### NATIONAL SECURITY (RATIONING) REGULATIONS. RATIONING ORDER No. 103.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the National Security (Rationing) Regulations, the Rationing Commission hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Rationing Order No. 103.

### Interpretation.

2. This Order shall be read and construed with the Rationing Order No. 44 and, unless the contrary intention appears, expressions used in this Order shall have the same meaning as those expressions have in that Order.

### Coupons marked "D" to be available.

- -(1.) Subject to the next succeeding sub-paragraphs, 3.—(1.) Subject to the next succeeding sub-paragraphs, coupons which form or formed part of a ration document marked "D 1945-6" printed in black on pink paper shall, for the purposes of the Rationing Order No. 44, be deemed to be tea coupons and shall be available for the supply of tea to, and the obtaining of tea by, consumers until midnight on Sunday the twenty-first day of October, 1945.
