APPOINTMENT OF KING'S WAREHOUSE.

(T. & C. '45/227.)

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 106 of the Customs Act 1901-1936, I, Richard Valentine Keane, Minister of State for Trade and Customs, hereby appoint the following to be a King's Warehouse:—

QUEENSLAND.

Brisbane—King's Warehouse No. 4.

Premises known as the Division of Import Procurement Kangaroo Point Store, including buildings and storage area situated on the northern side of Holman-street, Kangaroo Point, Brisbane, commencing at the eastern intersection of Holman-street with the bank of the Brisbane River and extending westward for 360 feet, thence northward for 340 feet, thence following the bank of the river to the starting point.

ORDER MADE BY THE MINISTER UNDER SECTION 265 OF THE CUSTOMS ACT 1901-1936.

WHEREAS by Order made in pursuance of section 265 of the Customs Act 1901-1936 and dated the twentieth day of November, 1944, a notification of which appeared in the Commonwealth Gazette dated the fourteenth day of December, 1944, a penalty of One pound together with forfeiture of the goods related to the offence was imposed on Nils Olsson, care of M.V. 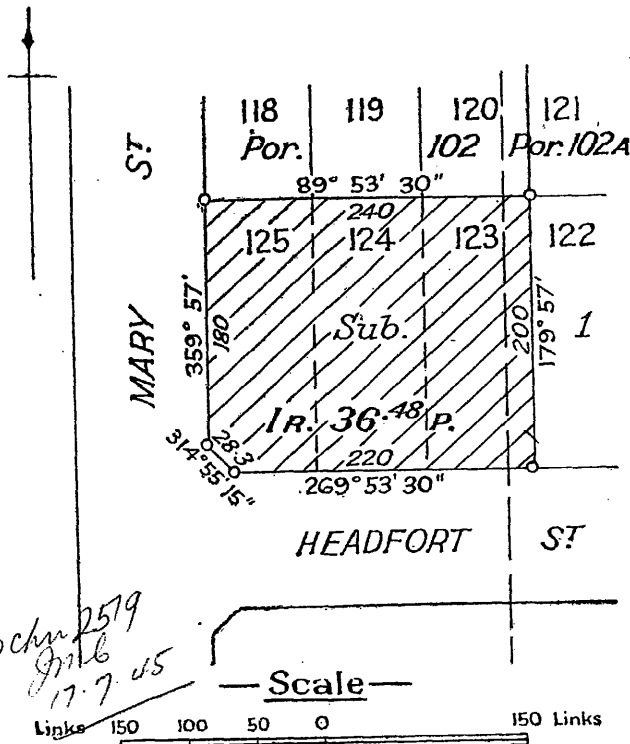

DISPOSAL BY SALE OF POSTAL LAND AT DAY DAWN, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

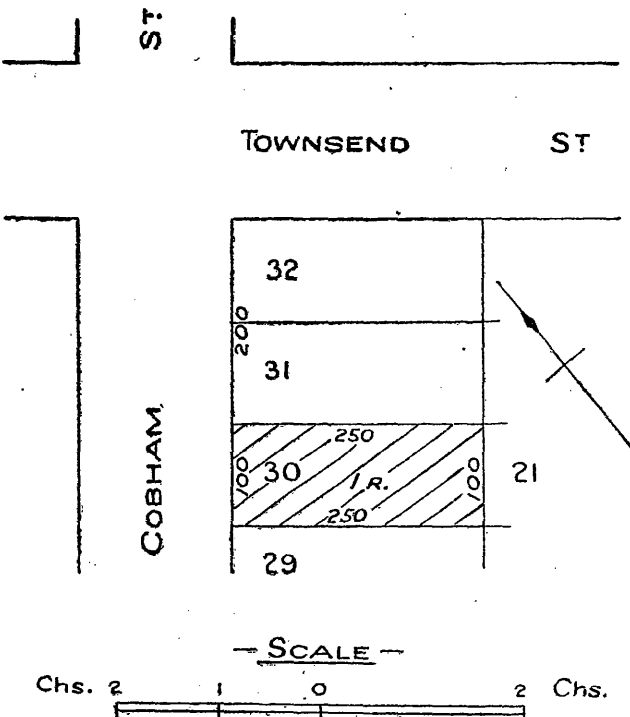

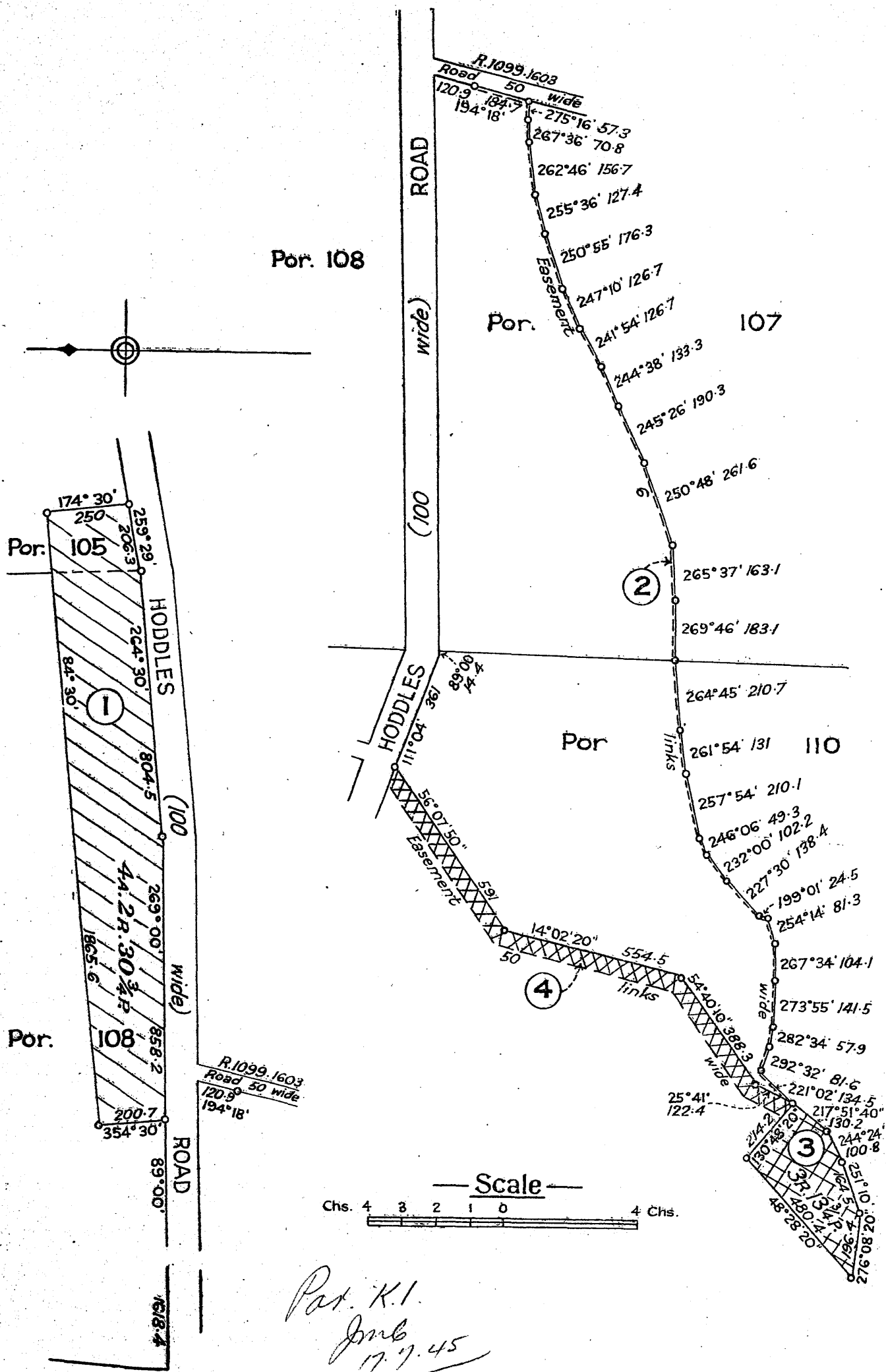

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

(A) **Manipulative Telegraphy Section.**—The candidate will be required to demonstrate ability to—

- (i) transmit telegraphically in 30 minutes 30 typical telegrams averaging an equivalent of 5 message units (MU) per telegram on a morse key or an approved semi-automatic sending device in the standard manner;
- (ii) receive telegraphically from morse sounder in 30 minutes 30 typical telegrams averaging an equivalent of 5 message units (MU) per telegram, and record the messages by typewriter in the standard manner;
- (iii) prepare in each of two periods of one hour each on one day, with a minimum intervening period of one hour, perforated tape containing the approved symbols representing 64 typical telegrams averaging an equivalent of 6 message units (MU) per telegram by manipulating in the standard manner a tested multiplex keyboard. (Where multiplex apparatus is not locally available, a start-stop keyboard will be substituted in the test.)
- (iv) attend to the telegraphic reception of telegrams by morkrum printer or teleprinter by checking and treating in 30 minutes in accordance with the approved procedure 32 telegrams averaging an equivalent of 6 message units (MU) per telegram;
- (v) read in 15 minutes perforated multiplex tape containing the approved symbols representing 5 typical telegrams averaging an equivalent of 9 message units (MU) per telegram. (Where multiplex equipment is not available this test will not apply.)

(B) **Technical and Traffic Telegraphy Sections.**—The candidate will be required to demonstrate in a written examination and a combined oral and practical test his knowledge of—

- (i) the standard working procedure and the manipulative methods to be observed on telegraph systems in use in the State;
- (ii) the Telegraph Regulations and Rules, telegraph rates, prescribed order of priority of traffic, and the use of standard forms;
- (iii) internal and external circulation systems in the State;
- (iv) telegraph channels and routes within the State, and those connected with adjoining States;
- (v) the procedure employed at each stage in dealing with originating, terminating and through traffic of all classes including phonograms, and the fundamental principles associated with the proper disposal of traffic;
- (vi) the principles of electricity and magnetism;
- (vii) primary and secondary batteries;
- (viii) the apparatus associated with, and the fundamental principles of operation of simplex, duplex (differential and bridge), diplex, quadruplex, multiplex and start-stop systems, as well as concentrator facilities;
- (ix) circuit connexions of simplex and duplex systems, including telegraph repeaters in use on manually operated channels in the State;
- (x) the methods involved in the location of faults on physical telegraph channels and in apparatus associated with manually operated systems in use in the State; circuit patching procedure;
- (xi) protective devices employed in telegraph practice;
- (xii) the effects of simple faults, such as contacts, open circuits, earths and leakages; correct adjustments of sounders, keys, pole-changers and relays (excluding Gulstad and Creed relays); manipulation of switches used in manual simplex and duplex (differential) systems;
- (xiii) simple circuit changes by means of section switches or small telegraph switchboards;
- (xiv) the principles of the telephone transmitter and receiver.

Instruction in the subject-matter of the examination may be obtained in Postal Institute classes where established. Inquiries concerning classes, conditions of examination and advancement, &c., may be directed to the Education and Welfare Officer, G.P.O., in the capital city of the State in which the officer is located.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.—Telegrams selected for manipulative tests will be typical in every respect of those dealt with under actual working conditions, and the texts of approximately 5 per cent. of the telegrams will contain code and/or cipher groups. In computing the unitary content of each telegram selected, due allowance will be made for the preamble, and in the case of items (i), (ii) and (iii) for the prescribed miscellaneous operations associated with traffic dispersal.

The practical portion of the combined oral and practical test will in the case of a Telegraphist be confined to the equipment installed in the office where the Telegraphist is located. His theoretical knowledge of apparatus specified in the conditions will be tested orally. In applying the oral portion of the combined oral and practical test, due regard will be given to the Telegraphist's unfamiliarity with the practical working of such equipment.

The written examination and the combined oral and practical test will be divided into three sub-sections, viz.:—

- (i) Technical Telegraphy (written);
- (ii) Traffic Telegraphy (written);
- (iii) Combined Oral and Practical Test.

One hundred marks will be allotted to—

- (i) each item of the manipulative telegraphy test except item (iii);
- (ii) a paper in a written examination; and
- (iii) the combined oral and practical test;

of which 60 or more marks shall represent a pass in each case. In the case of item (iii) of Section (A) a candidate must gain at least 60 marks of a maximum of 100 in each-hourly test in order to secure a pass in that item. Deductions of marks will be made in Section (A) for any uncompleted portion of the test, corrected and uncorrected errors, operating faults and traffic irregularities.

Where, owing to the remote location of an officer, it is found impracticable to carry out locally the combined oral and practical test, the Board may substitute for the test such other evidence as it thinks suitable to determine the possession of the required qualifications.

The examination of a Telegraphist at an office without the necessary equipment for the conduct of the whole of the manipulative and/or the combined oral and practical test will be limited to tests on the apparatus which is available. Upon installation at such office of any additional equipment mentioned in the syllabus, or upon transfer to an office where such apparatus is installed, the Telegraphist will be required within a period of six months to attain proficiency therein to the standard prescribed. Any increment accruing after such installation or transfer will be held over until the Superintendent of Telegraphs certifies that the required proficiency has been attained. If proficiency is attained within the period of six months, the increment from the due date will be paid subject to the prescribed conditions governing increments. A Telegraphist failing to attain proficiency within the period of six months will be transferred to a position where his limited qualifications may be suitably utilized.

EXEMPTIONS.—An officer who passed in Technical Telegraphy (Written), Traffic Telegraphy (Written) or the Combined Oral and Practical Test at Examination No. 2453, held in June, 1943, or at Examination No. 2518, held in June, 1944, will be exempted from re-examination in such section at this examination.

ADVANCEMENT.—A Telegraphist, Third Division, who qualifies will, subject to the provisions of section 31 of the *Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1943*, be advanced in salary to £342 (S) per annum from the first day of July in the year in which he passes the examination if on that date he will have been in receipt of salary at the rate of £330 (S) per annum for at least twelve months; otherwise advancement will be from the date of completion of twelve months' service with salary at the rate of £330 (S) per annum.

A Telegraphist, Fourth Division, who passes this examination will not be eligible for advancement beyond salary of £330 (S) per annum until he qualifies also for inclusion in the Third Division.

Officers of the Third Division, other than Telegraphists, who qualify will be transferred or promoted, as the case may be, in accordance with the provisions of section 50 of the *Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1943*.

TRAVELLING EXPENSES.—Officers who are required to travel for the purpose of attending the oral and practical test may apply to the Chief Officer for refund of the cost of conveyance necessarily incurred in such attendance. Payment will be subject to the approval of the Board, and may be disallowed if the results of the examination do not warrant refund, or if the position of Telegraphist is not in the regular line of the officer's advancement.
