AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1938.

B E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

ďΗ

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Ordinance (No. 2) 1938.
- (2.) The Liquor Ordinance 1929-1936, as amended by the Liquor Ordinance 1938, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) Sub-section (3.) of section one of the Liquor Ordinance 1938 is repealed.
- (4.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1938.

Conditions of grant or renewal of Residential Hotel Licence.

- 2. Section twenty of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the proviso to sub-section (1.) and inserting in its stead the following proviso:—
- "Provided that paragraph (d) of this sub-section, in so far as it relates to partitions dividing rooms, shall not apply to premises in respect of which a Residential Hotel Licence was granted or renewed, or a conditional Certificate under section thirty-three of this Ordinance was granted, prior to the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and which were erected at the date of the grant or renewal of the licence or the grant of the certificate as the case may be.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Canberra Community Hospital, Ordinance 1938.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Canberra Com-short title and munity Hospital Ordinance (No. 2) 1938.

(2.) The Canberra Community Hospital Ordinance 1938 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Canberra Community Hospital Ordinances 1938.

2. Section five of the Principal Ordinance is amended by Definitions inserting in the definition of "Hospital Tax", after the word "thirty-four", the words and letter "or thirty-four A".

3. Section eight of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

"8. Any person who, within the period of twelve months ending qualifications on the last Saturday in May in any year, has paid Hospital Tax for enrolment in respect of a period of not less than twenty-six weeks, and the wife of any such person, shall be entitled to enrolment and to vote at the election of members of the Board in that year."

4. After section thirty-four of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

"34A. Where the nature of the employment of an employee voluntary within the meaning of the Hospital Tax Ordinance is such that contributions during portion of the year he is required to reside and is employed employee within the Territory and during the remaining portion of the year he is required to reside and is employed outside the Territory, he may, if he so desires, pay to the Commissioner of Taxation voluntary contributions in respect of the period during which he is employed outside the Territory at the rate specified in the Table contained in section seven of the Hospital Tax Ordinance which is applicable to his average weekly income, and for the purposes of sections eight, nine, thirteen, thirty and thirty-two of this Ordinance such voluntary contributions shall be regarded as hospital tax."


