PROCLAMATION.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. HUNTINGFIELD Administrator.

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by section eleven of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance 1927 of the Territory for the Seat of Government that where the Governor-General is satisfied that reciprocal that where the Governor-General is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside England and Ireland for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within the Territory, the Governor-General may by Proclamation published in the Gazette declare that part to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of that Ordinance:

And whereas it is provided by section seventeen of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1937, as applied to the said Territory by section six of the Interpretation Ordinance 1937, that in any Ordinance "the Governor-General" means the Governor-General of the Commonwealth, or the verson for the time being

any Ordinance "the Governor-General" means the Governor-General of the Commonwealth, or the person for the time being administering the Government of the Commonwealth, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council:

Now therefore I, William Charles Arcedeckne, Baron Huntingfield, the Administrator aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature and the Governor in Council of the State of Queensland for the enforcement within the said State of maintenance orders made enforcement within the said State of maintenance orders made by Courts within the Territory, do hereby declare the State of Queensland to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE

To make provision for the Control and Management of the Canberra Community Hospital, and for other purposes.

E it ordained by the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Canberra Community Hospital Ordinance 1938.

Parts.

2. This Ordinance is divided into Parts, as follows:-

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—The Canberra Community Hospital Board.

Part III.—Administration of the Hospital.

Part IV.—Miscellaneous.

Commencement.

- 3.—(1.) Sections one, two, three, five to eleven (inclusive) and thirteen to twenty (inclusive) of this Ordinance shall come into operation on the date of notification of this Ordinance in the Gazette.
- (2.) The remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall come into operation on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight.

Repeal.

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4.—(1.) The Ordinances specified in the First Schedule to this

Ordinance are repealed.

- (2.) All by-laws and regulations made in pursuance of the Ordinances repealed by this Ordinance (except the Hospital Board Election Regulations) shall continue in force but may be amended or repealed by by-laws or regulations made in pursuance of this Ordinance.
- (3.) The members of the staff of the Hospital on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight shall continue to hold office as if appointed under this Ordinance.

Definitions.

- 5. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears—"election" means an election of members of the Board;
 - "Hospital Tax" means the tax levied in pursuance of the Hospital Tax Ordinance and, for the purposes of sections eight, nine, thirteen, thirty and thirty-two of this Ordinance, includes voluntary payments made under section thirty-four of this Ordinance;

"infectious disease" means an infectious disease as defined in the Public Health (Infectious Diseases) Regulations made under the *Public Health Ordinance* 1928-1930;

"member" means a member of the Board;

- "prescribed" means prescribed by this Ordinance or by any regulations or by-laws made or continued in force thereunder;
- "the Board" means the Canberra Community Hospital Board constituted under this Ordinance;
- "the Chief Electoral Officer" means the Chief Electoral Officer for the Commonwealth;
- "the Commissioner of Taxation" means the Commissioner of Taxation referred to in section eight of the *Income Tax Assessment Act* 1936-1937;

"the Hospital" means the Hospital known as the Canberra Community Hospital;

"the Hospital grounds" means the land described in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance;

- "the Hospital Tax Ordinance" means the Hospital Tax Ordinance 1935, and includes that Ordinance as amended from time to time;
- "the Minister" means the Minister of State for Health;
- "this Ordinance" includes any regulations made there-

PART II.—THE CANBERRA COMMUNITY HOSPITAL BOARD.

- 6.—(1.) For the purposes of this Ordinance, there shall be a constitution of Board. Board, to be known as the Canberra Community Hospital Board. consisting of six members, who shall be elected or appointed in the prescribed manner.
- (2.) The Board shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal, and may acquire, hold and dispose of real and personal property and shall be capable of suing and being sued in its corporate name.

(3.) All Courts, Judges and persons acting judicially shall take judicial notice of the seal of the Board affixed to any document

or notice and shall presume that it was duly affixed.

(4.) Upon the constitution of the Board in accordance with this Ordinance, the members of the Canberra Community Hospital Board constituted under the Ordinances repealed by this Ordinance shall cease to hold office, and all property vested in that Board shall become vested in the Board so constituted.

7.—(1.) For the purpose of each election, the Chief Electoral Roll to be Officer shall be the Returning Officer, and shall prepare a roll of prepared. persons entitled to vote, and shall give effect to the provisions of this Ordinance in so far as it relates to the election.

- (2.) The Returning Officer may appoint a Deputy Returning Officer, who may, subject to the control of the Returning Officer, exercise all the powers of the Returning Officer.
- 8. All persons who, within the period of twelve months ending Persons qualified for on the last Saturday in May in any year, have paid Hospital Tax in qualified enrolling respect of a period of not less than twenty-six weeks shall be entitled to enrolment and to vote at the election of members of the Board in that year.

- 9. For the purposes of the preparation of the roll, within Preparation of Roll. fourteen days after the last Saturday in May in each year-
 - (a) the Authorizing Officer of each Commonwealth Department shall furnish to the Chief Electoral Officer a list containing the names and addresses of all employees of that Department from whose salary or wages Hospital Tax has been deducted in pursuance of section eight of the Hospital Tax Ordinance in respect of a period of not less than twenty-six weeks within the period of twelve months ending on that day; and
 - (b) the Commissioner of Taxation shall furnish to the Chief Electoral Officer a list containing the names and addresses of all persons by whom Hospital Tax has been paid in pursuance of section nine or ten of the Hospital Tax Ordinance or of section thirty-four of this Ordinance in respect of a period of not less than twenty-six weeks within the period of twelve months ending on that day.

10. Any person qualified to vote at the election who is not-

(a) a medical practitioner:

(b) an employee of the Hospital;

(c) a person under contract to supply goods or services to the Hospital; or

(d) the spouse of a person specified in paragraph (a), (b) or (c) of this section.

shall be qualified to be nominated and elected as a member of the Board.

Qualification for election

Nominations.

- 11.—(1.) Nominations of persons for election as members of the Board shall—
 - (a) state the name of the candidate, his place of residence and occupation;
 - (b) be signed by not less than six persons qualified to vote at the election;
 - (c) be lodged with the Returning Officer not later than twelve o'clock noon on the fifteenth day of June in the year in which the election is to be held; and
 - (d) contain a statement signed by the person nominated that he is willing to act as a member of the Board if elected.
- (2.) Retiring members of the Board shall be eligible for nomination and re-election.
- (3.) As soon as practicable after the close of nominations the Returning Officer shall publish in the *Gazette* the name, place of residence and occupation of each person nominated.
- (4.) If the number of candidates nominated is the same as the number of vacancies to be filled, the Returning Officer shall declare the candidates nominated duly elected,
- (5.) If the number of candidates nominated is less than the number of vacancies to be filled, the candidates nominated shall be declared elected in accordance with the last preceding sub-section, and the Minister may appoint such additional members as are required.
- (6.) The Returning Officer shall publish in the Gazette the names of the persons elected or appointed in pursuance of either of the last two preceding sub-sections.
- (7.) If the number of candidates nominated is greater than the number of vacancies to be filled, the Returning Officer shall make all necessary arrangements for holding the election.

Board to convene public meeting before clection.

- 12.—(1.) In the case of any election after the first election the Board shall, by notice in a newspaper published in the Territory, convene meetings at not less than two places in Canberra of persons entitled to vote at the election.
- (2.) Each meeting shall be held on a date between the last day for the receipt of nominations and the day on which the election will be held.
- (3.) Each member of the Board shall attend at least one of the meetings.
- (4.) The Chairman of the Board, or a member of the Board nominated by him, shall preside at each meeting, and shall permit a reasonable discussion of matters relating to the Hospital and shall answer any questions relevant to such matters as, in his opinion, are reasonable.

Election of members of the Board.

- 13.—(1.) The first election shall be held on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and at that election six members shall be elected or appointed.
- (2.) Subsequent elections shall be held on the thirtieth day of June in each year (or, if that day is a Sunday, on the preceding day) and at each of those elections three members shall, subject to sub-section (7.) of this section, be elected or appointed.
- (3.) Where more than three members are to be elected at any election, three of the members elected or appointed (who shall be determined in accordance with the next succeeding sub-section) shall hold office for a period of two years from the date of the election and the remainder shall hold office for a period of one year from that date.
- (4.) If the number of candidates nominated for an election at which more than three members are to be elected—
 - (a) is more than the number of members to be elected, the members to hold office for the period of two years shall be the three candidates who have the greatest number of votes to their credit at the conclusion of the count:

Provided that, if at the conclusion of the count it is not possible, by reason of an equality of votes, to decide which of two or more candidates shall hold office for the period of two years, the Returning Officer shall determine by lot which of the candidates having the equality of votes shall hold office for that period;

(b) is more than three but not more than the number of members to be elected, the members to hold office for the period of two years shall be determined by the Returning Officer from among those candidates by lot, and the remaining members and any member appointed by the Minister shall hold office for the period of one year;

(c) is three, the members to hold office for the period of two years shall be the candidates so nominated and any member appointed by the Minister shall hold

office for the period of one year; and

(d) is less than three, the members to hold office for the period of two years shall include the members so nominated and the Minister shall determine which of the members appointed by him shall hold office for the period of two years and which shall hold office for the period of one year.

- (5.) Where three members are to be elected at any election, the members elected or appointed by the Minister shall hold office for a period of two years.
- (6.) If the place of a member becomes vacant before the expiration of his term of office, the Minister may appoint a person who has paid Hospital Tax in respect of a period of not less than twenty-six weeks within the year preceding the date of the appointment to be a member to hold the place until the expiration of the term, or the date of the next election, whichever is the earlier:

Provided that, before making any such appointment, the Minister shall invite the Board to submit the names of three persons so qualified whom the Board deems to be suitable for appointment, and if the Board, within such time as is fixed by the Minister, submits the names of three persons so qualified accordingly, the person appointed by the Minister shall be one of those persons.

- (7.) Where the term of office of a member to whose vacant place a person has, or might have, been appointed by the Minister under the last preceding sub-section would, but for the vacancy, have extended beyond the date of the next election, a member shall be elected or appointed at that election to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term, in addition to the three members referred to in sub-section (2.) of this section.
- 14.—(1.) In any election under this Ordinance the voting shall the voting. be by post.
- (2.) The Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the last day for lodging nominations, send by post to each person whose name appears on the roll prepared for the purposes of the election a ballot paper initialled by the Returning Officer, together with an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer for the return thereof.
- (3.) The names of the candidates shall be printed on the ballot paper in alphabetical order and each name shall be preceded by a square.
- (4.) It shall be the duty of each person who receives a ballot paper from the Returning Officer to record personally his vote on the ballot paper by placing the number 1 in the square opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and the numbers 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) in the squares opposite the names of all the remaining candidates so as to indicate the order of his preference for them, and to fold the ballot paper and return it to the Returning Officer in the envelope supplied for the purpose.
- (5.) No person other than the person to whom the ballot paper has been sent shall mark a vote upon a ballot paper.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

- (6.) The poll shall close at twelve o'clock noon on the date of the election, and only those ballot papers received by the Returning Officer prior to that time shall be admitted to the scrutiny.
- (7.) The Returning Officer shall keep a locked and sealed ballot-box having marked thereon the words "Canberra Community Hospital Board Election—Ballot papers received from Voters" and shall place and keep in that ballot-box until the scrutiny all envelopes containing ballot papers which are received by him prior to twelve o'clock nooon on the date of the election.

Scrutineers.

15. Each candidate may, by notice in writing signed by the candidate and addressed to the Returning Officer setting out the name and address of the scrutineer, appoint one scrutineer to represent him at the scrutiny.

The scrutiny.

- 16. Immediately after the close of the poll, the Returning Officer shall, in the presence of such duly appointed scrutineers as are in attendance—
 - (a) open the ballot-box and produce unopened all envelopes containing ballot papers contained therein;
 - (b) extract the ballot papers from the envelopes in which they are enclosed; .
 - (c) after rejecting all informal ballot papers, count the number of first preference votes recorded for each candidate;
 - (d) exclude the candidate who has the fewest votes and transfer each ballot paper counted to him to the candidate next in order of the voter's preference, and if the number of remaining candidates is greater than the number required to be elected, continue the process of excluding the candidate who has the fewest votes and transferring each of his ballot papers to the unexcluded candidate next in order of the voter's preference until the number of remaining candidates is equal to the number to be elected:

Provided that if at any time two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be excluded the candidate to be excluded shall be determined by the Returning Officer by lot; and

(e) when the number of remaining candidates is equal to the number of candidates to be elected, declare those candidates elected.

Result of election.

- 17.—(1.) Upon the conclusion of the scrutiny the Returning Officer shall make out a statement showing the result of the election and the names of the candidates elected and shall publish notice of the result in the *Gazette*.
- (2.) A notice published in the Gazette in pursuance of the last preceding sub-section or in pursuance of sub-section (6.) of section eleven of this Ordinance, shall, subject to this Ordinance, be conclusive evidence of the result of the election.

Re-count

- 18.—(1.) At any time before the publication in the Gazette of the result of an election, the Returning Officer may, if he thinks fit, on the written request of any candidate setting forth the reasons for the request, or of his own motion, conduct a re-count of the ballot papers.
- (2.) If the Returning Officer refuses, on the request of a candidate, to conduct a re-count of the ballot papers, the candidate may, in writing, request the Minister to direct a re-count of the ballot papers and the Minister may, as he thinks fit, either direct a re-count of the ballot papers or refuse to direct a re-count.
- (3.) The Returning Officer shall, when conducting a re-count, have the same powers as if the re-count were the scrutiny, and may reverse any decision in relation to the scrutiny as to the allowance and admission or disallowance and rejection of any ballot paper.

19. A ballot paper shall be informal if-

Informal ballot papers.

- (a) it is not initialled by the Returning Officer; or (b) it has no vote indicated on it, or it does not indicate
 - the voters first preference for one candidate and the order of his preference for all the remaining candidates.
- 20. The Returning Officer shall place in separate parcels-Ballot papers

(a) all the ballot papers received by the Returning Officer parcelled. which have been rejected as informal;

(b) all the unrejected ballot papers received by the Returning Officer; and

(c) the copy of the roll used for the election, and shall endorse on each parcel a description of the contents, add his signature and the date, and retain the parcels for a period of one year, after which they shall be destroyed.

21.—(1.) The first meeting of the Board after each election Meetings of the Board. shall be held within fourteen days after the date of that election, and shall be convened by the Minister by notice in writing to each member of the Board.

(2.) At that meeting, and at the first meeting after the occurrence of any vacancy in the office of Chairman, the members shall elect a Chairman, who shall, subject to his continuing to be a member, hold office until the thirtieth day of June next ensuing.

(3.) The Chairman may resign his office by writing addressed to the Minister.

(4.) After the first meeting, the Board shall hold such meetings as, in the opinion of the Chairman or of at least three other members, are necessary for the efficient conduct of its affairs, but so that an interval greater than one month shall not occur between any two consecutive meetings.

(5.) Notice in writing of each meeting shall be given to each member by the Chairman or by the members convening the meeting, as the case may be.

(6.) In the case of the illness or absence of the Chairman, the members present shall appoint one of their number to act as Chairman.

(7.) At meetings of the Board, four members shall form a quorum, and the Chairman, or person acting as Chairman, shall have a deliberative vote, but shall not have a casting vote. If the voting is equal the question shall be deemed to have been decided in the negative.

(8.) The absence of any member from a meeting of the Board

shall be reported by the Chairman to the Minister.

(9.) Every member present at any meeting of the Board shall vote on all questions put to the meeting:

Provided that if all the members are not present at the meeting, any two members may request that the question be deferred for determination by a full meeting of the Board and the question shall then be deferred until the next full meeting of the Board.

(10.) Where any question has been so deferred, a notification of the fact shall be sent to each member, and every member who has received the notification shall attend the next meeting or submit to the Board a reasonable explanation of his failure to attend.

(11.) Minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Board shall be kept by the Secretary to the Board, and copies of the minutes relating to each meeting shall be transmitted by the Chairman to the Minister as soon as practicable after the meeting is held.

22. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Board, Dismissal dispense with the services of any member for misbehaviour or for of the neglect or failure to carry out any of the provisions of this Board. Ordinance.

- 23. A member shall be deemed to have vacated his office-
 - (a) if his services are dispensed with in pursuance of as member of the Board. the last preceding section;
 - (b) if he becomes bankrupt or takes advantage of any provision of any Act relating to bankruptcy;

(c) if he becomes of unsound mind;

- (d) if he resigns his office by writing addressed to the Minister and the resignation is accepted by the Minister;
- (e) if he absents himself (except on leave granted by the Board) from two consecutive meetings of the Board; or
- (f) if he, in any way, otherwise than as a member, and in common with the other members, of an incorporated company consisting of more than twenty-five members—
 - (i) becomes concerned or interested in any contract or agreement made by or on behalf of the Board; or
 - (ii) participates, or claims to participate, in the profits of any such contract or agreement or in any benefit or emolument arising therefrom.

PART III.—ADMINISTRATION OF THE HOSPITAL.

General powers and duties of Board.

- 24.—(1.) The Board shall, subject to the directions of the Minister—
 - (a) determine matters concerning the general policy to be adopted by the Medical Superintendent in the administration of the Hospital; and
 - (b) arrange for the purchase of supplies, equipment and any other things necessary for the efficient operation of the hospital.
- (2.) The Board may, from time to time, confer with representatives of the medical profession on matters of interest to the Hospital and the profession.

(3.) The Board shall have no power to borrow money.

(4.) The powers conferred on the Board by this Ordinance shall not be affected by reason only of there being a vacancy in the membership of the Board.

Medical Superintendent

- 25.—(1.) The Minister shall appoint a Medical Superintendent of the Hospital, who shall hold office for such period and on such terms and conditions as the Minister determines.
- (2.) Subject to this Ordinance, the Medical Superintendent shall be responsible for the general administration of the Hospital.

Appointment of officers and servants. 26.—(1.) The Board may, from time to time—

(a) appoint a Secretary to the Board and such clerical and other officers as are necessary to assist him; and

- (b) upon the recommendation of the Medical Superintendent, engage or discharge other members of the staff of the Hospital.
- (2.) Persons so appointed or engaged shall not be subject to the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1937, but shall be engaged for such periods and be subject to such conditions as are determined by the Board.

Revenue of the Board.

- 27. The revenue of the Board shall consist of-
 - (a) all amounts received-
 - (i) as Hospital Tax and applied, in accordance appropriations made by the Parliament, for or towards the maintenance of the Hospital; and
 - (ii) by the Commissioner of Taxation in pursuance of section thirty-four of this Ordinance;
 - (b) such other amounts as are appropriated by the Parliament for the purposes of the Hospital;
 - (c) all payments received from in-patients or out-patients, and all payments received in respect of any services rendered by the Hospital or for the hire of plant or equipment of the Hospital; and

(d) all donations contributed for the purposes of the Hospital and any other money received by the Board for the purposes thereof.

- 28.—(1.) Subject to sub-section (2.) of this section, the Board Expenditure may apply any moneys in its hands, in such proportions and in such manner as it thinks fit, for any of the following purposes:-
 - (a) payment of expenses in connexion with the conduct of elections, and in connexion with the convening of public meetings in accordance with the provisions of section twelve of this Ordinance;

(b) the maintenance of the Hospital;

- (c) the provision of medicines, disinfectants, surgical requisites, and medical, surgical and nursing attendance for sick or infirm persons who are not inmates of the Hospital;
- (d) making such provision as, in the opinion of the Board, is necessary for the isolation of persons who are suffering from any infectious disease or have been in contact with persons suffering from any such disease;

(e) payment of the salaries or wages of all persons employed in pursuance of this Ordinance; and

- (f) payment of all other expenses necessarily incurred in carrying this Ordinance into effect, or in doing or performing any acts or things which the Board is empowered or required to do or perform by this Ordinance or by any law of the Territory.
- (2.) The Board may, with the consent of the Minister, pay the cost of any necessary treatment of residents of the Territory in sanatoria or State institutions outside the Territory.
- (3.) The Board shall exercise the powers and functions conferred and imposed upon it by this Ordinance or by any other law of the Territory in such manner that its operations will be financially self-supporting and no expenditure in any financial year shall, except with the consent of the Minister, exceed the revenue of the Board for that year.
- 29. All revenue received by the Board shall be paid into an Money account opened by the Board at the Commonwealth Bank of Aus- Pecceived by Board. tralia or the Commonwealth Savings Bank of Australia, and that account shall be operated upon only in the manner directed by the Board by resolution

- **30.**—(1.) The Board shall keep full and particular accounts Board to of all moneys received and expended by it. The accounts of and furnish moneys received shall be so kept that the revenue derived from-
 - (a) persons paying Hospital Tax;
 - (b) dependants of such persons; and
 - (c) other persons,

shall be separately shown.

- (2.) The Board shall, in the month of April in each year, prepare and furnish to the Minister a report on the condition of the Hospital as to works, repairs, alterations, furniture and fittings, and shall submit any proposals as to any new works, repairs, alterations, furniture, fittings or equipment which, in the opinion of the Board, will be required during the ensuing financial year.
- (3.) The Board shall, in addition to the report referred to in the last preceding sub-section, prepare and furnish to the Minister, not later than the thirty-first day of July in each year, a statement setting out in respect of the current financial year-
 - (a) the estimated income of the Board:
 - (b) the estimated expenditure of the Board;

(c) the estimated deficit or surplus; and

- (d) the amounts (if any) by which in the opinion of the Board, the rates of Hospital Tax should be increased or decreased, having regard to the estimated deficit or surplus.
- 31. All books and accounts kept by the Board shall be audited Audit. at least once in each financial year by the Auditor-General for the Commonwealth who shall make a report of each audit to the Minister.

Liability of patients.

- 32.—(1.) Where a person or any dependant of a person is admitted to the Hospital as an in-patient or an out-patient, and that person has for a period of three months immediately prior to that admission—
 - (a) been resident within the Territory; or
 - (b) paid Hospital Tax,

the person or the dependant shall, in respect of that admission, be entitled to receive from the Board without charge—

- (c) if an in-patient, such accommodation, attendance or treatment in a General Ward of the Hospital as is prescribed; or
- (d) if an out-patient, such attendance, treatment or services as, subject to the direction of the Board, the Medical Officer in charge of the Hospital considers necessary.

(2.) Any person to whom the last preceding sub-section applies shall, in respect of—

- (a) any accommodation, attendance or treatment received by him or his dependant from the Board, in addition to the accommodation, attendance or treatment to which he or his dependant is entitled as an in-patient or as an out-patient, as the case may be, to receive in pursuance of the last preceding sub-section; or
- (b) his or his dependant's removal to or from the Hospital by or at the expense of the Board,

be liable to pay to the Board such charges as are prescribed.

(3.) Where a person, not being a person to whom the last two preceding sub-sections apply, or any dependant of such a person, is admitted to the Hospital as an in-patient or an outpatient, that person shall, in respect of any accommodation, attendance or treatment received by him or his dependant from the Board, and, if he or the dependant were removed to or from the Hospital by or at the expense of the Board, in respect of that removal, be liable to pay to the Board such charges as are prescribed, but not exceeding, in any case, the actual cost of the accommodation, attendance, treatment and removal:

Provided that there shall be deducted from any sum due in respect of the liability of any person under this sub-section any amount paid by that person by way of Hospital Tax prior to admission to the Hospital of himself or his dependant.

- (4.) Where any person or any dependant of a person is admitted to a hospital approved by the Board in any State, whether in a public, intermediate or private ward, and that person—
 - (a) being a person specified in paragraph (a) of subsection (1.) of section six of the Hospital Tax Ordinance, has paid Hospital Tax for a period of three months immediately prior to his or his dependant's admission to the hospital or temporary absence from the Territory; or
 - (b) being a person specified in paragraph (c) of sub-section
 (1.) of section six of the Hospital Tax Ordinance—
 - (i) has paid Hospital Tax payable by him in respect of the financial year preceding the date of his or his dependant's admission to the hospital;
 - (ii) if no assessment has been issued in respect of that year, has paid the Hospital Tax payable by him in respect of the preceding financial year; or
 - (iii) has paid all instalments due under sub-section—
 (3.) of section ten of the Hospital Tax
 Ordinance at the date of his or his
 dependants' admission to the hospital; or

(c) being a person other than a person referred to in paragraph (a) or (c) of sub-section (1) of section six of the Hospital Tax Ordinance, had, immediately prior to his or his dependant's admission to the hospital or temporary absence from the Territory, been resident in the Territory for a period of three months,

the Board may, in its discretion, make a payment to the person concerned, or to that hospital, towards the cost of providing accommodation for the person or his dependant, at the rate of Six shillings for each day on which the person or his dependant is an in-patient in that hospital, but not exceeding a period of eight weeks in any twelve months:

Provided that, before any payment is made in pursuance of this sub-section, the Board shall be satisfied that, at the time of his admission to the other hospital—

- (d) effective treatment of the person or his dependant was not possible at the Hospital; or
- (e) the person or his dependant was temporarily absent from the Territory and had not left the Territory for the purpose of being admitted to hospital.
- (5.) Notwithstanding anything contained in this section, where any person who is resident within the Municipality of Queanbeyan, or any dependant of a person so resident, is admitted to the Queanbeyan District Hospital, and that person has, for a period of three months immediately preceding his or his dependant's admission to the hospital, been employed in the Territory and paid Hospital Tax, the Board may, in its discretion, make to the Queanbeyan District Hospital a payment towards the cost of providing accommodation for the person or his dependant, at the rate of Six shillings for each day on which that person or his dependant is an in-patient in the hospital, but not exceeding a period of eight weeks in any twelve months.
- (6.) Where any person mentioned in the last preceding subsection has not paid Hospital Tax for a period of three months immediately preceding the admission of that person or any of his dependants to the Queanbeyan District Hospital, the Board may, in its discretion, make to that hospital a payment towards the cost of providing accommodation for the person or his dependant in that hospital equivalent to the amount of Hospital Tax paid by that person—
 - (a) during the period of twelve months immediately prior to such admission; or
 - (b) since the date of the last payment to that hospital by the Board in respect of that person or any of his dependants,

whichever is the shorter period.

- (7.) Any person who is a financial member of a contributory fund of a public hospital in any State shall, on the production of a certificate from the Secretary of that public hospital, and subject to this Ordinance, be accepted as a patient in the Hospital and shall, to the extent to which payment in respect of his accommodation, attendance or treatment is made to the Hospital by the public hospital to whose fund the person is a contributor, be entitled to a remission of charges under this section.
 - (8.) In this section—

"accommodation" includes maintenance and services;

"dependant", in relation to any person, means the wife of that person, or any child of that person who is under the age of seventeen years and is or has been, at any time within twelve months prior to the date of admission to the Hospital, wholly or partly dependent upon the earnings of that person;

"General Ward" means a ward determined by the Board to be a Public or General Ward and includes an Isolation Ward in the Infectious Diseases Block and a General Ward in the Obstetric Section of the Hospital;

- "services" includes the provision of such drugs and dressings as are specified in the British Pharmacopæia, but does not include treatment;
- "treatment" means medical treatment.

Recovery of amounts due to Board.

Members of the Defence Forces and the Hospital Staff and

- 33.—(1.) The amount of the liability of any person under the last preceding section shall be a debt due to the Board and may be sued for and recovered by action instituted by any person authorized in writing by the Board in any Court of competent jurisdiction as a debt recoverable summarily.
- (2.) Any person admitted to or treated at the Hospital, the wife or husband, as the case may be, of that person, and any children of that person who were over the age of twenty-one years at the time the liability was incurred, shall be jointly and severally liable for any sum payable under the last preceding section and, where that person is an infant, that sum may be recovered from his parent or guardian.

34.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in section thirty-two of this Ordinance—

(a) members of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth who are entitled under the conditions of their engagement to free medical and hospital services and members of the Resident Staff of the Hospital shall be entitled to the benefits conferred by sub-section (1.) of that section; and

- (b) the dependants of any such member shall not be entitled to any benefits under section thirty-two of this Ordinance unless, for a period of three months immediately prior to the admission of any such dependant to the Hospital or to any hospital referred to in sub-section (4.) of that section or to his temporary absence from the Territory, as the case may be, the member pays to the Commissioner of Taxation a voluntary contribution of Ninepence for every week in respect of which he receives income at a rate of not less than Two pounds per week, but if the member pays voluntary contributions in accordance with this paragraph his dependants shall be entitled to the same benefits as the dependants of a person referred to in that sub-section.
- (2.) The voluntary contribution referred to in paragraph (b) of the last preceding sub-section may, with the consent of the member concerned, be deducted from his salary or wages by the Authorizing Officer of the Royal Military College or the Secretary of the Board, as the case may be, and the Authorizing Officer and the Secretary shall, within three days after each pay-day, pay to the Commissioner of Taxation the total amounts of all deductions made in pursuance of this section.

Funeral expenses.

35. If any person dies at the Hospital, the amount of any funeral expenses incurred by the Board in respect of that person shall be a debt due to the Board and may be recovered in like manner as if it were a liability incurred under section thirty-two of this Ordinance.

Statement of amount due. 36. A written statement of any amount due under section thirty-two, thirty-four or thirty-five of this Ordinance, purporting to be signed by a person thereto authorized in writing by the Board, shall be *prima facie* evidence of the amount being due.

- 37.—(1.) The Board may remit, wholly or in part, or post-Board may pone the payment of, all or any sums of money becoming due and of money due. payable under this Ordinance for accommodation, maintenance, services, attendance, treatment, removal or burial.
- (2.) For the purposes of the last preceding sub-section, the Chairman of the Board may require any person liable for any payment under this Ordinance to produce to the Board such documents and other information as, in the opinion of the Board, are necessary in order to ascertain the ability of that person to meet his liability in respect of any such accommodation, maintenance, services, attendance, treatment, removal or burial.

PART IV.—MISCELLANEOUS.

- 38.—(1.) The Minister or any person thereto authorized in Special powers writing by him, may, without previous notice, visit and inspect the Hospital at any time he thinks fit.
- (2.) The Minister may at any time call a special meeting of the Board, or require the Chairman of the Board or the Secretary to the Board to call such a meeting, and it shall be the duty of the Chairman or Secretary, as the case may be, to call a meeting accordingly.
- (3.) The Minister, or any person thereto authorized in writing by him, shall be entitled to be present at any meeting of the Board and to speak at any such meeting but shall not take any other part in the proceedings thereof.
- 39.—(1.) The Minister may appoint for the Hospital two official visitors, or more official visitors, at least one of whom shall be a woman.
- (2.) An official visitor shall hold office during the pleasure of the Minister.
- (3.) An official visitor shall report to the Minister at such times, in such manner and on such matters, as the Minister directs.
- 40.—(1.) The Board may make by-laws, not inconsistent with By-laws. this Ordinance, for or with respect to—
 - (a) the admission or discharge of patients and other persons entitled to the benefits of the Hospital;
 - (b) the maintenance of order, discipline, decency and cleanliness among the inmates of the Hospital;
 - (c) the prohibition of the introduction of any specified articles into the Hospital;
 - (d) the charges to be paid in respect of accommodation, maintenance, services, attendance and treatment at or from the Hospital, the hire of plant and equipment of the Hospital, and the removal of patients to or from the Hospital;
 - (c) the duties of the officers, nurses, attendants and servants of the Hospital;
 - (f) the management, care, control and superintendence of the Hospital and the fulfilment of the purposes thereof;
 - (g) the maintenance of order and the regulation of traffic in the Hospital grounds; and
 - (h) the imposition of penalties not exceeding Five pounds for a breach of any by-law.
 - (2., All such by-laws shall be published in the Gazette.
- (3.) Within one month from the date of publication in the Gazette of any by-law, the Minister may disallow the by-law, and the disallowance, on being published in the Gazette, shall annul the by-law from the date of publication.
- 41. The Minister may make regulations, not inconsistent with regulations this Ordinance, prescribing all matters which are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for carrying out or giving effect to this Ordinance.

This section of the examination will consist of questions regarding any of the items in the above syllabus of practical tests, together with questions calculated to test the candidate's knowledge of the principles underlying the ordinary work of a mechanic.

III. Educational-
