## EXCISE BY-LAW No. 15.

BENJAMIN COURTICE, the Minister of State for the Commonwealth of Australia administering the Department of Trade and Customs, do hereby, in pursuance of the Excise Tariff 1921-1948, as proposed to be amended by the Excise Tariff Proposals, and of all other enabling powers make the following Departmental By-law.

## BEN. COURTICE

#### BY-LAW No. 15.

#### Excise Tariff Item 5(A).

Liqueurs may be delivered under Excise Tariff Item 5 (A) subject to the following conditions:

- (1) The liqueur shall be manufactured in accordance with a formula approved by the Comptroller;
- (2) The formula intended to be used in the manufacture of the liqueurs shall disclose-

  - (a) the name of the liqueur;
    (b) the quantity in liquid gallons of spirit intended to be used, the approximate strength of that spirit and the material from which that spirit is made;
    (c) a description and the name of each ingredient intended to be used in confinentian with the spirit to complete the
  - junction with the spirit to complete the
  - manufacture;
    (d) the origin of each ingredient and whether it is a synthetic or a natural product;
    (e) whether the method of manufacture is by
  - distillation or by the compounding of the ingredients;
- 5263.—No. 142.—Prior 6D; Quarterly, 8s. 2d.; Half-Yearly, 16s. 3d.; Yearly, 32s. 6d.

- (3) The liqueur shall have a spirit content of not less than 40 per cent. proof spirit except in the case of advocaat in which the spirit content shall be not less than 30 per cent. proof spirit.
- (4) A sample from each batch of completely manufactured liqueur shall be submitted to the Comptroller and must be approved before delivery of the liqueur from the factory.

Provided that this requirement may be waived at the discretion of the Comptroller and under such conditions as he thinks fit.

Excise By-law No. 1 dated 27th day of February, 1947, published in Commonwealth Gazette No. 38 of 27th February, 1947, is hereby cancelled. (Operating on and from 4th October, 1948.) (T. & C. 48/4085.)
