NATIONAL SECURITY (FISH) REGULATIONS.

SALE OF FISH (NEW SOUTH WALES) ORDER

pursuance of regulation 5 of the National Security (Fish) Regulations, I, John Johnstone Dedman, Minister of State Post-war Reconstruction, hereby make the following

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as the Sale of Fish (New South Wales) Order.

Administration.

2. This Order shall be administered by the Minister of State for Post-war Reconstruction.

Application.

3. This Order shall apply to the State of New South Wales.

Definitions.

4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-

"authorized person" means a person in whom the control of any fish market is vested under the Fish Markets (New South Wales) Order;
"district" means the Metropolitan Fish Supply District constituted under the Fisheries and Oyster Farms Act, 1935-1942, of the State and any other fish supply district constituted under and for the purposes of that Act in which a fish market is situate;
"fish market" means the fish market established at the

"fish market" means the fish market established at the date of commencement of the Fisheries and Oyster Farms (Amendment) Act, 1942, of the State by the Municipal Council of Sydney in the Metropolitan Fish Supply District in pursuance of section 195 of the Sydney Corporation Act, 1932-1942, of the State, and the fish market established at Newcastle in the State in pursuance of section 41s of the Fisheries and Oyster Farms Act, 1935-1942, of the State, and any other fish market established for a district under that Act;

"original owner" has the same meaning as in section 4 of the Fisheries and Oyster Farms Act, 1935-1942. of

the State; "the Chief Secretary" means the Chief Secretary of New

South Wales;
"the State" means the State of New South Wales;
"to sell" means to sell by wholesale or by retail or by auction, and includes to barter or exchange, supply for profit, offer for sale, receive for sale, have in possession for sale, expose for sale, send, forward or deliver for sale, cause or suffer or allow to be sold, offered or exposed for sale, and words derived therefrom have a corresponding meaning.

Restriction on delivery and sale of fish.

- 5.—(1.) All fish taken or landed by an original owner in any district or brought by him into any district or brought into any district by any other person shall be delivered to the authorized person in that district.
- (2.) This paragraph shall take effect as from a date fixed by the Chief Secretary by notice published in the New South Wales Government Gazette.
- (3.) This paragraph shall not apply to any sale or delivery of fish by-
 - (a) a fisherman who is the holder of a consent under sub-section (3.) of section 40s of the Fisheries and Oyster Farms Act, 1935-1942, of the State and who complies with all the terms and conditions of the consent;

(b) a person who has taken or landed fish or brought fish into a district for his own consumption or that of the household where he resides; or
(c) a person who sells or delivers fish in pursuance of the authority or the direction of the Chief Secretary or an authorized person and who complies with all the terms and conditions of that authority or with that direction direction.

Transport and processing of fish.

6.-(1.) A person shall not for gain or reward engage in the transport or processing of fish unless he is the holder of a licence issued by the Chief Secretary and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of the licence.

(2.) This paragraph shall take effect as from a date fixed by the Chief Secretary by notice published in the New South Wales Government Gazette.

(3.) This paragraph shall not apply to the transport of fish purchased in pursuance of an essential consumer's certificate under the National Security (Fish) Regulations.

Authorized person may sell fish delivered at fish market.

7.—(1.) An authorized person may take delivery of, and sell on behalf of the consignor, any fish delivered at a fish market, as if that fish had been consigned to him with authority for him so to sell it.

(2.) An authorized person may exercise the powers conferred on him by the last preceding sub-paragraph notwithstanding that the fish was consigned to some other person or was not consigned to any other person.

Delivery and sale of certain fish excluded.

- 8. This Order shall not apply to the delivery or sale in any district of—

 (a) canned, smoked or cured fish; or

 (b) oysters.

Terms and conditions of authority and licence.

- -(1.) The terms and conditions of any authority or licence issued under this Order may-
 - (a) be made to apply to the whole of the State or to any district of the State specified in the authority or

(b) be made so as to operate for any period or periods, for any time or times, or for any occasion or occasions, specified therein; and
(c) be of general operation or of specially limited operation according to time, place, circumstances,

(c) be of general operation of of specially limited opera-tion according to time, place, circumstances, conditions or restrictions.

(2.) Any authority, direction or licence issued under this der may be revoked, varied or amended by the Chief Order may Secretary.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2229.

Spirituous Liquors-New South Wales-Country Areas No. 6. In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order

Definitions and interpretations.

"Prescribed areas" means all those areas of New South Wales comprised within a radius of 3 miles from the principal post office of each of the following places:—Adaminaby, Araluen, Ashford, Baldry, Barham, Bemboka, Bendemeer, Berridale, Bingara, Boggabilla, Bonalbo, Bonshaw, Boomi, Booroorban, Bundarra, Burns, Byrock, Canbelego, Carinda, Cassilis, Cathcart, Cobbadah, Collarenebri, Collie, Coolabah, Cooyal, Dareton, Dalgety, Darlington Point, Deepwater, Delegate, Delungra, Dungowan, Ebor, Emmaville, Euabalong, Fifield, Garah, Girilambone, Glencoe, Gol Gol, Goodooga, Goolgowi, Goolma, Graman, Gravesend, Gulargambone, Hatfield, Hermidale, Hill End, Hillston, Ivanhoe, Jennings, Jindabyne, Jingellic, Jugiong, Kyalite, Laurel Hill, Lightning Ridge, Little Billabong, Majors Creek, Maude, Menindie, Merriwagga, Moonbi, Mount Gipps, Mount Hope, Mullaley, Mungindi, Murray Downs, Nundle, Nymagee, Pilliga, Quanbone, Quondong, Rockwell, Stephen's Creek, Silverton, Somerton, Talbingo, Talmalmo, Tambar Springs, Tingha, Tomingley, Tooleybuc, Tooma, Tooraweenah, Torrington, Urbenville, Walgett, Wangonilla, Warialda, Wentworth, Wilcannia, Wollar, Wyndham, Yanco Glen, Yarrangobilly, and all those areas comprised within a radius of 3 miles from each of the following hotels—Kosciusko Hotel and The Chalet, Kosciusko; "spirituous liquors" means any spirituous or fermented

within a radius of 3 miles from each of the following hotels—Kosciusko Hotel and The Chalet, Kosciusko; "spirituous liquors" means any spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, and includes any mixture thereof with aerated waters; "aerated waters" includes cordials, fruit drinks and bottled mineral waters; "mixed spirit drinks" means any mixture containing gm, whisky, schnapps, brandy or rum, prepared by the seller and served and consumed on his premises; "5-oz. glass" means any glass or similar container containing not less than 5 oz.; "small 7-oz. glass" means any glass or similar container containing less than 7 oz.; "7-oz. glass" means any glass or similar container containing 7 oz. or more but less than 8 oz.; "8-oz. glass" means any glass or similar container containing 8 oz. or more but less than 16 oz.; "16-oz. glass" means any glass or similar container containing not less than 16 oz.;

"16-oz. glass" means any glass or similar container containing not less than 16 oz.;
"oz." means fluid ounce or ounces as the case may be;
"inp" means 1 fluid ounce;
"quarter bottle" means a reputed half pint (6½ fluid

onnes)

ounces);
"half bottle" means a reputed pint (13 fluid ounces);
"bottle" means a reputed quart (26 fluid ounces);
"quart or flagon" means an imperial quart (40 fluid ounces?

"split bottle" means 7 fluid ounces.

(2.) Where any price calculated under the provisions of this Order is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, such price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

(3.) For the purpose of this Order, where any bottled spirituous liquors are sold without a label bearing the brand and description of that liquor, that liquor shall be deemed not to be of any of the brands or descriptions set out in the Schedule to this Order.

Maximum prices-Liquors specified in Schedule.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any spirituous liquors specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold in the prescribed areas to be the price specified in that Schedule.

Maximum prices-Non-listed liquors or unspecified quantities of listed liquors.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind or quantity of spirituous liquors or any mixture thereof, or any mixture of liquids containing any spirituous or fermented liquors, for the sale of which a maximum price is not fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, may be sold in the prescribed areas by any person, to be—

(a) in respect of sales of hear all start or liquid.

(a) in respect of sales of beer, ale, stout or lager (together with any container supplied therewith)
—an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such beer, ale, stout or lager:

or lager;
(b) in respect of sales of whisky, brandy, gin, schnapps or rum (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such whisky,

brandy, gin, schnapps or rum; or

(c) in respect of sales of any spirituous liquors other
than those specified in sub-paragraphs (a) or (b)
hereof, or any mixture of spirituous liquors or any

mixture of liquids containing spirituous liquors (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such spirituous liquor or mixture.

Sales by wholesale-Maximum prices.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which any spirituous liquors may be sold in the prescribed areas by wholesale to be the maximum price fixed for such sale by wholesale other than by such foregoing provisions, subject however, in each case, to the maximum limit imposed by those foregoing provisions. provisions.

Exhibition of price list.

6. Every person who sells or has for sale any spirituous liquors or any mixture thereof, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, and in each of the bars, dining rooms and lounges at such place or places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum price fixed by this Order for any kind and quantity of such spirituous liquors or mixture thereof. I hereby declare that any notice shall be deemed to be an approved form if it is otherwise in compliance with regulation 45 of the National Security (Prices) Regulations. of the National Security (Prices) Regulations.

Variation of maximum prices by notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which spirituous liquors specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

SPECIFICATION UNDER REGULATION 4A.

IN pursuance of paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (2.) of regulation 4A of the National Security (Female Minimum Rates) Regulations, I, Edward James Holloway, the Minister of State for Labour and National Service, hereby specify the following vital industries, parts of vital industries and occupations within vital industries:—

The aircraft manufacturing and assembling industry.

The munitions manufacturing industry.

The industries carried on in motor body, coach or carriage building establishments.

The occupations of the domestic staffs of hospitals, asylums and institutions of a like nature.

NATIONAL SECURITY (FISH) REGULATIONS.

FISH MARKETS (NEW SOUTH WALES) ORDER.

N pursuance of regulation 9 of the National Security (Fish)
Regulations, I, John Johnstone Dedman, Minister of State
or Post-war Reconstruction, hereby make the following

This Order may be cited as the Fish Markets (New South Wales) Order.

Administration.

2. This Order shall be administered by the Minister of State for Post-war Reconstruction.

Application.

3. This Order shall apply to the State of New South Wales.

Definitions.

4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-

"Newcastle Fish Market" means the fish market estab-lished at Newcastle in the State of New South Wales in pursuance of section 41B of the Fisheries and Oyster

in pursuance of section 41B of the Fisheries and Oyster Farms Act, 1935-1942, of the State;
"Sydney Fish Market" means the fish market established at the date of commencement of the Fisheries and Oyster Farms (Amendment) Act, 1942 of the State by the Municipal Council of Sydney in the Metropolitan Fish Supply District in pursuance of section 195 of the Sydney Corporation Act, 1932-1942, of the State.

"the State" means the State of New South Wales.

Control of fish markets.

5.—(1.) The control of the Sydney Fish Market shall, as on and from the seventeenth day of September, 1945, be vested in the corporation sole constituted by section 41a of the Fisheries and Oyster Farms Act, 1935-1942, of the State under the name of the Chief Secretary of New South Wales.

the name of the Chief Secretary of New South Wales.

(2.) As from a date fixed by the Minister by notice published in the Gazette, the control of the Sydney Fish Market shall be transferred to and be vested in an association specified in the notice which has been formed under the Co-operation Act, 1923-1945, of the State and the component societies of which are trading societies formed under Division 3 of Part II. of that Act for the object of carrying on the industry of fishing.

(3.) As from a date fixed by the Minister by notice published in the Gazette, the control of the Newcastle Fish Market shall be transferred to and be vested in a trading society specified in the notice which has been formed under Division 3 of Part II. of the Co-operation Act, 1923-1945, of the State for the object of carrying on the industry of fishing.

(4.) A person, other than the person in whom the control of

(4.) A person, other than the person in whom the control of the Sydney Fish Market or the Newcastle Fish Market is for the time being vested in pursuance of this paragraph, shall not sell fish in either the Sydney Fish Market or the Newcastle Fish Market, as the case may be.

Mode of sale.

6. A person in whom the control of any fish market is vested in pursuance of the last preceding paragraph may sell fish in that fish market by wholesale or retail or by private contract or at public auction.
