PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit. W. J. MoKell Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1948, it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time by Proclamation reserve, for places for the recreation or amusement of the public, any unalienated Crown lands not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the purposes of a racecourse and public recreation the lands described in the Schedule hereto being Crown lands which are unalienated and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:

Now, therefore, I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve for the purposes of a racecourse and public recreation the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto.—(D.I. 49/1474.)

THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land at Katherine in the Northern Territory of Australia and containing an area of 140 acres or thereabouts commencing at a point bearing 209° 17' 10" and distant 3798.5 links from the south corner of Lot No. 19 Town of Katherine; thence by lines bearing 128° 27' for 50 chains; 218° 27' for 28 chains; 308° 27' for 50 chains and 38° 27' for 28 chains to the point of commencement.

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (2.) of section thirteen of the said Ordinance that the Attorney-General may, by instrument under his hand, delegate to any person all or any of his powers and functions in relation to the Northern Territory under any Act of the said State in force in the Northern Territory as a law thereof, as affected by the

said Ordinance, so that those powers and functions may be exercised by the delegate subject to such reservations and instructions (if any) as are set out in the instrument of delegation:

Now therefore, I, John Armstrong Spicer, the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth, do hereby delegate to the person for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Crown Law Officer and Draftsman, Darwin, all the powers of the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth under sections three hundred and thirty-four and three hundred and thirty-five of the Criminal Law Consolidation Act 1876, of the State of South Australia, in its application to the Northern Territory, such delegation to remain in force during the pleasure of the Attorney-General.
