NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2327.

Beans, Peas, Lettuce, Rhubarb, Cucumbers, Marrows, Pumpkin, Trombone, Carrots, Parsnips, White Turnips, Swede Turnips, Bunched Onions and Celery—South Australia.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Commonwealth Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order.—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 2327.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1846 as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 1932, 2034, 2120 and 2186 is hereby further amended by omitting from the Schedule the prices appearing opposite the items specified in the Schedule to this Order, and inserting in their stead the prices appearing opposite thereto in such last-mentioned Schedule.

NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.
PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2330.

Cartridges.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Commonwealth Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order

6852.—No. 226,—Price 3D,

Revocations.

2. Prices Regulations Orders Nos. 2102 and 2174 are hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, "metropolitan area" means the Adelaide, Brisbane, Hobart, Melbourne, Perth or Sydney metropolitan area. as defined in Prices Regulation Order No. 1598.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which the cartridges specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold by wholesale or by retail to be—

(a) where delivery is made in a metropolitan area—the prices specified in those Schedules;

(b) where delivery is made outside the metropolitan areas—the prices specified in the said Schedules, plus cost of rail transport from the nearest metropolitan area to the railway station nearest the purchaser's premises.

Variation of maximum prices by notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which cartridges specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 2331.

Confectionery-Western Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Commonwealth Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order N_0 , 2331.

Application.

2. This Order shall apply only to sales of confectionery in Western Australia.

Definitions and interpretation.

- 3.—(1.) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "confectionery" includes chocolates;
 - "cost into store" means, in relation to any confectionery, the sum of the invoice price of the goods, sales tax thereon, and cost of transport necessarily incurred and properly recorded on an invoice in relation to that confectionery;
 - "count line" means confectionery packed and labelled by the manufacturer in such manner as to indicate a retail selling price based on the number of pieces or articles;
 - "invoice price" means, in relation to any confectionery, the purchase price paid or payable: Provided that where any trade or quantity discount or any rebate is allowable and is properly recorded on an invoice delivered in relation to that confectionery, and discount or rebate at a rate not less than the aforesaid discount or rebate was customarily allowed by the supplier to the purchaser in relation to confectionery of the same kind on 31st August, 1939, then the amount of that discount or rebate shall be deemed to be part of the invoice price;
 - 'packet lines' means confectionery packed and labelled by the manufacturer for retail sale in a box, jar, carton or other container; but does not include count lines as defined in this paragraph.
- (2.) In computing any cost into store per pound for the purpose of Part II. of the Schedule to this Order, if the actual cost into store per pound calculated under the provisions of sub-paragraph (1.) hereof—
 - (a) is an exact number of halfpence—such cost into store per pound shall be computed to the next upward nemny.
 - (b) is not an exact number of halfpence—such cost into store shall be computed to the nearest penny.

Certain sales by retail.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any conlectionery may be sold by retail by a retailer who is not the manufacturer of that confectionery to be—
 - (a) in respect of count lines—the price as set out in the second column of Part I. of the Schedule to this Order according to the invoice price as set out in the first column of that Schedule;

- (b) in respect of packet lines-
 - (i) where the invoice price is set out in the first column of Part I. of the Schedule to this Order—the price set out opposite thereto in the second column of that Schedule:
 - (ii) where the invoice price is not so set out—
 the cost into store plus 33½ per centum
 thereof;
 - (iii) in respect of other than count or packet lines—the price as set out in the second column of Part II. of the said Schedule, according to the cost into store per pound as set out in the first column of that Schedule; or
- (c) the maximum price fixed by the provisions of Prices Regulation Order No. 1015,

whichever is the lesser.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which two or more kinds of confectionery, made up as a mixture by any retailer, who is not a manufacturer of that confectionery, may be sold by retail to be the total of the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of each variety of confectionery contained in such mixture, plus the cost (if any) of any carton or box in which such mixture is packed.

Other sales by retail and sales by wholesale.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any confectionery, a maximum price for the sale of which is not otherwise fixed by this Order, may be sold to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of that confectionery by the provisions of Prices Regulation Order No. 1015.

Exhibition of prices.

7. Every person who sells or has for sale any kind of confectionery, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business a notice or notices setting forth his retail selling prices of each such kind of confectionery which he sells or has for sale. Any such notice shall be deemed to be in an approved form if it otherwise complies with regulation 45 of the National Security (Prices) Regulations.

Variation of maximum prices by notice.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which confectionery specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

METAL FOIL AND PAPER ORDER No. 44.

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Metal Foil and Paper Order

Revocation of Metal Foil and Paper Order No. 15.

2. The Metal Foil and Paper Order No. 15 as amended by paragraph 2, paragraph 3 and paragraph 4 of the Metal Foil and Paper Order No. 41 is revoked.

NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS. CONTROL OF LIQUOR ORDER (No. 5).

N pursuance of regulation 59 of the National Security (General) Regulations, I, John Johnstone Dedman, the Minister of State for Post-war Reconstruction, hereby make the following order:---

Citation.

1. This Order may be Cited as the Control of Liquor Order (No. 5).

Amendment of paragraph 3.

- 2 Paragraph 3 of the Control of Liquor Order is amended—

 - (a) by omitting from the definition of "retailer" the word ", spirits";
 (b) by omitting the definition of "spirits"; and
 (c) by omitting from the definition of "wholesaler" the word ", spirits" and the word "distiller,".

Sale of beer and Spirits.

3. Paragraph 5 of the Control of Liquor Order is amended by omitting the words "or spirits" (wherever occurring).

Supplies to be allocated proportionately.

- 4. Paragraph 7 of the Control of Liquor Order is amended-
 - (a) by omitting from sub-paragraph (1.) the words "or spirits" (wherever occurring);
 - spirits" (wherever occurring);
 (b) by omitting from sub-paragraph (2.) the word
 ", spirits"; and
 (c) by omitting from sub-paragraph (3.) the words " and
 - spirits

Revocation of paragraph 9.

5. Paragraph 9 of the Control of Liquor Order is revoked.

6. Paragraph 10 of the Control of Liquor Order is amended by omitting the word "distiller,".
