APPOINTMENT OF A BOARDING STATION IN THE PORT OF PORT ADELAIDE, SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

#### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section fifteen of the Customs Act 1901-1936 it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, appoint boarding stations for the boarding of ships and aircraft by officers. ships and aircraft by officers:

And whereas by Section eighteen of the said Act it is enacted that all boarding stations in actual use by authority at the commencement of that Act shall continue as if appointed under that Act:

And whereas the Semaphore Boarding Station in the port of Port Adelaide, State of South Australia, was in actual use by authority at the commencement of the said Act:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the appointment of the Semaphore Boarding Station and to appoint a Boarding Station in the limits of the port of Port Adelaide in the State of South Australia and to fix the limits of such Boarding Station:

Now therefore I, Alexander Gore Arkwright, Baron Gowrie, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said appointment and do appoint the following Boarding Station in the port of Port Adelaide, State of South Australia, to be a Boarding Station within the meaning of the said Act and fix the limits of such Boarding Station to be as follows:—

#### OUTER HARBOUR BOARDING STATION.

All those waters within the port of Port Adelaide bounded by an imaginary line from a Point (a) with Wonga Shoal Light bearing 180° 22 cables, thence 000° 7 cables, thence 270° 15 cables, thence 180° 7 cables, thence 090° 15 cables to point (a).

### AN ORDINANCE

## For the Revision and Amendment of certain Ordinances of the Australian Capital Territory.

B E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Ordinances Short title Revision Ordinance 1938.

### AN ORDINANCE

#### To amend the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930-1938.

B it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

#### Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance (No. 2) 1938.
- (2.) Sub-section (3.) of section one of the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1938 is repealed.
- (3.) The Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930-1937, as amended by the Seat of Government (Designation) Ordinance 1938 and by the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1938, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (4.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930-1938.

#### Power to delegate under regulations.

- 2. Section eight of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting after the word "Minister" (second occurring) the words "administering that Ordinance".
- 3. Section ten of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

#### Administration of Ordinances

- "10. The Ordinances, the titles of which are specified in Column 1 of the Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Schedules to this Ordinance shall, to the extent specified in Column 2 of those Schedules, be administered respectively by—
  - (a) the Prime Minister;
  - (b) the Attorney-General;
  - (c) the Minister of State for Health;
  - (d) the Minister of State for the Interior;
  - (e) the Treasurer; and
  - (f) the Minister of State for Works.".
