Spirituous and Fermented Liquors-Tasmania.

Spirituous and Fermented Liquors—Tasmunia.

WHEREAS it is provided, inter alia, by sub-regulation (1B) of regulation 23 of the National Security (Prices) Regulations that the powers conferred by paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (1) of regulation 23 of those Regulations to fix and declare by Order published in the Gazette, the maximum price at which any declared goods may be sold shall for all purposes be deemed to be validly exercised by an Order so published which fixes any such price by reference to a list of prices approved by the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner and issued by a body or association of persons which is recognized by the Commissioner, in the case of sales by a trader in goods, to be representative of the traders in the goods in relation to the sale of which the price is so fixed. is so fixed.

And whereas the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner has recognized the Tasmanian Licensed Victuallers' Association and the Northern Divisions of the Tasmanian Branch, United Licensed Victuallers' Association of Australia, as representative of traders in spirituous and fermented liquors in Tasmania.

Tasmania.

And whereas the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner has approved of the following lists of retail prices (hereinafter referred to as the "said lists") that is to say—(a) the list issued by the Tasmanian Licensed Victuallers' Association, and stated to be "Retail Price List on and after 26th October, 1942, for all hotels situated within the Metropolitan of Hobart" (hereinafter referred to as "the Hobart List") and (b) the list issued by the Tasmanian Licensed Victuallers' Association and stated to be "Retail Price List on and after 1942, for all hotels situated outside the Metropolitan of the Metropolitan and stated to be "Retail Price List on and after 1942, for all hotels situated outside the Metropolitan of Association and stated to be Retail Frie List on and after 26th October, 1942, for all hotels situated outside the Metropolitan Area of Hobart" (hereinafter referred to as "the South Tasmanian List") and (c) the list issued by the Northern Divisions of Tasmanian Branch United Licensed Northern Divisions of Tasmanian Branch United Licensed Victuallers' Association of Australia and stated to be "Amended Retail Price List Metropolitan Area of Northern Division of the U.L.V.A. of Australia—Tasmanian Branch—operative from 10th November, 1942" (hereinafter referred to as "the Launceston List") and (d) the list issued by the Northern Divisions of Tasmanian Branch of the United Licensed Victuallers' Association and stated to be "Amended Retail Price List Northern Divisions of Tasmanian Branch U.L.V.A. of Australia (excluding Launceston Metropolitan Area)—on and after 12th November, 1942" (hereinafter referred to as the North Tasmanian List").

Now therefore, I, Douglas Berry Copland, the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2227.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1629 as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 1719, 1883, 2015 and 2109 is hereby

Definitions.

3.—(1.) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-

(a) "Bottle" means a bottle which is reputed to contain

(a) "Bottle" means a bottle which is reputed to contain 26 fluid ounces;
(b) "Launceston City Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Launceston, Tasmania;
(c) "The Metropolitan Area of Hobart" means all that area comprised within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, Hobart;
(d) "Nobbler" means one fluid ounce;
(e) "Northern Area of Tasmania" means that part of Tasmania north and west of the line referred to in sub-paragraph (g) hereof, but does not include the Launceston City Area;
(f) "Oz." means fluid ounce or ounces as the case may be;

may be;

(g) "Southern Area of Tasmania" means all that area of Tasmania south and east of a line commencing at a point on the coast of Tasmania, two miles northward of Swansea Post Office and proceeding to a point two miles due north of Derwent Bridge and thence to the northernmost extremity of Port Davey but does not include the Metropolitan Area of Hobart;

(h) Unless otherwise stated, the prices of all spirits are for a measured nobbler;

(i) "Imported" means, in relation to any spirits, that those spirits are not manufactured in Australia.

(2.) For the purpose of this Order where any bottled spirituous or fermented liquor is sold without a label bearing

the brand and description of that liquor, that liquor shall be deemed not to be of any of the brands or descriptions set out in the said lists.

Prices specified in lists.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the spirituous or fermented liquors specified in the said lists may be sold in Tasmania to be—

(a) for sales in the Metropolitan Area of Hobart—the price set out in the Hobart List;
(b) for sales in the Southern Area of Tasmania—the prices set out in the South Tasmanian List;
(c) for sales in the Launceston City Area—the prices set out in the Launceston List;
(d) for sales in the Northern Area of Tasmania—the prices set out in the North Tasmanian List.

Certain sales with aerated waters.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I fix and declare the maximum price at which any spirituous or fermented liquors may be sold other than by the bottle together with aerated waters or cordials as set out hereunder to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of such spirituous or fermented liquors plus-

(i) where imported spirits are sold with Tasmanian aerated waters or bottled mineral waters (whether

the contents are used by one or more persons)—
threepence per 7-oz. bottle;

(ii) where imported spirits are sold with other Australian aerated waters or bottled mineral waters (whether the contents are used by one or more persons), civing the state of the solution of t -sixpence per 7-oz. bottle; persons)-

Liquors and quantities not specified.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind or quantity of spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, or any mixture of liquids containing any spirituous or fermented liquors, for the sale of which a maximum price is not fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, may be sold by any person to be by any person to be-

(i) in respect of sales of beer, ale, stout or lager (together with any container supplied therewith) -an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such beer, ale, stout

or lager;

(ii) in respect of sales of whisky, brandy, gin, schnapps or rum (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such whisky,

threepence for each fluid ounce of such whisky, brandy, gin, schnapps or rum;

(iii) in respect of sales of any spirituous or fermented liquors other than those specified in sub-paragraphs (i) or (ii) hereof or any mixture of spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture of liquids containing spirituous or fermented liquor (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such spirituous or fermented each fluid ounce of such spirituous or fermented liquor or mixture:

Provided that if any price calculated under the provisions of this paragraph is not an exact number of pence or half-pence that maximum price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

Exhibition of price list.

7. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail any spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business and in each of the bars, dining rooms and lounges at such place or places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum prices fixed by this Order for the sale by him of any kind and quantity of such spirituous or fermented liquors. I hereby declare that any form of notice shall be deemed to be an approved form if it is otherwise in compliance with regulation 45 of the National Security (Prices) Regulations.

Sales by wholesale.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I fix and declare the maximum price at which any spirituous or fermented liquor may be sold by wholesale in Tasmania to be the maximum price fixed for such sale by wholesale other than by such foregoing provisions, subject however in each case to the maximum limit imposed by those foregoing provisions.

Variation of maximum prices by notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any spirituous or fermented liquors specified in a notice in pursuance of this

paragraph may be sold in Tasmania by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.

CONTROL OF BUILDING MATERIALS ORDER (No. 3).

N pursuance of regulation 59 of the National Security (General) Regulations, I, John Johnstone Dedman, the Minister of State for Post-war Reconstruction, hereby make the following Order:-

Citation.

l. This Order may be cited as the Control of Building Materials Order (No. 3).

Administration.

2. Paragraph 2 of the Control of Building Materials Order is amended by omitting the words "Post-war Reconstruction" and inserting in their stead the words "Works and Housing".

Saving of appointments, &c.

3. The Control of Building Materials Order is amended by inserting after paragraph 13 the following paragraph:—

"Saving of appointments, &c.

"14 Every appointment which was made, every consent, licence, permission, exemption, approval or other authority

whatsoever which was granted, and every notice, direction or requirement which was given or made under this Order by the Minister of State for Post-war Reconstruction or the Minister of State for War Organization of Industry, or by a delegate of either of those Ministers, and which was in force immediately prior to the commencement of this paragraph, shall continue in force as if made, granted or given under this Order by the Minister of State for Works and Housing."
