NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS. PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2249.

Secondhand Vacuum Cleaners—New South Wales.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order—

Citation.

- 1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2249.

 Definition.
 - 2. In this Order-
 - "Secondhand" means used.

Maximum prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any secondhand vacuum cleaner referred to in the Schedule to this Order may be sold to be the price specified therein.

Exhibition of price tickets.

- 4.—(1.) Any person who sells or has for sale, other than by auction, any secondhand vacuum cleaner shall attach to those goods or display in relation to those goods, a ticket or label setting forth his selling price for that vacuum cleaner.
- (2.) Any ticket or label required by this Order to be attached to or displayed in relation to any goods shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods, and as to be properly associated therewith.

Advertisements.

5.—(1.) Any person who advertises a secondhand vacuum cleaner for sale shall include in such advertisement the following particulars—

(a) the name and address of the advertiser;

(b) the make and description of such secondhand vacuum cleaner;
(c) the maximum price fixed under the National Security (Prices) Regulations for the sale of that second-

hand vacuum cleaner;
(d) the price which he intends to accept for such secondhand vacuum cleaner (hereinafter referred to as

hand vacuum cleaner (hereinafter referred to as the "selling price");

(2.) Such advertisement may be in the following form:—
(Make and description.)

(Name and address of advertiser.)

£...... (selling price). Maximum price under the N.S.(P.)R. £.....

Variation of maximum price by notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any secondhand vacuum cleaner specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2250.

Knitted Fabric.

National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order-

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2250.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-"Capital city" means any of the metropolitan areas of Adelaide, Brisbane, Hobart, Melbourne, Perth or Sydney as defined in Prices Regulation Order No. 1598:

"the specified fabric" means-

- (a) 54 inch warp loom knitted fabric manufactured from 140 denier acetate rayon yarn and marketed by Tradition Manufacturing Company, 289 Flinders-lane, Melbourne, as "Celtex"; and

 (b) 54 inch warp loom knitted fabric manufactured from 140 denier acetate rayon yarn and marketed by American Importers, 289 Flinders-lane, Melbourne.
- Flinders-lane, Melbourne.

Maximum prices-Specified fabric.

- 3. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 4 of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which the specified fabric may be sold to be-

 - (a) in respect of sales to manufacturers or to wholesalers or to retailers, the price calculated at—

 (i) the rate per pound specified in the
 Schedule to this Order; or

 (ii) the rate per lineal yard specified in that
 Schedule, whichever is the lesser; or

 (b) in respect of sales by retail—the price per lineal
 yard specified in the said Schedule.

Transport and insurance.

4. The maximum prices specified in the Schedule to this 4. The maximum prices specified in the Schedule to this Order include transport to railhead or wharf of the capital city nearest the purchaser's place of business, plus insurance of that fabric during transit, and in any case where the seller does not bear the cost of transport and insurance or any part thereof, the maximum prices so specified shall be reduced accordingly.

Sales of unspecified fabrics by Tradition Manufacturing Company and American Importers.

5. Persons trading as Tradition Manufacturing Company, of 289 Flinders-lane, Melbourne, or as American Importers of the same address shall not sell any knitted fabric, other than the specified fabric, unless and until they have made a written request to the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner to fix the maximum price at which that fabric maximum price at which that fabric maximum has sald to fix the maximum price at which that fabric may be sold and the Commonwealth Prices Commissioner has fixed the maximum price accordingly.

Variation of maximum prices by notice—Sales by any person.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any knitted fabric specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be

sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Trading with the Enemy Act 1939-1940.

GIFT PARCELS OR PACKAGES TO ITALY.

IT is notified for public information that for the purposes of the licence granted by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia pursuant to section 15 of the Trading with the Enemy Act 1939-1940 on the second day of May, 1945, and published in the Gazette, No. 89, dated the third day of May, 1945, which exempted from the provisions of that act the following class of transactions, namely:—

The transmission to parsons resident in any of the

The transmission to persons resident in any of the territories specified in the Schedule to that licence of parcels or packages containing foodstuffs, wearing apparel, medicinal preparations or toilet articles, provided none of the goods contained in such parcels or packages is the subject of a commercial or business transaction between arm person or body of persons of whetever between any person or body of persons of whatever nationality (and if incorporated, wherever incorporated) resident or carrying on business in any of those territories and any person or body of persons of whatever nationality resident elsewhere,

the following additional territories in Italy have by virtue of the approval given on 12th September, 1945, been added to the territories so specified:-

The whole of Sicily and Sardinia.
