiture or punishment,

and any such investigation, legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued or enforced, and any such penalty, forfeiture or punishment may be imposed, as if the Ordinance by which the law is repealed or ceases to apply had not been made.

12. The repeal of an Ordinance or part thereof which provided Effect of that a law of the State or part of that law was repealed or ceased ordinance. to apply to the Territory, shall not, unless the contrary intention appears, have the effect of reviving the application of that law or part thereof without express words.

Reference to repealed provisions of State laws. 13. Where an Ordinance repeals any provision of a law of the State or provides that any such provision shall cease to apply to the Territory, and re-enacts any such provision with or without modification, references in any other law of the State in force in the Territory or in any other Ordinance to the provision so repealed or ceasing to apply shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed as references to the provision so re-enacted.

Reference to amended Commonwealth or State laws. 14. Where, in any Ordinance, reference is made to any law of the Commonwealth, or to any law of the State in force in the Territory, and that law of the Commonwealth is subsequently amended, or that law of the State is subsequently amended in its application to the Territory, then, unless the contrary intention appears, the reference shall, from the date of the amendment, be deemed to be to that law as so amended.

Amending Ordinance to be construed with amended State law. 15. Every Ordinance amending a law of the State in force in the Territory shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed with that law and as part thereof.

Regulations.

- 16.—(1.) Where an Ordinance confers power to make regulations, all regulations made accordingly shall, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - (a) be notified in the Gazette;
 - (b) take effect from the date of notification, or from a later date specified in the regulations; and
 - (c) be laid before each House of the Parliament within fifteen sitting days of that House after the making of the regulations.
- (2.) If either House of the Parliament passes a resolution (of which notice has been given at any time within fifteen sitting days after the regulations have been laid before such House) disallowing any regulation, that regulation shall thereupon cease to have effect.
- (3.) Where a regulation is disallowed under this section, the disallowance of the regulation shall have the same effect as a repeal of the regulation.
- (4.) Evidence of any regulation made under any Ordinance may be given in all Courts by the production of the Gazette purporting to contain it, or by the production of a document purporting to be a copy thereof and purporting to be printed by the Government Printer or by the authority of the Government of the Commonwealth.
- (5.) For the purposes of this section, "regulations" includes rules under an Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Canberra Community Hospital Board Ordinance 1935-1937.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909, and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Canberra Com- Short title munity Hospital Board Ordinance (No. 4) 1937.
- (2.) Sub-section (4.) of section one of the Canberra Community Hospital Board Ordinance (No. 3) 1937 is repealed.
- (3.) The Canberra Community Hospital Board Ordinance 1935-1936, as amended by the Canberra Community Hospital Board Ordinance 1937, the Canberra Community Hospital Board Ordinance (No. 2) 1937 and the Canberra Community Hospital Board Ordinance (No. 3) 1937, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (4.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Canberra Community Hospital Board Ordinance 1935-1937.
 - 2. Section twelve of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

Revenue of the Board.

- (a) by omitting paragraph (a) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:—
 - "(a) All amounts received-
 - (i) as Hospital Tax; or
 - (ii) by the Commissioner of Taxation in pursuance of section nineteen of this Ordinance,

and applied, in accordance with appropriations made by the Parliament, for or towards the maintenance of the Hospital;"; and

- (b) by omitting from paragraph (c) the words "and outpatients" and inserting in their stead the words "or out-patients, and all payments received in respect of any services rendered by the Hospital or for the hire of plant or equipment of the Hospital".
- 3. Section thirteen of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

Expenditure by the Board.

- (a) by omitting from sub-section (1.) the words "the next succeeding sub-section" and inserting in their stead the words "sub-section (2.) of this section"; and
- (b) by inserting, after sub-section (1.), the following subsection:—
 - "(1A.) The Board may, with the consent of the Minister, pay the cost of any necessary treatment of residents of the Territory in sanatoria or State institutions outside the Territory."

Liability of patients.

- Section seventeen of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting sub-sections (4.) and (5.) and inserting in their stead the following sub-sections:—
- "(4.) Where any person or any dependant of a person is admitted to a hospital, approved by the Board, in any State, whether in a public, intermediate or private ward, and that person—
 - (a) being a person specified in paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of sub-section (1.) of section six of the Hospital Tax Ordinance 1935-1936, has paid Hospital Tax for a period of three months immediately prior to his or his dependant's admission to the hospital or temporary absence from the Territory; or
 - (b) being a person specified in paragraph (c) of subsection (1.) of section six of the Hospital Tax Ordinance 1935-1936—
 - (i) has paid Hospital Tax payable by him in respect of the financial year preceding the date of his or his dependant's admission to the hospital, or
 - (ii) if no assessment has been issued in respect of that year, has paid the Hospital Tax payable by him in respect of the preceding financial year, or
 - (iii) has paid all instalments due under sub-section
 (3.) of section ten of that Ordinance at the
 date of his or his dependants' admission to
 the hospital; or
 - (c) being a person other than a person referred to in paragraph (a), (b) or (c) of sub-section (1.) of section six of the *Hospital Tax Ordinance* 1935-1936 had, immediately prior to his or his dependant's admission to the hospital or temporary, absence from the Territory, been resident in the Territory for a period of three months,

the Board may, in its discretion, make a payment to the person concerned or to such hospital towards the cost of providing accommodation for the person or his dependant, at the rate of Six shillings for each day on which the person or his dependant is an in-patient in that hospital, but not exceeding a period of eight weeks in any twelve months:

Provided that, before any payment is made in pursuance of this sub-section, the Board shall be satisfied that, at the time of his admission to the other hospital—

- (a) effective treatment of the person or his dependant was not possible at the Hospital; or
- (b) the person or his dependant was temporarily absent from the Territory and had not left the Territory for the purpose of being admitted to a hospital.
- "(5.) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section, where any person who is resident within the Municipality of Queanbeyan or any dependant of such a person so resident, is admitted to the Queanbeyan District Hospital, and that person has, for a period of three months immediately preceding his or his dependant's admission to that Hospital, been employed in the Territory and paid Hospital Tax, the Board may, in its discretion, make to the Queanbeyan District Hospital, a payment towards the cost of providing accommodation for the person or his dependant, at the rate of Six shillings for each day on which that person or his dependant is an in-patient in that Hospital, but not exceeding a period of eight weeks in any twelve months.

- "(5A.) Where any person mentioned in the last preceding subsection has not paid Hospital Tax for a period of three months immediately preceding the admission of that person or any of his dependants to the Queanbeyan District Hospital, the Board may, in its discretion, make to that Hospital a payment towards the cost of providing accommodation for the person or his dependant in that Hospital equivalent to the amount of Hospital Tax paid by that person-
 - (a) during the period of twelve months immediately prior to such admission; or
 - (b) since the date of the last amount paid to that Hospital by the Board in respect of that person or any of his dependants,

whichever is the lesser period.".

- 5. Section nineteen of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:-
- "19.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in section Members of the Defence Forces and the Hospital Staff seventeen of this Ordinance-

- (a) members of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the dependants. Commonwealth who are entitled under the conditions of their engagement to free medical and hospital services and members of the Resident Staff of the Hospital shall be entitled to the benefits conferred by sub-section (1.) of that section; and
- (b) the dependants of any such member shall not be entitled to any benefits under section seventeen of this Ordinance unless, for a period of three months immediately prior to the admission of any such dependant to the Hospital or any hospital referred to in sub-section (4.) of that section or his temporary absence from the Territory, as the case may be, the member pays to the Commissioner of Taxation a voluntary contribution of ninepence for every week in respect of which he receives income at a rate of not less than Two pounds per week, but if the member pays voluntary contributions in accordance with this paragraph his dependants shall be entitled to the same benefits as the dependants of a person referred to in that sub-section.
- "(2.) The voluntary contribution referred to in paragraph (b) of the last preceding sub-section may, with the consent of the member concerned, be deducted from his salary or wages by the Authorizing Officer of the Royal Military College or the Secretary of the Board, as the case may be, and the Authorizing Officer and the Secretary shall, within three days after each pay-day, pay to the Commissioner of Taxation the total amounts of all deductions made pursuant to this section.".
- 6. Section twenty-five of the Principal Ordinance is amended By-Jaws. by inserting in paragraph (d) of sub-section (1.), after the word "Hospital," (first occurring), the words "the hire of plant and equipment of the Hospital".

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance 1930-1937.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance (No. 2) 1937.
- (2.) Sub-section (2.) of section one of the Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance 1937 is repealed.
- (3.) The Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance 1930-1934, as amended by the Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance 1937, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (4.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance 1930-1937.

Minor and consequential amendments.

2. The minor and consequential amendments set out in the second column of the Schedule to this Ordinance shall be made in the provisions of the Principal Ordinance respectively specified opposite to such amendments in the first column of that Schedule.

Definitions.

- 3. Section five of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
 - (a) by omitting the definition of "High Court";
 - (b) by omitting from the definition of "Indictable offence" the words "High Court" and inserting in their stead the words "Supreme Court";
 - (c) by inserting, after the definition of "Information", the following definition:—
 - "'Judge' means the Judge of the Supreme Court;"; and
 - (d) by omitting the definition of "Registrar of the High Court" and inserting in its stead the following definition:—
 - "'Registrar' means the Registrar of the Supreme Court;".

Acts by a Magistrate or

- 4. Section twelve of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end thereof the following sub-section:—
- "(2.) Without affecting the generality of the last preceding sub-section, where it is provided in any law in force in the Territory that an information or complaint may be laid or made before, or a summons or warrant issued by, a Court, a Justice of the Peace or a Clerk of Petty Sessions, the information or complaint may be laid or made, and the summons or warrant may be issued by, a Magistrate or the Clerk."

Powers and functions of Magistrates.

5. Section seventeen of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the words "at the commencement of this Ordinance".

- 6. Section nineteen of the Principal Ordinance is amended— Jurisdiction of Court.
 - (a) by omitting the words "by any Ordinance, whether made before or after the commencement of this Ordinance, or by this Ordinance, or by any law" and inserting in their stead the words "by any law for the time being"; and
 - (b) by inserting, after the word "jurisdiction" (last occurring), the words "shall be deemed to be conferred on and ".
- 7. After section twenty-four of the Principal Ordinance the following sections are inserted:-
- "24A.—(1.) Subject to any rules or regulations under this Removal of civil cases to Ordinance, the Judge may, on the application of either party the Supreme to an action referred to in section twenty of this Ordinance made Court. to him before the action comes before the Court for hearing, grant leave for the removal of the action into the Supreme Court on such terms and conditions as to costs or otherwise as the Judge thinks fit.

"(2.) Upon the granting of such leave, all proceedings in the action in the Court shall be discontinued and the Clerk shall transmit to the Registrar all documents relating to the action as

are filed of record in the Court.

(3.) Upon receipt of the documents, the Supreme Court shall proceed in the action as if it had been originally commenced in the Supreme Court and all subsequent proceedings in the action shall be according to the course and practice of that Court.

"24B. Applications under the last preceding section shall be Procedure for removal of cases. subject to the following provisions:-

(a) The application shall be in writing and shall-

- (i) set out the grounds on which the applicant claims that leave should be granted;
- (ii) be signed by the applicant or his solicitor;
- (iii) be lodged (together with two copies) with the Clerk; and
- (iv) be accompanied by a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence;
- (b) The applicant may lodge with the application affidavits in support;
- (c) On receipt of the application the Clerk shall forthwith transmit one copy to the other party to the action and one copy with any affidavits lodged in pursuance of paragraph (b) of this section to the Registrar and the action shall then be stayed;
- (d) On receipt of the application, the Registrar shall forthwith transmit to the Judge a copy of the application with any affidavits lodged in pursuance of paragraph (b) of this section;
- (e) The Judge shall consider every application so transmitted and may make an order either granting leave for the removal of the action into the Supreme Court or that the action be continued in the Court of Petty Sessions;
- (f) If the Judge makes an order granting leave for the removal of the action, the Registrar shall post a copy of the order to each party to the action;
- (g) If the Judge makes an order that the action be continued in the Court of Petty Sessions, the Registrar shall forthwith serve a copy of the order on the Clerk and the Clerk shall forthwith appoint a return day for the summons (if any) issued in the action and post a copy of the order to each party to the action with a notice specifying the day appointed as the return day for the summons;
- (h) The stay of the action shall cease on the day on which the copy of the order is posted to the applicant in pursuance of paragraph (g) of this section;

(i) Time shall not run for filing any notice of intention to defend or of the grounds of defence or for any proceeding under this Ordinance in the action while the action is stayed in pursuance of this section.".

Person to whom summons to be directed.

- 3. Section thirty-eight of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting paragraph (c) of sub-section (2.) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:—
 - "(c) shall set out the complainant's address for service which address shall not be more than three miles from the office of the Clerk;".
- 9. Section forty-one of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

Service of summonses.

- "41.—(1.) A summons issued in respect of an information shall be served at least seventy-two hours, and a summons issued in respect of a complaint shall be served at least ten clear days, before the time appointed in the summons for the hearing thereof, upon the person to whom it is directed, by delivering a copy thereof to him personally, or, if he cannot be found, by leaving it, at his last known place of abode, with some other person apparently an inmate thereof and apparently not less than sixteen years of age.
- "(2.) If it appears to the Court or a Magistrate or the Clerk, by statement on oath or by affidavit, that from any cause service in accordance with the last preceding sub-section cannot be effected, the Court or Magistrate or the Clerk may extend the time for hearing and, in the case of a summons in respect of a complaint, the Court may make such order for substituted or other service or for the substitution for service of notice by advertisement or otherwise as to the Court seems just.
- "(3.) Service of a summons in accordance with this section may be proved by the oath of the person who served it or by affidavit or otherwise.".
- 10. Section sixty-two of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

Service, &c., of summons on witness. "62. A summons to a witness shall be served, and proof of service may be given, in the same manner as provided in section forty-one of this Ordinance in the case of a summons to a defendant.".

Admission to bail of persons committed for trial or sentence.

- 11. Section ninety-nine of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
 - (a) by inserting, after the word "trial" (first, second and third occurring), the words "or sentence"; and
 - (b) by inserting, after the word "trial" (fourth occurring), the words "or receive his sentence".

Admission to bail of persons committed for trial or sentence and who are in prison awaiting trial or sentence.

- 12. Section one hundred of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
 - (a) by inserting, after the word "trial" (first and second occurring), the words " or sentence"; and
 - (b) by inserting, after the word "tried", the words "or sentenced".
- 13. Section one hundred and twenty-three of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

Notice of defence.

- "123.—(1.) Where a defendant in any complaint intends to defend the action upon the complaint, he shall, at least five clear days before the return day, file a notice of such intention to defend with the Clerk and the Clerk shall forthwith transmit by post a copy of the notice to the complainant.
- "(2.) If a notice of intention to defend is not filed in pursuance of this section, the defendant shall not, without the leave of the Court, be permitted to defend the action upon the complaint.
- "(3.) The Court may grant the leave referred to in the last preceding sub-section on such conditions as to costs and adjournment as the Court thinks fit.

- "(4.) At the close of the opening of the complainant's case and before any evidence is taken, the defendant, if so required by the complainant, shall, by himself or his counsel or solicitor, give a concise statement of his defence to the complaint and of the points on which he relies, and he shall not, except by leave of the Court, enter or rely upon or give evidence as to any other matters than those included in the defence and points so stated.".
- 14. "127. Where the defendant in any complaint-

Appeals as of right to the Supreme Court against convictions, &c.

- "207.—(1.) Where any person is aggrieved—
 - (a) by a conviction of the Court imposing a fine of Five pounds or more, or any term of imprisonment except imprisonment in default of payment of a fine; or
 - (b) by an order for commitment under Division 5 of Part IX. of this Ordinance,

he may appeal in the prescribed manner to the Supreme Court against the conviction or order.

"(2.) The appellant shall serve notice of the appeal on the Clerk and on all parties directly affected by the appeal within twenty-one days after the conviction or order is made.

Appeals in other cases

- "208.—(1.) Any person who is aggrieved by a conviction or order (other than a conviction or order referred to in the last preceding section) may, within twenty-one days after the conviction or order is made or given, apply in the prescribed manner to the Judge for leave to appeal to the Supreme Court against the conviction or order.
- "(2.) An application under the last preceding sub-section shall be in writing and shall—
 - (a) set out the grounds on which the applicant claims that leave should be granted;
 - (b) be signed by the applicant or his solicitor;
 - (c) be lodged (in duplicate) with the Registrar; and
- (d) be accompanied by a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence, and the applicant shall forthwith serve a copy of the application on the Clerk and on all the parties directly affected by the proposed appeal.
- "(3.) The applicant may lodge with the application affidavits in support.
- "(4.) On receipt of an application, the Registrar shall forthwith transmit to the Judge a copy of the application and any affidavits or other documents lodged in support thereof.
- "(5.) The Judge shall consider any application so transmitted to him and may, in the absence of the parties, make an order granting or refusing leave to appeal against the conviction or order, or may order that the application be set down for hearing before him in Chambers on a day and at a time appointed by him.
- "(6.) Where the Judge sets down an application for hearing before him in Chambers, the Registrar shall notify the applicant of the time and place appointed for the hearing and proceedings shall be taken as upon any ex parte application to the Judge in Chambers, and the Judge may make an order granting or refusing leave to appeal.
- "(7.) Where an order granting or refusing leave to appeal has been made in pursuance of sub-section (5.) or sub-section (6.) of this section, the Registrar shall forthwith serve a copy of the order upon the Clerk who shall forthwith cause a copy of the order to be served on the applicant and a copy to be posted to each other party directly affected by the proposed appeal.

- "(8.) The applicant shall, within five days after the service on him in pursuance of the provisions of sub-section (7.) of this section of a copy of an order granting leave to appeal, serve notice of appeal on the Clerk and on all parties directly affected by the appeal.
- "209. Within seven days after the service of any notice of Appellant to give security appeal on the Clerk, the appellant shall give security in the sum for costs. of Twenty pounds for the costs of the appeal.
- "210. Security may be given for the purposes of the last Security, how preceding section either by the deposit of money with the Clerk or by a bond in accordance with a form and with a surety approved by the Clerk and left with the Clerk and the following provisions shall apply with respect to any such deposit or bond:
 - (a) Where money is deposited with the Clerk, the Clerk shall pay the money into an account in the Commonwealth Bank pending the determination of the appeal and upon such determination-
 - (i) if the costs of and incidental to the appeal are not ordered to be paid by the appellant to the respondent, the Clerk shall repay the amount deposited to the person by whom it was deposited; or
 - (ii) if the costs of and incidental to the appeal are ordered to be paid by the appellant to the respondent, the Clerk, on being satisfied that the amount payable has been ascertained and that the whole or any portion thereof has not been paid to the respondent, shall apply the amount deposited in or towards satisfaction of the amount of costs unpaid and shall repay the balance (if any) to the person by whom it was deposited; and
 - (b) Where a bond is given as security, the Clerk shall, if costs of and incidental to the appeal are ordered to be paid by the appellant to the respondent, deliver the bond to the respondent who shall be entitled to the benefit thereof.
- "211. When security for the costs of the appeal is given in the When appeal prescribed manner, the appeal shall be deemed to be duly instituted, duly instituted. otherwise it shall be deemed to have been abandoned.
- "212. Evidence other than the evidence and proceedings before other evidence the Court shall not be received on the hearing of the appeal, except not to be received on by consent of the parties or by order of the Supreme Court.

"213. The Supreme Court on appeal may make any order supreme Court thereon (including an order as to the costs of and incidental to may make any order (including the appeal) as it thinks just, and the order shall have effect as order as to costs) on if it were a judgment of the Court of Petty Sessions and may be appeal. enforced by that Court accordingly.

- "214.—(1.) Where an appeal is duly instituted, the enforce-stay of ment or execution of the conviction or order appealed from shall execution pending appeal. be stayed until the appeal is concluded or is abandoned or discontinued and if the appellant is in custody he may, if not detained for any other cause, be liberated by the order of a Magistrate upon a recognizance with or without a surety or sureties to the satisfaction of the Magistrate.
- "(2.) Where an application for leave to appeal against a conviction or order is lodged as provided in this Part and the applicant furnishes security to proceed with the application and, in the event of leave to appeal being granted, to prosecute the appeal, the enforcement of the conviction or order shall be stayed until-
 - (a) a copy of an order refusing leave to appeal is served on the applicant in pursuance of sub-section (7.) of section two hundred and eight of this Ordinance; or

(b) twelve days after a copy of an order granting leave to appeal has been served on the applicant in pursuance of that sub-section,

whichever is the earlier, and, if the applicant is in custody, he may, if not detained for any other cause, be liberated by order of a Magistrate upon recognizance with or without a surety or sureties to the satisfaction of the Magistrate.

- "(3.) Security to proceed with an application for leave to appeal and, in the event of leave to appeal being granted to prosecute the appeal, may be given—
 - (a) where the application is in respect of an order for the payment of an amount not exceeding Twenty pounds, by the deposit with the Clerk of a sum of money equal to the amount ordered to be paid or by the applicant entering into a recognizance before the Clerk with or without sureties to the satisfaction of the Clerk in such sum conditioned that he will proceed with the application and, in the event of leave to appeal being granted, will prosecute the appeal; or
 - (b) in any other case, by the deposit with the Clerk of the sum of Twenty pounds or by the applicant entering into a recognizance before the Clerk with or without sureties to the satisfaction of the Clerk in the sum of Twenty pounds conditioned that he will proceed with the application and, in the event of leave to appeal being granted, will prosecute the appeal.".

Award of costs.

- 22. Section two hundred and forty-four of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
 - (a) by omitting from paragraph (f) of sub-section (1.) the word "and";
 - (b) by adding at the end of paragraph (g) of that subsection the words "and the costs in proceedings to obtain judgment on complaints shall follow the event; and"; and
 - (c) by adding at the end of that sub-section the following paragraph:—
 - "(h) Whenever a complaint over which the Court has no jurisdiction is brought before the Court, the Court may award costs to the like extent and recoverable in the like manner as if the Court had jurisdiction and the complaint had been dismissed.".
- 23. After section two hundred and forty-five of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

Remission of fees.

- "245A. Where it appears to the Attorney-General or any officer thereto authorized by the Attorney-General that the payment of any fee payable to the Clerk of the Court under this Ordinance would, owing to the exceptional circumstances of the particular case, involve undue hardship, the Attorney-General or that officer may reduce or remit the fee, or postpone payment of the fee, in that particular case."
- 24. Section two hundred and forty-six of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

Solicitor's costs.

"246. In any proceedings in which a solicitor or a solicitor and counsel are employed by a complainant or a defendant against whom a complaint is made, the costs incurred by the complainant or defendant in employing a solicitor or a solicitor and counsel to be included in the costs to be paid to the complainant or defendant by another party shall not exceed for the work done the sums respectively prescribed by rules or regulations under this Ordinance.".

- 25. Sections two hundred and fifty and two hundred and fifty-one of the Principal Ordinance are repealed and the following section inserted in their stead:—
- "250. Any sum becoming due in pursuance of a security Recovery of under this Ordinance shall be recoverable summarily on complaint by a member of the Police Force or by the Clerk or by some other person thereto authorized by the Court.".
- 26. Section two hundred and fifty-two of the Principal Sums paid by Ordinance is amended by omitting the words "before the Court recovered from in manner directed by this Ordinance" and inserting in their stead the words "summarily on complaint by the surety".

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the National Memorials Ordinance 1928-1931, as amended by the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930-1937.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *National Memorials Ordinance* 1937.
- (2.) The National Memorials Ordinance 1928-1931, as amended by the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930-1937, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *National Memorials Ordinance* 1928-1937.

Powers and functions of Committee.

- **2.** Section seven of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting paragraph (c) of sub-section (3.) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:—
 - "(c) come into operation as provided in the next succeeding section.".
- 3. After section eight of the Principal Ordinance the following section is added:—

Minister may

"9. Where the character of a national memorial in the City District is determined by the Committee, and the cost of the execution of the design and of the erection of the memorial is to be borne by the Commonwealth, the Minister may make such contracts or agreements as he thinks fit for that execution and erection.".

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Police Offences Ordinance 1930-1934.

E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:-

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Police Offences Ordinance 1937.

(2.) The Police Offences Ordinance 1930-1934 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Police Offences Ordinance 1930-1937.

- 2. Sections thirteen and thirty-nine, sub-paragraph (ix) of Repeal of certain paragraph (b) of sub-section (1.) of section forty, paragraphs sections. (e), (f) and (g) of that sub-section, paragraphs (b) and (f) of section forty-one, and sections fifty-seven and fifty-eight of the Principal Ordinance are repealed.
- 3. Section twenty-four of the Principal Ordinance is amended Incorrigible rogues. by omitting the words "criminal sittings of the High Court" and inserting in their stead the words "sittings of the Supreme Court".

4. Section thirty-seven of the Principal Ordinance is amended using vehicle by omitting sub-section (1.) and inserting in its stead the following without consent of owner.

- "(1.) Any person who takes or in any manner uses any vehicle the property of any other person without the consent of the owner or person in lawful possession thereof shall be guilty of an offence. Penalty: Fifty pounds or imprisonment for six months.".
- 5. Section forty-three of the Principal Ordinance is amended Offences tending the tending the stand personal by omitting paragraphs (a) and (b) and inserting in their stead persons injury. the following paragraphs:-

"(a) places any obstruction upon any stream or river whereby life or limb is likely to be endangered;

(b) leaves any hole, excavation or dangerous formation near any public place without fencing or enclosing it or keeping a light burning upon the enclosure from sunset to sunrise;".

"44. Any person who slaughters or skins any beast, or permits Slaughtering animals in any slaughtered beast to remain, in any public place, shall be public places. guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Ten pounds.".

ORDINANCE $\mathbf{A}\mathbf{N}$

Relating to the Regulation of Traffic.

E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:-

PART 1.-PRELIMINARY.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Traffic Ordinance 1937. short title.

Repeal

2. The Traffic Ordinance 1912, the Traffic Ordinance (No. 2) 1912, the Traffic Ordinance 1923 and the Traffic Ordinance 1935 are repealed.

Parts.

3. This Ordinance is divided into Parts, as follows:-

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—General Provisions as to Traffic.

Part III.—Rules of the Road.

Part IV.—Lights.

Part V.-Miscellaneous.

Definitions.

- 4. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "agricultural machine" means any machine (other than a tractor) used for cultivating land or sowing or harvesting crops:

"animal" means any horse, cattle or sheep;

- "bicycle" includes tricycle and any contrivance of a similar nature;
- "driver" means any person driving a vehicle and includes any person riding a bicycle, and "drive" includes "ride";
- "footpath" means any place upon a public street set apart or made for the use of foot passengers and, where the footpath is not clearly defined, includes the portion of the public street on the left of the carriage-way of the public street;

"inspector" means an inspector appointed in pursuance of the Motor Traffic Ordinance 1936;

"motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle within the meaning of the Motor Traffic Ordinance 1936;

"officer" means an officer appointed in pursuance of the Motor Traffic Ordinance 1936;

"public street" means any street, road, lane, thoroughfare, footpath, or place open to, or used by, the public, and includes any street, road, lane, thoroughfare, footpath, or place open to, or used by, the public, within that part of the village to the south of Captain's Point at Jervis Bay in which the Royal Australian Naval College was situated;

"the Registrar" means the Registrar of Motor Vehicles;

"vehicle" means any vehicle drawn by an animal.

PART II.—GENERAL PROVISIONS AS TO TRAFFIC.

Careless driving or riding.

5. Any person who walks upon a public street, or drives or rides any vehicle, bicycle or animal upon a public street, without due care or attention or without reasonable consideration for other persons using the street shall be guilty of an offence.

Dangerous driving or riding.

- 6.—(1.) Any person who, upon a public street, drives or rides any vehicle, bicycle or animal negligently or recklessly or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public shall be guilty of an offence.
- (2.) In considering whether an offence has been committed under this section, the Court shall have regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition and use of the public street upon which the offence is alleged to have been committed, and the amount of traffic which was, or might reasonably have been expected to have been, upon that public street at the time.

Driver intoxicated.

- 7.—(1.) Any person who, upon a public street, drives or rides any vehicle, bicycle or animal or is in charge of any such vehicle or animal while he is under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be guilty of an offence.
- (2.) Any person who is arrested for an offence under this section shall be entitled, upon request made by him or on his behalf, to be examined by a registered medical practitioner, and, where any such request is made, the person making the arrest shall afford all reasonable facilities for the holding of the examination.

8. Any person who, without lawful authority (proof whereof vehicles, &c., not to be shall lie upon him), drives or rides any vehicle or bicycle or drives, driven or ridden rides or leads any animal on or along any footpath, except over on footpaths. that portion of the footpath forming part of the entrance-drive leading from the carriage-way of a public street into any premises, shall be guilty of an offence:

Provided that, in the event of the carriage-way of a public street being impassable for any reason, a bicycle may be wheeled along the footpath except where the traffic of passengers on the footpath is likely to be obstructed by the passage of the bicycle.

9. Any person who, upon a public street, rides a bicycle which Bicycles to be fitted with has not affixed thereto on some convenient part-

(a) an efficient brake; and

(b) a bell or other efficient appliance for giving warning of its approach,

shall be guilty of an offence.

10. Any person who, upon a public street, rides a bicycle— Control of

(a) without having at least one hand upon the handle-bar in such a position as to have adequate control of the steering of the bicycle; or

(b) without having his feet on the pedals thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

11. If, upon a public street, more than one person is carried carriage of more than on a bicycle which is not constructed or adapted for the carriage person on a bicycle which is not constructed or adapted for the carriage person on a bicycle. of more than one person, each of those persons shall be guilty of an offence.

12. The driver of any vehicle (including a motor vehicle) Permitting who knowingly permits any person riding a bicycle to attach eyclists himself to the vehicle while it is in motion on any public street, themself vehicles shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Any person riding a bicycle who, upon any public street, Persons riding attaches himself to any vehicle (including a motor vehicle) or to to attach any other bicycle whilst the vehicle or the other bicycle is in other vehicles. motion shall be guilty of an offence.

14. Any person riding a bicycle who travels upon any public Bicycles not to pace behind street for more than three hundred yards behind any motor vehicle motor vehicles. and within six feet from that vehicle shall be guilty of an offence.

15.—(1.) Subject to the next succeeding section, if two or more priving or vehicles are driven abreast of each other in the same direction riding abreast. upon any public street, the driver of each of those vehicles shall be guilty of an offence:

Provided that this sub-section shall not apply in any case-

- (a) where two bicycles and no more are ridden abreast; or
- (b) where a vehicle is driven abreast of another vehicle for the purpose of passing that other vehicle.
- (2.) A vehicle shall be deemed to be abreast of another vehicle if any part of the vehicle is by the side of any part of that other vehicle.
- (3.) For the purposes of this section, "vehicle" includes motor vehicle and bicycle.
- 16.—(1.) Where application is made to the Registrar by any Bicycle races person for permission for more than two bicycles to be ridden abreast upon any public street for the purpose of any bicycle races or trials and the applicant gives notice of his application by advertisement in a local newspaper at least two clear days before the day in respect of which the permit is desired, and the Registrar is satisfied that permission can be granted without danger to the public, the Registrar may, subject to any directions of the Minister, issue a permit exempting the persons taking part in the races

or trials from the provisions of this Ordinance or the Regulations in relation to riding abreast, rules of the road and speed limits during those races or trials.

- (2.) The Registrar shall in any such permit specify the time and place at which the races or trials are to be conducted and may also state any conditions to be observed in relation to the races or trials.
- (3.) An application for a permit under this section shall be accompanied by a fee of One shilling.

Three or more horses not to be ridden 17.—(1.) If three or more horses are ridden abreast upon a public street, the rider of each horse shall be guitty of an offence:

Provided that this section shall not apply where the horses are ridden by members of the Police Force on duty or by members of the Defence Force of the Commonwealth whilst wearing a uniform of that Force.

(2.) A norse shall be deemed to be abreast of another horse if any part of that horse is by the side of any part of the other horse.

Width of vehicles.

- 18.—(1.) Subject to the next succeeding sub-section, any person who, upon a public street, drives, or causes or permits to be driven, any vehicle, the total width of which and the load thereon exceeds eight feet in width, shall be guilty of an offence.
- (2.) In any case where the Registrar is satisfied that it is reasonable to permit any vehicle to be driven upon any public street, although the width of that vehicle or any part of the load thereon exceeds eight feet, he may, upon application therefor by any person and upon payment of a fee of One shilling, grant to the applicant a permit for the vehicle to be driven upon such public streets during such times or in such circumstances as the Registrar specifies in the permit.

Projecting loads.

- 19. Any person who drives, or causes or permits to be driven, upon any public street, any vehicle—
 - (a) upon which the load is not safely and securely fastened;
 - (b) loaded with timber which is not so fastened as to prevent flapping or swaying; or
 - (c) having thereon a load extending beyond or overhanging any portion of the vehicle which is not so loaded that the load is parallel to the sides of the vehicle,

shall be guilty of an offence.

Control of vehicles drawn by animals.

- 20. The driver of any vehicle drawn by an animal shall not, while the vehicle is upon any public street—
 - (a) ride upon the vehicle unless-
 - (i) the animal is capable of being driven with reins and proper reins are attached to the animal; or
 - (ii) the animal is led by some other person;
 - (b) be at such a distance from, or in such a situation with respect to, the vehicle when it is in motion that he cannot properly guide and control the animal;
 - (c) be away from the vehicle unless one of the wheels is securely fastened by a chain or strap so as to effectually prevent the rotation thereof;
 - (d) ride upon the shafts of the vehicle; or
 - (e) act as driver of or be in sole charge of any other vehicle except where there is only one such other vehicle drawn by an animal and that animal is guided by a rein attached to its bit and the rein is held by the driver.

21. Any person who, upon a public street-

Traffic not to be obstructed.

- (a) negligently or wilfully obstructs, hinders or prevents the free passage of any person, vehicle (including a motor vehicle), bicycle or animal;
 - (b) wilfully stops any vehicle, bicycle or animal he is riding or driving—
 - (i) between the footpath and the near side of any vehicle (including a motor vehicle) stopped for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers or goods;

(ii) opposite to the entrance of any other public street or across any passage, thoroughfare or foot crossing; or

(iii) upon the intersection of that public street and any other public street;

(c) leaves the vehicle, bicycle or animal unattended in such a position as to obstruct traffic or unreasonably cause inconvenience to any person; or

(d) races the vehicle, bicycle or animal with any other vehicle (including a motor vehicle), bicycle or animal, shall be guilty of an offence.

- 22. Any person who, in any public street in the vicinity of any Animals in the sale-yards, inconveniences passers-by or obstructs traffic by causing saleyards. or permitting any animals—
 - (a) to assemble and remain standing, or
- (b) to be drafted into separate mobs or flocks, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 23.—(1.) Any person who, without the written permission of Processions and the Minister, organizes a procession or parade of any kind upon a public street shall be guilty of an offence.
- (2.) Any person who joins or takes part in any procession or parade for which the permission of the Minister has not been obtained shall, if the procession or parade causes any obstruction to traffic upon a public street, be guilty of an offence.
- 24. Any person who, upon a public street, drives or rides a Speed of vehicles, &c., passing schools, &c.
 - (a) at a greater speed than ten miles per hour-
 - (i) while passing any school at a time when children are coming out; or
 - (ii) while he has not a clear view of the traffic in the direction in which he is travelling; or
 - (b) past any motor omnibus, for the time being stopped for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers, to the danger of those passengers,

shall be guilty of an offence.

PART III.—RULES OF THE ROAD.

- 25. Every person driving or riding any vehicle, bicycle or General rules of the road.
 - (a) keep the vehicle, bicycle or animal as near as practicable to the footpath on his left side:

Provided that, when the vehicle, bicycle or animal is proceeding at a rate faster than six miles an hour, the vehicle, bicycle or animal may be driven or ridden at a reasonable distance from the footpath;

- (b) when meeting another vehicle (including a motor vehicle), bicycle or animal, pass with it on his right side;
- (c) when overtaking another vehicle (including a motor vehicle), bicycle or animal, pass with it on his left side, and shall not cross over to the left side of the public street until his vehicle, bicycle or animal is clear of the vehicle, bicycle or animal which he has passed;

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- (d) before stopping—
 - (i) indicate his intention to do so by raising his right hand with his fingers extended and pointing upwards in such a manner that his right hand shall be clearly visible to any person immediately following; and
 - (ii) bring the vehicle, bicycle or animal close to the footpath on his left side and parallel thereto:
- (e) before turning to his right, extend his right arm with hand and fingers pointing horizontally in the direction in which he intends to turn and in such a manner as to be visible to any person immediately following and, in addition, before turning to the right from one public street into another, drive or ride parallel to the footpath on the left side of the public street he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the footpath on the left side of the public street he is entering:

Provided that, when a traffic dome is placed on any intersection, the person driving or riding shall keep to the left or near side of such dome;

- (f) whenever necessary, give to any person walking, driving or riding upon a public street sufficient warning of the approach of the bicycle by using the bell or other efficient appliance for giving warning of its approach;
- (g) exercise due care, by slowing down, or, if necessary, by stopping the vehicle, bicycle or animal so as not to splash mud upon any person—
 - (i) in or upon or entering or leaving a stationary vehicle (including a motor vehicle); or
 - (ii) waiting at the stopping place of a motor omnibus; and
- (h) at the request of, or signal by, any person leading, driving, riding or in charge of a restive animal, stop his vehicle, bicycle or animal as near as practicable to the footpath and parallel thereto, and remain stationary as long as is reasonably necessary.

Right-of-way at intersections.

- 26.—(1.) A person driving a vehicle when approaching any intersection or junction of two or more public streets at which the traffic is not controlled by a member of the Police Force or an officer, and to which any other vehicle (including a motor vehicle) is approaching so that if both vehicles continued on their course there would be a possibility of a collision, shall, if the other vehicle is approaching from his right, give way to the other vehicle and allow it to pass him, and if necessary for that purpose, stop his vehicle, and shall not increase the speed of his vehicle when approaching any such intersection or junction under these circumstances.
- (2.) This section shall apply also in cases where two bicycles or a bicycle and a vehicle (including a motor vehicle) or two animals, or an animal and a vehicle (including a motor vehicle) or bicycle are approaching an intersection or junction in the circumstances mentioned in the last preceding sub-section and "vehicle" shall, for the purposes of this section, be deemed to include a bicycle and an animal.

Traffic signs.

27.—(1.) The Minister or any person thereto authorized by him may cause notices, signs or devices to be exhibited in or near any public street for the purpose of regulating the movement of traffic or indicating the route to be followed by traffic in the street, or for the purpose of excluding persons, vehicles (including motor vehicles), bicycles or animals from any public street during any public procession or public function or ceremony or in the event of any public street being impassable or unsafe for traffic.

- (2.) Any person driving or riding or in charge of any vehicle (including a motor vehicle), bicycle or animal or walking on any public street who, unless otherwise directed by a member of the Police Force or an officer, fails to conform to the indication given by any such notice, sign, or device shall be guilty of an offence.
- 28.—(1.) For the purpose of regulating the traffic in public Traffic streets and preventing any obstruction thereof, any member of the by members of Police Force or any person thereto authorized in writing by the Police Force, Minister or otherwise lawfully authorized may—
 - (a) by holding up his hand or giving any other appropriate signal, or in any other manner, order or direct any person to stop so long, or proceed in such a manner and direction, as that member or authorized person deems fit;
 - (b) by holding up his hand or giving any other appropriate signal or in any other manner, order or direct any person in charge of a vehicle (including a motor vehicle), bicycle or animal to stop the vehicle, bicycle or animal so long, or to drive or ride or otherwise take the vehicle, bicycle or animal in such a manner and direction, as that member or authorized person deems fit;
 - (c) order or direct any person to leave any public street, from which the person is excluded in pursuance of the last preceding section and expel any person from the street, who when so ordered or directed does not leave the street; or
 - (d) direct any person in charge of a vehicle (including a motor vehicle), bicycle or animal to remove the vehicle, bicycle or animal from any portion of any public street.
 - (2.) Any person who refuses or fails to comply with any direction or order given in pursuance of the last preceding subsection shall be guilty of an offence.

PART IV.—LIGHTS.

- 29. A person shall not drive upon any public street, or cause Lights on or permit to be upon any public street, at any time between sunset and sunrise, any vehicle which has not a lighted lamp attached thereto on the off side of the front thereof in such a manner and position as to show
 - (a) a bright white light clearly visible to any person approaching the vehicle from the front; and
 - (b) a red light clearly visible to any person approaching the vehicle from the rear:

Provided that it shall not be necessary for the lighted lamp to be attached to the vehicle if the vehicle is stationary and under or near a lighted public street lamp or other outside lamp so illuminating the street as to render the vehicle clearly visible and remove any risk of accident by collision or otherwise.

- 30. A person shall not ride upon any public street or cause Lights on or permit to be upon any public street at any time between sunset bicycles. and sunrise any bicycle which has not—
 - (a) a lighted lamp attached thereto in such a manner and position as to show a bright white light clearly visible to any person approaching the bicycle from the front; and
 - (b) a lighted lamp attached thereto in such a manner and position as to show a bright red light clearly visible to any person approaching the bicycle from the rear, or a red reflector attached thereto in such a manner or position as to reflect the lights of a vehicle approaching the bicycle from the rear.

Lights on projecting loads,

31. Whenever the load on any vehicle which is being driven or is standing upon any public street at any time between sunset and sunrise projects more than three feet behind the body of the vehicle, a lighted lamp shall be kept attached to the rear of the vehicle in such a manner and position as to show a red light clearly visible to any person approaching the vehicle from the rear or passing the vehicle from the front.

PART V.-MISCELLANEOUS.

Driver to stop in case of accident.

- 32.—(1.) Where injury or damage is caused to any person, or to any vehicle (including a motor vehicle), bicycle or animal in the charge of any person, by reason of an accident in which another vehicle, bicycle or animal is concerned, the driver or rider of the lastmentioned vehicle, bicycle or animal shall—
 - (a) stop his vehicle, bicycle or animal for a time sufficient to allow of any necessary inquiries to be made by or on behalf of that person;
 - (b) if so required by—
 - (i) the person who is injured or whose vehicle, bicycle or animal is injured or damaged;
 - (ii) a member of the Police Force, or an inspector or officer; or
 - (iii) any person who witnessed the accident and is acting or purports to be acting on behalf of any injured person,

state his name and place of abode, and also the name and place of abode of the owner of the vehicle, bicycle or animal; and

- (c) report the accident and, at the same time, state his name and place of abode, to a member of the Police Force within twenty-four hours after the occurrence of the accident.
- (2.) For the purposes of this section, "animal" means any horse, cattle, sheep, pig or dog.

Driver to stop vehicle, &c., when required by an inspector or a member of Police Force. 33. Any person driving or riding any vehicle, bicycle or animal who, when called upon to do so by a member of the Police Force or by an inspector or officer, in the execution of his duty under this Ordinance, fails to stop the vehicle, bicycle or animal, shall be guilty of an offence.

Name and place of abode to be stated. 34. Any person who, when required by a member of the Police Force or by an inspector or officer, in the execution of his duty under this Ordinance, to state his name or place of abode, refuses to do so or states a false name or place of abode, shall be guilty of an offence.

Driver or owner of vehicle, &c., to furnish information when required.

- 35.—(1.) Where any offence is alleged to have been committed against this Ordinance in respect of any vehicle, bicycle or animal, any member of the Police Force or any inspector or officer may require the owner or driver or any agent or employee of the owner of the vehicle, bicycle or animal, or any passenger in the vehicle, to give any information which it is in his power to give and which may lead to the identification of the person who was driving or riding the vehicle, bicycle or animal when the offence is alleged to have been committed.
- (2.) Any person who, upon being so required, refuses or fails to give any such information shall be guilty of an offence.

Power to arrest without warrant. **36.** Any member of the Police Force may arrest without warrant any person who, in his view, commits an offence against section twenty-seven or twenty-eight of this Ordinance or who commits or is reasonably suspected of committing an offence against section thirty-four of this Ordinance and may keep that person in custody until that person can be admitted to bail or taken before a Court to be dealt with according to law.

Laying of information.

37.—(1.) An information or complaint for an offence against or a contravention of any provision of this Ordinance may be laid or made by any person.

- (2.) If any such information or complaint is laid or made by any person other than the Registrar or an inspector or officer thereto authorized by the Minister or a member of the Police Force, and the proceedings are dismissed or withdrawn, the Court may, if it thinks fit, order that person to pay to the defendant, in addition to any costs, such compensation as it thinks reasonable.
- 38. A person shall not be liable to be convicted of an offence offence due to against or a contravention of a provision of this Ordinance if he proves, to the satisfaction of the Court hearing the case, that the offence or contravention could not have been avoided by any reasonable efforts on his part.
- 39. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect any liability of any Liability at common law and by statute.
- **40.** Any person who commits an offence against, or contrapenalties for venes any provision of, this Ordinance, may be prosecuted summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction, and that Court may, in respect of any such offence or contravention for which no other penalty is expressly provided, impose a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- 41. The Minister may make regulations, not inconsistent with Regulations. this Ordinance, prescribing all matters which are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for carrying out or giving effect to this Ordinance, and in particular may make regulations providing for and in relation to—
 - (a) the limit of speed at which any vehicle or bicycle or class of vehicle may travel in any public street, or any part of a public street, specified in the regulations;
 - (b) the parking or ranking of vehicles and bicycles;
 - (c) parking places and the like; and
 - (d) the imposition of penalties not exceeding Ten pounds which may be imposed for breaches of the regulations.

AN ORDINANCE

To provide for the Protection of Commonwealth Lands.

B E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Protection of Lands Short title. Ordinance 1937.

Definitions.

- 2. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears—

 "authorized officer," in relation to any act, matter or thing,
 means an officer thereto authorized in writing by the
 Minister;
- "lands" means lands vested in the Commonwealth; and "permit" means a permit issued under this Ordinance.

Sand, gravel, &c., not to be taken without permit. 3.—(1.) A person shall not, without a permit in that behalf issued under this Ordinance, take from any lands any stone, shell, sand, gravel, clay or earth.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

- (2.) The Minister may, for such period as he thinks fit, by notice published in the *Gazette*, suspend the operation of this section in respect of any substance or in respect of any lands, and this section shall thereupon cease to apply in respect of that substance or those lands, as the case may be, until the expiration of the period of suspension, or until the suspension is sooner revoked, whichever first happens.
- (3.) The Minister may, at any time, by notice published in the Gazette, revoke any such suspension.

Power to grant permits.

- **4.**—(1.) The Minister or an authorized officer may issue permits to go upon any lands and to take therefrom any substance referred to in the last preceding section.
- (2.) A permit may be limited to any particular substance, and to any particular lands, district or locality.
- (3.) A permit shall continue in force for the period specified therein and no longer, and shall not be issued for any period exceeding twelve months.
- (4.) A permit shall only be granted over lands included in a lease in cases where the substances are reserved to, or are the property of, the Crown.
- (5.) A permit issued under this section shall not extend to authorize the taking from any lands any substance which is, or appears to be, metalliferous.

Terms and conditions of permits.

- 5.—(1.) The terms and conditions on which a permit may be issued shall be as determined by the Minister, and any permit may be cancelled by the Minister or an authorized officer for non-compliance by the holder of the permit with any term or condition of the permit.
- (2.) Where the Minister or an authorized officer cancels any permit, the Minister or the authorized officer shall forward by post to the person whose permit has been cancelled, at his address as stated in that permit, notice of the cancellation of the permit and the cancellation shall be deemed to take effect at the time the notice would have been delivered in the ordinary course of post.

Fees for permits. 6. The fee payable for a permit shall be at the rate of Five shillings per month or portion of a month for each vehicle to be used for taking any substance in pursuance of the permit.

Substances or materials not to be placed on lands. 7. A person shall not, without the authority of the Minister or an authorized officer (proof whereof shall lie upon the person accused), deposit, or cause to be deposited, on any unleased lands, any substance or materials.

Penalty: Twenty pounds, and, if the substance or materials continue on the land for more than one day, a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day or portion of a day during which they so continue.

Excavations or obstructions on lands to be lighted.

8. Where any excavation or obstruction is made, or any substance or material is placed, on any unleased lands with the authority of the Minister or an authorized officer, or any work is being carried on on any unleased lands entailing the opening up or breaking of the surface thereof, the person making, or permitting or causing to be made, the excavation or obstruction, or placing the substance or material, or permitting or causing the substance or material to be placed, on the lands, or carrying out the works, shall cause sufficient lights to be affixed in a proper

place to indicate clearly the excavation, obstruction, substance, material or works, and continue those lights every night from sunset to sunrise while the excavation, obstruction, substance, material or works continue, and shall during all that time at his own expense cause the place on which they are continued to be sufficiently fenced or enclosed to prevent any danger of inconvenience to any person.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.
