In pursuance of the National Security (Shipping Coordination) Regulations, the Stevedoring Industry Commission hereby makes the following Order:—

1. Awards.—The awards herein referred to are the awards of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration made respectively on the 7th day of April, 1936, and the 2nd day of July, 1937, in the matters of the Waterside Workers' Federation of Australia and the Commonwealth Steamship Owners' Association and others and the said Federation and the Permanent and Casual Wharf Labourers' Union of Australia and the said Association and others as varied from time to time.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the above award the

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the above award the following conditions shall apply to the work of sugar loading at Goondi:—

(1) The method of picking up labour for work at Goondi shall be the same as in operation for Mourilyan

Harbour.

(2) The place of assembly for conveyance to Goondi
(which will be at the expense of the employers)
shall be the Waterside Workers' Hall, Innisfail.

(3) Transport shall be provided by the employer.

(4) Travelling time shall be paid for, and meals supplied
in terms of the agreement between the parties
dated 8th July, 1944.

Port of Mackay.

pursuance of the powers conferred by the National Security (Shipping Co-ordination) Regulations the Stevedoring Industry Commission hereby makes the following

1. Awards.-The awards herein referred to are the awards of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration made respectively on the 7th day of April, 1936, and the 2md day of July, 1937, in the matters of the Waterside Workers' Federation of Australia and the Commonwealth Steamship Owners' Association and others and the said Federation and the Permanent and Casual Wharf Labourers' Union of Australia and the said Association and others.

2. Obligations of employers and employees with respect to transfers. Every employer, his servant or agent and every waterside worker shall carry out all orders or directions for transfers of labour given by or under the authority of the Chairman of the Waterside Employment Committee or such person as may be nominated by him for that purpose.

In addition to the transfers permitted by the awards men may be transferred from ship to ship or from whart berth to wharf berth as directed by or under the authority of such Chairman or such person as aforesaid whether such ships be worked by the same employer or be in the same

ships be worked by the same employer or be in the same locality or not.

locality or not.

If a vessel arrives or needs labour after the close of the pick-up and the time of such arrival or need could not have been reasonably anticipated during pick-up hours and on that account labour therefor was not requisitioned for at the pick-up or labour is requisitioned for a vessel during pick-up hours but owing to a shortage or anticipated shortage labour cannot or may not be able to be supplied at the pick-up the Chairman or such person as aforesaid if he is satisfied of the above may apart from powers of transfer aforesaid order any labour finishing a job to work such vessel but replace such labour with fresh labour at the

next pick-up if it is available and labour being so to work under such circumstances shall be entitled to waiting time between the two jobs but the latter job shalf not be regarded as a fresh engagement and no such labour shall be so ordered to work where the period between the time of finish of the first job and the start of the second exceeds four hours. exceeds four hours:

exceeds four hours:

Provided further that where at or before the completion of a recognized shift men are ordered to transfer from that employer to another employer at a time later than the completion of the next succeeding shift no waiting time shall be payable.

No job to which labour is transferred from another during any one shift shall be regarded as a fresh engagement.

Where labour not having commenced duty for one employer is re-allocated by the Chairman or other authorized officer

is re-allocated by the Chairman or other authorized officer to another employer no obligation for payment of the four-hour minimum shall rest with the first employer.

3. This Order shall come into operation forthwith.
