NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR CONSENT TO THE CHANGE OF THE CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR MEMBERSHIP OF AN ORGANIZATION.

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made to me under the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1949 for consent to the change of conditions of eligibility for membership of the Professional Officers Association, Commonwealth Public Service from the following.

### " Membership.

Any person with professional qualifications permanently or temporarily employed in the Commonwealth Public Service in a professional capacity approved by the Executive Council shall be eligible for membership.

The following professions are approved:-

- 1. Engineers: (a) civil; (b) mechanical; (c) electrical; (d) mining; (e) marine; (f) military; (g) lighthouse; (h) ship construction.

  2. Architects and quantity surveyors.

- 4. Analysts and metallurgists.
  5. Meteorologists.
- 6. Surveyors.
- 7. Draughtsmen.
  8. Medical officers, including surgeons.
  9. Actuaries and statisticians.
- 10. Barristers and solicitors.11. Biochemists.
- 11. Biochemists.
  12. Valuers: (a) those persons who at the 1st day of January, 1940, were classified as assistant valuer, valuer, senior valuer or chief valuer; (b) those persons who may be subsequently appointed as valuers: (i) who have graduated in architecture, surveying, agriculture or allied professions; (ii) who are members of the Institute of Valuers; or (iii) who have practised as valuers for a period of at least twelve years. at least twelve years.

13. Any person undergoing a recognized course of training for any of the above professions in a professional branch of the Service.

14. Any avocation requiring qualifications of a standard equivalent to those required for any of the foregoing professions, and which may be approved by the Executive Council.

Nothing in this Rule shall affect the rights of existing members.

### "QUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP.

Any officer or temporary employee of 'The Public Service' as defined by the Arbitration (Public Service) Act 1920-1947 employed:

(i) in a professional capacity and who possesses related professional qualifications, or
 (ii) as a cadet professional officer and who possesses adequate related qualifications

may, following approval by the Executive Council or by any body to whom, for the purpose, the Executive Council delegates its authority, be admitted to member-

Notwithstanding the above, a person filling a professional position and performing duties of a professional character but lacking in adequate appropriate qualifications, may be admitted to membership of the Association if he is able to satisfy the Executive that he has performed such duties for a continuous period of not less than five (5) years immediately preceding the date of his application and that it was not reasonable and/or practicable for him to acquire the academic and/or professional qualifications normally required for his profession.

In determining eligibility for membership the approving authority shall be guided by the principles laid down in Appendix 'A' hereto.

(Appendix 'A'-Qualifications for Membership.-

1. Professional Capacity.—Professional capacity shall be taken to imply work of the following nature:—

(i) Predominantly intellectual and varied in character as opposed to routine mental, manual, mechanical or physical work.
(ii) Involving the consistent exercise of judgment and discretion in its performance.
(iii) Requiring the assumption of responsibility.
(iv) Requiring knowledge of an advanced type in the field of science or learning customarily acquired by a prolonged course of higher learning as distinguished from an apprenticeship or training in the performance of routine processes.

2. Professional Qualifications.—Provided they are directly related to the professional capacity in which the applicant for membership is employed 'adequate related professional qualifications' shall mean any one of the following:—

(i) These are

he following:—

(i) Those possessed by the holder of a degree of a recognized University.

(ii) Those possessed by the holder of a diploma of a recognized Technical College or School of Mines, or which would, in general, be accepted as a qualification for admittance as a corporate member to the appropriate recognized professional institute.

(iii) Those possessed by the holder of a certificate

(iii) Those possessed by the holder of a certificate of corporate membership of an approved professional institute.

(iv) A certificate or gazetted notification that the

certificate or gazetted notification that the officer has passed the professional examination prescribed for promotion to a professional position in a department of the Commonwealth Public Services.
