NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

APPOINTMENT OF COMPENSATION BOARD UNDER REGULATION 60L.

And whereas it is desired to revoke the appointment of the said Compensation Board and to appoint in its stead the Compensation Board named hereunder:

Now therefore I, Francis Michael Forde, Minister of State for the Army, for myself and for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Defence, do hereby revoke the appointment of the said Compensation Board for the Northern Territory Lines of Communication Area and appoint in its stead the following Compensation Board for the purpose of assessing the compensation payable in respect of any loss or damage suffered by reason of anything done by me or by my authority or direction or by the Minister of State for Defence or by his authority or direction—

(a) in pursuance of regulation 53, 54, 55 or 56 of the National Security (General) Regulations;
(b) in respect of any furniture or equipment requisitioned in pursuance of sub-regulation (1.) of regulation 57 of the National Security (General) Regulations or the Defence Impressment Order, being furniture or equipment contained in any building the subject of any action under the said regulation 53, 54, 55 or 56; or
(c) in pursuance of sub-regulation (1.) or (2.) of regulation 57 of the National Security (General) Regulations or the Defence Impressment Order in relation to—

tions or the Defence Impressment Order in relation to-

(i) vehicles (including motor cycles) of all kinds; or
 (ii) tools, equipment and prime movers of all kinds required for use in connexion therewith—

NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2270.

Maize—Queensland.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:-

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2270.

Revocation.

2. Insofar as it relates to sales of maize in Queensland, Prices Regulation Order No. 1617, as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 1717, 1750 and 1927 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-

"Atherton" means all that area comprised within a radius of five miles from the principal post office, Atherton, Queensland.

"Bag" means three bushels.

"Brisbane" means all that area constituted under the

Brisbane" means all that area constituted under the name of the "City of Brisbane" by the City of Brisbane Act of 1924.

"Bushel" means, in relation to whole or cracked maize, 56 pounds weight.

"Wallangarra" means all that area comprised within a radius of five miles from the principal post office, Wallangarra, Queensland.

"Rockhampton" means all that area of Queensland comprised within a radius of

"Rockhampton" means all that area of Queensland comprised within a radius of five miles from the principal post office, Rockhampton.
"Current cost of transport" means the flat ton rate per mile as charged by the Queensland State Railway Department for the transport of maize.

Sales by growers—Maize (other than cracked maize).

4. I fix and declare the maximum price inclusive of cost of the container at which maize may be sold by a grower for delivery in Queensland to be-

(a) where delivery is made at any of the places specified in the First Schedule to this Order—the prices specified therein; or

(b) where delivery is made in Queensland other than at the places specified in the First Schedule—the prices specified in that Schedule for delivery at the prices specified in that Schedule for delivery at the place which is nearest to the grower's premises, less the current cost of transport from those premises to that place, plus the cost (if any) incurred by the grower in transporting the maize from those premises to the place of delivery to the purchaser, and recorded on the invoice or docket delivered by the grower.

Sales by wholesale-Maize (other than cracked maize).

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price inclusive of the cost of the container at which maize may be sold by wholesale in Queensland, other than by a grower, in the lots specified in the Second Schedule to this Order to be—
 - (a) for deliveries ex truck—the price paid or payable by the wholesale seller, or the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that maize to the wholesale seller, whichever is the lesser, plus the margin at the rate specified in that Schedule; or

(b) for deliveries ex store, the sum of the following:-

(i) the price paid or payable by the wholesale seller, or the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the of such maize to the wholesale seller,

whichever is the lesser;

(ii) any cost incurred by the wholesale seller in transporting those goods to his premises and recorded on the invoice or docket delivered by him; and

(iii) the margin at the rate specified in that

Schedule.

Sales by growers or by wholesale-Cracked maize.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I fix and declare the maximum price at which cracked maize may be sold in Queensland by a grower, or by wholesale, to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of maize by the grower, or by wholesale, as the case may be, plus threepence per bushel.

Bales by retail-Maize, including cracked maize.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price inclusive of the cost of the container at which maize, including cracked maize, may be sold by retail in Queensland, to be the sum of the following:

(a) the price paid or payable by the retail seller, or the maximum price fixed by the foregoing pro-visions of this Order for the sale of that maize to

the retail seller, whichever is the lesser;
(b) any cost incurred by the retail seller in transporting that maize to his premises and recorded on an invoice or docket delivered by him; and
(c) the margin at the rate specified in the Third School to this Order.

Schedule to this Order.

Provided that where the maize is purchased whole by the retail seller and cracked by him, the maximum price so fixed by the foregoing provisions of this paragraph for the sale of cracked maize, shall be subject to an increase of threepence per bushel to cover cost of cracking.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, where any maize is sold by retail in broken bag lots in a hessian container, the maximum price fixed shall be increased by any cost of such container which is recorded on the invoice or docket delivered by the seller.

Delivery of invoices.

9. Any person who sells any maize, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by this Order, shall deliver with such maize an invoice or docket specifying the number of bushels sold and the selling price thereof.

Sales by the bag.

10. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which maize may be sold by the bag to be:

(a) the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of the maize actually contained in the bag; or

(b) the maximum price so fixed for the sale of 168 pounds.

Variation of maximum prices by notice in writing.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which maize specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
