PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 1995.

Spirituuous Liquors—Carnamah Areas—Western Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Acting Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 1995.

Definitions and Interpretation.

2.—(1.) In this Order and the Schedule thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

“aerated waters” includes cordials;

“Carnamah areas” means all those areas of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 3 miles from the principal post office of each of the following towns: Carnamah, Coorow, Three Springs and Mingenev;

“spirituous liquors” means any spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, and includes any mixture thereof with aerated waters;

“oz.” means a fluid ounce or ounces as the case may be;

“small 5-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing less than 5 oz.;

“5-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 5 oz. or more but less than 6 oz.;

“6-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 6 oz. or more but less than 7 oz.;

“7-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 7 oz. or more but less than 8 oz.;

“8-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 8 oz. or more but less than 9 oz.;

“9-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 9 oz. or more but less than 10 oz.;

“10-oz. pot” means any glass or similar container containing 10 oz. or more but less than 12 oz.;

“12-oz. pot” means any glass or similar container containing not less than 12 oz.;

“small nobbler” means any glass or similar container containing less than 13/16th oz.;

“nobbler” means any glass or similar container containing not less than 13/16th oz.;

“reputed quart” means 26 oz.;

“imperial quart” means 40 oz.;

“reputed pint” means 13 oz.;

“bottle” means a reputed quart (26 fluid oz.);

“half bottle” means a reputed pint (13 fluid oz.);

“quarter bottle” means a reputed half pint (6½ fluid oz.).

(2.) For the purpose of this Order, where any bottled spirituous or fermented liquor is sold without a label bearing the brand and description of that liquor, that liquor shall be deemed not to be of any of the brands or descriptions set out in the Schedule to this Order.

Maximum prices—Liquors specified in Schedule.

3. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any variety or quantity of spirituous liquors specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Carnamah areas to be the prices specified therein.

Quantities not specified.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any spirituous liquors specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold in quantities other than those specified in that Schedule, to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the next smaller quantity of such spirituous liquors specified in that Schedule or if there is no smaller quantity specified then such price (calculated to the nearest downward halfpenny) as bears the same ratio to the maximum price fixed for the next higher measure or quantity as the quantity actually sold bears to the next higher quantity.

Sales in dining-room, lounge or saloon bar.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any spirituous liquors specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person in any hotel dining-room, lounge or saloon bar in the Carnamah areas to be the prices specified in the said Schedule plus an amount equal to the difference between the hotel dining-room, lounge or saloon bar prices respectively charged by that person on 15th April, 1942, for any such spirituous liquors and the public bar prices charged by that person for such spirituous liquors on such date: Provided that if in the case of any sale, by reason of the absence of records such difference between the hotel dining-room, lounge or saloon bar prices and the public bar prices at the 15th April, 1942, cannot be ascertained the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply and such sale shall be deemed to have been made in the public bar.

Non-listed liquors.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind of spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, or any mixture of liquids containing any spirituous or fermented liquors, for the sale of which a maximum price is not fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, may be sold by any person to be—

- (i) in respect of sales of beer, ale, stout or lager—(together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such beer, ale, stout or lager;
- (ii) in respect of sales of whisky (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such whisky;
- (iii) in respect of sales of brandy (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such brandy;
- (iv) in respect of sales of gin (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such gin;
- (v) in respect of sales of schnapps (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such schnapps;
- (vi) in respect of sales of rum (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such rum;

(vii) in respect of sales of any spirituous or fermented liquors other than those specified in sub-paragraphs (i) to (vi) hereof or any mixture of spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture of liquids containing spirituous or fermented liquor (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such spirituous or fermented liquor or mixture:

Provided that if any price calculated under the provisions of this paragraph is not an exact number of pence or halfpence that maximum price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

Exhibition of price-list.

7. Every person who sells or holds for sale by retail any spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business and in each of the bars, dining-rooms and lounges at such place or places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum prices fixed by this Order for the sale by him of any kind and quantity of such spirituous or fermented liquors. I hereby declare that any form of notice shall be deemed to be an approved form if it is otherwise in compliance with regulation 45 of the National Security (Prices) Regulations.

Fixation of maximum prices by notice.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any spirituous or fermented liquors specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 1996.

Spirituous Liquors—Northam Areas—Western Australia.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Acting Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 1996.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 1019 as amended by Prices Regulation Order Nos. 1312 and 1383 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and interpretations.

- 3.—(1.) In this Order and the Schedule thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

“aerated waters” includes cordials;

“Northam areas” means all those areas of Western Australia comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office of each of the following towns—Northam, Cunderdin, Tammin, Spencers Brook, Grass Valley, Toodyay, Bolgart, Meckering, Dowerin, Goomalling, Jemmacubine and Bakers Hill;

“spirituous liquors” means any spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, and includes any mixture thereof with aerated waters;

“oz.” means a fluid ounce or ounces as the case may be;

“small 5-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing less than 5 oz.;

“5-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 5 oz. or more but less than 6 oz.;

“6-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 6 oz. or more but less than 8 oz.;

“8-oz. glass” means any glass or similar container containing 8 oz. or more but less than 10 oz.;

“10-oz. pot” means any glass or similar container containing 10 oz. or more but less than 11 oz.;

“11-oz. pot” means any glass or similar container containing not less than 11 oz.;

“small nobbler” means any glass or similar container containing less than 13/16th oz.;

“nobbler” means any glass or similar container containing not less than 13/16th oz.;

“reputed quart” means 26 oz.;

“imperial quart” means 40 oz.;

“reputed pint” means 13 oz.;

“bottle” means a reputed quart (26 fluid oz.);

“half bottle” means a reputed pint (13 fluid oz.);

“quarter bottle” means a reputed half pint (6½ fluid oz.).

- (2.) For the purpose of this Order, where any bottled spirituous or fermented liquor is sold without a label bearing the brand and description of that liquor, that liquor shall be deemed not to be of any of the brands or descriptions set out in the Schedule to this Order.

Maximum prices—Liquors specified in Schedule.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any variety or quantity of spirituous liquors specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Northern areas to be the prices specified therein.

Quantities not specified.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any spirituous liquors specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold in quantities other than those specified in that Schedule, to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the next smaller quantity of such spirituous liquors specified in that Schedule or if there is no smaller quantity specified then such price (calculated to the nearest downward halfpenny) as bears the same ratio to the maximum price fixed for the next higher measure or quantity as the quantity actually sold bears to the next higher quantity.

Sales in dining-room, lounge or saloon bar.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any spirituous liquors specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person in any hotel dining-room, lounge or saloon bar in the Northam areas to be the prices specified in the said Schedule plus an amount equal to the difference between the hotel dining-room, lounge or saloon bar prices respectively charged by that person on 15th April, 1942, for any such spirituous liquors and the public bar prices charged by that person for such spirituous liquors on such date: Provided that if in the case of any sale, by reason of the absence of records such difference between the hotel dining-room, lounge or saloon bar prices and the public bar prices at 15th April, 1942, cannot be ascertained the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply and such sale shall be deemed to have been made in the public bar.

Non-listed liquors.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind of spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, or any mixture of liquids containing any spirituous or fermented liquors, for the sale of which a maximum price is not fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, may be sold by any person to be—

(i) in respect of sales of beer, ale, stout or lager (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such beer, ale, stout or lager;

(ii) in respect of sales of whisky (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such whisky;

(iii) in respect of sales of brandy (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such brandy;

(iv) in respect of sales of gin (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such gin;

(v) in respect of sales of schnapps (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such schnapps;

(vi) in respect of sales of rum (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of threepence for each fluid ounce of such rum;

(vii) in respect of sales of any spirituous or fermented liquors other than those specified in sub-paragraphs (i) to (vi) hereof or any mixture of spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture of liquids containing spirituous or fermented liquor (together with any container supplied therewith)—an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such spirituous or fermented liquor or mixture:

Provided that if any price calculated under the provisions of this paragraph is not an exact number of pence or halfpence that maximum price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny.

Exhibition of price-list.

8. Every person who sells or holds for sale by retail any spirituous or fermented liquors or any mixture thereof, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business and in each of the bars, dining-rooms and lounges at such place or places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum prices fixed by this Order for the sale by him of any kind and quantity of such spirituous or fermented liquors. I hereby declare that any form of notice shall be deemed to be an approved form if it is otherwise in compliance with regulation 45 of the National Security (Prices) Regulations.

Fixation of maximum prices by notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any spirituous or fermented liquors specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 1997.

Horseflesh—Western Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Mortimer Eugene McCarthy, Acting Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 1997.

Retail maximum prices.

2. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which horseflesh specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Western Australia to be those specified therein.

Fixation of maximum prices by notice.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which horseflesh specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

SERVICE MUNITIONS (SAFETY PRECAUTIONS) ORDER.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by regulation 66 of the National Security (General) Regulations, I, William Patrick Ashley, the Minister of State for Supply and Shipping, do hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as the Service Munitions (Safety Precautions) Order (No. 1).

Definition.

2. In this Order, "authorized officer" means, in relation to any operation involving the handling, loading, unloading, stowage, stacking or storage of service munitions, an officer authorized by Order under regulation 66 of the National Security (General) Regulations to exercise a general power of personal supervision and direction over that operation.

Smoking, welding, &c. while service munitions are being loaded &c.

3. A person shall not, except with the express permission in writing of the Minister of State for Supply and Shipping or an authorized officer—

- whilst on board or within one hundred feet of any ship on or from which service munitions* are being handled, loaded, unloaded or stowed, smoke or light a match or operate any device to produce a naked flame or do any other act likely to cause fire or explosion;
- whilst actually engaged in the handling, loading, unloading or stowing of service munitions on board, or within one hundred feet of, any ship, have in his possession any materials for smoking, including matches or any lighting appliance;
- carry out any welding, oxy-acetylene cutting or hot rivetting of any description, or perform any operation entailing the use of any fire or open flame, on board or within one hundred feet of any ship containing service munitions, or on or from which or alongside which service munitions are being loaded, unloaded or handled; or
- cause, authorize or allow any motor vehicle under his control, which has a producer gas attachment containing any lighted charcoal or other fuel, to come or remain within one hundred feet of any ship on or from which or alongside which service munitions are being loaded, unloaded or handled.

* "Service Munitions", as defined in regulation 66, includes—

- shells, cartridges, rockets, grenades, bombs, torpedoes, mines and depth charges, charged with any explosive or incendiary substance;
- explosives or incendiary substances;
- aviation or motor spirits (including drums or other containers from which aviation or motor spirit has been emptied, but which have not been effectively cleansed to ensure that they are free of all residue and vapour of the spirit), lighting kerosene and any other inflammable liquid having a flash point not higher than 150 degrees Fahrenheit (as determined in the manner specified in the British Board of Trade Memorandum relating to the carriage of Dangerous Goods and Explosives in Ships); and
- dangerous chemicals; used or capable of being used for naval, military or air force purposes.
