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## NATIONAL SECURITY (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 3310.

*Fish—Tasmania.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the National Security (Prices) Regulations, I, Horace Eddy Bishop, Assistant Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

### *Citation.*

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 3310.

### *Revocation.*

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 2361 as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 2547, 2564, 2721 and 3120 is hereby revoked.

### *Definitions.*

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
- “fish” includes crayfish, lobsters, crabs and prawns or the flesh or any part thereof, and scallops;
- “Hobart” means all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of five miles from the General Post Office at Hobart;
- “Launceston” means all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of three miles from the post office at Launceston;
- “prescribed area” means any of the following areas:—
- (a) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of five miles from the General Post Office at Hobart;
  - (b) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Launceston;
  - (c) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Burnie;
  - (d) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Devonport;
  - (e) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Stanley;
  - (f) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at St. Helens;
  - (g) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Bicheno;
  - (h) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Triabunna;
  - (i) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Dunally;
  - (j) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Kettering;
  - (k) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Margate;
  - (l) all that area of Tasmania comprised within a radius of two miles from the principal post office at Gordon;

“headed and drawn” means head removed and gut drawn out;

“headed and gutted” means head removed, belly slit and gut drawn out;

“headed and cleaned” means head removed, belly slit, gut and blood sac removed thoroughly and back bone brushed;

“fillet” means the descaled flesh of a fish from which the head and backbone have been removed, which may or may not be skinned, from which all the back and belly pieces have been removed and which except in the case of flathead has the belly ribs removed;

“wings” means the breast and shoulder bones of a fish, the covering flesh and skin thereon and the pectoral and ventral fins.

### *Maximum prices—Sales by wholesale—Fish other than scallops.*

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish (other than scallops) specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale in Tasmania to be—

- (a) for sales in a prescribed area other than in Launceston—the price specified in the Schedule to this Order;
- (b) for sales in Launceston—the sum of the following:—
  - (i) the price so specified;
  - (ii) the actual cost (if any) of transporting such fish to Launceston from the place at which such fish was first brought to land;
  - (iii) in the case of—
    - (aa) barracouta, cod, garfish, mullet and salmon— $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per lb.;
    - (bb) crayfish—2d. per lb.
- (c) for sales outside a prescribed area—the price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale by wholesale of that fish in the prescribed area nearest to the place of sale less the current cost of transporting that fish to such prescribed area from the point of purchase of that fish by the wholesaler.

### *Maximum prices—Sales by wholesale—Scallops.*

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which scallops may be sold by wholesale in Tasmania to be—

- (a) for sales in Hobart—
  - (i) in the case of scallops in the shell— $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per lb.;
  - (ii) in the case of scallops other than in the shell— $9\frac{1}{4}$ d. per lb.;
- (b) for sales outside Hobart—
  - (i) where transported from Hobart—
    - (aa) for scallops in the shell— $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per lb.;
    - (bb) for scallops other than in the shell—1s. per lb., plus cost of transport from Hobart to the point of delivery;
  - (ii) in other cases—
    - (aa) for scallops in the shell— $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per lb.;
    - (bb) for scallops other than in the shell—9d. per lb.

Maximum prices—Sales by retail—Fish other than scallops.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish (other than scallops) specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Tasmania to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that fish by wholesale plus the difference between the price specified in the second column of that Schedule and the price specified in the third, fourth, fifth or sixth column of that Schedule according to whether the fish is uncleaned, gutted, headed and gutted or fillets.

Maximum prices—Sales by retail—Scallops.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which scallops may be sold by retail in Tasmania to be—

(a) for sales in Hobart—

- (i) for scallops in the shell—2½d. per lb.;
- (ii) for scallops other than in the shell—1s. 1d. per lb.;

(b) for sales outside Hobart—

- (i) for scallops in the shell—3½d. per lb.;
- (ii) for scallops other than in the shell—1s. 6d. per lb.

Maximum prices—Cooked fish—Sales by retail.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which cooked fish of any variety other than crayfish, prawns or scallops, may be sold by retail in Tasmania to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that fish by retail uncooked, plus an amount calculated at the rate of 6d. per lb.

Exhibition of price-list.

9. Every retailer who sells or has for sale by retail any goods, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business in the form of a price-list and in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those goods.

Exhibition of price tickets.

10.—(1.) Every person who sells or has for sale by retail any goods, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach to or display with those goods a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2.) Any ticket or label required by sub-paragraph (1.) of this paragraph to be attached to or displayed with any goods shall be in the form of a separate price ticket or label specifying the selling price applicable to each lot of each description of those goods so as to properly associate such price with each lot of each description of those goods to which such price applies and be in such form as to be easily legible to persons inspecting or viewing those goods.

Delivery of dockets—Sales by wholesale.

11. Every person who sells fish by wholesale in Tasmania shall deliver with that fish a docket or invoice containing the following particulars:—

- (a) his name and place of business;
- (b) the name and address of the purchaser of that fish;
- (c) the date of the sale of that fish;
- (d) the class or variety of fish sold;
- (e) the weight of that fish;
- (f) the rate per lb. charged for that fish;
- (g) the total price of that fish.

Fixation of maximum prices by notice.

12. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which fish specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in Tasmania by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

APPOINTMENT OF COMPENSATION BOARDS UNDER  
NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATION 60L.

**W**HEREAS by Instrument of Appointment dated 3rd September, 1947, published in *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette*, No. 175, dated 11th September, 1947, James Thorpe was appointed a Member of the Compensation Boards for the State of Queensland.

Now therefore in pursuance of section 6 of the *Defence (Transitional Provisions) Act 1946* and regulation 60L of the National Security (General) Regulations, I, Herbert Victor Johnson, Minister of State for the Interior, do hereby appoint Charles Thomas Leach to act as a Deputy for the aforesaid James Thorpe on the Compensation Boards for the State of

Queensland for the purpose of assessing compensation payable in respect to any loss or damage suffered—

- (a) in pursuance of regulations 53, 54, 55 or 56 of the National Security (General) Regulations; and
- (b) in respect of any furniture or equipment requisitioned in pursuance of sub-regulation (1.) of regulation 57 of the National Security (General) Regulations or the Defence Impressment Order, being furniture or equipment contained in any building the subject of any action under the said regulations 53, 54, 55 or 56.
