NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2191.

Oysters.

IN pursuance of the powers delegated to me by the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner pursuant to regulation 46 of the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Second Assistant Prices Commissioner, Prices Branch, Canberra, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2191.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1955 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of this Order and the Schedule thereto—

“Standard sack” means a sack measuring not less than 39 inches high and 25 inches wide;

“by retail” means in relation to any sale of oysters that such sale is a sale by retail as defined by regulation 33 of the National Security (Prices) Regulations, and that the quantity sold is not in excess of twelve dozen oysters;

“oysters” mean any oysters other than cooked oysters; “by wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of oysters, that such sale is not a retail sale as defined in this paragraph.

Sales by wholesale—Prescribed areas.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which oysters may be sold by wholesale in the Sydney metropolitan area or Melbourne metropolitan area (hereinafter referred to as the prescribed areas) to be the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

Sales by wholesale—Outside prescribed areas.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which oysters may be sold by wholesale outside the prescribed areas to be—

(a) where transported from a prescribed area—the maximum price fixed for the sale of those oysters in the prescribed area from which they are transported, plus the cost of transport actually incurred in transporting the oysters from such prescribed area to the place of delivery;

(b) where not transported from a prescribed area—the maximum price fixed for the sale of those oysters in the prescribed area which includes or is nearest to the place where those oysters were gathered, less the usual cost of transport to such prescribed area from the place where such oysters were gathered.

Sales by retail—Prescribed areas.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which oysters may be sold by retail in the prescribed areas to be the price specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Sales by retail—Outside prescribed areas.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which oysters may be sold by retail outside the prescribed areas to be the price fixed for the sale by retail of those oysters in the nearest prescribed area, plus the cost of transport (if any) actually incurred by the retail seller and properly attributable to the transport of such oysters to his premises and noted on an invoice delivered to him in relation to those oysters.

Delivery of invoices or dockets.

8. Every person who sells by wholesale oysters, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by or under the National Security (Prices) Regulations, shall deliver with those oysters a docket or invoice containing the following particulars:—

- name of purchaser;
- number of oysters sold;
- price per dozen, or per sack, charged for those oysters;
- total price of those oysters.

Variation of maximum prices by notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I declare the maximum price at which any oysters specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Second-hand Domestic Washing Machines—New South Wales.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2192.

Definition.

2. In this Order—

“second-hand” means used.

Maximum prices—Machines specified in Schedule.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any second-hand domestic washing machine of the description specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold in New South Wales to be the price specified therein.

Variation of maximum prices by notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any second-hand domestic washing machine specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
