PROCLAMATION.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. HUNTINGFIELD Administrator.

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

W HEREAS by Customs Tariff (Primage Duties) 1934 ad valorem duties of Customs (in the said Act referred to as Primage Duties) were imposed at the rates specified in the said Act:

And whereas by the said Act it is provided that there may be added to the list of goods on which primage duty at the rate of five per centum is imposed, such goods as are from time to time added by Proclamation made by the Governor-General with the advice of the Federal Executive Council and published in the Gazette:

And whereas it is desirable that there be added to the list of goods on which primage duty at the rate of five per centum is imposed the goods hereinafter referred to:

Now therefore, I, William Charles Arcedeckne, Baron Huntingfield, the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council do hereby, as from nine o'clock in the forenoon reckoned according to standard time in the Territory for the Seat of Government, on the fifth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, add to the list of goods on which primage duty at the rate of five per centum is imposed such of the following goods as are not, at that time, subject to primage duty at the rate of four per centum ad valorem or exempt from primage duty:—

Coods govered by Tariff Items 172(A)(1) and 208(I)

Goods covered by Tariff Items 172(A)(1) and 208(J) in the Customs Tariff Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the fourth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight.

This Proclamation may be cited as Customs Proclamation No. 377.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth of Australia this fourth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight and in the second year of His Majesty's reign.
