Defence (Transitional Provisions) Act 1946-1947.

CONTROL OF TINPLATE ORDER (No. 4).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section nine of the *Defence (Transitional Provisions) Act 1946-1947*, I, John Ignatius Armstrong, the Minister of State for Supply and Development, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Tinplate Order (No. 4).

Prohibition against use of tinplate without consent.

2. Paragraph 3 of the Control of Tinplate Order is repealed and the following paragraph inserted in its stead:—

“3. A person shall not, except with the consent of an authorized person, purchase, sell, use, consume or otherwise dispose of or print, lacquer, cut, stamp, fabricate or submit to any process, any tinplate for any purpose other than for or in connexion with the fabrication of containers of the prescribed capacity for a product which—

- (a) falls within the description of, or is, a substance specified in the first column of the table contained in paragraph 3AB of this Order.
- (b) is not a product declared by the Minister by notice in the *Gazette* to be an excepted product for the purpose of this paragraph.”

3. Paragraph 3A of the Control of Tinsplate Order is repealed and the following paragraphs are inserted in its stead:—

Limitation upon use of containers.

"3A. A person shall not, except with the written consent of an authorized person, use a container, fabricated wholly or in part from tinsplate—

- (a) for any purpose other than as a container for a product which—
 - (i) falls within the description of, or is, a substance mentioned in the table contained in the next succeeding paragraph; and
 - (ii) is not a product declared by the Minister by notice in the *Gazette* to be an excepted product for the purposes of the last preceding paragraph; or
- (b) as the container of any product unless the container is of the prescribed capacity.

Capacity of containers.

3AB. For the purposes of paragraphs 3 and 3A of this Order "the prescribed capacity", in relation to the container of any product, means the capacity specified in the second column of the following table opposite to the substance specified in the first column of that table which that product is or within the description of which that product falls:—

Asparagus	Not less than 10 oz.
Asparagus soup	Not less than 16 oz.
Beans, with tomato	Not less than 16 oz.
Butter	Not less than 12 oz.
Eggs, dried	Not less than 16 lb.
Eggs, pulped	Not less than 20 lb.
Fish	Not less than 4 oz.
Fish paste	Not less than 1 oz.
Fruit	Not less than 16 oz.
Fruit juice	Not less than 16 oz.
Golden syrup	Not less than 2 lb.
Honey	4 gallons
Jam	Not less than 24 oz.
Malt extract	Not less than 16 oz.
Meat (other than edible meat offal in frozen form)	Not less than 12 oz.
Meat, with vegetables or other products (pack to contain not less than 50 per centum by weight of meat)	Not less than 12 oz.
Meat paste	Not less than 3½ oz.
Milk, condensed	Not less than 12 oz.
Milk, dried (full cream only)	Not less than 12 oz.
Milk, malted	Not less than 12 oz., nor more than 5 lb.
Spaghetti, with tomato	Not less than 16 oz.
Tomatoes	Not less than 16 oz.
Tomato juice	Not less than 16 oz.
Tomato paste	Not less than 16 oz.
Tomato pulp	Not less than 5 gallons
Tomato puree	Not less than 30 oz.
Tomato soup	Not less than 16 oz.
Treacle	Not less than 2 lb.
Vegetables (other than asparagus)	Not less than 16 oz.

Entry and inspection.

4. Paragraph 3B of the Control of Tinsplate Order is repealed and the following paragraph inserted in its stead:—

"3B.—(1.) Any person authorized in writing in that behalf by the Minister may—

- (a) enter and inspect any premises where tinsplate is held in stock or is being subjected to any process or where tinsplate containers are being filled with any substance;
- (b) inspect any books, accounts or other documents kept in those premises in relation to tinsplate;
- (c) take extracts from, or make copies of, any such books, accounts or other documents;
- (d) take for inspection samples of any tinsplate containers which have been filled with any substance; and
- (e) take for inspection samples of any substance with which tinsplate containers are being filled.

(2.) A person who takes any sample in pursuance of the last preceding sub-paragraph shall offer to pay a reasonable price for the sample so taken."

NATIONAL SECURITY (LANDLORD AND TENANT) REGULATIONS.

DELEGATION OF POWERS.
