THE KING has been graciously pleased to confer the under-mentioned awards:—

AUSTRALIAN MILITARY FORCES.

For most conspicuous bravery:

VICTORIA CROSS (POSTHUMOUS).

Corporal John Bernard Mackey, NX20317.

Corporal Mackey was in charge of a section of "D" Company 2nd/3rd Australian Pioneer Battalion in the attack on the feature known as "Helen" to the east of Tarakan. This section was in the van moving along a narrow spur with scarcely width for more than one man when it came under fire from three well-sited positions

man when it came under fire from three well-sited positions near the top of a very steep razor-backed ridge.

Corporal Mackey led his men forward and charged the first light machine gun position but slipped, and after wrestling with one enemy bayonetted him and charged straight on to the heavy machine gun which was firing from a bunker six yards away. He rushed this post and killed the crew with grenades.

He then jumped back, and changing his rifle for a sub-machine gun attacked further up the steep slope to another light machine gun position. Whilst charging he

another light machine gun position. Whilst charging he fired his gun and reached within a few feet of the enemy position when he was killed, but not before accounting

for two more enemy.

By his exceptional bravery and complete disregard for his own life, Corporal Mackey was responsible for the killing of seven Japanese and the eliminating of two machine gun posts, thus enabling his platoon to gain its objective.

For most conspicuous gallantry and extreme devotion to duty:

VICTORIA CROSS.

Private Leslie Thomas Starcevich, WX11519.

Private Starcevich was a member of "B" Company 2nd/43rd Australian Infantry Battalion during the capture of Beaufort, North Borneo.

In the approach along a thickly-wooded spur, the enemy was encountered at a position where movement off the single track leading into the enemy defences was difficult and hazardous. The leading section came under fire from two enemy machine our posts and suffered fire from two enemy machine gun posts and suffered casualties. Private Starcevich, who was Bren gunner, moved forward and assaulted each post in turn, killing five enemy and putting the remaining occupants of the posts to flight.

The advance continued until the section came under fire from two more machine gun posts. When a burst of gun fire wounded Starcevich's No. 2 gunner, he again advanced, fearlessly firing his Bren gun from the hip and ignoring hostile fire. He captured both posts single-

handed, disposing of seven enemy.

These daring efforts enabled "B" Company to press its attack with speed and so relieve pressure on another

company which was attacking from another direction.
Private Starcevich's unhesitating assaults carried out single-handed with great personal valour and complete disregard of danger speeded the attack, which proved decisive in the success of the action.

In no circumstances, however, will expense be borne by the Commonwealth in fees in respect of a subject for more than two years of the course.

Each officer nominated for an assisted place will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth, and to be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will fulfil the conditions of his assisted place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Commonwealth during the period of three years immediately following the termination of his course. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £125.

The continuance of the assistance by the Commonwealth Government after the expiration of each calendar year will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the University as to the officer's attendance, conduct and progress at the University, and by the Chief Officer or the principal officer of his Department in the State as to his conduct, diligence and efficiency as an officer.

The Commonwealth may at any time discontinue its payment to the University on behalf of a selected officer if the Board is satisfied that—

(a) the prescribed conditions of tenure are not being complied with; or

(b) the conduct of the holder has been idle, unbecoming,

disorderly, or otherwise improper; or (c) the holder has failed to make satisfactory progress:

(d) the exigencies of the Service so require;

and thereupon all advantages to an officer connected with his selection for a University course shall cease and determine.

Upon application and the production of satisfactory evidence, any selected officer may have his course suspended by the Public Service Board for a period not exceeding one year, and if necessary for a further period, but in normal circumstances suspension will not be granted within the first year of the course. If the circumstances are considered by the Board to require or to justify such action, it may, without application from the holder, suspend an assisted place
