(ii) an amount equal to the difference (if any) between the price referred to in (a) and the ruling market price for Grade 1 potatoes in the nearest capital city on the day of delivery of the potatoes into the retail seller’s store.

3. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which the “Sunglo” unshrinkable wool fabric specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold to be the prices specified in that Schedule, subject however to the following provisions of this Order.

Transport, discounts.

- 4.—(1.) The maximum prices specified for sales to whole-salers or retailers shall be subject to a discount of 2½ per centum for payment on or before the 15th day of the month following delivery: Provided that goods delivered after the 20th day of any month shall be deemed to be delivered in the following month.

(2.) The maximum prices specified for sales to wholesalers or retailers are for delivery free into purchaser's store, or, where the purchaser's store is situated outside the metro-politan areas, for delivery free on rail at the nearest metro-politan area. Where deliveries are not so made, those maxi-mum prices shall be reduced by the extra transport costs necessary to make such deliveries.

(3.) In the case of retail sales outside the metropolitan areas, freight (other than postage) incurred by the retail seller in transport from the nearest metropolitan area may be added if properly recorded in his books of account.

- (a) where delivery is made *ex* mill—£5 10s. per ton;
- (b) where delivery is made *ex* truck, Perth—£6 10s. per ton;
- (c) where delivery is made other than *ex* mill or *ex* truck, Perth—£6 10s. per ton, less the usual cost of transport to Perth railway station from the place where the flax chaff was cut, plus the cost actually incurred and properly attributable to transport from that place to the place of delivery to the purchaser.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 1923.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall operate on and from the nineteenth day of February, 1945.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears:—

“A range of multiple fittings” means, in relation to any type of footwear, a range of fittings of each sample or last—

- (a) in the case of women's footwear of sizes 2 and upwards—not less than 5 fittings of each sample or last;
- (b) in the case of men's footwear—not less than 4 fittings of each sample or last;
- (c) in the case of youths', maids' or children's footwear—not less than 3 fittings of each sample or last.

“Cost into store” means, in relation to any sale of footwear by retail, the sum of the following:—

- (a) the purchase price including sales tax paid or payable to a manufacturer or a whole-saler for that footwear by the retail seller; and
- (b) cost of transport actually incurred and properly attributable to the transport of the footwear from the point of delivery to the retail seller to the retail seller's store:

Provided that no amount shall be included for cost of transport under the provisions of this paragraph unless such amount is clearly recorded by the retail seller on an invoice received from the supplier.

Maximum retail prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the types of footwear specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be the cost into Store of that footwear plus a percentage margin thereon at the rate specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite that type of footwear, or the maximum price fixed by the provisions of Prices Regulation Order No. 666 or Prices Regulation Order No. 1015 for the sale of that footwear, whichever is the least.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any person may sell by retail any men's, women's or children's footwear which he has purchased other than from a manufacturer or wholesaler to be the price paid or payable by that person for that footwear.

Variation of maximum prices by notice.

6.—(1.) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I declare the maximum price at which any footwear specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

(2.) All notices given in pursuance of any Prices Regulation Order issued prior to this Order which operate to fix a maximum price for any footwear less than the maximum price fixed by the provisions of this Order, and which are in force at the commencement of this Order, shall be deemed to have been given under this Order.

 - "Maker-up" means, in relation to any bed sheet, a person who manufactures those bed sheets from material supplied by a semi-manufacturer.
 - "Semi-manufacturer" means, in relation to any bed sheets, a person who purchases material and supplies that material to a maker-up who manufactures that material into those bed sheets.
 - "Manufacturer" means, in relation to any bed sheets, a person who purchases material and manufactures that material into those bed sheets.
 - "Wholesale merchant" means, in relation to any bed sheets, a person who purchases those bed sheets manufactured and resells those bed sheets by wholesale.
 - "The maximum price fixed for the sale by wholesale by that manufacturer for the material contained in the bed sheets" and "the maximum price fixed for the sale by wholesale by that semi-manufacturer for the material contained in the bed sheets" means in respect of—
 - Material manufactured in British India which is specified in the first column of the Schedule to Prices Regulation Order

No. 1522, as amended from time to time—the amount per yard set out in the third column of such Schedule opposite each such description multiplied by the number of yards of such material used in the bed sheet.

(ii) Material manufactured in British India which is not specified in the first column of the Schedule to Prices Regulation Order No. 1522, as amended from time to time—and in respect of which no price has been fixed by virtue of paragraph 9 of such Order—the cost of such material to such manufacturer or semi-manufacturer.

(iii) Material manufactured in the United States of America and imported and sold by the Division of Import Procurement of the Commonwealth Department of Trade and Customs to that manufacturer or semi-manufacturer—the cost of such material per yard multiplied by the number of yards of such material used in the bed sheet, plus 10½ per centum thereof.

(iv) Material manufactured in the United Kingdom and specified in the first column of the Schedule to Prices Regulation Order No. 1800, as amended from time to time—the amount set out in the third column of that Schedule opposite each such description of material set out in the first column multiplied by the number of yards of such material used in the bed sheet.

(v) Material other than that referred to in the foregoing sub-paragraphs—such price per yard multiplied by the number of yards of material used in such bed sheet, as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such manufacturer or semi-manufacturer, or until such price is fixed by the Commissioner, then the cost to the manufacturer or semi-manufacturer of the material contained in the bed sheet.

(g) "Costs" means, in relation to the sale by wholesale of any bed sheets by a manufacturer or semi-manufacturer, the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable by the seller for those goods, insurance, freight, exchange and duty payable thereon.

Sales by manufacturers.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bed sheets manufactured in Australia may be sold by the manufacturer to be—

- for sales other than by retail—the sum of 4½d. per bed sheet plus the maximum price fixed for the sale by wholesale by that manufacturer for the material contained in the bed sheet;
- for sales by retail—the sum of 7d. per bed sheet plus the maximum price fixed for the sale by retail by that manufacturer for the material contained in the bed sheet.

Sales by semi-manufacturers.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bed sheets manufactured in Australia may be sold by the semi-manufacturer to be—

- for sales other than by retail—the sum of 5½d. per bed sheet plus the maximum price fixed for the sale by wholesale by that semi-manufacturer for the material contained in the bed sheet.
- for sales by retail—the sum of 7d. per bed sheet plus the maximum price fixed for the sale by retail by that semi-manufacturer for the material contained in the bed sheet.

Sales by wholesalers.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the whole-sale merchant may sell bed sheets manufactured in Australia to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of those bed sheets other than by retail by the manufacturer or semi-manufacturer from whom the wholesale merchant purchased the bed sheets.

Retailers.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bed sheets manufactured in Australia may be sold by any person other than the manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or wholesale merchant to be the sum of—

- the cost thereof—which for the purpose of this sub-paragraph shall mean the sum of—
 - the purchase price paid or payable;
 - sales tax;

- (b) 40 per centum of the cost thereof;
 (c) costs incurred by the retail seller in transporting the goods from the seller's point of delivery to the retail seller's place of business by the cheapest route and which are properly recorded in his books of account.

Makers-up.

7. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which the service of making-up bed sheets may be supplied by the maker-up to be the sum of 4½d. per bed sheet.

Discounts.

8. Where, on 12th April, 1943, any manufacturer or semi-manufacturer customarily allowed any discount, in relation to sales by wholesale to any person or class of persons, for payment of the purchase price within a certain time, the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order or by notice in writing thereunder in respect of sales to such person or classes of persons upon payment of such purchase price within such time shall be subject to a deduction of a discount at the same rate as that so customarily allowed as aforesaid.

Application of Prices Regulation Order No. 1015.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, if a maximum price is fixed for the sale by any manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, wholesale merchant or any other person of any bed sheets manufactured in Australia other than by retail or by retail or a maximum rate is fixed for the supply by any person of a service of hemming or hemming and trimming of any bed sheets by or under the provisions of Prices Regulation Order No. 1015, other than paragraph 4 thereof and such price is less than the maximum price fixed for the sale of that bed sheet by that manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, wholesale merchant or that other person other than by retail or by retail by the foregoing provisions of this Order or any notice in writing under this Order, then I fix and declare the maximum price at which that bed sheet may be sold by that manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or wholesale merchant or other person other than by retail or by retail or the maximum rate for the supply of the service of hemming or hemming and trimming that bed sheet to be—

- (a) the maximum price or rate so fixed by or under the provisions of this Order; or
 (b) the maximum price or rate so fixed by Prices Regulation Order No. 1015, other than paragraph 4 thereof,

whichever is the lesser.

Maximum prices and rates subject to variation by notice.

10. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I declare the maximum price at which any bed sheets manufactured in Australia may be sold or the maximum rate at which the service of hemming bed sheets may be supplied by any person to whom a notice in pursuance of this paragraph is given to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 1924.

Milk—Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 1924.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1477 is hereby revoked.

Application.

3. The provisions of this Order shall not apply to any sales of milk for delivery to or by a retailer whose premises are situated within five miles of the principal post office, Albury, New South Wales.

Definitions and interpretation.

4.—(1.) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Bendigo area” means the area specified in Part I. of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“by retail” or “by wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of milk, that such sale is a sale by retail or by wholesale, as the case may be, but is not a sale by semi-wholesale;

“by semi-wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of milk—

(a) that such milk is sold by a retailer to a person to whom the retailer has, on the day of the sale, sold a quantity of milk (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale) exceeding 2 gallons; or

(b) is a sale to a person who conducts a shop where milk is sold separately from any milk round.

“Central area” means the area specified in Part II. of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“Gippsland area” means the area specified in Part III. of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“Mallee area” means the area specified in Part IV. of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“Melbourne area” means that area of Victoria comprised in the Metropolis area as defined in the Milk Board Act of 1935 (No. 4183) of the State of Victoria, with the exception of that part of such Metropolis area comprised in the Bendigo area as defined in this Order;

“North Central area” means the area specified in Part V. of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“North-Eastern area” means the area specified in Part VI. of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“Northern area” means the area specified in Part VII. of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“prevailing price” means, in relation to the sale of milk by any person by wholesale, semi-wholesale or retail, the price at which milk was sold by that person by wholesale, semi-wholesale or retail, as the case may be, on the 31st day of March, 1944, upon substantially the same terms and conditions, or if no such sale was made on that date upon substantially the same terms and conditions, the last preceding date upon which such a sale was made by that person upon substantially the same terms and conditions;

“treatment” includes the pasteurization, cooling, chilling, refrigerating of milk, and “treated” has a corresponding meaning;

“Western area” means the area specified in Part VIII. of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“Wimmera area” means the area specified in Part IX. of the Second Schedule to this Order.

(2.) For the purpose of this Order, where any post office or principal post office of any place, is situated less than 3 miles from any boundary line of any area defined in this Order, then all places within 3 miles of that post office, or principal post office, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be within the area in which that post office, or principal post office, is situated.

Maximum prices—specified areas.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold for delivery in any of the areas specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order to be—

- (a) in respect of sales to retailers (excluding semi-wholesale sales)—
- (i) where delivery is taken at the retailer's premises—the price specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite to such area; or
 - (ii) where delivery is taken at any other place—the price specified in (i) of this sub-paragraph less the cost which would be incurred in transporting the milk to the retailer's premises;
- (b) in respect of sales by retail—
- (i) where such milk is not sold in a sealed container—
 - (A) the price specified in the fourth column of that Schedule opposite such area, or
 - (B) the price paid or payable by the retail seller for such milk plus an amount computed at the rate of 1s. 1d. per gallon, plus any cost incurred in transporting that milk to his premises, whichever is the lesser; or
 - (ii) where such milk is sold in a sealed container—the price specified in (i) of this sub-paragraph, plus an amount computed at the rate of ½d. per quart; and
- (c) in respect of sales by semi-wholesale—
- (i) where such milk is not sold in a sealed container—
 - (A) the price specified in the third column of that Schedule opposite such area, or
 - (B) the price paid or payable for such milk by the semi-wholesaler plus an amount calculated at the rate of 6d. per gallon, whichever is the lesser; or
 - (ii) where such milk is sold in a sealed container—the price specified in (i) of this sub-paragraph plus an amount computed at the rate of 2d. per gallon.

Maximum prices—Melbourne area.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold by any person for delivery in the Melbourne area by wholesale, semi-wholesale or retail to be the prevailing price for the sale of milk by that person.

Maximum prices—treatment depots.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold to any person other than to a retailer for treatment in any area specified in the Schedule to this Order to be the maximum price for the sale of that milk to a retailer in that area less an amount computed at the rate of 1d. per gallon.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold to a retailer by any person who has purchased that milk and treated that milk in any area specified in the Schedules to this Order to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of that milk to a retailer in that area plus an amount computed at the rate of 2d. per gallon.
