 REGULATIONS.**

**ORDER UNDER REGULATION 5A.**

**I**N pursuance of regulation 5A of the National Security (Enemy Property) Regulations, I, Joseph Benedict Chifley, the Treasurer of the Commonwealth, hereby make the following order:—

I specify the 24th day of March, 1948, as the date until which each of the persons named in the schedule to this order shall, for the purposes of the National Security (Enemy Property) Regulations, be treated as if he or she had not ceased to be an enemy subject as defined in those regulations.

**COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.**

**REWARDS FOR DISCOVERY OF URANIUM ORE IN  
 THE COMMONWEALTH AND ITS TERRITORIES.**

**P**ERSONS making discoveries of deposits of uranium ore are invited to apply to the Secretary, Department of Supply and Shipping, Melbourne, Victoria, for the grant of a reward.

2. An application for the grant of a reward in respect of a discovery of a deposit containing uranium ore will only be considered if the deposit containing uranium ore is distant not less than 15 miles from any other deposit the existence of which is recorded in a list kept by the Secretary, Department of Supply and Shipping.

3. Where, in the opinion of the Minister for Supply and Shipping, the deposit containing uranium ore is not sufficient to be of economic importance, but would justify prospecting in the neighbourhood for further deposits of uranium ore, the applicant may apply for a reward, and the Minister shall determine in such cases what reward, if any, should be granted.

4. Where the Minister considers that the deposit containing uranium ore is sufficient to be of economic importance, he may approve of a reward of up to One thousand pounds (£1,000).

5. Where a deposit is such that, in the opinion of the Minister, it is capable of producing twenty-five (25) tons or more of uranium oxide, he may approve of a reward of One thousand pounds (£1,000) and he may also approve of an additional reward at the rate of Two thousand pounds (£2,000) in respect of each twenty-five (25) tons of uranium oxide which the deposit is capable of producing.

6. Where, in the opinion of the Minister, a deposit of uranium ore is capable of producing more than twenty-five (25) tons of uranium oxide, the rate of reward may be calculated *pro rata* in respect of the excess over twenty-five (25) tons.

7. The maximum amount of any reward for any discovery of a deposit containing uranium ore shall be Twenty-five thousand pounds (£25,000).

8. Payment of any reward shall be by lump sum or by such instalments payable at such times as the Minister for Supply and Shipping determines.

9. Where two or more persons apply for the grant of a reward in respect of the discovery of the same deposit containing uranium ore, the Minister for Supply and Shipping may, if he approves of a reward, grant the reward to one applicant only or he may apportion the reward among any two or more of the applicants in such proportions as he thinks fit according to his view of the merits of the applicants.

10. Where application is made for the grant of a reward, the application may be granted wholly or in part or refused at the absolute discretion of the Minister for Supply and Shipping.

11. The grant of any reward exceeding One thousand pounds (£1,000) shall be subject to the consent of the Treasurer being given to the grant.

12. An officer or employee of the Crown (whether in the right of the Commonwealth or a State) who makes a discovery of a deposit of uranium ore in the course of his official duties as an officer or employee shall not be eligible for the grant of a reward.

13. The invitation to apply for rewards shall be considered to be withdrawn upon publication of a notice in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* that the Minister for Supply and Shipping has decided that grants of rewards for the discovery of deposits containing uranium ore shall no longer be made.

14. The invitation to apply for a reward in respect of any discovery of uranium ore is not to be regarded as an offer the acceptance of which will give rise to a contract to pay a reward in respect of that discovery.
