PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia W. J. McKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Bank Holidays Ordinance W 1927-1937 of the Australian Capital Territory that the Governor-General may, from time to time as he thinks fit, by proclamation, appoint special days to be observed as Bank Holidays either throughout the Territory or in any part specified in the proclamation.

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby appoint Monday, 3rd January. 1949, to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the Australian Capital Territory.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth of Australia this fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight in the twelfth year of His Majesty's reign.

NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1946, of the Northern Territory of Australia, it is provided amongst other things that the Governor-General may, at any time, by Proclamation, reserve any unalienated Crown Lands in the said Territory not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase, for places for the recreation or amusement of the public:

And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the recreation or amusement of the public, the lands described in the Schedule hereto being Crown Lands which are unalienated and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve for the recreation or amusement of the public the Crown Lands described in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land at Finke Railway Siding containing an area of 3 acres 3 roods 33.6 perches more or less; commencing at a point on the prolongation south-easterly of the south-western boundary of Lot 1 distant 100 links from the southernmost point of Lot 1; thence north-easterly parallel to and distant 100 links from the south-eastern boundary of Lot 1 for a distance of 450 links; thence south-easterly at

an internal angle of 90 degrees for 880 links; thence south-westerly at an internal angle of 90 degrees for 450 links thence northwesterly at an internal angle of 90 degrees for a distance of 880 links to the point of commencement.

(d) In respect of other prescribed examinations, three years commencing on the first day of the month following that in which the results of the first examination in the acquisition of eligibility were

The Board may extend the period of eligibility if, while it is current, an officer has completed or is pursuing at a University or a Technical College a course of study which in its opinion warrants the grant of such extension, but in no case will eligibility be extended beyond the day preceding the twenty-fourth anniversary of the officer's birth, except as

provided in paragraph 3.

6. Promotion or transfer to an office of Cadet (Personnel) of officers who are eligible in accordance with this notification

of officers who are eligible in accordance with this notification will be effected pursuant to the provisions of section 50 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1948.

Each Cadet will be informed of the particular course of study to be undertaken by him. Cadets will usually be required to do a major in one group.

The subjects will be so grouped as to facilitate the completion of a degree course by the officer outside the cadetship, if he so desires.

(b) Public Service Board.—A course of study and examinations in personnel administration directed by the Pacet.

(c) Departmental.—A course of study and examinations in departmental personnel work while employed in Departments.

12. FAILURE AT EXAMINATION.—Subject to section 67 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, if a Cadet (Personnel) fails to obtain satisfactory results at the annual examina-tions, the Board will decide whether the cadetship should be terminated and the officer transferred to such other office as may be deemed appropriate.
