PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit.
HENRY
Governor-General.

By His Royal Highness the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by sub-section (4.) of section fifty-seven A of the *Bankruptcy Act 1924-1933* it is enacted that that section shall apply in relation to any State Act or law of a Territory, which Act or law is specified by the Governor-General by proclamation as being an Act or law in relation to which that section applies:

And whereas, by proclamation dated the fourteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one *The Rural Development Co-ordination of Advances Act of 1938*, of the State of Queensland, was specified as an Act in relation to which the said section fifty-seven A applied:

And whereas it is desirable that the said section fifty-seven A should no longer apply in relation to *The Rural Development Co-ordination of Advances Act of 1938* of the State of Queensland:

And whereas it is desirable that the said section fifty-seven A should apply in relation to *The Farmers' Assistance (Debts Adjustment) Acts 1935 to 1938*, of the State of Queensland:

Now therefore I, Henry William Frederick Albert, Duke of Gloucester, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—

(a) revoke so much of the said proclamation dated the fourteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one as specifies *The Rural Development Co-ordination of Advances Act of 1938* of the State of Queensland as an Act in relation to which the said section fifty-seven A applies; and

(b) specify *The Farmers' Assistance (Debts Adjustment) Acts 1935 to 1938*, of the State of Queensland as an Act in relation to which the said section fifty-seven A applies.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth this twenty-first day of March in the year of our (L.S.) Lord, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and in the ninth year of His Majesty's reign.

THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA has in its possession a quantity of gold amalgam weighing about 467.43 oz. and two (2) gold ingots weighing 2.86 oz. which came into the possession of the Military Authorities at Namie near Wau in the Territory of New Guinea on or about the third day of August, 1942.

It is hereby notified that persons claiming to be the owners of the said gold amalgam or the said gold ingots or any part thereof must take the necessary steps to establish their claims to ownership by legal proceedings instituted in a Court of competent jurisdiction for the return of the said gold amalgam or gold ingots or part thereof to them.
It is hereby further notified that should legal proceedings not be instituted as aforesaid on or before the first day of June, 1945, or should such proceedings be taken but fail to

establish the claim of any claimant to ownership the Commonwealth will convert the said gold amalgam and gold ingots into money and the money so obtained will be dealt with pursuant to sections 28, 29 and 30 of the *Audit Act* 1901-1934.
