PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. MoKELL Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia it is amongst other things provided that the Governor-General may appoint such times for holding the Sessions of the Parliament as he thinks fit:

Now therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Constitution do by this my Proclamation appoint Wednesday the twenty-second day of February One thousand nine hundred and fifty as the day for the said Parliament to assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and all Senators and Members of the House of Representatives are hereby required to give their attendance accordingly in the building known as the Houses of Parliament, Canberra, at the hour of ten-thirty a.m. on the said twenty-second day of February One thousand nine hundred and fifty. nine hundred and fifty.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Commonwealth of Australia this twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty and in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's (L.s.) reign.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

THEREAS by sub-section one of Section seventy-six of the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1948, it is provided that the Governor-General may proclaim any day to be observed as a holiday in the Public Offices of the Commonwealth in lieu of any of the days mentioned in the said sub-section:

And whereas it is desired that the thirtieth day of January One thousand nine hundred and fifty should be observed as a holiday in the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory of Australia in lieu of the twenty-sixth day of January One thousand nine hundred and fifty.

Now therefore I, William John McKell, Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby appoint Monday the thirtieth day of January One thousand nine hundred and fifty to be observed as a holiday in the Public Offices of the Commonwealth in the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory of Australia in lieu of Thursday the twenty-sixth day of January One thousand nine hundred and fifty.
