#### PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Autsralia to wit. W. J. McKell Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by section four of the Matrimonial Causes Act 1945 that Part II. of that Act shall apply in relation to marriages celebrated in Australia, on or after the third day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and before the appointed day, where the husband (whether a member of an overseas Naval, Military or Air Force, or not) was, at the time of the mariage, not domiciled in Australia, and the wife was, immediately before the marriage, domiciled in a State or Territory:

And whereas it is provided by section nine of the Matrimonial Causes Act 1945 that in Part II. of that Act "the appointed day" means such day as is specified by Proclamation to be the appointed day:

And whereas is it expedient that the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, shall be specified to be the appointed day:

Now therefore I, William John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby specify the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, to be the appointed day.

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said Proclamations:

Now therefore, I, Wiliam John McKell, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council—

- (a) do hereby revoke Customs Proclamation No. 504;
- (b) do hereby amend Customs Proclamation No. 524 as amended by Customs Proclamations No. 638 and 640 by omitting from the schedule thereto the words "Heating and Cooking appliances, metal";
- (c) do hereby amend Customs Proclamation No. 535 as amended by Customs Proclamation No. 643 by omitting from the schedule thereto the words "Cotton yarn";
- (d) do hereby amend Customs Proclamation No. 561 by omitting from the schedule thereto the words "Goods manufactured wholly or in part of synthetic resin";
- (e) do hereby amend Customs Proclamation No. 563 as amended by Customs Proclamation No. 764 by omitting from the schedule thereto the words "Window blinds";
- (f) do hereby revoke Customs Proclamation No. 579;
