PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by virtue of section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1946, it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may by Proclamation revoke wholly or in part any reservation or dedication of lands made in pursuance of any law in force in the Northern Territory at any time prior to the commencement of the said Ordinance.

And whereas by Proclamation dated 9th June, 1909, and published in the Government Gazette of the State of South Australia, on 17th June, 1909, certain lands in the Northern Territory described in the Schedule thereto were reserved for the aboriginal inhabitants of South Australia.

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the reservation of the lands made by the said Proclamation described in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said reservation made by the said Proclamation.

THE SCHEDULE.

Comprising that portion of the Northern Territory of the State of South Australia bounded on the east and south by portions of pastoral lease 2184, and on the west by permit No. 111; and on the north by portions of permits Nos. 82 and 141.

And whereas Customs Proclamation No. 698 made on the eighteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and ferty-seven, and published in the Gazette on the nineteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, was issued in pursuance of the said section 9:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the said proclamation and make other provisions in lieu thereof:

Now therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke Customs Proclamation No. 698, as from nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned accord-No. 698, as from nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned according to standard time in the Australian Capital Territory, on the eleventh day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and do hereby declare that, as from the said time on the said date, the rates of duty set out in the column headed "British Preferential Tariff" in the Schedule to the said Customs Tariff 1933-1939 shall apply to such goods covered by Item 113 (B) in the said Schedule as are the produce or manufacture of the non-self-governing Colony of Malta.

This Proclamation may be cited as Customs Proclamation No. 704.

CUSTOMS BY-LAWS Nos. 445-458.

BENJAMIN COURTICE, the Minister of State for Trade and Customs, in pursuance of the Customs Tariff 1933-1939, and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following By-laws.

Customs Tariff 1933-1939, Item 174 (Y).

The machines, machine tools, and appliances for use in connexion therewith, enumerated hereunder, may be admitted under Tariff Item 174 (x), viz.:—

Motors, miniature, consisting essentially of a stator which is a permanent ring magnet, and a rotor consisting of a gap ring armature winding mounted on a bobbin and spindle and revolving freely within the stator, for operation by direct current batteries 1.5 yolts to 24 volts. Employers shall place their requisitions for day labour not later than 1.45 p.m. each day, Monday to Friday inclusive, with the following exceptions:—

That requisitions for labour required to commence work between the hours of 8 a.m. Saturday and 7 a.m. Monday shall be lodged not later than 1.45 p.m. on Friday.

That requisitions for labour required for day shift Monday or the following day when Monday is a holiday shall be lodged not later than 2.45 p.m. on Friday.

The list shall be displayed in such manner and at such place or places as the Waterside Employ ment Committee deems proper, setting out the roster numbers in numerical order of the men engaged, the hatch or place for which they are engaged, the time of engagement and the berth or place at which they are to commence work. Any member listed shall be deemed to have been engaged in accordance with the scheme.

Provided that if at 6.45 a.m. on any day it appears that a ship cannot commence work because of weather conditions or breakdown of machinery or non-arrival of the vessel or if it is necessary to alter the time of engagement, the employer shall be bound to notify the circumstances to the Labour Superintendent, who shall be authorized to cancel the labour for which lists have been posted and/or to order the labour for a time later than that listed. - When fresh labour has not been engaged for a vessel which was expected to finish before the end of a particular shift and the finish of the vessel has been delayed by unforseen circumstances such as rain, breakdown of machinery or other just cause, the Chairman, or if he is not available, the Labour Superintendent, in conjunction with the local secretary or other official of the South Coast branch of the Waterside Workers' Federation, shall, if all labour has been absorbed, direct labour from another vessel to finish the job, and such engagement will not be regarded as a fresh engagement. be paid.

During the training period trainees will be paid between 2,500 and 3,000 dollars per annum, dependent upon qualifications and experience. On appointment to the permanent staff of the Bank, the salary will be approximately 3,500 dollars per annum, with good prospects of early advancement to salaries of 4,500 or 5,000 dollars, for those who have demonstrated ability during training.

One or two persons may be nominated from Australia. The successful applicants will be announced on the 1st October, 1948, and the course of training will begin about 1:t January, 1949.
