NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

CONTROL OF PRODUCTION AND DISTRIBUTION OF FOOTWEAR ORDER (No. 2).

IN pursuance of regulation 59 of the National Security (General) Regulations, I, William Patrick Ashley, Minister of State for Supply and Shipping, hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Production and Distribution of Footwear Order (No. 2).
- 2. The Control of Production and Distribution of Footwear Order is amended by adding after paragraph 1 the following paragraph la:-

1A. This Order shall be administered by the Minister of State for Supply and Shipping.

- 3. Paragraph 2 of the Control of Production and Distribu-tion of Footwear Order is amended by omitting the definition of "the Controller" and inserting in its stead the following definition:
 - "Controller" means the person for the time being appointed by the Minister to be the Controller of Footwear and Leather Goods and includes any person for the time being appointed by the Minister to be the Deputy of the Controller or to act for the Controller for all or any purposes of this Order."

NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

REVOCATION OF DECLARATION OF WATER AND SEWERAGE WORKS TO BE PROHIBITED PLACES.

TO BE PROHIBITED PLACES.

WHEREAS by sub-regulation (1.) of regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that if it appears to the Minister to be necessary or expedient in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community that special precautions should be taken for the security of any place he may by order declare that place to be a prohibited place for the purpose of these Regulations:

And whereas by an order made on the 15th day of July, 1942, pursuant to the said regulation 4, John Johnstone Dedman, Minister of State for War Organization of Industry, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Defence, declared all places in Australia which are under the control of declared all places in Australia which are under the control of a governmental, semi-governmental, municipal or local authority or body engaged in the supply of water or the maintenance and control of a sewerage system and being places used primarily for the collection, storage, conveyance or disposal of water or of sewage and in particular but without limiting the generality of the foregoing all reservoirs, open viaducts and channels, water towers, exposed water mains, syphons and pumping stations and where they and any of

them are surrounded by or contained in any such enclosure were declared to be prohibited places for the purposes of the National Security (General) Regulations:

And whereas it appears to me, Francis Michael Forde, Minister of State for the Army, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Defence, that it is no longer necessary or expedient in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community that special precautions should be taken for the security of those places referred to in the said Order made on the 15th day of July, 1942: of July, 1942:

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2232.

-Queensland. Milk-

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2232.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1947 as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 2113 is hereby amended—

- (a) by omitting from sub-paragraph (1.) of paragraph 3
 the definition of Brisbane metropolitan area, and
 inserting in its stead the following definition:
 "Brisbane metropolitan area" means all that area
 constituted under the name of the "City of
 Brisbane" by the City of Brisbane Act of 1924 of the State of Queensland;
- (b) by inserting after paragraph 6 the following paragraph:-
 - Deposits."6A. No charge shall be made for any deposit on ' any bottle unless that deposit is refundable to the purchaser on the return of a bottle of the same size and brand, and does not exceed—

(a) in respect of 1-pint bottles—3d. per bottle;

(b) in respect of ½-pint bottles-2d. per bottle." inserting after paragraph 7 the following (c) by paragraph:

Exhibition of price lists.

"8. Every person who sells milk by retail in the area to which this Order applies shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of milk by him by retail. Any such notice shall be deemed to be in a form approved by the Commissioner if it is otherwise in compliance with regulation 45 of the National Security with regulation 45 of (Prices) Regulations."

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2233.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 2073 is hereby amended-

(a) by omitting paragraph 3 and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:-

"3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears, the Brisbane metropolitan area means all that area constituted under the name of the 'City of Brisbane' by the City of Brisbane Act of 1924 of the State of Queensland."

(b) by omitting paragraph 4 and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:—

"4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which milk may be sold in the Brisbane metropolitan area or in the town of Redcliffe, including any delivery, to be the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order."

(c) by omitting the Schedule, and inserting in its stead the Schedule to this Order.
