NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 3258.

Shirts, Flannels, Underpants and Pyjamas.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 3258.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 3060 is hereby amended—

(a) By omitting from paragraph 4 the definition of "value" and inserting in its stead the following definition:—

"value" means, in relation to any material or aids to manufacture—

(a) in respect of material or aids to manufacture manufactured in Australia and purchased by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or maker-up, as the case may be, from the manufacturer of that material or those aids to manufacture the purchase price paid or payable therefor plus 2½ per centum;

(b) in respect of material or aids to manufacture purchased by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or maker-up, as the case may be, from the Division of Import Procurement of the Department of Trade and Customs or from the Commonwealth Disposals Commission the purchase price paid or payable therefor plus 2½ per centum;

(c) in respect of material, linings or trimmings imported by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or maker-up, as the case may be, and which are of a description specified in the Schedule to Prices Regulation Order No. 2522 as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 2648—

(i) the basic landed cost of that material or of those linings or trimmings as specified in such Schedule plus 5 per centum thereof; or

(ii) the cost thereof plus 5 per centum; whichever is the lesser;

(d) in respect of materials, linings or trimmings imported by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, as the case may be, and which are not of a description specified in the Schedule to Prices Regulation Order No. 2522 as amended as aforesaid—

(i) the cost thereof less 20 per centum; or

(ii) where an amount is specified by the Commissioner or Deputy Prices Commissioner in relation to that material or those linings or trimmings and notified in writing to that manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or maker-up then such amount plus 5 per centum;

(e) in respect of material or aids to manufacture purchased by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or maker-up, as the case may be, from a wholesale merchant—the purchase price paid or payable therefor;

(f) in respect of material or aids to manufacture purchased by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or maker-up, as the case may be, from a retail trader—

(i) the purchase price paid or payable therefore less 30 per centum; or

(ii) where an amount is specified by the Commissioner or Deputy Prices Commissioner in relation to that material or those aids to manufacture and notified in writing to that manufacturer, semi-manufacturer or maker-up—then such amount; "

(b) By omitting from Form No. 3 appearing in the First Schedule thereto the expression "Cost at Current Award Rates" and inserting in its stead the expression "Total Labour Cost".

NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 3260.

Hairdressing Charges—South Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 3260.

Definition.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears, "half holiday" means, in relation to the supply by any person of any of the services specified in the Schedule to this Order—Saturday, or where some other day of the week is usually observed as a half holiday in lieu of Saturday in the district in which that person supplies any of those services—that day.

Maximum rates.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rates at which the services specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be supplied in South Australia to be the rates specified in the second column of that Schedule.

Exhibition of price-list.

4. Every person who supplies any of the services specified in the Schedule to this Order, the maximum rate for which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, particulars of the maximum rates fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the supply by him of those services.

Fixation of maximum rates by notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which any service a maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order and which are specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Bread—South-west Land Division of Western Australia.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

- 1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 3262.

Revocation.

- 2. Prices Regulation Order No. 3125 as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 3203 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

- “bread” means white bread, wholemeal bread, whole wheatmeal bread and brown bread;
- “South-west Land Division” means the South-west Land Division of the State of Western Australia as defined in the Land Act 1933-1946 of that State but excluding from such South-west Land Division (as so defined) that portion thereof hereinafter defined as the “metropolitan area”;
- “metropolitan area” means all that area of the State of Western Australia comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office at Perth;
- “booked sale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, that such sale is not a cash sale as defined in this paragraph;
- “by retail” means, in relation to any sale of bread, that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in this paragraph;
- “by wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, that the quantity sold by the seller together with the amount sold by him during the preceding six days to the same purchaser is—
 - (a) in the case of a sale other than for resale—
not less than 240 lb.; or
 - (b) in the case of a sale for resale—not less than 60 lb.;
- “cash sale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale where payment is made by the purchaser for the bread within sixteen days of the date of delivery of that bread;
- “1-lb. loaf” means a No. 1 loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947 of the State of Western Australia;
- “2-lb. loaf” means a No. 2 loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947 of the State of Western Australia;
- “Vienna ½-lb. loaf” means a No. 1 Vienna loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947 of the State of Western Australia;
- “Vienna 1-lb. loaf” means a No. 2 Vienna loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947 of the State of Western Australia;

Maximum prices.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread and bread rolls may be sold in the South-west Land Division to be—

- (a) in respect of sales of bread for delivery within the boundaries of those town-sites other than Ravens-thorpe in which a bakery is established and operating—the price specified in the First Schedule to this Order;
- (b) in respect of sales of bread for delivery within the boundaries of the town-site of Ravens-thorpe—the price specified in the Second Schedule to this Order;
- (c) in respect of sales of bread for delivery elsewhere in the South-west Land Division—
 - (aa) in the case of sales by wholesale the maximum wholesale price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that description of bread by wholesale for delivery in the town-site whose boundaries are nearest to the place where that bread is delivered, plus the actual amount of railage (if any) paid or payable by the seller, or the actual amount of delivery charges (if any) paid or payable by the seller to any other person in respect of the delivery of that bread to the purchaser;
 - (bb) in the case of sales by retail the maximum wholesale price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that description of bread by wholesale for delivery in the town-site whose boundaries are nearest to the place where that bread is delivered, plus—
 - (i) the actual amount of railage (if any) paid or payable by the seller, or the actual amount of delivery charges (if any) paid or payable by the seller to any other person, in respect of the delivery of that bread to the purchaser;

- (ii) a margin of one half-penny per loaf in the case of both 1-lb. and 2-lb. loaves;
- (d) in respect of sales of bread rolls the price specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.

Provided that where 1-lb. loaves of bread are sold to the same purchaser by cash sale to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two 1-lb. loaves shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be a 2-lb. loaf.

Fixation of maximum prices by notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bread and bread rolls specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in the South-west Land Division by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Definitions.

- “Kalgoorlie-Boulder area” means all that area of the State of Western Australia comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of eight miles from the principal post office at Kalgoorlie;
- “booked sale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, that such sale is not a cash sale as defined in this paragraph;
- “by retail” means, in relation to any sale of bread, that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in this paragraph;
- “by wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, that the quantity sold by the seller together with the amount sold by him during the preceding six days to the same purchaser is—
- (a) in the case of a sale other than for resale— not less than 240 lb.; or
- (b) in the case of a sale for resale—not less than 60 lb.;
- “cash sale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale where payment is made by the purchaser for the bread within sixteen days of the date of delivery of that bread;
- “1-lb. loaf” means a No. 1 loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947 of the State of Western Australia;

"2-lb. loaf" means a No. 2 loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947 of the State of Western Australia;

"Vienna $\frac{1}{2}$ -lb. loaf" means a No. 1 Vienna loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947 of the State of Western Australia;

"Vienna 1-lb. loaf" means a No. 2 Vienna loaf within the meaning of the Bread Act 1903-1947 of the State of Western Australia;

Maximum prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread and bread rolls may be sold for delivery within the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area to be—

(a) in respect of sales of bread, the price specified in the First Schedule to this Order;

(b) in respect of sales of bread rolls, the price specified in the Second Schedule to this Order:

Provided that where 1-lb. loaves of bread are sold to the same purchaser by cash sale to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two 1-lb. loaves shall for the purpose of this Order be deemed to be a 2-lb. loaf.

Fixation of maximum prices by notice.

Definitions.

"the Adelaide metropolitan area" means all that area of South Australia comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office at Adelaide;
"prevailing price" means, in relation to the sale of bread by wholesale by any person, the maximum price fixed for the sale of that bread by wholesale by that person by or under the provisions of any Prices Regulation Order issued prior to the nineteenth day of January, 1948, and in force on that last-mentioned date.

Maximum prices—Sales by wholesale.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 3268.

Bread—Victoria—Sales Outside Melbourne Metropolitan Area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 3268.

Revocations.

2. Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 729, 799 and Prices Regulation Order No. 1573 as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 1737 are hereby revoked.

Application.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the operation of Prices Regulation Order No. 1087.

Definitions.

4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“bread” includes bread rolls;

“by wholesale” includes, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale by a retailer to a person to whom that retailer has, on the day of the sale, sold a quantity of bread (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale) totalling 12 lb. of bread;

“booked sale” means, in relation to any sale of bread that such sale is not a cash sale as defined in this paragraph;

“cash sale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale where payment is made by the purchaser for the bread within 30 days of the date of delivery of that bread;

“Melbourne metropolitan area” means the municipalities of Box Hill, Brighton, Brunswick, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Coburg, Collingwood, Dandenong, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Kew, Malvern, Melbourne, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Northcote, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, Sandringham, South Melbourne, St. Kilda and Williamstown.

Maximum prices.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread may be sold outside the Melbourne metropolitan area to be—

(a) in respect of sales by wholesale—

(i) for a cash sale—the price specified in the Schedule to this Order;

(ii) for a booked sale—the price so specified plus—

(aa) in the case of 1-lb. loaves—½d.

(bb) in the case of 2-lb. loaves—½d.

(b) in respect of sales by retail—

(i) for a cash sale—the price specified in the Schedule to this Order;

(ii) for a booked sale—the price so specified plus—

(aa) in the case of 1-lb. loaves—½d.

(bb) in the case of 2-lb. loaves—½d.

Fixation of maximum prices by notice.

6.—(1.) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bread specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in Victoria outside the Melbourne metropolitan area by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

(2.) All notices given in pursuance of Prices Regulation Order No. 1573 as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 1737 and which operate to fix a maximum price for the sale of bread in Victoria outside the Melbourne metropolitan area and which are in force at the commencement of this Order shall be deemed to be given under this Order.
