ORDER APPROVING THE AMENDMENT OF BYE-LAWS OF THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, AUSTRALIA.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General. By His Excellency the Government General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia. His Excellency the Governor-

WHEREAS by Letters Patent of His Majesty the King bearing date the tenth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, The Institution of Engineers, Australia, was by Charter passed under the Great Seal constituted, erected and incorporated into a body politic and

And whereas by Clause 16 of the said Charter it is provided that the majority of the Corporate Members present in person or by proxy and voting at a General Meeting of the said Institution specially called for the purpose of which due notice has been given shall have power from time to time to make such Bye-laws as shall seem requisite and convenient for the regulation government and advantage of the said Institution its members and property and for the furtherance of its objects and purposes and from time to time to revoke alter or amend any Bye-law or Bye-laws previously made but so that the same be not repugnant to the said Charter or to the laws and statutes of the Commonwealth of Australia or any State or Territory thereof:

And whereas by the said Clause 16 it is further provided that no such Bye-law revocation alteration or amendment shall take effect until approved by the Governor-General-in-Council of the Commonwealth of Australia:

And whereas in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter the majority of the Corporate Members present in person or by proxy and voting at a General Meeting of the said Institution specially called for the purpose of which due notice had been given and held at Sydney on the first day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, amended certain of the Bye-laws previously made:

And whereas the said amendments have been submitted to me, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, in accordance with Clause 16 of the said Charter:

Now therefore I, William John McKell, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council in pursuance of all powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby order that the said amendments (a copy of which is annexed hereto) be and the same are hereby approved and allowed.

AMENDMENTS OF BYE-LAWS OF THE INSTITUTION OF Engineers, Australia.

- (1) Bye-law 6 is amended by omitting the words "in any two consecutive years." and inserting in their stead the words "in respect of any visit to the Commonwealth of Australia.".
- (2) Bye-law 13 is amended by omitting paragraph (i) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:—
 - "(i) (a) That he is at the time of his application for election or transfer following the profession
 - election or transfer following the profession of engineering, or

 (b) That he has followed the profession of engineering, and that although at the time of his application for election or transfer he is not following the profession of engineering, it is in the interests of the profession that he should be elected or transferred, and ".
- (3) Bye-law 14 is amended by omitting paragraph (i) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:
 - "(i) (a) That he is at the time of his application for election or transfer following the profession of
 - election or transfer following the profession of engineering, or

 (b) That he has followed the profession of engineering, and that although at the time of his application for election or transfer he is not following the profession of engineering, it is in the interests of the profession that he should be elected or transferred, and ".
- (4) Bye-law 15 is amended by omitting all the words from and including the word "Unless" and inserting in their stead the words "No person shall remain in the grade of Junior for more than ten years from the time of his election or transfer into this grade or in any case after reaching the age of 35 years.".
- (5) Bye-law 28 is amended by omitting the words "two more than" and inserting in their stead the words "equal to".
- (6) Bye-law 50 is amended by inserting the words "entitled to be" immediately before the word "furnished".
- (7) Bye-law 62 is repealed and the following Bye-law inserted in its stead:-
- "62. The Council shall from time to time fix the entrance and transfer fees and the annual subscriptions for the various grades of members and shall have power to fix special rates for members resident outside the Commonwealth of Australia. The annual subscription of a member temporarily absent from the Commonwealth may be reduced or suspended for the period of such absence under such conditions as the Council may from time to time prescribe.".
 - (8) Bye-laws 63 to 67 inclusive are repealed.

- (9) Bye-law 68 is amended by omitting the words "The annual subscription for any year not paid on the first day of January next ensuing shall be regarded as being twelve months in arrears," and inserting in their stead the words "The annual subscription for any year not paid on the first day of August of that year shall be deemed to be in arrears.".
- (10) Bye-law 69 is repealed and the following Bye-law inserted in its stead:-
- "69. A Member, Associate Member, or Associate whose subscription is not in arrears may at any time compound his subscription for the current year and all future years by the payment in one of the first five years of his membership as a Corporate Member or as an Associate of such sum as the Council shall from time to time fix. If paid subsequently such sum shall be reduced by such amount as the Council shall from time to time fix for every year of such membership ofter from time to time fix for every year of such membership after five years.

In estimating the compositions to be paid for life membership of The Institution the years of Corporate Membership in a Foundation Society shall be taken into consideration as also the years of membership as a Corporate Member or as an Associate of the Predecessors of the Institution.".

- (11) Bye-law 74 is amended by omitting the words "A member who is in arrears with his subscription for more than 12 months" and inserting in their stead the words "A member who is, in the terms of Bye-law 68, in arrears with his subscription".
- (12) Bye-law 75 is repealed and the following Bye-law inserted in its stead :-
- "75. A Member whose subscription in any year has not been paid on or before the first day of August of that year shall be notified according to a prescribed form. In the event of his continuing in arrears for three months after such notification, the Council shall be advised and it shall have the power failing satisfactory response to a final notification in writing to erase the name of the defaulter from the Register."

PASSENGER'S PERSONAL EFFECTS.

Determination Under Regulation 24 (4) of the Customs Regulations.

IN accordance with Regulation 24 (4) of the Customs Regulations, I determine as follows in regard to "personal effects" of passengers arriving in Australia: of passengers arriving in Australia:

"The personal effects of a passenger include the passenger's own wearing apparel and articles of personal use. They include also jewellery, hair-brushes and essential toilet requisites, bicycles, cameras of non-commercial types, camp equipment of travelling sportsmen, exposed (or exposed and developed) films for home cinematographs brought to Australia by passengers and recording incidents of their travels abroad, portable gramonhouse sporting cause surgical deptal or by passengers and recording incidents of their travels abroad, portable gramophones, sporting guns, surgical, dental or veterinary hand instruments, gramophone records, sporting rifles including those for range competitions, saddles, personal sporting requisites, tradesmen's hand tools, portable equipment of the kind normally owned by workers for the carrying out of their particular trades, and typewriters. Provided that every such article is the passenger's own exclusive property, is or has been in his possession, is for his own use, and is not intended for gift, sale, exchange or trade.

"In certain circumstances and subject to special approval, a motor cycle (with or without side car) or a second-hand motor vehicle may be regarded as personal effects. In each case, application must be made to the Collector of Customs, setting out the circumstances of the importation.

"Personal effects do not include-

- (i) partly made wearing apparel, piece goods of silk wool or other material, lace, or goods of any kind for making into wearing apparel or furnishings;
- (ii) household goods or furnishings or any article for use, decoration, or ornament in a house or premises;
- (iii) perfumes, spirituous liquors, tobacco, cigarettes or confectionery;
- (iv) aircraft or motor vehicles except a second-hand motor car or second-hand motor van or truck with standard fittings and accessories, the private property of a passenger who intends to reside in Australia permanently, subject—
 - (a) to the production to, and to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs of evidence that the car, van or truck is the private property of the passenger and has been in his possession and use for at least one year prior to the date of its shipment to Australia.
 - prior to the date of its shipment to Australia; and

 (b) to the lodgment by the passenger with the Collector of Customs of a documentary security subscribed to as surety by an approved bank or guarantee company requiring that an amount specified therein representing the Customs duties and sales tax ordinarily payable on the car, van or truck at the date of its importation, shall be paid to the Collector in the event that the car, van or truck is sold or otherwise disposed of in Australia by the passenger or on his behalf within three years of its importation into Australia; importation into Australia;
- (v) wireless sets;
- (vi) home cinematographs (projectors)."

The determination of 7th February, 1949, published in Gazette No. 21, dated 17th March, 1949, is hereby superseded.
