CUSTOMS BY-LAWS Nos. 975-990.

I. JOHN ARTHUR PERKINS, for and on behalf of the Minister of State for the Commonwealth of Australia administering the Department of Trade and Customs, do hereby, in pursuance of the *Customs Tariff* 1933-1938, and of all other enabling powers, make the following Departmental By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 982.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 91 (A).

Peanuts for use in the manufacture of oil may be admitted under Tariff Item 91 (A), under security. (Operating on 26th June, 1937; 10th July, 1937; 4th August, 1937; 20th September, 1937; 8th November, 1937; 1st and 8th December, 1937; 20th January, 1938; 22nd March, 1938; and 13th and 14th April, 1938, only.) (T.D. 38/404.)

BY-LAW No. 979.

Milling machine, button, including accessories, for ornamental buttons, capable of producing all straight patterns up to 24 divisions. (Operating on 13th May, 1938, only.)

Motor, electric, pipe ventilated, shunt wound, 36 horse-power, 750/1,500 revolutions per minute. (Operating on 4th July, 1938, only.)

Motor, electric, induction, slipring, totally enclosed, 25 horse-power, 750 revolutions per minute, 3 phase, 25 cycle, 440 volt. (Operating on 1st April, 1938, only.)

Motors, electric, induction, squirrel cage, fan-cooled, totally enclosed, 35 horse-power, 1,430 revolutions per minute, 25 cycle. (Operating on 19th July, 1938, only.)

Motors, electric, induction, squirrel cage, fan-cooled, totally enclosed, 40 horse-power, 1,460 revolutions per minute, 25 cycle. (Operating on 4th July, 1938, only.)

Rings, impact, valves and valve seats, being spare parts for a 1,000 gallons capacity homogenizer for use in connexion with the manufacture of ice cream. (Operating on 24th December, 1937, only.)

Rolls for bearingizer tools for the sizing and surface finishing of metal parts of machines and machine tools. (Operating on 5th February, 1938, only.)

Stringing or looping and knotting machine designed to put a loop of thread in tags, price tickets, booklets, pamphlets, catalogues, price-lists, &c. (Operating on 11th March, 1938, only.)

BY-LAW No. 981.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 219 (c).

The hand tools of trade for the use of artisans and mechanics and hand tools in general use prescribed hereunder when not made wholly of wood, unless otherwise specified, and not being machines, may be admitted under Tariff Item 219 (c), viz.:—

(a) Inserters, keeper, being in the nature of pliers fitted with a specially designed nose and used in connexion with the adjustment of motor engine valves. (Operating on and from 14th April, 1938.) (T.D. 38/396.)

- (b) Replacers, valve key, for use in connexion with the adjustment of motor engine valves. (Operating on and from 14th April, 1938.) (T.D. 38/401.)
- (c) Replacers, split lock, for use in connexion with the adjustment of motor engine valves. (Operating on and from 14th April, 1938.) (T.D. 38/401.)

BY-LAW No. 988.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 229 (c).

By-law No. 49, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended as follows:—

By adding after clause (4) of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 11 the following clauses, viz.:—

- (5) By adding not less than 20 per cent. by volume or weight of linseed oil fatty acids or tung oil fatty acids. Duty shall be paid on the actual quantity of perilla oil used plus 10 per cent.
- (6) By adding not less than 100 parts of phthalic anhydride and 60 parts of glycerine to 250 parts of perilla oil. Duty is to be paid on the actual quantity of perilla oil used plus 10 per cent.

By adding after clause (2) of sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 22, the following clauses, viz.:—

- (3) By adding not less than 20 per cent. by volume or weight of linseed oil fatty acids or tung oil fatty acids. Duty shall be paid on the actual weight of the perilla oil used plus 10 per cent.
- (4) By adding not less than 100 parts of phthalic anhydride and 60 parts of glycerine to 250 parts of perilla oil. Duty is to be paid on the actual quantity of perilla oil used plus 10 per cent.

BY-LAW No. 983.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 231 (B) (3).

The following may be admitted under Tariff Item 231 (B) (3), viz.:—

Barium Sulphate for use in the manufacture of white kalsomine, under security. (Operating on 9th December, 1937; 6th January, 1938; 5th February, 1938; 1st March, 1938, and 1st April, 1938, only.) (T.D. 38/404.)

BY-LAW No. 976.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 264 (D) (2).

Acetates of a class or kind used in the manufacture of acetic acid, as prescribed hereunder, may be admitted under Tariff Item 264 (D) (2), viz.:—

Calcium acetate for use in the manufacture of ester acetates, under security.

By-law No. 54, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words "Calcium acetate for use in the manufacture of amyl acetate and ethyl acetate, under security".

BY-LAW No. 984.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 320 (c) (2) (b) (2).

The following may be admitted under Tariff Item 320 (c) (2) (b) (2), viz.:—

Kinematograph film entitled "Our Chalet" depicting activities of the Girl Guide Movement. (Operating on 23rd June, 1938, only.) (T.D. 38/404.)

BY-LAW No. 978.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 358 (B).

The following parts and materials for use in the manufacture or repair of aeroplanes and other aircraft may be admitted under Tariff Item 358 (B), viz.:—

Batteries, storage, non-spillable, for use solely in aeroplanes and other aircraft in respect of which approval for the performance of aerial acrobatics has been granted by the Civil Aviation Board, under security.

By-law No. 82, published in *Gazette*, No. 39, dated 5th May, 1936, is hereby amended by omitting from sub-paragraph (b) the words "that except in regard to spark plugs set out in (a) above" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "that except in cases where the By-law directs that security be given".

BY-LAW No. 980.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 404.

The materials and minor articles shown in the Second Column of the table hereunder may be admitted under Tariff Item 404 for use in the manufacture within the Commonwealth of the articles shown respectively opposite such materials or minor articles in the first column of the table.

As to all the goods shown in the second column, the qualification, unless otherwise expressly stated, applies that they must not be partly or wholly of gold or silver, but, unless the contrary is specially stated, goods merely gold-plated or silver-plated are not excluded.

Customs Tariff 1933-1938, Item 415A(2).
