And whereas it is desirable to reserve for the purpose of a stock quarantine and holding ground the lands described in the Schedule hereto being Crown lands which are unalienated and not subject to any right of, or contract for, purchase:
Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve for the purpose of a stock quarantine and holding ground the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto.—(D.I. 50/447.)

THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia about 70 miles due east of Wycliffe Well containing an area of about 146 square miles and bounded by lines commencing at the northeastern corner of Animbra lines commencing at the northeastern corner of Animbra Commonage Reserve thence easterly for about 16.8 miles to the southeastern corner of Pastoral Lease No. 135; thence southerly for about 8.7 miles to the northern boundary of Pastoral Lease No. 105; thence westerly along the northern boundary of Pastoral Lease No. 105 and the prolongation thereof to the eastern boundary of Animbra Commonage Reserve; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that reserve to the point of commencement.

CUSTOMS (IMPORT LICENSING) REGULATIONS. NOTICE.

IT is notified for public information that, pursuant to the powers conferred upon me under regulation 15 of the I powers conferred upon me under regulation 15 of the Customs (Import Licensing) Regulations, I hereby revoke all previous ministerial determinations under the said Regulations relating to the exception of goods or classes of goods from the application of the said Regulations and except from the application of the said Regulations the goods or classes of goods enumerated in the schedule hereto.

In the schedule hereto, the words "Customs Tariff" mean the Customs Tariff 1933-1949 and include that Act as amended from time to time or as proposed to be amended by any Customs Tariff Proposals introduced in the House of Representatives for that purpose.

Representatives for that purpose.

Wherever, in the schedule hereto, reference is made to goods produced or manufactured in the United Kingdom, it shall be understood that such reference will apply only to goods which comply with the conditions relating to the

application of a Preferential Tariff set forth in section 151A the Customs Act 1901-1949 and any determination thereunder.

For the purpose of this notice, no goods shall be deemed to be goods the produce or manufacture of any Territory the to be goods the produce or manufacture of any Territory the produce of which is excepted from the application of the said Regulations unless the particular goods comply with the conditions relating to the application of a Preferential Tariff, set forth in section 151A of the Customs Act 1901-1949 and any determination thereunder, or would comply with those conditions if the British Preferential Tariff were applicable to that Territory and unless the goods are consigned to Australia from that Territory.

THE SCHEDULE.

Passengers' personal effects and passengers' furniture and household goods admissible under Item 409 (A) of the Customs

fide gifts not imported for commercial purposes, the value of which in Australia does not exceed £20, or such further amount as the Minister may approve in special circumstances, provided that this exception shall not apply to tea in excess of 2 lb. net weight.

Goods which are proved to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs to have no commercial value.

Goods which the Collector of Customs is satisfied are bona fide samples, not being goods of the kind for which import licences are normally not granted.
