I RICHARD VALENTINE KEANE, Minister of State for the Commonwealth of Australia administering the Department of Trade and Customs, do hereby, in pursuance of the *Customs Tariff* 1933-1939, make the following Departmental By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 1252.

Customs Tariff 1933-1939, Item 105 (A) (1) (d) (1).

By-law No. 1029, published in *Gazette* No. 204, dated 16th September, 1943, as amended by By-law No. 1137, published in *Gazette* No. 127, dated 29th June, 1944, is hereby further amended by omitting from sub-paragraph (b) thereof the date "31st December, 1944", and inserting in its stead the date "30th June, 1945". (T.D. 45/35.)

BY-LAW No. 1253.

Customs Tariff 1933-1939, Item 105 (A) (1) (d) (2).

By-law No. 1030, published in *Gazette* No. 204, dated 16th September, 1943, as amended by By-law No. 1138, published in *Gazette* No. 127, dated 29th June, 1944, is hereby further amended by omitting from sub-paragraph (b) thereof the date "31st December, 1944", and inserting in its stead the date "30th June, 1945". (T.D. 45/36.)

BY-LAW No. 1248.

Customs Tariff 1933-1939, Item 174 (y).

The machines, machine tools, and appliances for use in connexion therewith, enumerated hereunder, may be admitted under Tariff Item 174 (y), viz.:—

Electrical machines and appliances—

Meters, alternating current, watt-hour, 3-rate (or triple tariff). (Operating on and from 20th November, 1944.) (T.D. 45/30.)

BY-LAW No. 1254.

Customs Tariff 1933-1939, Item 174 (y).

The machines, machine tools, and appliances for use in connexion therewith, enumerated hereunder, may be admitted under Tariff Item 174 (y), viz.:—

- (a) Coils, armature, being replacement parts for armatures for electric storage battery locomotives used in the mining industry. (Operating on 26th February, 1945, only.)
- (b) Cutters, gear, of the Fellows type, for use on gear planing machines. (Operating on 19th November, 1942, only.)
- (c) Head, balance weight drive, compensating, for a screener used in connexion with the refining of sugar. (Operating on 21st February, 1945, only.)
- (d) Header, superheater, cast iron, for a railway locomotive. (Operating on 19th March, 1945, only.)
- (e) Impellers, sleeves, and case sections, silicon iron, being replacement parts for glandless centrifugal pumps for pumping sulphuric acid. (Operating on 1st August, 1944, only.)
- (f) Measuring and filling machines, for the measuring and filling of cooked meat into cans. (Operating on 24th February, 1944, only.)
- (g) Motor, induction, electric, 3 phase, 50 cycle, 730 revolutions per minute, 415 volt, 170 horse power, vertical spindle, squirrel cage, alternating current, protected type. (Operating on 5th March, 1945, only.)
- (h) Parts for electric storage battery locomotives, viz.:—
Plugs.
Receptacles.
(Operating on 27th January, 1945, only.)
- (i) Recorder outfits, comprising recorder, metering units, water cooler and flow regulators, but excluding mains unit for determining the proportion of oxygen in the feed water being supplied to boilers. (Operating on 12th October, 1944, only.)
- (j) Rollers, rubber-covered, for squeezing mangles forming portion of a plant for the rot-proofing of cotton duck piece goods. (Operating on 15th March, 1945, only.)
- (k) Splitting (or cheeking) machine, head, for use in the tanning industry. (Operating on 17th March, 1945, only.)

(l) Stellite parts for bobbin tamping machines. (Operating on 15th April, 1942, 3rd February, 1943, 20th July, 1943, 2nd and 15th August, 1944, and 26th February, 1945, only.)

(m) Turbine, steam, pass-out type, for use with 2,500 kilowatt alternator. (Operating on 14th September, 1944, only.)

- (b) Extract, wattle bark, for use in the tanning industry. (Operating on the following dates only, viz.:—4th and 11th September, 1944, 15th, 16th, 21st and 23rd November, 1944, 8th, 11th, 19th and 21st December, 1944, 11th, 12th, 15th, 16th, 17th, 19th, 22nd and 23rd January, 1945, 7th and 26th February, 1945, and 1st and 2nd March, 1945.)
- (c) Hose, fire, canvas, 1½ inches diameter, for use in connexion with forest fire-fighting, imported by a State Government Department. (Operating on 15th February, 1945, only.)
- (d) Mixers, concrete, two cubic yard capacity, for mounting on vehicles and for mixing for any desired period while in transit to the job. (Operating on 7th March, 1945, only.)

- (e) Parts for all metal commercial type aeroplanes, having provision for the conveyance of at least ten passengers at a cruising speed of not less than 171 miles per hour and for aeroplanes for defence purposes. (Operating on the following dates only, viz.:—30th January, 1945, 2nd, 5th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 16th, 20th, 21st, 22nd and 23rd February, 1945.)
- (f) Spare parts for marine navigation instruments. (Operating on 2nd and 3rd January, 1945, and 5th February, 1945, only.)
- (g) Testing appliance for the testing of spark plugs for aviation purposes. (Operating on 29th May, 1944, only.)

- (b) Packing material, asbestos, for use in the construction of a still to be used in the production of acetic acid. (Operating on 3rd January, 1945, and 1st and 13th February, 1945, only.)
- (c) Plugs, spark, for use with gas pumps, imported for a State Government Department. (Operating on 11th January, 1945, only.)
- (d) Vulcanizer, electric, for use in connexion with the maintenance and repair of trailing cables in a coal mine. (Operating on 9th November, 1944, only.)

- (9) Belgian Congo, type "Raton". (Operating on 16th October, 1944, 18th January, 1945, 6th February, 1945, and 15th March, 1945, only.)
- (10) Egyptian, types "Zagora" and "MOG". (Operating on 16th and 19th February, 1945, and 9th and 13th March, 1945, only.)
- (11) Indian, comber waste, types "311", "1422" and "1422A". (Operating on 5th and 31st January, 1945, and 1st and 15th March, 1945, only.)
- (12) Indian, types "2205", "Vehar", "Pales", "Gorda" and "Iacas". (Operating on 16th and 22nd February, 1945, and 13th March, 1945, only.)

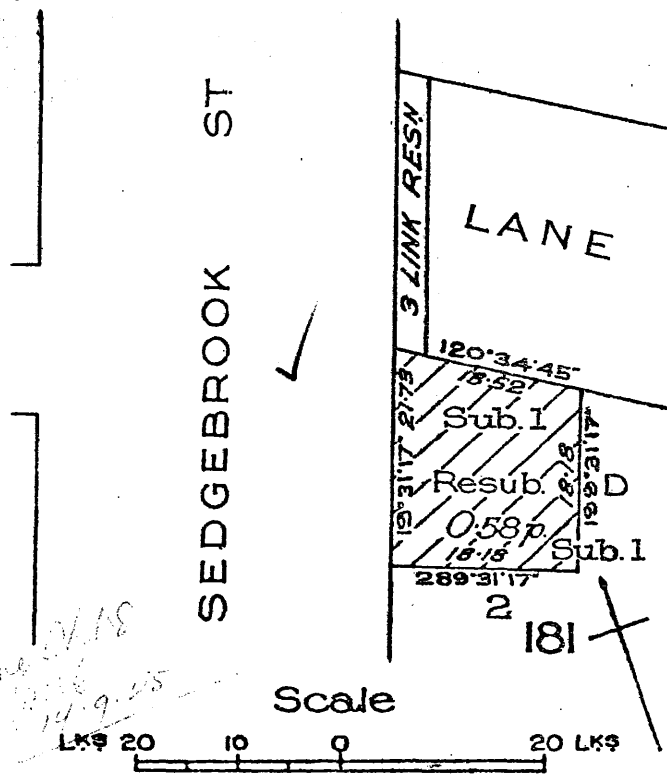

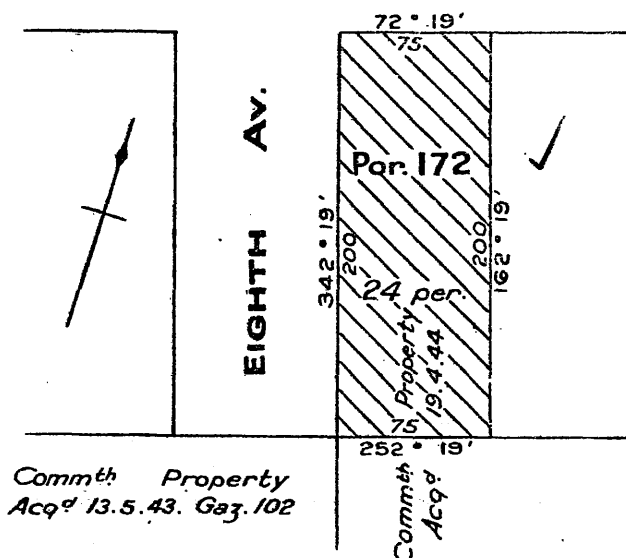
