WHEREAS by section four of the Evidence Act 1905-1934 it is enacted that all Courts shall take judicial notice of the official signature of any person who holds or has held

certain offices in that section mentioned, or any office to which the Governor-General, by order published in the Gazette, declares that section to apply, and of the official seal of every such person and of the fact that such person holds or has held such office, if the signature or seal purports to be attached or appended to any judicial or official document:

THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

Slaughtering Ordinance 1923-1940.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section 2A the *Slaughtering Ordinance 1923-1940* it is provided that that Ordinance shall apply only to such part or parts of the Northern Territory as the Administrator, by notice in the *Gazette* of the Northern Territory, proclaims from time to time to be affected by that Ordinance:

And whereas by virtue of section 10 of the *Interpretation Ordinance 1931-1940* it is sufficient if any notification required to be published in the *Northern Territory Gazette* is published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Honorable Charles Lydiard Aubrey Abbott, the Administrator of the Northern Territory of Australia, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned part of the Northern Territory to be affected by the *Slaughtering Ordinance 1923-1940*.

Part of the Northern Territory referred to Above.

All that area contained within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at a point on the centre line of Stuart Highway which bears 78° 28' from a point opposite the 359 mile post on the proposed Katherine Daly Waters Railway Extension and bounded on the north by a line bearing 78° 28' and 258° 28' for a distance of ten miles on either side of the said commencing point; thence on the east and west by lines running in a generally southerly direction parallel to, and at a distance of ten miles on either side from the centre line of the said Stuart Highway, to their intersections with the southern boundary, being an arc of a circle of ten miles radius whose centre is at Alice Springs Post Office.

Dated at Alice Springs this twenty-second day of February, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five.

Where two or more candidates secure the same total of marks, their order of merit, respectively, will be determined by marks obtained for (a) Arithmetic, (b) Spelling, and, (c) Geography.

TEXT BOOKS.—No text-books are prescribed, but a booklet containing papers set at a previous Commonwealth Public Service Examination for appointment as Telephonist may be obtained from the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Herald Building, 66 Pitt-street, Sydney, for 3d. (4½d. by post).
