And whereas it is desirable to reserve for Travelling Stock Routes the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto, being unalienated Crown lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Now therefore I, Henry William Frederick Albert, Duke of Gloucester, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of Travelling Stock Routes.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

(a) All that piece of land containing an area of 16 square miles more or less, being a strip one mile wide, one half mile on either side of the lines described in the following:— Commencing at a point one mile west and one half mile south of the south-eastern corner of the travelling stock reserve surrounding No. 9 Bore on the Western Australian Border (Gordon Downs) to Newcastle Waters Stock Route; thence east for about 780 chains parallel to and distant one half mile south of the southern boundary of Pastoral Lease No. 396, thence in a south-south-easterly direction for about 500 chains to a point on the northern boundary, about 45 chains east of the north-western corner of the travelling stock reserve surrounding Causeway Bore:

And whereas it is desirable to exempt the class of transactions specified in this Licence from the provisions of the said Act:

Now therefore I, Henry William Frederick Albert, Duke of Gloucester, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby exempt from the provisions of the said Act the following class of transactions, namely—

- (a) the transmission to persons in enemy territory of communications of a personal nature only; and
- (b) the transmission to persons resident in enemy territory of parcels or packages containing food-stuffs, wearing apparel, medicinal preparations or toilet articles, provided none of the goods contained in such parcels or packages is the subject of a commercial or business transaction between any person or body of persons of whatever nationality (and if incorporated, wherever incorporated) resident or carrying on business in enemy territory and any person or body of persons of whatever nationality resident elsewhere.

EXCISE REGULATIONS 1925, Nos. 76 AND 78 AND REGULATION 130 OF THE CUSTOMS REGULATIONS.

DRAWBACK of the full amount of excise duty paid on Australian gin used in the manufacture within the Commonwealth of gin squash may be allowed under the provisions of the Excise Regulations 1925 and of the Customs Regulations upon exportation from the Commonwealth of such gin squash and after compliance with the said Regulations.

Provided that the gin be added to the other ingredients under the supervision of an officer and that in each case before drawback is allowed the Collector shall be satisfied that the drawback claimed is properly due.
