## NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 3225.

Retail price of groceries—New South Wales.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order
No. 3925

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 2980 as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 3014 is hereby further amended—

- (a) by omitting from the Schedule thereto the maximum prices appearing opposite the items specified in the First Schedule to this Order and inserting in their stead the maximum prices specified in relation thereto in such last mentioned Schedule;
- (b) by inserting at the end of the items appearing in the Schedule thereto under the heading "Fruits (Canned and Bottled)" the items specified in the Second Schedule to this Order and in relation thereto the maximum prices specified in such lastmentioned Schedule
