TION TO THE SOLICITOR GENERA

DELEGATION TO THE SOLICITOR-GENERAL.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of the Solicitor-General Act 1916 the Attorney-General is empowered by writing under his hand to delegate any of his powers or functions under any Act (except that power of delegation), so that the delegated powers may be exercised by the Solicitor-General as fully and effectually as by the Attorney-General:

Now therefore I, John Albert Beasley, the Minister of State for Defence, acting for and on behalf of the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth, do hereby delegate to the Solicitor-General of the Commonwealth all the powers and functions of the Attorney-General under—

(a) the Lands Acquisition Act 1906-1936;

(b) the Statutory Declarations Act 1911-1944;
(c) any Acts of the Commonwealth relating to Patents,
Trade Marks, Designs or Copyright, or any Regulations thereunder;

(d) section sixty-one of the Judiciary Act 1903-1940;

- (e) the War Precautions Act Repeal Act 1920-1934, or any Regulations made under the War Precautions Act Repeal Act 1920 or made under that Act as subsequently amended;
- (f) section two hundred and eight of the Bankruptcy Act 1924-1933;
- (g) section ten, sub-section (4.), of the National Security Act 1939-1943;
- (h) the National Security (Land Transfer) Regulations, being regulations under the National Security Act 1939-1943, or under any amendments of those Regulations;
- (i) the Peace Officers Act 1925-

(1) Power to grant increments to Peace Officers within the limits of remuneration approved by the Governor-General in Council;

(2) Power to promote Peace Officers of any rank or grade, other than that of Superintending Peace Officer or Deputy Superintending Peace Officer;

(3) Power to authorize Peace Officers to resign their offices or to withdraw from the duties

thereof;
(4) Power to dismiss any Peace Officer where he is satisfied that the Peace Officer has committed an offence of such a ser ous nature. or his services are so unsatisfactory, that he should no longer be permitted to hold office as a Peace Officer; and

(5) Power to terminate the appointment of any Peace Officer-

(i) where the Commonwealth Medical officer has certified that in his opinion the Peace Officer is in such condition of health that it is not possible for him to perform his duties with reasonable efficiency; hose sick leave gradity are

(ii) whose sick leave credits exhausted: and

hose services are no longer required in view of the reduction in the amount of work to be done (iii) whose and for whom no other suitable position is available elsewhere; and

(j) the sections hereinafter specified of the following Ordinances of the Austral an Capital Territory made under the Scat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Scat of Government (Administration) Act 1910, or made under either or both of

those Acts as subsequently amended:—
(1) sections three and six of the Maintenance
Orders (Facilities for Enforcement)
Ordinance 1927-1938;

(2) section six, sub-section (1A.), of the Police Superannuation Ordinance 1928-1945; and

(3) section five of the Police Ordinance 1927-1943 insofar as that section appl es to the appointment of constables, the promotion of members of the Police Force not higher than the rank of sergeant and the granting to members of the Police Force increments and allowances within such limits, and on such conditions, as have been approved generally or in like cases by the Attorney-General.

This instrument of delegation shall continue in force until the return of the Attorney-General to Australia.
