#### AUTHORITY

Commonwealth of Australia. W. J. McKell Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 69 of the Defence Act 1903-49 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Force, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manœuvres, or other naval military or air-force exercises or purposes.

And whereas by the said section it is provided that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use;

Now therefore I. William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council do hereby authorize such members of the Military Forces as shall be directed in writing by the officer who shall at any time during the continuance of this Authority be holding the office or performing the duties of the General Officer Commanding Eastern Command to enter upon the lands in the State of New South Wales described in the schedule hereto and use them for training, manœuvres or other military exercises or purposes from the first day of February, 1950, until the thirty-first day of January, 1951.

And I direct that all claims for damage or loss alleged to have been sustained by reason of any such entry and use shall be submitted in writing to the General Officer Commanding Eastern Command. Victoria Barracks, Paddington, New South Wales, within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss.

# THE SCHEDULE.

All that part and parcel of land being part of Portion 63, Parish of MINTO, County of CUMBERLAND, in the State of New South Wales, contained within the following boundaries.

Commencing at a point on the fenced northern boundary of the INGLEBURN Military Camp area, bearing 90 degrees for 22 chains, and 60 degrees for 46 chains, from the southwest corner of Portion 63, thence by a line bearing 330 degrees for 13 chains, thence by a line bearing 60 degrees for 46 chains, thence by a line bearing 150 degrees for 13 chains to the fenced boundary of INGLEBURN Camp area, thence by the fenced boundary in a South-Easterly direction to the point of commencement.

## COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA. AIR EFFICIENCY AWARD.

IT is notified that the Secretary of State for Commonwealth Relations has advised that His Majesty The King has been pleased to approve of the issue of the following Further Regulations:-

FURTHER REGULATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN AND OVER THE COMMONWEALTH (L.S.) OF AUSTRALIA IN REGARD TO THE CITIZEN AIR FORCE OF THE ROYAL AUSTRALIAN AIR FORCE, FURTHER

Whereas His Majesty King George the Sixth, being desirous of signifying his appreciation of long and meritorious service in his Auxiliary and Volunteer Air Forces, by warrant under his Sign Manual, dated the seventeenth day of August, 1942, instituted and created a medal to be available for officers and airmen of those Forces and to be designated the "Air Efficiency Award", and directed that the therein following regulations should govern the said award.

And whereas His Majesty by a further warrant under

And whereas His Majesty, by a further warrant under his Sign Manual, dated the twenty-seventh day of December, 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Warrant") directed that the aforesaid regulations be annulled and that the regulations set forth in the said Warrant (hereinafter referred to as "the said regulations") should henceforth govern the said award:

And whereas by the said regulations it is, amongst other things, prescribed that the said award shall be conferred under such further regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration and other matters, in amplification of the said regulations as may, with His Majesty's approval, be issued from time to time by the Governors-General, Governors or Officers administering the Government, as the case may be, in regard to the Auxiliary or Volunteer Reserve Air Forces of His Majesty's respective Dominions, Colonies or Territories under His Majecty's protection: under His Majecty's protection:

# FURTHER REGULATIONS. Eligibility.

- 1. Officers and airmen of the Citizen Air Force of the Royal Australian Air Force shall be eligible for the Air Efficiency Award, provided that—

  - (a) their qualifying service commenced before 4th September, 1939;
    (b) they have completed the required periods of training and are certified by the responsible authorities of the Royal Australian Air Force as efficient and in every way deserving of the award.

### Recommendations or Applications for Award.

2. Every recommendation or application for the Air Efficiency Award shall be submitted to the Air Board, and, if the Air Board approves thereof, it shall be submitted to the Governor-General.

### Qualifying Service.

- 3. The following shall count as "qualifying service" under regulation 6 of the Royal Warrant:—
  - (a) Service in an aircrew category in the Active Citizen
    Air Force of the Royal Australian Air Force shall
    ordinarily count as time and a half but full-time
    service in an aircrew category in that Force during
    the hostilities which commenced on 3rd September,
    1939, shall count as treble time.
  - (b) Other service in the Active Citizen Air Force shall ordinarily count as single time, but full-time service in that Force during the hostilities which commenced on 3rd September, 1939, shall count as double time as double time.
  - (c) Service in the Active Citizen Military Forces or Citizen Naval Forces of the Commonwealth shall count as single time.

- (d) Service in the Permanent Naval or Military Forces of the Commonwealth after 3rd August, 1914, and before 1st September, 1921, shall count as single time.
- (e) Service in the Australian Imperial Forces or the Naval or Military Expeditionary Forces of the Commonwealth after 3rd August, 1914, and before 1st September, 1921, shall count as double time if in a non-permanent force, provided that such service can be counted as double time for the efficiency award of the force in question.
- (f) Service on the active list in the Auxiliary Naval,
  Military or Air Forces of Great Britain, present,
  past or future, or in the Territorial Army of
  Great Britain, including Officers' Training Corps,
  shall count as single time.
- (g) Service on the active list in the Auxiliary Naval,
  Military or Air Forces, present, past or future, of
  a British possession or protectorate shall count as
  single time.
- single time.

  (h) Service in the Royal Navy, His Majesty's Regular Army, the Royal Flying Corps, the Royal Air Force, or a permanent Naval, Military or Air Force of a British possession or protectorate after 3rd August, 1914, and before 1st January, 1922, if the member concerned joined one of those forces after 3rd August, 1914, and before 12th November, 1918, shall count as double time if in a non-permanent or non-regular force, provided that it can be counted as double time for the efficiency award of the force in question; but such service shall count as single time if in a permanent regular force. regular force.
- regular force.

  (i) Service in the Reserve of the Citizen Air Force, the Reserve of the Citizen Military Forces or the Reserve of the Citizen Naval Forces shall count as half time, provided that there is a liability for annual training, and shall count as three-quarter time if the service is in an aircrew category and there is a liability for flying training which has been fulfilled.

## Service without Training Liability.

4. Service in a reserve or auxiliary force involving a liability for service only and no liability for training in peace shall not reckon as qualifying service for the Air Efficiency Award.

#### Service already Reckoned.

- 5. No period of service for which an Efficiency Decoration or Medal or Long Service and Good Conduct Medal has already been awarded shall count as qualifying service for the Air Efficiency Award.
- Continuity of Qualifying Service.
  6. Qualifying service shall be continuous unless the Governor-General, by regulation, or in the special circumstances of a particular case, shall otherwise direct.

#### Actual Service.

7. Service in the Active Citizen Air Force shall count as "actual service" under regulation 6 of the Royal Warrant.

# Registration.

8. A register of those on whom the Air Efficiency Award has been conferred will be maintained at the Head-quarters of the Royal Australian Air Force.

#### Forfeiture.

9. The Governor-General may, by order under his hand, cancel and annul the grant of the Air Efficiency Award to any

10. The Governor-General may, upon the recommendation of the Air Board, restore an Air Efficiency Award after the cancellation and annument of a grant thereof.

### Notification.

11. Every award, cancellation and annulment and restoration of the Air Efficiency Award shall be notified in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette.

MAY IT PLEASE THE COURT.

HENRY WILLIAM CRITTENDEN, a Candidate for the Kingsford Smith Electoral Division in the State of New South Wales at the General Elections of 10th December 1949, now residing at 12 Seville St., Lane Cove in that State, respectively present this my Petition as authorised by Part XVIII of the Commonwealth Electoral Acts 1918-1949.

The validity of the duly proclaimed election of Gordon Anderson to sit as a Member of the House of Representatives for the Kingsford Smith Electoral Division on 21st December

Anderson to sit as a Member of the House of Representatives for the Kingsford Smith Electoral Division on 21st December 1949 is disputed by me under the following counts:—

1. The said Gordon Anderson is not capable of being chosen or of sitting as a Member of the House of Representatives he being under acknowledgment of adherence, obedience and/or allegiance to a foreign power within the meaning of Section 44 of the Commonwealth Constitution.

2. More than £250 was expended by or on behalf of the

2. More than £250 was expended by or on behalf of the said Gordon Anderson as and by way of election expenses in contravention of Part XVI Sections 145 and 146 of the Commonwealth Electoral Acts of 1918-49.

3. Certain Commonwealth Government Department Publications produced wholly at the public expense were used by the said Gordon Anderson and/or his Agents for the purpose of influencing Electors in his favor and the cost of which is part of the Election Expenses as limited by the relevant part and sections of the Commonwealth Electoral Acts 1918-49.

I rely upon the facts as set out hereunder.

As to Count No. 1-

Section 44 Sub-Section 1, of The Commonwealth Constitution of 1900, provides that-

Any person who-"Is under any acknowledgment of allegiance, obedience, or adherence to a foreign power, or is a subject or a citizen or entitled to the rights or privileges of a subject or a citizen of a foreign power ..." shall be incapable of being chosen or of sitting as a Senator or as a Member of the House of Representatives." any acknowledgment of allegiance, tatives?

The Roman Catholic Church is both a Spiritual and Temporal Power. It has survived as a Religion for nearly 2,000 years only because of its power and influence as a Political State.

The Spiritual Head of the Roman Catholic Church as a Religious Body is the Reigning Pope, who is also, as the Sovereign Pontiff the Ruling Head of the Roman Catholic Church as a Political Hierarchy centered in the independent sovereign State of the Holy See or Papal State situated in its own territory at Rome.

In 1860 the Government of Italy under Garibaldi forcibly incorporated three of the nine Papal States over which the Popes had exercised sovereignty for centuries. The temporal power of the Vatican was suspended. In 1870 the remaining six Papal States were incorporated into a United Italy and the Pope no longer had jurisdiction or diplomatic status as the ruler of an independent State. The then Pope and his successors since accepted the position only under protest, and still maintained the validity of their claims to all those ancient political rights and privileges of which they were now deprived.

deprived.

In 1929 the Lateran Treaty was signed by the Italian Government on the one hand and Pope Pius XI. as head of the Holy See, on the other, whereby temporal power was restored to him and his successors, and which recognized full and independent sovereignty of the Holy See. As compensation for having deprived the Holy See of Temporal Power and Sovereignty for sixty years, inter alia, the Treaty provided for the Italian Government to pay the Pope 750 million lire (£20,000,000 stg.) and further to pay him 5 per cent. per annum on 1,000 million lire (£25,000,000 stg.). The Treaty also recognized the Roman Catholic Church as the State Religion of Italy. The Vatican City was recognized as being an independent sovereign State known as the Papal State, and having "Independent Diplomatic Status among the sovereign States of the World". The entire motif of this Treaty was political from the view points of both parties. The aim of the Italian Government is accepted generally as including the moral support of the Vatican for its projected imperial adventures which included the attack upon Abyssinia.

Since 1929 to the present day the Papal State has its own

Since 1929 to the present day the Papal State has its own independent ruling sovereign in the person of the Pope, who is internationally recognized as the Sovereign Pontiff. It has its own accredited diplomatic representatives (nuncios &c.) in exchange with those of other powers. It has its own Executive Council and Legislature, including various executives among which is the Papal Secretary of State. It has its own treasury and coinage, military establishment, post and telegraph and, in fact all the recognized institutions of a Sovereign Power.

Since the Lateran Treaty was signed the British Diplomatic Representative at the Vatican and Resident in Rome is a Minister Plenipotentiary with status and emoluments slightly higher than those of the British Representative in Panama Republic—similarly a sovereign State and foreign power to all others.

The immediate outcome of the Lateran Treaty between two political entities as the contracting parties was the establishment of the wholly political Catholic Action Organization in all countries where opportunity offered. Under the overall direction of the present Pope then Cardinal Pacelli as Secretary of State to the Vatican, Apostolic Delegate Panico established Catholic Action in Australia on a nation-wide basis. To-day in this country Catholic Action is believed to have a secret and active membership of up to two hundred thousand and every member of the Roman Catholic Church is expected to give it full moral if not active support. Its influence is seen and felt in almost every department of the Australian way of life especially in the Political, Public Service, Trade Union Propaganda and Local Government spheres of action.

Later Pope Pius XI. signed the Concordat (treaty) between the Vatican and Hitler which many authorities agree precipitated World War II.

The history of the Roman Catholic Church as with that of every country, is overwhelmingly political. It is not necessary to cite more than a few cases such as the humiliation of King John, as a prelude to the signing of Magna Carta.

The Excommunication of Queen Elizabeth and the Vatican backing of European Courts to wage war on England from which the Armada eventuated. The Guy Fawkes plot to blow up the English House of Parliament in 1603 was inspired by the same hierarchy. The revolt in Ireland under James II. was similarly inspired. Nearer at hand we have the anticonscription campaigns of World War I. under Archbishop Mannix which were wholly political, and in which almost every priest was a leader. These coincided with the Irish Rebellion of 1916, during which the Pope sent a Special Mass to "His Irish Province" calling upon all Irish Catholics to support the Rebels as a sacred duty. Nor can it be denied that the Vatican, politically bound to Hitler, sponsored Eire's neutrality. (In World War II).

The selected Laws and Decrees set out hereunder are part of what is known as The Canon Law of the Roman Catholic Church and mandatory upon all its members in all countries, including Australia, and claimed and accepted as taking precedence over the Civil Laws of all countries in which such members live. They are administered by Local Hierarchies combrising a constituent Governing Body of Bishops and Priests with delegated and discretionary powers from the Pope himself. The numbered sequence in this Statement is for reference herein only.

These Laws and Decrees are cited, confirmed and elaborated in hundreds of official books, documents, and journals authorized by the Pope.

- 1. The definitions, teachings, decrees and instructions of the Roman Pontiff are infallible and above all earthly law.
- 2. The Pope can annul all legal relations of those in ban, especially their marriages.
- 3. The Pope can release from every obligation, vow, either before or after being made.
- 4. The Roman Catholic is free and independent of any earthly power, a sovereign society, the supreme head of which the Pope must be esteemed the king.
- 5. If the Pope's authority comes into conflict with the civil laws upon any vital point, the Catholic is to act as he did in the first, second and third centuries.
- 6. The Church and her priests have the right of immunity from all civil laws.
- 7. The clergy should be tried for civil and criminal offences only in ecclesiastical courts.
- 8. The Church has the right to interfere in the discipline and in the arrangement of the studies of the public schools.
- 9. The execution of Papal commands for the persecution of heretics causes remission of sins.
- 10. He who kills one that is excommunicated is no murderer in the legal sense.
- 11. It is quite unlawful to demand, defend or to grant unconditional freedom of thought or writing or of worship as if these were so many rights given by nature to men.
- 12. In point of fact, democracy is a mischievous dream wherever the Catholic Church does not predominate to inspire the people with reverence.
- 13. The Pope has the right to annul State laws, treaties, constitutions, &c., to absolve from obedience thereto as soon as they seem detrimental to the rights of the Church or those of the clergy.
- 14. The Pope has the right of admonishing and, if necessary, of punishing the Temporal rulers, emperors and kings.
- 15. Without the consent of the Pope no tax or rate of any king can be levied upon a clergyman or upon any (R.C.) church whatsoever.
- 16. The Pope has the right to absolve from oaths and obedience to the persons and laws of the princes whom he excommunicates.
- 17. The civil power has no power to assist persons to regain their freedom who have once adopted a religious life—that is, have become priests or nuns.
- 18. All private persons whether of the laity or the sacred orders, male or female, who, without the proper ecclesiastical authority cites before any lay tribunals any ecclesiastical person whatsoever, either in civil or criminal cases, and shall publicly compel them to be present in court, shall incur excommunication.
- 19. The laws of the Church do not recognize any civil privileges as belonging to persons 'non-Catholic; their marriages are not valid; they live only in concubinage; their children, being bastards, are not capacitated to inherit. When Catholics are married according to the rules of the Church the marriage is valid, even if in other respects they infringe all the laws of their own country.
- 20. All Catholics must make themselves felt as active elements in daily political life in countries where they live. All Catholics should exert their power to cause constitutions of States to be modelled on the principles of the true Church. Catholics have just reason to enter into the political life having in mind the purpose of introducing the wholesome life-blood of Catholic wisdom, virtue into the whole system of the State."

I submit that it is clearly established by the foregoing that:

- The Roman Catholic Church is an integral part of a world-wide political régime headed by the Pope as Sovereign Pontiff and ruler of a foreign power within the meaning of section 44 clause 1 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia.
- 2. The Canonical Laws and Decrees imposed upon and accepted by Roman Catholics in Australia whom the Pope claims as his subjects within his Australian Province, cannot by any reasonable interpretation be included in the spiritual or religious category within the meaning of the provision for religious freedom in the Australian Constitution,

but are entirely in the political category and primarily calculated to achieve the political ends of a foreign power. They conflict with and challenge the Civil Laws of Australia as well as the principles of Magna Carta 1215 A.D., Habeas Corpus 1679 A.D. and the Bill of Rights 1689 A.D., upon which they are founded, together with the Australian Constitution.

3. All Roman Catholics in Australia are under "acknowledgments of allegiance, obedience or adherence to a Foreign Power" within the meaning of section 44 clause 1 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia and are therefore not capable of being chosen or of sitting as Senators or Members of the House of Representatives".

The recent direction by the present Pope to Catholic Judges that they should ignore the civil laws in certain cases which came before them, can be interpreted in no other way than that where the civil law conflicts with "Church Law" Catholic Judges must betray their solemn oaths taken to adminster the laws of the State without a single reservation.

In addition there are many such classical works as Gladstone's "Church and State", inspired by the Vatican's repudiation of certain undertakings made by the English R.C. Hierarchy as a condition precedent to the Special Act passed in 1829 which permitted Roman Catholics to sit in the English Parliament.

It is the political activities of the Local Hierarchies in English-speaking countries that have given them such control over the Press, Radio and Politics generally, as to virtually impose a taboo upon publication of matters calculated to prejudice their special interests.

Infrequent news items of this category in the aggregate provide a convincing endorsement of the case as presented herein. Included in these are Sydney Morning Herald's Report of Post-war Roman Catholic Political parties in every State in Europe, under various names but all under Vatican direction and control in pursuit of its Temporal Power.

The said Gordon Anderson was, at the times of his nomination and election, a professed member of the Roman Catholic Church. As such he, as in the case of all members of that Church in all countries, is under "acknowledgement of Adherence, Obedience or Allegiance to a Foreign Power"—the Papal State. He is therefore incapable of being chosen of eithing as a Member of the Heure of Paparson to tive. or of sitting as a Member of the House of Representatives.

#### As to Count No. 2.

Part XVI., Sections 145-146, of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-49, make no provision for any additional amount of election expenses beyond the specified £250 and Section 147 specifically defines "Election Expenses" as including all expenses incurred by or on behalf or in the interests of any candidate at or in connexion with any election excepting only the purchasing of electoral rolls and the personal and reasonable living and travelling expenses of the candidate".

The following Section 148 requires that "any person incurring or authorizing electoral expense by or on behalf of any candidate must have the written authority of the candidate in each case. It is submitted that any expense incurred by a trade union, party or other body or person referred to in Section 152 of Part XVI. of the said Electoral Acts on behalf or in the interest of any candidate is included Acts on behalf or in the interest of any candidate is included in the prescribed maximum of £250 for each candidate. It is in the prescribed maximum of £250 for each candidate. It is submitted also that where such expense is similarly incurred on behalf of or in the interest of any political party, it must be a charge at least proportionately against each of that Party's Candidates. Any other conclusion would defeat the entire letter and spirit of sections 145, 146, 147 which clearly aim at protecting candidates against the advantage otherwise exercised by wealthier opposing candidates and/or the interests which are prepared to back them. I find that the cost of daily and weekly newspaper advertising authorized by The Australian Labor Party for and on behalf of all its candidates who were frequently named therein and which includes the said Gordon Anderson appears in the aggregate to exceed £250 per Labor Party Candidate for the House of Representatives, and £500 per candidate for The Senate, under such conditions my candidature was gravely prejudiced by inability to expend more than the prescribed £250, as against the very large funds available to the said Gordon Anderson.

As to Count No. 3.

Several expensively produced booklets were published by various Commonwealth Government Departments shortly prior to the last general elections, for example those from the Departments of Post-war Reconstruction and Social Services.

Hundreds of thousands of copies of these booklets extolling the work of the Departments concerned under Labor Adminis-tration were made available to Labor Party Candidates, including the said Gordon Anderson in whose electorates they were freely distributed as part of the electioneering literature issued by or on behalf of the Party Candidates in each Electorate. Severe and quite justifiable criticism has been

voiced throughout the Press and at Public Meetings against this manifestly corrupt misuse of public funds, and which is in my submission an illegal practice vide Section 162 (b).

I submit that the cost of this literature must be included as "Election Expense" within the meaning of Section 147 of the Commonwealth Electoral Acts. My candidature was thus servicedly projudiced. seriously prejudiced.

I respectfully pray for such relief as is warranted by the circumstances to the end that Justice may be done as provided by the Commonwealth Constitution and Electoral Acts.

The whole of the facts as set out in this my Petition are true in all essentials to the best of my knowledge and belief.

# COMMONWEALTH PUBLIC SERVICE.

# PROMOTIONS—SECTION 50 AND REGULATION 109.

THE following promotions are provisional and subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and, where consequent upon another provisional promotion, shall be dependent upon the latter being confirmed. Appeals should be lodged, either by letter or telegram, within twenty-one days of the date of this notification, as follows:—

(a) if the promotion is to be made in a State, with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector in the capital city of that State; (b) if the promotion is to be made in the Australian Capital Territory, with the Public Service Inspector in Canberra, unless the promotion is to be made to a vacancy in the Postmaster-General's Department, in which case the officer shall lodge his appeal with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Sydney;

(c) if the promotion is to be made in the Northern Territory—

(i) with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Brisbane, in the case of a promotion to a vacancy in the Department

of Trade and Customs;

(ii) with the Commonwealth Public Service Inspector, Adelaide, in the case of a promotion to a vacancy in the Postmaster-General's Department;

(iii) with the Public Service Inspector, Canberra, in other cases.

An appellant shall forward his appeal direct to the Public Service Inspector, and the following particulars in respect of mis permanent position should be set out at the foot of the appeal:-

Full name (block letters)
Age (in years)
Designation
Standard salary scale
Office or Branch
Denortment

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate Commonwealth Public Service Inspector within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Under Section 50 (7a) of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, the Board may regard an appeal as having been made against a provisional promotion notified hereunder by any officer who, at any time within the time prescribed for lodging an appeal, is absent on leave for war service, or is absent from Australia on official duty.

Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions, a separate appeal should be lodged in respect of each. The grounds of appeal must be as prescribed in Section 50 of the Commonwealth Public Service Act, viz.:-

- (1) Where a promotion is to be made to a position prescribed in Regulation 109G, viz.:—Assistant, Grade 1—female; Assistant, Grade 2—male or female; Labourer; Lift Attendant; Lineman, Grade 2; Line Foreman, Grade 1; Mail Officer; Postal Assistant, Grade 1; Postal Assistant (Mail); Postal Clerk (Fourth Division); Senior Postal Clerk, Grade 1; Assistant Storeman; Storeman, Grade 1; Storeman, Grade 2; Telegraphist (Fourth Division); Quarantine Assistant, Grade 1; Searcher and Watchman—that the appellant is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient.
- (2) In other cases-

(a) Superior efficiency; or

(b) Equal efficiency combined with seniority.
